MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

IN accordance with the provisions of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," the Municipal Council, Kandy, has made the following regulations, under sections 18 and 23 of the said Ordinance, in lieu of the regulations dated October 28, 1875, published in the *Gazette* of October 29, 1875 :—

Mahaiyawa General Cemetery.

1. All applications for graves are to be made to the keeper of the cemetery within six hours of the time fixed for the burial of the person for whom the grave is wanted.
2. The keeper of the cemetery must intimate the line to be followed by a funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.
3. Should it be necessary for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.
4. The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his commands are to be obeyed.
5. No grave shall be less than 6 feet in depth or at a distance of less than 4 feet from any other.
6. No grave shall be reopened within a year, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except for post mortem examinations for the purposes of the criminal law.
7. The keeper of the cemetery shall send weekly to the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages a copy of transcript of the burials, as the same are registered in the register book.
8. The following fees are to be paid in advance by applicants for graves :—

Provided that such fees shall not be levied from the Roman Catholic or the Muhammadans, or from religious bodies whose vested interests may be or may have been acknowledged by the Government. In the case of Muhammadans, such fees have been and are hereby commuted in respect of an annual payment of Rs. 20 fixed at meeting of the Municipal Council, Kandy, March 1, 1875.

Provided further—

(1) That the burial of corpses from the Government Civil Hospital, Kandy, shall be allowed by the cemetery-keeper on payment of Re. 1 per corpse, on condition that the graves be dug by the hospital contractor or servants, and that the burial takes place under the supervision of the cemetery-keeper.

(2) That paupers dying in the town be allowed to be buried free of charge in the portion of the cemetery allotted to them according to their religion, on the production of a certificate signed by a Minister of the Christian religion, a Police Inspector, or the Secretary of the Kandy Municipal Council to the effect that the friends or relatives of such deceased persons are not able to pay the fees herein authorized for the digging of a grave.

This revised scale of fees and charges shall come into force on and from the date of the publication of this notice.

"Improvements in or relating to rubber smoking and drying cabinets or houses."

Abstract:—

A brick furnace for making smoke is connected to the lower end of an upwardly sloping passage or gallery which is closed in on all sides. The passage is described as being of rectangular section, constructed of wood or iron framework, covered with plaited bamboo and plastered. There is a corrugated iron roof as well. Near the inner flat roof of the sloping passage are rails on which slide carriers consisting of rectangular frames with cross bars of triangular section and on these cross bars are hung the rubber sheets to be smoked or cured. The carrier frames with their hanging rubber sheets are placed on the rails at the upper end of the passage or gallery and a succession of such loaded carriers are pushed along the rails until they emerge, in succession, at the lower end over the smoke producing furnace, having passed in that way through the smoke throughout the length of the passage. Doors are provided at each end of the passage for the admission and egress of the carriers and a flap is arranged in the roof at the upper end to regulate, presumably, the flow of smoke. The cross bars of the carrier frames are provided with spikes standing upwards for fixing the edges of two rubber sheets on each cross bar so that each hangs over opposite edges of each cross bar and exposes as much as possible of all its surfaces to the action of the smoke.

The claims are:—

1. A rubber smoking and drying cabinet or house, comprising an upwardly inclined passage arranged substantially as described and illustrated so that smoke can be introduced at the lower end of the passage and the rubber introduced at the upper end of the passage and be caused to travel through the passage to the lower end where it is removed.

2. A rubber smoking and drying cabinet or house, comprising an upwardly inclined passage into which smoke is introduced, the rubber being carried on carriers arranged to be moved on guides or rails, the carriers being introduced at the upper end of the passage.

3. A rubber smoking and drying cabinet or house, comprising an upwardly inclined passage into which smoke is introduced, the rubber being carried on carriers arranged to be moved on guides or rails, the carriers being introduced at the upper end of the passage and the arrangement being such that by pushing on the uppermost of the carriers, all of the carriers can be moved in the passage.

4. A rubber smoking and drying cabinet or house, comprising an upwardly inclined passage into which smoke can be introduced, guides or rails extending through said passage, and rubber carriers adapted to rest on said guides or rails and to be moved thereon, the rubber carriers consisting of rectangular frames which when in position on the guides have two opposite sides horizontal but perpendicular to the direction of the passage, and which opposite sides are arranged to support the two ends of each of a number of bars, the rubber sheets being attached to the bars, so that the sheets hang in substantially vertical planes parallel to the direction of the passage.

5. In a rubber smoking or drying cabinet or house, a hanger for supporting a sheet or sheets of rubber, comprising a bar having a number of spikes on to which the sheet of rubber is pressed or other means for fastening the rubber sheet to the bar, the rubber sheet being arranged to rest on an edge or edges of the bar.

6. For a rubber smoking or drying cabinet or house a hanger for supporting a sheet or sheets of rubber, comprising a bar having a number of spikes on to which the rubber sheet is pressed or other means for fastening the rubber sheet to the bar, the bar being adapted to be supported so that the rubber sheet can rest on an edge or edges of the bar.

7. For a rubber smoking or drying house or cabinet, a hanger or bar for supporting the rubber, substantially as described or as illustrated in Figures 8 and 9 of the accompanying drawings.

8. A rubber smoking or drying house or cabinet constructed or employed substantially as described or as illustrated in the accompanying drawings.

“An improved Latex Spout and Cup Holder.”

Abstract:—

The characteristics of this spout and cup holder consist in providing deep downwardly flanged sides to the spout and slotting or cutting in each of those flanges a slit into which can be pushed the lip of a cup or other similar collecting vessel which is thereby held in place below the spout. There are holes in those flanges also for passage of a loop of wire forming a clip to fix the spout and cup holder to the tree, the top edge of the inclined spout being driven into the tree until the inner edges of the flanges come in contact with the bark and so form a stop to prevent the spout being driven too far into the tree. A modification is a flanged spout without the slits and forming a spout with stops to prevent the spout being driven too far into the tree, but it is not then a cup holder.

A cover for the collecting receptacle and spout is illustrated and described, in part, but is not claimed in the Specification as accepted.

The claims are:—

1. A spout for use in collecting liquids or semi-liquids such as rubber latex, resin, or the like from trees or shrubs bearing same, which is made substantially as described so that whilst it can be driven into the bark of the tree or shrub to serve as a guide or chute for collecting the latex, resin, or the like, yet cannot be driven into such an extent as to penetrate the cambium and thereby injure the tree or shrub, substantially as described.

2. A spout as claimed in claim 1, having sides or buttresses (B) with flanges (A) the flanged buttresses not only strengthening the spout but also preventing its lip being driven too far into the tree or shrub.

3. A spout such as claimed in claims 1 or 2 formed with slots in the flanged sides substantially as described so that a cup or receptacle for collecting latex, resin, or the like can be push-connected to it, substantially as described.

“An improved tapping knife for rubber trees or the like.”

Abstract:—

The nature of the invention is described in the claims.

The claims are:—

1. A tapping knife consisting of a blade of section sharpened at both ends and pivotted about its middle to a handled shank to which also it can be locked in one of two positions by a sliding clamp, substantially as described and illustrated and for the purposes described.

2. In tapping knives as claimed in claim 1 an elongated blade of section the longer side of which, being sharpened, forms the cutting edge and the short side the guard, substantially as described and illustrated.

3. In tapping knives a blade as claimed in claim 2 pivotted about its middle point substantially as described and illustrated.

4. In tapping knives as claimed in claim 1 a handled shank provided at its end with a pivot substantially as described and illustrated on which the blade claimed in claim 1 and 2 is freely pivotted.

5. In tapping knives as claimed in claim 1 a clamp or sleeve substantially as described and illustrated made to slide on the inner end of the shank to lock the pivotted blade in one of two positions substantially as and for the purposes described.

6. In tapping knives a pivotted blade of section sharpened at both ends, a shank provided at its outer end with a pivot and a sliding clamp, in combination, for the purpose of providing the operator with a guarded chisel cutting edge for either right or left hand tapping of rubber trees or the like.
