China Sea-Palawan, East Coast-Port Princesa (Royalist)-Light re-established.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 109, dated March 28, 1903, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 671 of 1903) that the white fixed light, visible from a distance of five miles, has been re-established in the former lighthouse on

Saboruco or Tide pole point, Port Royalist.

Pacific Ocean—The Philippine Islands—Bohol, Northwest Coast-Tubigon Point-Reef to the North-westward

Arabia, North-east-Persian Gulf-Shat-al-Arab-Buoy marking South-east of Abadan Bank.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 301, dated October 14, 1902, issued by this office, the Bombay Government has given further notice (No. 84 of 1903) that information dated 29th August has been received from the Agents, British India Steam Navigation Company, Limited, that the Master of ss. Kola reports having placed a large conical iron busy painted red and white vertically in place of the red cask buoy with staff and ball at the entrance, which latter had disappeared.

This buoy marks the south-east of Abadan bank, and is moored in 11 ft. L. W. S., and bears N. 48° W. from outer buoy, distant three miles, and S. 41° E. from No. 1 can buoy, on the Abdulla bank, distant 24 miles.

The buoy is now a little inside of the eastern edge of

the deepest part of the channel and is visible 7 miles.

The north-west end of Abadan bank is washed away.

No. 1 buoy is now a large can buoy.
