## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Kachcheri, Kandy, on Wednesday, May 27, 1903, at 4 o'clock p.m., in accordance with Notice dated May 23, 1903.

*Present* :—Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 18, 1903, were taken as read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1902 to April 30, 1903, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of April, 1903.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during April, 1903.

4. *Correspondence* :—

(a) Read letter No. 7 dated April 21, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to the Chairman's letter No. 21 of March 27, 1903, stating that in view of other more pressing claims on public funds, it is regretted that the request for an illuminated clock outside the Kandy railway station cannot be granted.

(b) Read memorandum dated April 29, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter to Dr. J. H. Ebell, intimating his nomination by His Excellency the Governor, as a Member of the Municipal Council *vice* Dr. J. Craib.

(c) Read memorandum dated April 29, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter of same date to the Director of Public Works, stating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the recommendation that the maintenance of approach roads to public buildings be taken over by his Department at once.

(d) Read memorandum No. 38, dated May 6, 1903, from the Government Agent, forwarding copy of letter to him from the Colonial Secretary, stating that the King's Bath and reservations on the Hilpankandura stream, Ampitiya, may be handed over to the charge of the Municipal Council, on condition the place is kept tidy and made accessible.

Resolved—That the charge of the King's Bath and reservation be accepted, and that provision be made in the estimates for its maintenance on conditions stated.

5. The Chairman, in submitting the report of the Special Committee appointed on January 17 "to inquire into sundry complaints made of irregular acts on part of several Inspectors," and which had been circulated in accordance with resolution of April 18 (5-18/4-03), stated that in the opinion of the Committee the two charges framed against the Chief Inspector (Mr. P. F. Toussaint) are conclusive, and leave no doubt that he received gratifications; other charges have not been inquired into, and he moved that the Chief Inspector be dismissed the service of the Council.

This was seconded by Mr. Gibbon.

Mr. Tomalin moved as an amendment—That the Chief Inspector Mr. P. F. Toussaint be given time up to May 30, 1903, within which to submit his resignation of the appointments held by him under the Municipal Council, failing the receipt of which he be dismissed.

The Chairman, with consent of the seconder, withdrew his motion, and on putting Mr. Tomalin's resolution to the Meeting declared it to be carried unanimously.

6. Rules and regulations under section 104 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902, drawn up by the Special Committee appointed on February 21 (Min. 7-21/2-03), and a copy of which had been furnished to each Member, were submitted, with addition of section 8a, General Subjects. (Appendix A.)

Proposed by Chairman, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the rules and regulations submitted be approved and adopted for guidance of Standing Committees.

On being put to the Meeting the Chairman declared the motion to have been unanimously adopted.

7. The Meeting proceeding to elect by ballot a Member of Standing Committee (b) Market and Sanitation, in place of Dr. Craib.

The Chairman, on scrutinizing the votes, declared Dr. J. H. Ebell to have been elected a Member of the Standing Committee on Market and Sanitation.

8. Read application dated January 29, 1903, from the Resident Engineer, Colombo Gas & Water Company, and subsequent correspondence, for permission to lay a 5-in. pipe from the lake to the electric power station, Bogambra, for the supply of water for a condenser. This will take the place of the present 3-inch pipe from the lake and a 1-in. pipe in connection with the mains.

Resolved, as proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Mr. Tomalin, that the application be granted on condition proposed by the Resident Engineer, that in the event of the level of the lake being at any time seriously reduced the supply be discontinued on receipt of notice from the Secretary, and that a hydrant be fixed by the Council near the market in connection with the pipe for drawing off of water during the day for filling Municipal water carts.

9. Considered recommendation of Standing Committee (d) Municipal Works, that a house service pipe for a private supply be allowed to premises 89, Brownrigg street, on application of Mr. C. B. Nugawela Diyawadana Nilame. Resolved—That the application be granted.

10. Read application by the Secretary for permission to purchase a rotary neostyle duplicator for office use. Resolved,—That permission be granted if it can be shown to Chairman that a saving of Rs. 50 can be effected in cost of printing during the year.

11. Considered application by the Secretary for temporary additional clerical aid in the office for three months owing to the great increase of work, of which a statement was read.

Resolved.—That the application be granted, arrangement being left to the Chairman.

12. Mr. Gibbon gave notice that at the next Meeting he would move, in view of the Chief Inspector's services being dispensed with, that there be no Chief Inspector in future, and that the Inspector appointed to carry out the inspection of outlying districts, such as Peradeniya and Katugastota, be allowed horse allowance when necessary, under authority of the Health Officer.

#### APPENDIX A.

*Rules framed under section 104 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, to regulate the proceedings of Standing Committees established under Ordinance No. 7 of 1902.*

1. The Meetings of the Standing Committees shall take place each month on the same day as that fixed for the General Meeting, either immediately before or immediately after the General Meeting as shall be determined by the Chairman, or on such day and hour as the Chairman shall deem necessary.

2. Any Standing Committee shall have power to appoint Special Sub-Committees of its Members for any special purposes.

3. Two Members, of whom the Chairman shall be one, shall form a quorum. In the absence of the Chairman three Members shall form a quorum.

4. The recommendations of every Standing Committee shall be submitted to the General Meeting for approval, except in such cases as are provided in the Ordinance for the Chairman to deal with.

5. The work of the several Standing Committees shall be limited to making inquiries and submitting recommendations to the General Meeting, except when otherwise provided for.

#### No. 1 or (a) Standing Committee on "Law and General Subjects."

##### *Law.*

1. To frame by-laws and consider objections and opinions of Law Officers of the Crown.
2. To amend, alter, or revoke any by-laws that may be necessary.
3. To advise as to the course to be adopted or steps to be taken in cases brought by or against the Municipal Council.
4. To advise in respect of the interpretation or construction of any section of any Ordinance or by-law.
5. To advise in respect of the liability or not of any person to the payment of any tax or rate.
6. To receive the monthly statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and the monthly statement of work done by the Municipal Magistrate.
7. To consider any question relating to compensation for damages.

##### *General Subjects.*

1. To consider any questions relating to the issue, withdrawal, or cancellation of any licenses or permits.
2. To consider any questions relating to rent of leased lands and encroachments.
3. The survey and disposal of unserviceable plants, tools, stores, &c.
4. To advise respecting stands for licensed passenger vehicles.
5. To receive the carriage Inspectors' monthly reports and to make order thereon.
6. To make rules and regulations and alter the same from time to time respecting the inspection of weights and measures and testing of same, and to receive the reports of the Inspector of Weights and Measures.
7. To consider and advise on applications for employment, the salary of which exceeds Rs. 160 per mensem.
8. To advise the Chairman in respect of the removal or dismissal of officers whose salary does not exceed Rs. 100 a month.
9. To sanction the employment by Chairman of other officers as may be required in case of any emergency on such salary as the Standing Committee shall deem fit.
10. To consider any question relating to the extinguishing of fire.
11. To consider and advise on any question arising, on any subject relating to the Town Hall, Municipal Office or stores requirements, such as, fittings, furniture, alterations, or the providing of further accommodation.

## No. 2 or (b) Standing Committee on "Markets and Sanitation."

*Markets.*

1. To determine matters respecting the appropriation of stalls and spaces, and the rent to be recovered therefrom.
2. To advise on letting of markets, purchase of lands for markets, and the closing of markets.
3. To consider complaints respecting misconduct of stalls or space holders and other persons occupying or frequenting the markets.
4. To advise respecting any improvements required to be carried out in the markets as regards stalls, lighting, &c.
5. To advise the Chairman respecting private markets and the suspension of licenses.
6. To advise as regards prohibition of sale or exposure for sale of any article in or upon any public streets.

*Sanitation.*

1. To receive and consider the Health Officer's monthly and special reports.
2. To inquire and report upon any recommendations or suggestions made, if practicable.
3. To determine upon and carry out any steps that may be necessary, or measures that may be adopted in case of any epidemic.
4. To advise on any matters respecting the scavenging of the streets and disposal of rubbish, the removal and disposal of night soil and conservancy of public and private latrines, and to determine the places for depositing the same.
5. To sanction the providing of houses for reception of persons suffering from any dangerous or infectious diseases to charge and levy fees and to make by-laws in respect of such houses.
6. To advise Chairman with regard to the providing and maintenance of a suitable carriage or carriages for the conveyance of persons suffering from infectious diseases.
7. To advise as regards provision of proper apparatus for disinfecting of clothing and bedding, &c.

## No. 3 or (c) Standing Committee on "Finance and Assessment."

*Finance.*

1. To receive the monthly statements of receipts and disbursements.
2. To consider the Auditor's reports.
3. To consider annual budgets and supplemental budgets.
4. To sanction expenditure not exceeding Rs.— of an urgent and pressing nature pending the sanction of Council.
5. To consider the necessity for reduction or increase of any amount of authorized expenditure, and recommend the transfer of moneys assigned under one head to another head.
6. To consider claims for lighting of streets, markets, &c.
7. To consider applications for pensions and gratuities.
8. To consider claims for payment of commission to collectors and remuneration for services rendered.
9. To advise on fees to be levied in respect of any licenses issued and fares recoverable in respect of vehicles, jinrickshas, &c., licensed to ply for hire.
10. To advise respecting the compounding with livery stable-keepers and others keeping carriages.

*Assessment.*

1. To receive the assessors' reports on assessment made of all premises within the Municipal limits, and to revise the same where necessary.
2. To consider and determine all objections to assessment.
3. To consider any questions as to liabilities of owners or occupiers of premises in respect of assessment tax or water-rate due.
4. To consider notices of action in respect of assessment of properties.
5. To consider questions regarding assessment of new and improved buildings, and to advise as to what buildings should be exempted from assessment tax under proviso of section 127 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

## No. 4 or (d) Standing Committee on "Municipal Works."

1. To receive the monthly report of progress of work done.
2. To advise on any contract for works.
3. To advise on applications for house service pipes.
4. To advise on all questions relating to water supply, including the maintenance and conservancy of lands acquired for purposes of preventing the contamination of water supplies of the town, namely, the Hermitage and Roseneath estates.
5. To consider questions relating to the conservancy of the lake, silt traps, and the streams flowing into the lake.
6. To advise on subjects relating to the execution of drainage works (public and private).
7. To consider and advise on any questions relating to the improvement of the town, its extensions, the providing of recreation grounds, and the improvement of alleys.
8. To advise with regard to erection of new huts, sheds, or buildings, and to refuse to grant permission.
9. To consider any questions respecting the improvement and maintenance of cemeteries and burial grounds, and the providing of further burial or cremation grounds.
10. To consider and advise on any questions on the extensions of water supply and lighting of the town.

### Health Officer's Report for the Month of April, 1903.

*Scavenging.*—The scavenging of the town has been fairly well carried out during the month.

*Drains.*—Much as they have been for years. I was very pleased to see that that one in Colombo street had been taken in hand, and the work there now is nearly completed; this is one of the most important drains in the town.

*Water Supply.*—Good.

*Alleys.*—The alleys remain in much the same condition as I have so often reported. The inhabitants will not use dry-earth in the latrines or flush the surface drains frequently enough.

*Laundries.*—Generally well kept.

*Dairies.*—Well kept.

*Bakeries.*—Well kept.

*Market.*—Well kept. All food stuffs exposed for sale were found good.

*Cattle passed this Month.*—Cattle, 460; buffaloes, 134; sheep, 132; goats, 232.

*Slaughter House and Exposing Shed.*—Well kept. The floor of the slaughter-house wants repairing; this has been reported, and is now being attended to.

*Cooly Lines.*—Fairly well kept.

*Boutiques.*—Well kept.

*Night Soil Depôt.*—Well kept.

*Latrines.*—Generally well kept, but not sufficient dry-earth used.

*General Health.*—Good. A few cases of measles and chickenpox and two cases of enteric fever have been reported. One case at 111, Malabar street, in its third week, and so impossible to remove it to hospital. Patient isolated under medical supervision and visited by the Ward Inspector daily. The second case occurred at Queen's Hotel, and was immediately removed to hospital. All precautions have been taken, the place was thoroughly disinfected, and the bedding burnt.

### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on June 20, 1903, at 2 p.m.

*Present:*—The Chairman; H. A. Grant, Esq.; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; N. Dias Abeysinha, Esq.; Dr. E. Ludovici; Magdon Ismail, Esq.; and F. Perera, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on 16th May last.

2. Referring to the resolution of Council passed at their last Meeting *re* rifle range for the Volunteers, Mr. C. P. Hayley asked for a reconsideration of the permission granted, as, in his opinion, the change made in the line of fire exposed the public to danger. After discussion of the question it was decided to appoint a Committee composed of the Chairman, Messrs. C. P. Hayley, H. A. Grant, and Dr. Ludovici to report on the matter.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Hayley asked—What steps the Municipality propose to take to repair the breach in the ramparts and to prevent its spreading or increasing?

The Chairman replied that he had reported to the Colonial Secretary the fall of a portion of the Star Bastion, and was informed that a copy of his letter had been forwarded to Military authorities, from whom nothing has as yet been heard. A fence has been put up to prevent people going near the breach. He (the Chairman) had no intention to take any further steps, as the Council is not responsible for the state of the ramparts.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Hayley moved—That the Railway authorities be requested to improve the level crossings in the Municipal limits.

Seconded by Dr. Ludovici.—Carried.

5. Submitted Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1902.

Moved by Dr. E. Ludovici, seconded by Mr. M. Ismail and carried, that the report be adopted.

6. Submitted letter from the Secretary, Galle Golf Club, applying for authority to put up a lean-to against the ramparts near the seat at the entrance to the Fort.

Resolved—That the Secretary, Golf Club, be asked to send in a plan of the proposed lean-to, showing also the site where it is to be erected.

7. Submitted petition from Kehelkaduwe Vitanage Lokuhamy praying for restoration of her license to a stall in the green market, which had been cancelled by the Chairman.

Resolved—That the matter be left for the decision of the Chairman.
