The Bombay Government has given notice (No. 55 of 1903) of a derelict being in 15 fathoms, Mangalore flagstaff bearing east by south on June 5, 1903, constituting a danger to navigation.

India, West—Malabar Coast—Cochin Light—Character altered.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 170 of 1901, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given

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notice (No. 425 of 1903) that on January 1, 1902, the white fixed light at Cochin was replaced by a white group occulting light, showing groups of four occultations every minute, thus: light, 22½ seconds, eclipse, 4½ seconds; light, 6½ seconds, eclipse, 4½ seconds; light, 6½ seconds, eclipse, 4½ seconds; light, 6½ seconds, eclipse, 4½ seconds. It is elevated 37 ft. above high water, visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles from the bearing of N. 20° W., through north and east, to S. 11° E., and shown from a column 34 ft. high. The light is dioptric with a light power of 1,250 candles.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 53, dated March 4, 1901, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 432 of 1903) of the existence of a shoal with a depth over it of 24 ft. about eight-tenths of a cable to the southward of the line of the leading lights through the south channel to port Phillip. From it the red light on Portsea jetty bears S. 9° W., distant $11\frac{3}{4}$ cables, and Observatory Point flagstaff, S. 71° W.

Approximate position: lat. 38° 18 $\frac{1}{4}$ ' S., long. 144° 43 $\frac{1}{4}$ ' E.

Caution.—Vessels of large draught are, therefore, advised to keep the leading lights slightly open to the northward when between No. 1 and No. 3 buoys.

Pacific Ocean, South—Phoenix Islands—Position of Reef to the Southward.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 102, dated May 19, 1899, issued by this office, in which the Master of the Carondelet reported the existence of a dangerous

reef about sixty miles to the southward of the Phoenix islands; the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 434 of 1903) that the Captain of the R.M.S. Aorangi passed within four miles of this reef, which was marked by breakers in the shape of a horse-shoe, extending about three-quarters of a mile in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction. Excellent observations were obtained, which placed the reef in lat. 5° 33' 15" S., long. 173° 49' 45" W., or about ten miles to the eastward of the position shown on the chart. This position has been adopted for the Admiralty charts, and the name Carondelet reef affixed to the reef in place of E.D.

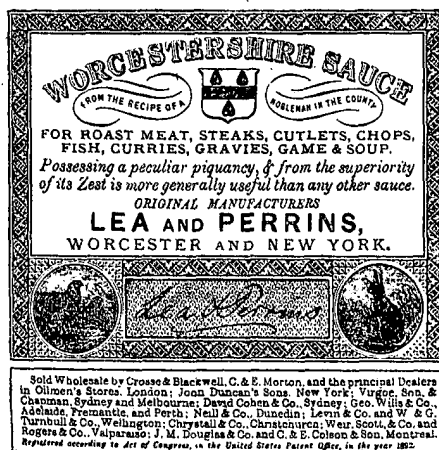

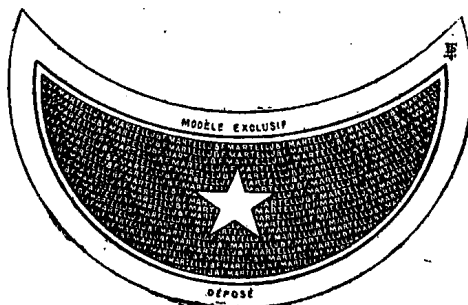

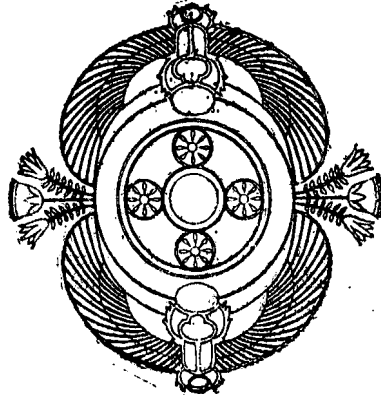
