Resthouse charges at the stations from and to which an officer is moved will not be repaid except when an officer can certify that such charges were incurred either at the station from which he is moved in consequence of his baggage being sent on ahead, or at the station to which he is moved in consequence of his baggage not arriving in time. Such charges cannot under any circumstances be repaid for any period exceeding two days in either case.

A PPLICATION having been made by Mr. R. M. Eckert of Sunnycroft estate, Veyangoda, to the Government Agent of the North-Central Province, for the lease of land lot No. 7,456 in preliminary plan No. 2,398, containing in extent 661 acres and 3 roods, bounded on the north by Pannakkawalakele, south by Thonygalakele, west by Pusiyankulamawewa Ismattekele, and east by Galkadawala village, Hinnemukalana, and Karambewa village, situated in the village Pussiyankulama of Nuwaragam korale in the Nuwaragampalata of the Nuwarakalawiya District, for the purpose of experimental cultivation which, if found to be successful, may lead to the opening up for cultivation of a large area of unirrigable jungle land hitherto lying waste, it is hereby notified under regulation No. 52 of land sale regulations published in Gazette dated 20th February, 1903, that the said land will be leased to the said applicant for five years under the following conditions, unless within six weeks from the date of this notice valid reasons to the contrary are adduced:—

1. The land to be taken over by the lessee in blocks of at least 100 acres each every year, such blocks being defined by the Government Agent by arrangement with the lessee.

2. The lease of the entire land to be completed within five years and to be terminated in

the fifth year.

3. The rent for the blocks taken over to be Re. 1 per acre per annum, payable each year in advance.

- 4. At the expiry of the lease, right of pre-emption at Rs. 10 per acre to be allowed to the lessee.
- 5. No timber above 2 ft. in circumference to be felled, and any valuable timber under that size felled to be paid for at Government rates.

6. Aloes only to be cultivated on the land leased.

7. The land to be forfeited to, and vest in, the Crown, if at any time such land on any building thereon be applied, without the written consent of the Governor, to other purposes than those specified in the grant or lease, or if within a reasonable time the necessary steps have not been taken to apply the land to the purposes for which it was granted.

8. No permanent buildings to be erected on the land without the written consent of the

Government Agent.

Order in Council.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 10th day of August, 1903.

Present:

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that when any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon has either before or after the passing of that Act been erected or placed on or near the coasts of any British Possession by or with the consent of the Legislature of that possession, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such dues (in that Act referred to as Colonial Light dues) to be paid in respect of that lighthouse, buoy, or beacon by the owner or master of every ship which passes the same and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable, and may by like Order increase, diminish, or repeal such dues, and those dues shall from the time mentioned in the

Order be leviable throughout His Majesty's dominions, and further that colonial light dues shall not be levied in any British Possession unless the Legislature of that possession has by address to the Crown or by Act or Ordinance duly passed, signified its opinion that the dues ought to be levied:

And whereas the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and the Minicoy Lighthouse are lighthouses which have been duly erected under and pursuant to the said section:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated respectively the 22nd day of May, 1883, the 9th day of May, 1892, and the 29th day of June, 1896, His Majesty duly fixed the dues leviable in respect of the said lighthouses for the classes of ships therein respectively mentioned:

And whereas under section 10 of the Public Works Loans Act, 1881, and the Acts therein referred to certain loans became due to the Public Works Loan Commissioners in respect of the said lighthouses, and it was by the said section enacted that so long as that were the case the dues payable in respect of the said lighthouses should be altered only with the consent of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that all loans made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners for the purposes mentioned in the said Acts have been repaid, and that it is expedient that the amount of the said dues should be reduced in manner hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, is pleased to direct that from and after the First day of October, 1903, or from the time of the receipt of notice of this Order, if that be later, by the officers authorized to collect light dues, the dues thenceforth to be levied shall be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-sixteenths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-sixteenth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said lights respectively, and such dues shall be levied in lieu of the dues leviable under the said recited Orders in Council or any of them.

Tis hereby notified that an examination under the regulations of August 26, 1891, for gentlemen in the Civil Service, will be held in the Council Chamber on Monday, October 19, 1903, at 10.30 A.M., and following days, namely:—

The examination under the Minute of December 12, 1898, and the *vivá voce* examination in the native languages for officers in the Public Works Department and the Forest Department will be held at the same time and place.

Only the Police Magistrates who are not members of the Bar or of the Civil Service and those candidates who have been specially nominated by the Governor will be admitted to the examination under the Minute of December 12, 1898.

The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of March 26, 1900, for officers in the Fourth and Fifth Classes of the Civil Service will also be held on October 19, 1903, as well as at the Kandy Kachcheri.

It is also hereby notified that candidates will be given the option of using Codes in the examinations in the Criminal Procedure Code and the Penal Code; they must, however, state when sending in their names what their option is, as the character of the papers set for those who use Codes and those who do not will be different.

Candidates are required to send in their names not later than October 4, 1903.

Gentlemen in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking up Sinhalese or Tamil.
