THE following rules framed by the District Committee of the Hambantota District, in terms of the 12th clause of Ordinance No. 3 of 1889 and 5th clause of Ordinance No. 17 of 1895, Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, are published for general information.

Rules framed by the District Committee of Hambantota in terms of the 12th Clause of Ordinance No. 3 of 1889 and 5th Clause of Ordinance No. 17 of 1895, Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance.

1. Two members of the District Committee shall form a quorum.
2. In the event of a vacancy, it shall be filled up in terms of the provisions of the Ordinance for the selection of District Committee Members. Such election, however, will not be valid till confirmed by the Provincial Committee.
3. The District Committee shall meet at the residence of the President in January and July on the days fixed by him.
Special meetings may be convened, when such are deemed necessary, at any place fixed by the President, and on notice given of the object of the meeting seven days beforehand.
4. Schools shall be established in temples selected by the District Committee for the education of the children in Sinhalese and Buddhism.
5. The incumbent of any such temple shall select for the school either a layman or ordained teacher, with the consent of the District Committee or of the trustee.
The necessary books shall be supplied by the District Committee.
6. When it is deemed necessary, the District Committee shall have the power to call on a trustee to tender security for a sum not exceeding Rs. 1,000 for the due performance of his duties; the trustee shall be bound to tender such security.
7. On occasions when a large collection is expected, it shall be lawful for the District Committee to appoint one or more watchers to take an account of the sums received by the trustee.
The trustees are bound to render them all information necessary for the due performance of the duties of the watchers. The District Committee Members shall be competent for this work.
8. It shall be the duty of the trustee to produce forthwith for examination and inspection, whenever he is called upon to do so by a District Committee Member, all moneys, books, and other movable property in his possession.
9. It shall be the duty of the trustees to forward to the District Committee Member every year before the 28th of February one-tenth of the annual income from the endowments of each temple, for carrying out the provisions of the Ordinance, and to obtain receipts.
The District Committee Member shall forward the sum to the President of the District Committee. The President shall remit the sum to the President of the Provincial Committee before the 31st March and obtain receipts.
10. A trustee shall obtain the sanction of the District Committee prior to constructing or incurring any expenditure in constructing any building on the temple premises or on temple lands in his charge. Any trustee committing a breach of this rule is liable to bear any expense he thus incurs.
11. The trustee shall be bound to forward to the District Committee before the 31st of January in each year a statement showing the works necessary to be done in the temple in his charge for the current year.

1. දිස්ත්‍රෙක්කොමිටියේ සමාජිකවරු දෙන්නෙක් රැස්උන විට වැඩකිරීමට සුදුසු සභාවක්වේ.

2. දිස්ත්‍රෙක්කොමිටියේ පුරප්පාඩුවක් සිදුඋනොත් අනිත් මැමබර්වරු විසින් එය සම්පුර්ණකිරීමට මුල් ආඥපණතේ තිබෙන නියෝගවලට එකතව ක්‍රියාකලියුතුය. එහෙත් එසේ ක්‍රියාකර තෝග් ගැනීම ප්‍රොවින්සියල් කොමිටිය විසින් ස්ඵරකරණතුරු වලංගු නැත.

3. දිස්ත්‍රෙක්කොමිටියේ ප්‍රධානතැන පදිංචිව සිටින ස්ථානයේදී ජනවාරි, ජූලි මාසවල මසු නියමකරණ දිනවලදී කොමිටිය රැස්වෙන්නට ඕනෑය. එහෙත් අතිරේක වශයෙන් යම් යම් කරුණු සඳහා මැමබර්වරු සම්මුඛවීම අවශ්‍යතාව ඕනෑකලොත් වෙන දවස්වලදී සහ අමුතු ස්ථානයන්හි දීත් කොමිටිය රැස්වෙන්නට පුළුවන. එසේ ඕනෑවෙන අමුතු රැස්වීම් යම් දවසකට සහ ස්ථානයකට ප්‍රධානතැන විසින් නියමකරණවා ඇද්ද ඒ වන සහ රැස්වීම කෙබඳු කරුනක් අරභයා උවචනාවන්ගේ දැකී යන වගද යටත්පිරිසයෙන් හත්දවසකට මත්තෙන් අනිත් මැමබර්වරුන්ට ලියවිලිවලින් දන්වා යවන්නට ඕනෑය.

4. ඒ ඒ ගම්වල පදිංචි බුඩාගමිකාර ලමසින්ට සිංහල භාෂාව ලියන්නට කියන්නට සහ බුඩාගමන් ඉගැන්වීමට මෙම ආඥපණතට යටහත්වූ දිස්ත්‍රෙක්කොමිටිය සුදුසු කියා නියමකරණ විහාර ස්ථාන වලට පාඨශාලාව බැගින් පැවැත්විය යුතුයි.

5. ඒ ඒ පාඨශාලාවල ප්‍රධානතිය දරණ සංඝයාවහන්සේ විසින් ඊට සෑහෙන ග්‍රහස්ථ හෝ ග්‍රමන ගුරුකෙනෙක් දිස්ත්‍රෙක්කොමිටියේ නොහොත් භාරකාරයාගේ කැමැත්ත ඇතුව පත්කල යුතුය. එකී ලමසින්ගේ ප්‍රයෝජනයට ඕනෑකරණ පොත් දිස්ත්‍රෙක් කොමිටිය විසින් සම්පාදනයකර දෙන්නට ඕනෑය.
