WEST RIDGEWAY.

HEREAS by section 4 of the Ordinance No. 21 of 1900, His Excellency the Gewernor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make rules for the direction and guidance of Notaries, not being Advocates or Proctors:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, have made the rule appearing in the schedule hereto for the direction and guidance of Notaries, not being Advocates or Proctors, in the discharge of their notarial duties, and the said rule having been published in two successive issues of the Government Gazette in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil

Regulation under " The Poisons Ordinance, 1901," empowering the Police to enter and inspect Premises and Books.

It shall be lawful for any officer of Police, not below the rank of Inspector, Korala, Muhandiram, or Udaiyar, to enter upon any premises occupied by any person licensed to sell poisons under Ordinance No. 11 of 1901, in order that he may ascertain by inquiry and inspection whether the provisions of the Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder are duly observed, and for this purpose such Police Officers may inspect the register and prescription book.
