#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, February 2, 1917.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 26, 1917.

*Present* :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Major A. W. de Wilton, Mr. L. B. Fernando ; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. Arthur Alvis ; Mr. H. L. de Mel ; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene ; Dr. E. V. Ratnam ; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo ; Mr. J. A. Perera ; Mr. T. L. Villiers ; Mr. C. H. Wellard ; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, Mr. W. C. S. Ingles ; Mr. W. A. Cave ; and Mr. Harold Creasy.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 12, 1917, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of January 12, 1917, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following :—

There have been 22 further cases of human plague and 6 cases of rat plague recorded for the month of January last. The corresponding totals for last year were 17 human and 7 rat cases, while in the preceding year there were 22 cases of human plague. Of the 22 human cases, 13 were septic and 9 bubonic in character. All proved fatal, but 2 bubonic cases, which are still alive at the Infectious Diseases Hospital.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman :—

(1) Is the road known as Driberg's lane a "street" within the purview of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, and, if so, is it vested in the Council under section 70 of the said Ordinance, or has it been exempted by the Governor in Executive Council ?

(2) Was Driberg's lane constructed at the expense of the Council, and what amount was spent upon its construction ?

(3) Under what circumstances does the General Manager of the Ceylon Government Railway periodically close Driberg's lane against its use by the general public ?

(4) What sum of money was contributed by the Council towards the construction of the overhead footbridge which connects Driberg's lane with Floor's lane ?

(5) Is this footbridge a "street" within the purview of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, and, if so, is it vested in the Council, or has it been exempted by the Governor in Executive Council ?

(6) Under what circumstances does the General Manager of the Ceylon Government Railway periodically close the footbridge against its use by the general public ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—

(1) The way to which reference is made and which has been mentioned, though not quite correctly, as Drieberg's lane is not a street, and has not been vested in the Council under section 70 of the Ordinance.

(2) There is a Government reservation running along the north side of the Railway from Panchikawatta to north and south Base Line road. In 1895 the Council expended some Rs. 10,000 with the object of making a road at the eastern end. They were stopped in order to await the decision of Government as to what Railway works were required.

Later a controversy arose between the Government and the Municipality as to whether the Railway authorities had the right to obstruct the path which ran along the north of the Railway line from Maradana Junction Station and which the Council claimed as a road.

The question was settled by a reference to the Additional District Judge, Mr. Felix Dias, as arbitrator. He gave his award in October, 1905, holding that the public had no right of cartway or even footway along the path.

In 1907 the Council expended some Rs. 175,000 on the acquisition of land with the object of making a roadway at the western end from the Panchikawatta road, and spent Rs. 429.81 in making a footway, which reaches up to the existing reservation retained by the Crown.

(3) In 1907, on a representation made by the Chairman, the Government duly intimated to the Municipality that the General Manager was arranging to provide a 3-foot pathway to enable persons to get from Panchikawatta to Base Line road until such time as the Council constructed the proposed new road. The letter goes on to say :—

“ It must be clearly understood that this is not to be regarded as the concession of a right of way, and that the path will be closed once a year.”

In view of this condition the pathway is closed once a year by the General Manager.

(4) The Council contributed a sum of Rs. 5,858 towards the construction of the overhead footbridge over the Railway.

(5) The bridge is not a street and is not vested in the Council.

(6) It was erected by the Government on a representation of the Chairman that the crossing of the line from Floor's lane to the pathway was dangerous. Its northern end is on the Crown reservation, and no public right of way exists. Its use is accordingly regulated by the same condition laid down for the 3-foot pathway, namely, that it will be closed to the public once a year.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that cattle should not be allowed to graze in Campbell park, and if any grazing permits have been issued for 1917 that they be recalled and cancelled.—Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman gave particulars with regard to the number of permits issued for the year and the amount realized by way of fees, as well as the expenses which will have to be incurred to keep the grass in order if the grazing of cattle is stopped.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.—Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.

The Chairman put the amendment to the meeting and it was declared carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 5 to 10 (inclusive) on the agenda. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

5-9. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage Works and of the Standing Committees named were laid before the Council in Committee :—

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage Works of January 17, 1917.*

(3) To consider a letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with regard to the proposals by the Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, to construct (a) 12-in. sewer X 1 to the Galle road; (b) 2 ft. 6 in. by 1 ft. 8 in. sewer to the Dshiwala canal (items not included in the modified scheme) at an estimated cost of Rs. 146,000.

Recommended that the following be constructed :—(a) the 12-in. sewer X 1 to the Galle road at a cost of Rs. 56,000; (b) the first section of the 2 ft. 6 in. by 1 ft. 8 in. sewer (along the line in red as shown in the tracing) at a cost of Rs. 34,000.

(10) To consider the question of providing a sum of Rs. 25,000 for the construction of a new outlet and the re-grading of the existing drain in the south end of York street.—Recommended that a sum of Rs. 25,000 be voted for the construction of the new outlet and the re-grading of the existing drain in the south end of York street, and that the work be carried out by the Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo supported the recommendation of the Standing Committees.

The Chairman replied to the points raised.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 3 (corresponding to items Nos. 2 and 9 of the extracts from the Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works and Finance of January 26, 1917, respectively), Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 6 (corresponding to items Nos. 16, 5, and 38 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Law, Municipal Works, and Finance), the Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted, and that Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Mr. H. L. de Mel be appointed a Special Committee to make the necessary arrangements.

With regard to item No. 7, it was resolved that the consideration of the matter be deferred, and that the papers be circulated.

Resolved—That the recommendations of the remaining items of the Standing Committee be adopted.

- (b) That the following be added to the Schedule B of fees charged under section 233 of the said Ordinance, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,783 of March 10, 1916, for trades and businesses which have by means of a by-law been declared to be offensive and/or dangerous trades and businesses for the purpose of section 212 of the said Ordinance for the use of places for the following purpose:—

Gravel quarry, license fee Rs. 25.

- (16) To consider the form in which the opening of the Colombo Waterworks Extension Scheme should take place when the work is completed in March next.—It is considered that His Excellency the Governor should be invited to formally open the new works, and that the ceremony be held in the afternoon.

With regard to item No. 6 (corresponding items Nos. 3 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 26, 1917), Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the consideration of the matter be postponed, and that the papers be circulated. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Perera opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committees and moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved, as an amendment, the addition of the words "and that the papers be circulated to the Members of Council." Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Mr. T. L. Villiers supported the recommendation of the Standing Committees.

- (40) To consider an application from Mr. C. M. Young, owing to the delay of his steamer, for extra half-pay leave (to be commuted, under section 22 of the Leave Minute, to full-pay) from December 23, 1916, to January 2, 1917, inclusive.—Recommended.
- (42) To consider an application from Mr. H. R. Pentin, Assistant Superintendent of the Fire Brigade, for leave, with permission to join His Majesty's Forces.—Recommended that leave be granted for the period of the war, on the return of Mr. Lanaway, on the usual terms, provided that Mr. Pentin joins His Majesty's Forces.

- (67) To recommend the transfer of a sum of Rs. 16 from Vote E (b) 19 (Veterinary Department) Miscellaneous to E (b) 16, Disinfectants, 1916 Budget. The vote was exceeded as a larger quantity of disinfectants had been used owing to the prevalence of anthrax throughout the year.—Recommended.

With regard to item No. 42, the Chairman moved that the matter be referred back for further consideration of the Standing Committee on Finance. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 47 (corresponding to item No. 14 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 26, 1917), resolved that the item "10 No. 24 in. gauge double tipping Decauville wagons" be omitted from the recommendation of the Standing Committees.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items, as amended, be adopted.

10. To consider the report of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 13, 1916, "to inquire into the cause or causes of the unusually long duration of the present epidemic of smallpox."

After Mr. J. A. Perera had opened a discussion of the report, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred for the next meeting. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume and that the resolutions of Council in Committee, as amended, be adopted. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Thursday, January 18, 1917.

THE Council met this day at 4 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 11, 1917.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena ; Mr. H. M. Makan Marikar ; Mr. D. W. Subesingha ; Dr. C. B. Lourensz ; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena ; and Mr. J. E. Perera.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of the Council and of the Special General Meeting of the Council held on December 9, 1916, copies of which were sent to each Councillor, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council and of the Special General Meeting of Council of December 9, 1916, be confirmed.

2. Letter No. 23 dated December 15, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* payment of arrears due for police engaged on Municipal duties.—Laid on the table.

3. Letter No. 1,994 dated November 6, 1916, from the Colonial Auditor *re* issuing of receipts by the shroff. Mr. D. W. Subesingha moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

4. Papers *re* Medical Officer of Health.—Resolved (1) that the resignation of Dr. Rajagopall be accepted from January 3, 1917 ; (2) that Dr. Ludovici be paid the full salary and allowance of the post for acting until the vacancy is filled ; (3) that application for the post be called for in the local papers ; and (4) that the candidates selected by the Council on December 11, 1915, be written to inquiring whether they would accept the post now if offered to them.

Dr. C. B. Lourensz left the meeting at this stage of the proceedings.

5. Application for Council's land at Ettiligoda for a period of five years to be used as an experimental and stock garden for the Galle District.—Deferred for next meeting.

6. The Standing Committees for 1917 were balloted for and resulted as follows :—

(1) *The Standing Committees on Finance and Assessment* :—Messrs. D. G. Goonewardena, C. E. de Vos, and G. E. Abeywardena.

(2) *Standing Committee on Municipal Works* :—Messrs. D. G. Goonewardena, C. E. de Vos, and E. H. Vanderstraaten.

(3) *Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects* :—Messrs. D. W. Subesingha, G. E. Abeywardena, and A. C. Hayley.

(4) *Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation* :—Mr. D. W. Subesingha, Dr. C. B. Lourensz, and Mr. A. C. Hayley.

7. The Chairman moved the reappointment of the Special Committee appointed on November 11, 1911, to ascertain and report as to the ways and means to be adopted to provide the town with improved lighting. Mr. D. W. Subesingha seconded.—Carried unanimously.

8. The Chairman moved the reappointment of the Special Committee appointed on July 13, 1912, to report on the steps to be taken to improve the drainage of the town. Mr. D. G. Goonewardena seconded.—Carried unanimously.

9. The Chairman moved the reappointment of the Special Committee appointed on June 13, 1913, to investigate the effect on the town water of the timber existing in the bed of the Hiyare reservoir and to report on the proposal to remove same and further to advise the Council generally as to the steps to be taken in this connection. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

10. With the permission of the Council the Chairman brought up the following matters for consideration :—

(1) The omission in schedule III., section 5, of the Ordinance No. 4 of 1916, for a stamp duty on license for handcars.

The Chairman moved that the following by-law be recommended :—“ The stamp duty payable for every license for a handcart shall be Rs. 3.” Mr. G. E. Abeywardena seconded.—Carried unanimously.

(2) Papers *re* headlights used on motor vehicles and speed limit of motor vehicles in the Fort. Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the following by-laws be recommended :—

(i.) That no head lights be used within the limits of the Municipality of Galle except on the following conditions :—

- (a) In the case of electric headlights, the lowest section of the reflector below the level of the light shall be cut off to the extent of at least one-third of the surface of the whole reflector by means of a shield or other device or contrivance with a dead black surface.
- (b) In the case of gas headlights, the whole of the lower half of the reflector at the back of the light shall be completely cut off by the interposition between the light and the reflector of a shield or some other device or contrivance with a blackened surface.
- (c) No lamp constructed to be used as a headlight shall be used as a side light within the Municipal limits of Galle.

(ii.) That the speed limit of mechanically propelled vehicles driven within the limits of the Fort Ward do not exceed 12 miles an hour. Mr. Makan Markar seconded.—Carried unanimously.

11. The following documents were laid on the table :—

- (1) Papers *re* notice of action for damages caused to a horse belonging to Mrs. Makan Markar owing to bad state of road.
- (2) Letter acknowledging receipt of casket for the address presented to His Excellency the Governor on his visit to Galle.
- (3) Statement of Receipts and Disbursements to end of December, 1916.
- (4) Progress Report of Work done on estimates to end of December, 1916.
- (5) Report of Inspector of Vehicles and Animals on carriages plying for hire during the month of December, 1916.
- (6) Diaries of (a) Medical Officer of Health, (b) Superintendent of Works, and (c) Manager of the Health Department.

## The Cemeteries and Burials Regulation, Sanitary Board, Galle District.

THE following regulations made by the Sanitary Board, Galle District, being the "proper authority" in that behalf, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 18 and 23 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1899, in respect of the general cemetery at Dodanduwa are published for general information.

## REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial of a person for whom the grave is wanted.
2. The keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one party come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.
3. Should it be necessary for the purposes of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.
4. The keeper shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his commands in that behalf shall be obeyed.
5. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth, or at a less distance than 4 feet from another. No grave shall be reopened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.
6. No dead body shall be buried or cremated without the permission of the cemetery keeper, and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due have been paid. Ashes and other remains on the scene of a cremation shall be buried by the parties responsible for the cremation within three days after the cremation.
7. No fees other than those specified in by-laws 9, 10, and 12 shall be recovered for the use of the burial ground from residents within the area defined by the Proclamation in *Gazette* No. 6,837 of November 24, 1916, published under section 6 (1) of Ordinance No. 9 of 1899.
