Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, June 12, 1903.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 6, 1903.

Present.—Mr. C. D. Vigors, Acting Chairman ; Mr. P. D. Khan ; Dr. C. W. van Geysel ; Dr. A. Perry ; Mr. F. C. Allen ; Mr. G. H. Alston ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. H. A. Jayawardene ; Dr. Solomon Fernando ; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen ; the Hon. Mr. Stanley Bois ; and Mr. H. Tiruvilingam.

The Minutes of May 1, 1903, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of May 1, 1903, be confirmed.

- Mr. C. Perera dissents on the ground that the salaries and duties should simultaneously be provided for by by-laws.
- (3) To appoint Mr. Barnard Electrical Inspector, under rule 51 of the electric lighting rules, and an Inspector under clause 21, schedule B, of Tramway By-laws.
The Committee recommend the appointments; that under clause 21 of the Tramway By-laws to be in place of the officer appointed by resolution of Council No. 16 of March 13, 1903.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations contained in the foregoing extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committees be adopted.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.

2. The Council next proceeded to ballot for the election of a Member for the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects in place of Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, resigned.

The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Mr. H. Tiruvilingam, who was accordingly elected as a member of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects.

3. The Council next proceeded to ballot for the election of a member of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment in place of Mr. F. C. Allen, resigned.

The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Mr. G. H. Alston, who was accordingly elected as a member of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment.

4. A report, dated May 19, 1903, of the Special Committee appointed on March 13, 1903, to re-consider section 3 of Ordinance No. 3 of 1897, and the regulations, part I., 22, framed thereunder, with a view to ensure in the future early and efficient notification of typhoid cases, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the report of the Special Committee be adopted, and that Government be asked also to make provision that every diseased person shall, on demand made by any "qualified Medical Officer" or "person professing to treat disease," give his full name and occupation and specify the full address of all places at which he has spent the nights during the fourteen days prior to such demand, and that in regulation 22 of the regulation dated December 16, 1901, under Ordinance 3 of 1897, the word "full" be inserted before "name."

Mr. G. H. Alston seconded.—Carried.

5. The report of the Special Committee appointed to consider the Chairman's Administration Report for 1902 was not ready.

6. A letter No. 62/03986 of May 20, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, regarding the amendment of the Municipal Councils' Ordinances in respect of assessment of buildings, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

7. A letter No. 63/09159 of May 26, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, regarding amendment of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 in respect of the qualification of voters, &c., was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

8. A letter No. 65/0771 of May 27, 1903, regarding the proposed amendment of sections 198 and 199 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

9. A letter No. 67/09175 of May 30, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the proposal that Mr. Richards, Second Assistant to the Government Printer, should supervise the work of the Municipal Printing Office, was laid before the Council,

The Chairman moved—That the Council regrets the decision of Government, and desires that the Chairman shall approach Government with a view to a re-consideration of the question. The Council believes that great attention has been paid to the organization of the Government Printing Office, and is most anxious to obtain advice from the staff of that office to enable it to secure similar efficiency in its own. The period for which the services are asked for should be three months.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

10. Papers regarding the report of the Electrical Adviser, Mr. Barnard, on the overhead wire question were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That all papers connected with the installation of the overhead high tension main to Galle Face Hotel, and the laying of the underground main in Kollupitiya, be referred to the Council's lawyers, and they be asked to report (1) what powers the Council has to secure the effective maintenance of the overhead high tension main to the Galle Face Hotel, or (2) to require its removal, or (3) to refuse the connection of the overhead with the underground main, and that a statement of the case be prepared by the Standing Committee No. 1 (Law and General).

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

11. To obtain authority of Council to require the production of the title deeds of premises Nos. 34/35, 2nd Division, Maradana.

12. To obtain authority of Council to require the production of the title deeds of premises No. 60, Prince street.

The Chairman moved—That the Secretary be authorized to require the production of the title deeds of premises Nos. 34/35, Second Division, Maradana, and of No. 60, Prince street, Pettah.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

13. The Chairman moved—That the vote taken for "Fees for analysis of food stuffs, &c." be altered to "Cost of samples and fees for analysis."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

14. Mr. H. A. Jayawardene moved—That Mr. W. B. de Saram, Inspector of Private Buildings, be transferred to the Secretary's Department as Revenue Officer on the same salary.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

15. Papers regarding pension of seconded officers were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the proposals of Government be adopted, and that the necessary alterations in the draft rules be made.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

16. Papers regarding flood outlets were laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That the matter be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, the Director of Public Works, the Surveyor-General, Mr. P. D. Khan, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. James Peiris, and Mr. H. A. Jayawardene—three to form a quorum.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

17. A letter No. 443 of May 22, 1903, from the Superintendent of Works, regarding increments to his clerks and overseers, was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That the proposed increments for all departments do begin from February 13, 1903.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.

18. A letter No. 59/7432 of May 14, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, sending an extract from a letter addressed to Mr. A. S. Barnard containing the conditions on which he is to do work for the Municipal Council, was laid on the table.

19. To cancel the sale of premises No. 72, Malignawatta, sold for arrears of assessment tax, and purchased for the Council, the arrears due having since been paid.

The Chairman moved—That the sale of premises No. 72, Malignawatta, sold for arrears of assessment tax, and purchased by the Council, be cancelled.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

20. Further remark of audit against query No. 6 on the accounts of January, 1902, regarding the expenses of drawing of the lease of the Grandpass market, was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That the payment of the half cost of the preparation of such leases and other documents as has already been made or may be made up to the end of 1903 be sanctioned.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

21. Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for October, 1902, were laid on the table.

22. Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from January 1 to April 30 and May 31, 1903, and Progress Report of Work done for the same period, were laid on the table.

23. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages and on shops used for the sale of kerosine, poisons, and gunpowder, were laid on the table.

24. An application for a meat stall at Jampettah street was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That leave be granted as a special case for a meat stall within the mile limit, subject in other respects to the usual requirements, provided that it be not granted for the house where stolen cattle were previously slaughtered.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Fire Brigade.

Inspector-General's Office,
Ceylon Police, Colombo, May 18, 1903.

SIR,—With reference to your letter No. 104 of May 5, 1903, forwarding a copy of a letter from Mr. Skelton on the subject of the fire brigade, I have the honour to inform you that I have been carefully through the file of papers on the subject, and visited the various stations now maintained.

2. I regret to say that I do not agree with Major Knollys' scheme, as to the staff he proposed to maintain and the manner in which the brigade is to be worked, and cannot recommend it to the Council.

3. From the notes Major Knollys has left on the subject it appears.....“The steam fire engine and possibly one of the Manuals now in the possession of the Municipality is to be kept at the Central Fire Station, with other appliances in possession of the Municipality, or to be obtained hereafter, such as escapes, ladders, &c. The other manuals now here to be either retained in their present houses or to be placed at police stations, as may seem most desirable, to be directed as stated below, and to be worked by volunteer or emergency labour. The hand pumps to be distributed among public buildings are to be kept at the Central Station. The staff to be as follows :—

“The Engineer and firemen to be enlisted in the police for discipline and such other duties as may be required of them. The Engineer to rank as a Sergeant-Major, the head fireman as a sergeant, and the firemen as 1st class constables. The driver and horsekeeper not to be enlisted.

“The four Inspectors, who receive Rs. 50 per annum each, are intended each to be in immediate charge of the fire appliances of a portion of the town, namely (1) Pettah and Fort, (2) Kotahena, (3) Maradana, (4) Kollupitiya, Cinnamon Gardens, and Slave Island.

“The sergeants and constables under them to keep the appliances in the small fire stations in order to be trained to fire duties, and to be exercised in turn with the steam fire engine. Their work in connection with the fire brigade is in addition to their own duties.”

4. From the above it will be seen that the whole of the fire brigade staff is to consist of men specially enlisted as Engineer and firemen, together with a certain number of officers and men of the present Police Force.

5. With all due deference to Major Knollys, I would point out that it is impossible for the police to efficiently look after the fire appliances, learn drills, practice with the steam fire engine, in addition to their own regular duties. To start with, (1) the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, has his hands full in doing his own work and looking after his men. He has the largest and the most important division of police in the Island. Moreover, the present

Superintendent (Mr. Byrde) is about to leave the Police; a new man will be put in charge of the division. It will take him some two or three years to get thoroughly in touch with his men and the working of the division, without time to devote to the fire brigade. (2) The second officer in charge is apparently to be one of the Assistant Superintendents of the Colombo Division. There are only two of these officers in Colombo; their hands are full, and moreover they are liable to transfer to the Provinces at any time. (3) The four Inspectors on Rs. 50 a year each. These Officers are in charge of the most important Divisions of the town; they are continually at work, and not only so, they are continually changing. They will not have time to look after the appliances placed under their charge, and I am quite sure they will not do it satisfactorily. (4) The four sergeants and twelve constables are to be detailed to look after the appliances under the above four Inspectors. They are to do this, learn fire drills, &c., in addition to their own duties as policemen. The sergeants and constables are fully worked as it is; each man does eight hours regularly, and frequently more. Besides this, he has to attend drills, orderly room, lectures, court, &c. Moreover the men are continually changing. This simply means that they will either neglect their police duties or those of the fire brigade.

6. I would therefore suggest that the fire brigade staff be an entirely separate body of men, and placed under its own Superintendent, to be styled Superintendent of Fire Brigade, this officer to be entirely responsible for the working and efficiency of the brigade to the Municipal Council. To make a start and to get the brigade in working order, I recommend that the following staff be engaged as soon as the Central Fire Station, now in course of construction, is completed:—

7. Of the three fire manuals now in possession of the Municipality, I would keep one at the Central Fire Station, one at its present station at Kotahena, and one at Kollupitiya; at Kotahena and Kollupitiya a staff of one overseer and four coolies to be maintained at each on their present rates of pay, the remainder of the overseers and coolies now employed to be discharged.

8. The Superintendent of Fire Brigade will then be able to keep his headquarter staff continually under his supervision, and teach them their work. The outstation manuals can be brought to the Central Station and worked there until all are efficient.

9. Besides this, I will, when the brigade is in working order, willingly send down a squad of constables and sergeants under an Inspector once a week to the Central Fire Station to be put through a course of fire drills, &c., and to be instructed in the duties of police at fires by the Superintendent. By this means we shall get a large body of police in time who will know and understand the working of the engines, manuals, &c.

10. As to the horsing of the steam fire engine, I am in favour of calling for tenders for the supply of two good horses to be constantly kept at the Central Fire Station; the contractor to undertake their grooming, food, &c., the Municipal Council merely keeping one good driver.

11. When we have started the brigade on a firm basis on a small scale we can see what developments are necessary, and what extra plant, gear, &c., is required, but I would not recommend any further expenditure until the Brigade is in thorough working order.

12. My scheme is a little more expensive than Major Knollys', but it will be more efficient and more satisfactory.

13. I have placed the salary of the Superintendent of Fire Brigade at Rs. 3,000 as I doubt being able to obtain an efficient officer on less. In addition to his duties as Superintendent of Fire Brigade, I think he might well be attached to the Works Department, as an additional Inspector of Private Buildings, and also in inspecting all hydrants, &c.

Fire Brigade.

The Municipal Office,
Colombo, May 1, 1903.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to report that the contract for the fire station building with the extension of time recommended will expire on July 1, 1903, and that even assuming that some delay may arise in the work, preventing the full use of the premises for a still further period, it is yet desirable that the preparations should now be made for the formation of the brigade.

2. As the Police Officers are not in a position to accept responsibility for the maintenance and working of the steam fire engine and plant, I would advise that the Works Department should become responsible for the maintenance of all the plant and buildings, and that the Engineer and any other member of the staff working under the Engineer shall be directly responsible to this department and be appointed by you upon my nomination.

3. The remainder of the staff should be selected by the Inspector-General of Police, who should have absolute control over the whole brigade and station for all purposes and discipline and fire work. The senior officer of the staff should be the chief fireman, and I would suggest that one officer should be, if possible, selected from the Water Department as turncock.

4. It is desirable, therefore, that you should communicate with the Inspector-General of Police and request him to take steps to give effect to the arrangements already decided upon and to invite him to advise the Council with regard to any further developments he may wish to recommend, either in men or appliances, for the perfecting of the brigade on the most efficient basis.

5. I have had an interview with Mr. Byrde, Superintendent of Police, Western Province, and write this letter so that arrangements may be thought out and appointments made with ample time for their proper consideration, and so that the Council may have time to consider and pass votes of funds necessary for salaries and working expenses.

6. The following comprise some of the points which will need to be considered :—

- (a) Further appliances.
- (b) Lighting of the station and call bells.
- (c) Telephonic communication with Police Stations and Maligakanda.
- (d) Inspection of and addition to hydrants and preparation of detailed plan showing the water mains, hydrants, and valves, and the method by which water delivery may be concentrated on any point within the town.
- (e) Horing of engine and fodder.

7. The buildings and appliances have been devised with the object of keeping down initial cost, and therefore many things have probably been left out that may be of material importance to efficient working.

8. I would suggest that the Inspector-General of Police be invited to consult with me whenever he may think that I can be of any assistance to him, both now and at any further time.
