MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, April 3, 1903.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 28, 1903.

Present:—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel; Dr. Allan Perry; Mr. F. C. Allen; Mr. L. Creasy; Mr. G. H. Alston; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. H. A. Jayawardene; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; and Dr. W. H. de Silva.

The Minutes of March 13, 20, and 27, 1903, having been printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

The Chairman moved—That the Minutes of March 13, 20, and 27, 1903, be confirmed. Dr. C. W. van Geyzel seconded.—Carried.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—In reference to a letter from Dr. Nicholas, late Acting Sanitary Officer, appearing in the Ceylon Independent of March 21, 1903, whether, when medical practitioners report cases of infectious diseases as required by the regulations, the present Sanitary Officer or Assistant Sanitary Officer makes personal inspection in each case, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that the Sanitary Officer reports that it is not practicable, nor is it the custom anywhere to visit every case of infectious disease reported by medical practitioners.

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2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-Whether for lighting all the electric arc lamps in the Fort the current used is that generated at the Galle Buck electric station or that at the central station at Gasworks street, and

moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that he is informed that the various underground mains supplying the Fort arc lights are fed from the arc lighting switchboard at Galle Buck station. In its turn the switchboard is fed partly from generators also situated in Galle Buck and partly from generators situated at the generating station in Gasworks street.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-What action has been taken in regard to the Board of Trade Regulations submitted by the Electrical Adviser about the year 1898, and which was printed and circulated among the Members of this Council, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that the Electrical Adviser to the Council reports that he has practically included all these

regulations under the regulations for laying electric mains.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—Whether the copy of the Board of Trade Regulations for the Tramways, which the Electrical Adviser promised by his letter No. 804 of September 10, 1902, to submit for the consideration of this Council at its Meeting in October last, was duly forwarded by him, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that proofs had been furnished to the Electrical Adviser, but that the final proof had not

yet been returned by him.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—Why the old gas lamps opposite Baptist Chapel and George Wall Fountain were not removed therefrom and erected near the Maradana Railway Terminus, in terms of the resolution of the Standing Committee of July 18, 1902.

The Chairman replied that the matter had been delayed owing to an oversight and will receive early attention.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That the Chairman do, in terms of section 7 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1901, prepare an edition of such of the by-laws of this Council as were in force on January 31, 1903, and forward a printed copy of the same to the Clerk of the Legislative Council, as the copy already forwarded was not a correct one, and that copies of such by-laws be circulated among the Members of Council and kept at the Municipal Office available for sale to the public at cost price, in terms of section 126 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

- (2) That penalties not exceeding Rs. 20 a day be attached to continued breaches of the following sections of the same Ordinance: 171, 175, 177 (a), 183, 193, 201 (2), 206, 207, 210, 212 (3), 243, and 244.

Provided always that, where the Ordinance gives a right to compensation for any action the Council may take, the penalty be not inflicted until the compensation has been ascertained.



Clerical Staff, Public Health Department.

SIR,—As directed I have the honour to submit a statement of the requirements as regards the permanent clerical staff in this Department. As regards the accurate definition of the duties to be assigned to each, I would refer you to my remark in letter No. 12 of February 8, 1903, on the question of proposed Clerical Staff, viz., that until the staff is available this cannot be done with accuracy. The temporary staff has not so far been available owing to the difficulty of getting suitable men to take up a temporary billet. A good clerk will not leave his employment for a temporary billet without some assurance of its being permanent, in the event of his proving satisfactory. And I am now informed that Mr. Solomonsz, who appeared to be a suitable man for the post of head clerk, and was mentioned by Secretary as available, cannot be spared. I therefore ask that the posts of head and second clerk be filled by advertisement, and that the salaries attached to the various posts be as under:—

I.—Head clerk at Rs. 1,000. II.—Second clerk at Rs. 660.

III. Third clerk (correspondence) at Rs. 540 VI.—Fourth clerk (registering) at Rs. 450.

This gives a total yearly expenditure in the clerical staff of Rs. 2,650.

As regards the duties, I would refer you to the statement of duties in letter No. 12 annexed.

Proposed Clerical Staff.

SIR,—In accordance with your instructions of February 4, 1903, to submit proposal for a temporary arrangement in regard to the clerical staff in the Public Health Department, I have the honour to submit the following provisional list of staff required with salaries. The duties cannot at present be fully detailed, as some time will be required after the staff is available in which to decide as to the accurate disposition of the work. I cannot say how long this proposed staff will be able to cope with the work, but at present the following is the minimum required for carrying on the work of the Department:—

Head clerk at Rs. 1,000 per annum. Second clerk at Rs. 660 per annum. Third clerk at Rs. 480 per annum. Fourth clerk at Rs. 360 per annum.

A provisional list of the duties of each is annexed.

Suggestions re filling these posts are annexed. The above I have called proposed staff No. (1). The one I have recommended I have called proposed staff No. (2).

Duties of Clerical Staff.

1. Head Clerk.—General supervision over all the clerical staff of the Department.

Responsible for the general discipline and observance of rules by all officers and servants in office staff, and compliance with resolutions of Council and Standing Committees.

To report to, and receive all instructions from, the Medical Officer of Health, and to see to complete and punctual obedience.

To attend to arranging, annexing, &c., of all papers dealt with by the Medical Officer of Health.

To take special charge of all papers re infectious disease.

To arrange and submit all information required by the Medical Officer of Health for purposes of reports, vital statistics, &c.

To supply all information required by the other officers of the department which it it is by rule or custom there right to have.

To be responsible for the proper protection of information from publication.

ANNEXURE.

To be directly in charge of Nos. 3 and 4.

To attend to correspondence No. 3.

Second Clerk.—'To attend to all papers on the ordinary routine work, such as Inspectors' daily reports and papers on the same, &c., connecting up papers, seeing that the reports are correctly numbered and entered, &c.

Third Clerk (Correspondence Clerk).—To act directly under the head clerk as his assistant. It would be of great advantage if he understood typewriting.

Fourth Clerk (Registering Clerk).—To be directly in charge of head clerk.

To do all registering, not only ordinary papers, but registration of laundries, bakeries, bairies, &c.

As regards the part of the clerical staff employed in the night soil conservancy office, I cannot at present state the requirements, but shall, as soon as the press of work allows, go into the question and submit a proposal should any re-arrangement be found necessary.

Staff available.

- 1. On going over the list of clerks now under the Council I find one man at the salary required for the head clerk, whom you mentioned was available, viz., Mr. A. C. Solomonsz. I suggest he should be given a trial.
- 2. There is no clerk on the list at the required salary who is suitable to fill the post of second clerk. I suggest that steps be taken to fill this post by advertising.
- 3. Mr. G. A. Amarasinghe is scheduled as drawing the required salary for the post of third clerk, but he is, as a matter of fact, actually drawing Rs. 540, i.e., Rs. 120 more.
- 4. Mr. M. de Fonseka is scheduled as drawing the required salary of Rs. 360, but he is, as a matter of fact, actually drawing Rs. 450, i.e., Rs. 90 more.

I have no post for men drawing the salaries which Nos. 3 and 4 are actually drawing. So some re-arrangement of the existing salaries should have to be made if the services of these men are to be retained. They should either be placed on the salaries I mention or other clerks employed, or they should be paid what they are at present actually drawing, which latter would raise the cost of the clerical staff by Rs. 210 per annum above what I suggest in the first instance.

I think it would be highly inadvisable, however, to do so at the expense of the higher clerks. It is very essential, I think, that the higher clerks should be paid in accordance with the responsibility of their position. Thus more efficient work is ensured by securing men of a stamp and position which gets them for that position.

It will be seen that I have made no provision for the employment in this department of Mr. F. S. de Fonseka, the present head clerk, who is on leave. I regret to say he is quite unfitted for the position which he at present holds. He has only been a very short time in this office, but in that time he has got the work into an almost hopeless state of confusion. I have therefore to request that he may be removed from amongst the clerical staff in the Public Health Department.

He has made errors for which I could not excuse the youngest registering clerk.

The proposed staff on salaries based on those at present drawn by Nos. 3 & 4 means an annual increase of Rs. 2,650 — Rs. 1,710=Rs. 940.

The latter does not necessitate the reduction of salaries of Nos. 3 & 4 from what they are at present actually drawing, and I beg to recommend it.

Metal Quarries.

SIR, -WITH reference to the Special Committee's report of September 18, 1902, I have the honour to inform you that-

(1) The land owned by Mr. John Perera is unsuited to quarry, as the rock is below water level, and work would be seriously interrupted during wet weather.

Further, the quarry would have to be a pit, and this form is unsuited to convenient and economical working. (2) The land near Elie House. I made a suggestion with regard to this land. I do not consider that it is anything like as convenient as Hill House. There are a large number of residents near, and much land would have to be acquired and cleared.

(3) Yakbedda has no very evident quantity of rock, and such as there is close down on the wet fields liable to It is reached by a long road with very bad gradients, in a bad state of repair, and I consider that this suggestion floods.

is in no way promising of any useful result.

(4) Pamankada. Here, there are a large number of quarries, all in full work, and I do not think that any good will come in the Council entering into direct competition for the available rock lands.

The output from the quarries is already very large, and it is not from this direction that any difficulty in outside

supply can arise.

The question of providing a quarry must be taken up and settled early. Although there are three contractors we cannot get the quantity of stone we require, and questions of quality and size, although of great importance, have to

be overlooked to a great extent in the effort to obtain quantity.

The Council is in a very difficult position, and must become liable to very heavy increased expenditure on maintenance, unless a quarry is provided from which a large proportion of the metal may be obtained, and if necessary

the whole quantity.

The present position is that there is no other source of supply than from contractors, and they will be in a

position to ask any rates they choose, as stone must be acquired.

The Hill House quarry is the only one which in any way offers reasonable prospects of convenient working. The Resident Engineer, Drainage Works, is anxious to obtain a quarry for his work, and intends to ask Government for Hill House for a quarry. If this is opened up as a quarry, then it would be just as simple for the Council to work it, and let the Resident Engineer, Drainage Works, take the comparatively small quantity he will ordinarily require.

The original scheme should be carried through, although it will be quite sufficient to take up the reduced scheme

in the first instance.

My work in all directions is seriously delayed and inconvenienced, besides the cost being largely increased with

prospect of still further increase, unless the Council is in a position to control the rates.

The Hill House scheme has been thoroughly investigated, and in recommending it I am supported by the opinions of the Resident Engineer, Colombo Harbour Works, and the Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works.

METAL CONTRACTS.

Superintendent of Works' Letter No. 192 of March 12, 1903.

SUPERINTENDENT OF WORKS states that it is absolutely necessary to get the metal asked for, and that it cannot be delayed, as he is short in his quantities. Authority is given, and the matter will be brought before the Works Standing Committee. I am informed by Superintendent of Works that hitherto the orders for metal have not specified the quantity to be delivered daily. That is a loophole which the contractors will undoubtedly take advantage of. All orders in future should state the quantity required to be delivered daily, and should specify, as far as possible, the places of delivery, in accordance with the contract.

Metal Contracts.

No. 192 R.

March 12, 1903.

SIR, -I HAVE the honour, in continuation of my letter No. 187 of 9th instant, to inform you that my further investigation of the subject of metal supply causes me great anxiety, and some vigorous steps must be at once taken to adequately meet the position.

The state of affairs up to the end of February was :-

The quantity of metal required on estimates is over 10,000 cubes for the year. So that 9,435 cubes have now to be delivered in ten months, or rather during 261 working days, which means that the deliveries must be 12 cubes per day by each contractor with the utmost regularity.

Wet weather will interfere with this, and therefore the full contract quantity must be rigidly enforced until we

have got in advance of the average rate of working.

Each of the contractors has failed in his contract, and steps must be taken under clauses V. and VI. of the

contracts to make good deficiencies, and that at once.

I have by reason to think that Muttu Carupen will fail utterly if he is pressed, and this will be a result I have anticipated for years and have tried to circumvent, but circumstances now are such that I dare not ask for any special consideration in his behalf.

It is necessary that a supply of stone should be at once obtained, and the only adequate source is from Mahara. The Resident Engineer, Colombo Harbour Works, will arrange for the delivery of 5,000 tons of rubble at the Racquet court and elsewhere, and the cost of the metal delivered on the roads will come to about Rs. 20 per cube. This quantity will be only about $\frac{1}{10}$ of the whole supply, whilst we have to face the possible loss of $\frac{1}{3}$ of the contract quantity by the failure of one contractor. In such an event, even if the other two contractors deliver the whole of their 15 cubes per day for the rest of the year, which is most improbable, there will still be a furthur balance of 2,000 cubes (or twice the quantity of stone I now ask authority to obtain from some other source) to be purchased on each 1,000 cubes obtained through the Harbour Works. The Council will lose about Rs. 9,000.

The position is one of great difficulty and urgency, and in view of the present state of the roads (which is very bad even in this fine weather, and there is no knowing what they may be like with the rains), I ask that authority may be given me as soon as possible. The arrangements for delivery will occupy at least one week, and the whole delivery

will take about two months to complete.

The breaking and transport of this metal will therefore not be, under the most favourable condition, complete before three months from the date of order, and consequently the roads will not benefit for that period. Thus we shall be close upon the middle of the year.

It may be desirable to decide upon a further delivery before this first proposed one is complete, and this must

depend upon the way the contractors comply with their contract.

With this metal I propose to make good the short deliveries under the contracts, and to recover the difference of cost as provided in the contracts. This is I think the only possible manner in which to force the contractors into a proper compliance with their undertakings.

ANNEXURE.

- 198. 1. Every person intending to erect or re-erect any building shall apply in writing to the Chairman for permission to erect or re-erect. The application shall contain an address to which replies may be posted, and shall be accompanied by full plans and specifications of the intended building. The plans shall include, if so required by the
 - (a) A fully dimensioned block plan drawn to scale of 1 chain to 1 inch showing -

- (1) The site of the intended building;
 (2) The entire extent of the premises on which it is intended to build, and also all buildings standing thereon;
- (3) All buildings in the adjoining premises within 20 ft. of any part of the site of the intended
- building;
 (4) All public streets, roads, lanes, or passages within 200 ft. of any part of the premises on which it is intended to build; and
- (5) The distances of the said buildings, streets, roads, lanes, or passages from the intended building.
- (b) Such fully and clearly dimensioned plans, elevations, and sections to a scale not smaller than one-eighth inch to a foot, as are necessary to describe fully the construction of the intended building and its appearance when finished, and as are necessary to show, among other things, all doors, windows, ventilating arrangements, drains and levels of lowest floor and foundations with respect to the surrounding ground, and with respect to the nearest public streets, roads, lanes, or passages.
- (c) A specification indicating the nature of the work and the materials to be employed in the construction of the intended building.
- 2. Within twenty-one days (exclusive of Sundays and Public Holidays) from the date of the receipt of the said application and plans by the Chairman, it shall be lawful for the Chairman by notice in writing, which notice may be served on the said person or posted to the said address, to require the said person to make any amendments, alterations, and additions to the said plans and specifications as to the Chairman may appear necessary, and it shall be the duty of the said person to make such amendments, alterations, and additions, and to furnish the Chairman with plans and specifications amended, altered, or added to in accordance with the said notice.

- 3. When the plans and specifications referred to in the preceding sub-sections hereof have been duly furnished to the Chairman, it shall be lawful for the Chairman, and the Chairman may in writing signed by him within twenty-one days (exclusive of Sundays and Public Holidays) from the date when such plans and specifications or such altered plans and specifications, as the case may be, shall have been furnished, to make order either-
 - (1) Prohibiting the erection or re-erection of the intended building, if it be deemed in the opinion of the Chairman likely to be injurious to the inhabitants of or property in the neighbourhood or to any

(2) Permitting the erection or re-erection of the intended building, subject to such written directions as he may think fit to give in respect of all or any of the matters following, viz. :-

(a) Space to be left about the building to secure free circulation of air and to facilitate scavenging.

Ventilation and drainage.

(c) Security against fire and, in case of places of public resort or entertainment including places for religious worship, the means of egress in the event of fire or accident.

Level and width of foundation level of lowest floor and stability of the structure.

(e) Line of frontage with neighbouring building if the intended building abuts on or is within 30 ft. a public street, road, lane, or passage.

(f) Front elevation where the building is one of a row of contiguous buildings abutting on or within

30 ft. of a public street, road, lane, or passage.

Setting back of the intended building for the improvement of the street, road, lane, or passage. (h) Nature and quality of the materials to be used, and the class of work to be adopted in building.

Such written permission and directions shall be served on the applicant or be posted to his said address. Until such written permission is granted and otherwise than in accordance with such directions as aforesaid, and until the expiration of the notice hereinafter mentioned, it shall not be lawful for any person to erect or re-creet

or to begin to erect or re-erect any building; provided, however, that if the Chairman shall not have notified to any applicant that the plans and specifications furnished by him require amending, altering, or adding to within twenty-one days (exclusive of Sundays and Public Holidays) from the date of the receipt of the same, it shall be presumed that such plans and specifications have been approved by the Chairman.

Provided further, that the Chairman shall make full compensation for any damage the owner of the premises intended to be built upon may sustain in consequence of the unconditional prohibition of the erection or re-erection of any building, and in the event of any dispute arising touching the amount of compensation the same shall be ascertained in the manner hereinafter provided.

- 4. It shall not be lawful for any person to commence or work upon any building, to erect or re-erect which permission shall have been granted as aforesaid, or, in the case of any such building the progress whereof has been suspended for a period of or exceeding three months, to resume work, until four days' written notice of the intention to commence or resume the same has been given to the Chairman at his office by the person by or for whom such work is intended to be commenced or resumed.
- 5. The intended building shall be commenced within six months of the date when the permission of the Chairman as aforesaid shall have been notified to the applicant, otherwise the said permission shall be deemed to be void.
- For the purposes of this and the following section the expression "erect or re-erect any building" shall include the construction, reconstruction, or alteration of any building or part of a building which involves the use of new foundations, or increased or altered super-construction on existing foundations, or the conversion into a dwellinghouse of any building not originally constructed for human habitation, or the conversion into more than one dwellinghouse of a building originally constructed as one dwelling-house only, or of one room of a building into more than one room by means of screens, walls, or partitions of any kind, or the conversion of two or more dwelling-houses or rooms into one dwelling-house or room.

199. Any person who shall erect or re-erect or begin to erect or re-erect any building-

Without the written permission of the Chairman previously obtained as hereinbefore provided; or

Without giving the notice referred to in sub-section (4) of the preceding section; or

(3) In contravention of written directions given by the Chairman under the provisions of sub-section (3) of the preceding section, unless specially authorized by the Chairman in writing to deviate in any particular from the plans and specifications and directions in the preceding section referred to-

shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for each offence, and to a further fine not exceeding Rs. 10 for every day during which the building is kept standing after conviction. It shall be lawful for the Chairman further to take down such building at the expense of the offender and to sell the materials thereof if he shall deem it fit so to do to defray such expense or to recover the same or any balance thereof from the offender.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, April 18, 1903, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated April 9, 1903.

Present:—Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.: P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.

- The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 21, 1903, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1902 to March 31, 1903, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of March, 1903.

Resolved -- That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during March, 1903.

Resolved-That a report be made as to what steps were taken to close cesspit on premises No. 16, Cemetery road.

- 4. Correspondence. -
- (a) Read memorandum dated March 27, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter No. 157 of March 27, 1903, to the Government Agent, authorizing the acquisition of land for purpose of obtaining access to the back of certain premises in Colombo street and Castle Hill street for removal of night soil.
- (b) Read letter No. 6, dated April 9, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, stating, in reply to the Chairman's application for the opinion of the Government Electrical Engineer as to a suitable instrument for testing the candle power of electric lamps, that it has been decided to await the arrival of the Government Electrical Adviser before taking action.
- Read memorandum dated April 7, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to Chairman's letter No. 20 of March 27, 1903, forwarding copy of memorandum by the Attorney-General, stating that there is no objection to the amendment of by-law No. 5 as suggested, making the fee payable on each dog registered Re. 1, and that there should be a separate certificate for each dog registered.

Resolved—That as suggested there be a c. rtificate issued for each dog registered.

(d) Read memorandum dated April 6, 1903, from the Government Agent, forwarding papers connected with an application by Mrs. Gibbon, President of the Young Women's Christian Association, applying for a site on a triangular plot of ground opposite the late post office, whereon to erect a hall for purposes of the Association and also a Tennis Court, if possible.

The papers had been referred to the Government Agent for the purpose of his ascertaining the views of the Council, in whom the land is vested.

The Chairman stated that he had suggested that the President of the Association should approach the Council on the subject, but no application had been received.

Resolved-That, in the meantime, the Provincial Engineer be asked to be good enough to inspect the site applied for and report whether it is suitable for building on.

5. The Chairman stated as the result of the inquiry held by the Special Committee into complaints made respecting the Chief Inspector, that in the opinion of himself and Mr. Sproule the evidence in support of the two charges framed is conclusive, and leaves no doubt that the Chief Inspector received gratifications.

The report had not been signed by Mr. Beven owing to his absence.

On proposal by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Jonklaas, it was resolved that the report with connected papers

6. Read letter dated March 9, 1903, from the Honorary Secretary of the Hewaheta Association, forwarding copy of a resolution adopted by the Association respecting the recovery of assessment tax at Ampitiya.

The resolution was also read.

. . . .

The Chairman pointed out that the letter was full of misstatements.

Resolved.—That the papers be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment,

7. Read recommendation by the Standing Committee (a) on Law and General Subjects:—"That a carriage stand for buggy carts, hackeries, &c., be provided in King street on the northern side, between Pavilion street and Trincomalee street."

Resolved-That the Private Secretary to His Excellency the Governor be written to, and asked if there is any objection to the proposal, as the site adjoins the boundary of the Pavilion premises.

- 8. Read recommendation of the Standing Committee (a) on Law and General subjects :-
 - (1) That the amount appearing against Mr. Weerasinha, late storekeeper, apparently due to waste covering a long period be written off.

 (2) That the unserviceable tools and stores be disposed of as suggested.

Resolved - That the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted, except that the tools and weights be thrown into the lake, and the remainder of things entered on the list be sold by public auction.

9. Read recommendation of the Standing Committee (c) on Finance and Assessment: -That the following fees be levied in respect of licenses instead of those now in force :-Rs.

0 30 Fee for license for tanneries O 20 Brick and lime kiln ... 10 Taxidermist 10 Timber depôt - • • Straw depôt ••• ••• Manure depôt 2 50 Tea shooks 10 0 Inflammable oil ...

Proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Mr. Sproule, that the revised scale of fees be adopted, to come into force from date of expiration of the present licenses, with the exception license for timber depôt and tea shooks, which are to be levied from May, 1903.

The motion was carried. Mr. Habeeboo Lebbe dissenting as regards the fee for kerosine oil licenses.

10. In accordance with notice, Mr. Sproule asked—Whether the assessment tax on Primrose Hill estate has been reconsidered, with a view to the reduction thereof, on basis of the facts supplied by Mr. Arthur Sinclair of Bogawantalawa to the Chairman, and moved for papers.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Habeeboo Lebbe.

Reply.—The objection with others has been referred to the Special Sub-Committee appointed to inquire and report on all objections to assessment, but the Special Sub-Committee has not yet made its report; papers submitted. With approval of the seconder, and with consent of Council, the motion was withdrawn.

11. In pursuance of notice, Mr. Sproule asked - What has been done to improve the condition of the side drain opposite to the houses bearing assessment Nos. 136, 137, 138, 139, and 140, Peradenica road, and moved for papers.

Reply. - Nothing has been done. Many drains in town require prior attention as soon as funds are available. There is no special hardship in this case, as the houses were built after the present drain was constructed and without proper foundations.

Papers including reply dated December 16, 1901, from the Provincial Engineer, on the subject, submitted.

With approval of the seconder, and consent of the Council, the motion was withdrawn.

12. In accordance with notice, Mr. Jonklass asked - If any inquiry had been made into the alleged misconduct of the market-keeper and his assistant, and moved for papers.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Vanderwall. The Chairman submitted explanation by the market-keeper

and his assistant with other papers on the subject.

It was proposed by Mr. Habeeboo Lebbe, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall—That the privilege to collect on Fridays and Mondays the rents for all spaces inside and outside the market for a period of three months commencing from May 1, 1903, at the rates fixed by the Council, be put up to public competition.

The explanations were accepted.

13. It was resolved that applications be called for the post of Scavenging Inspector (night soil) at rate of Rs. 30 per month; that applications be referred to the Chairman and Health Officer.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of March, 1903.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town has been fairly well carried out during this month. Reported to the Secretary in the early part of the month (March 4) the ill scavenged condition of the lower part of Colombo

Drains.—Repairs to the drains in Colombo street are in progress. This was one of the worst in the town. The rest of the drains in the Municipality remains much as they were. They are frequently flushed and kept as clean as possible.

Water Supply.—Very good (vide attached analysis).

Alleys.—Most of the alleys, particularly those in Brownrigg street and Colombo street, are in an insanitary state. The inhabitants will not use dry-earth or disinfectants in the latrines or flush their drains frequently enough. Laundries .- Generally well kept.

Dairies.—All in a sanitary state.

Bakeries.—All well kept. A few have been noticed to linewash more frequently.

Market.—Generally well kept. The different kind of food exposed for sale in it were good.

Cattle passed this Month.—Castle, 450; buffaloes, 82; sheep, 131; goats 232.

Slaughter House and Exposing Shed .- Well kept.

Cooly Lines.—Fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept.

Night Soil Depôt.—I have frequently inspected this depôt, both by night and day, and have found it well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General Health. - Good. A few cases of chickenpox and measles were reported and one case of smallpox at King's Hotel; this case was removed to the hospital. I myself, with the Chief and Ward Inspectors, thoroughly disinfected that part of the building the patient had lived in. There has been no fresh case.
