"Improvements for increasing the selectivity of electrical circuits." Abstract :-

It is said that wireless telephony over long distances has been found impracticable up to the present time on account of the excessively small variations of the small amount of energy which reaches the antenna of the receiving station. The principal object of this invention is to magnify the received energy, and consequently its variations also, many thousand of times and thus greatly extend the distances over which wireless telephony can be practised. It is claimed however that the devices and apparatus forming the invention are of practical utility for other purposes than radio signalling.

The fundamental means for carrying out the invention is called in the Specification a "resistance compensator," which may consist, in one of its applications, of an induction motor which converts mechanical energy into electrical energy and is applied to produce a negative resistance reaction in the conductor or the antenna of a radio receiving circuit. Instead of an induction motor an electron discharge apparatus may be used as an electric valve releasing stored electrical energy to produce the negative resistance reaction. Means are provided also for introducing a time lag in the operation of the resistance compensator to increase selectivity with respect to certain electrical impulses of special character.

The claims are :-

1. An arrangement for compensating the energy losses in an electrical conductor of periodically varying electric waves, characterized by the fact that the conductor is placed in electromagnetic interaction with a resistance compensator comprising a source of energy which transfers electrical energy to the conductor by creating in the conductor a negative resistance reaction of high value as compared with the original resistance reaction in the conductor, so that the resulting

effective resistance of the conductor is reduced from any given high value to the desired low value. 2. An arrangement according to claim 1, in which the negative resistance reaction is produced by a negative resistance which is in itself selective with respect to frequency.

An arrangement according to claim 1, in which the resistance compensator has the form of an induction motor. 3. the inductance reaction of which is compensated for the selected frequency by a suitable capacity reaction.

4. The application of the arrangements of claims 1 and 2 or 3 to screening a radio receiving system or the like against the action of disturbing electromagnetic waves, characterized by the fact that there is introduced into the antenna or receiving conductor of the system to be screened a resistance sufficiently high to screen the system effectively, and overcoming the said resistance with respect to the signal by impressing upon the antenna or receiving conductor by means of a resistance compensator excited by waves of the frequency to be received a negative resistance reaction sufficiently large to compensate to any desirable limit the losses due to the dissipative resistance introduced into the antenna.

5. The application of the arrangement of claims 1, 2, or 3, to receiving selectively over the same conductor simul-taneously a plurality of waves of different frequencies, characterized by the fact that there are associated with the conductor a plurality of receiving circuits each actuating a separate translating device and each being tuned to one of the wave frequencies and containing a resistance compensator responsive to that wave frequency.

An arrangement according to claim 4, characterized by the fact that the resistance compensator consists of an electrical power source and means such as an electron discharge device for selectively transferring power from the source to the conductor.

7. An arrangement according to claims 4 and 6, characterized by the fact that the resistance compensator consists of a plurality of units connected in cascade, the exciting circuit of at least one of the units being tuned to render the system selective with respect to frequency.

8. An arrangement according to claims 1 to 7, in which the exciting circuit of the resistance compensator is connected across a condenser in series with the receiving conductor so that the direct effect of electrical impulses of short duration on the compensator is greatly reduced.

9. An arrangement according to claims 1 to 8, characterized by the fact that a shunt circuit is established across the compensator to magnify the negative resistance reaction introduced into the main conductor and to shield the compensator from the direct effect of electrical impulses.

10. An arrangement according to claim 4, in which the introduced resistance is distributed along the receiving conductor with substantial uniformity with respect to all wave lengths which are developed upon the loaded conductor by electromotive force of frequencies met with in radio transmission.

11. An arrangement according to claim 10, in which the evenly loaded receiving conductor is connected to the resistance compensator by a conductor of high resistance.

12. An arrangement according to claims 1 to 11, characterized by the fact that, for the purpose of screening the system against electrical waves of the selected frequency but of short duration, there is introduced between the receiving conductor and the resistance compensator a wave conductor having a predetermined inductance, capacity and resistance affording a substantial time interval of energy transmission over the wave conductor and tuned to electrical impulses of the selected frequency, whereby the positive resistance of the receiving conductor remains opposed to receive electrical disturbances of the selected frequency and of short duration, but is finally compensated for prolonged harmonic impulses of the selected frequency.

A process for the separation or partial separation of potash from crude minerals containing potash."

Abstract .-- The process consists in subjecting suitable crude minerals containing potash to the action of heat, with the object of driving off volatile constituents of the mineral, or burning combustible constituents of the mineral, and leaving a residue which will be mostly potash, if the crude mineral thus operated on is suitable. The examples quoted as suitable are limestone and coral.

A convenient method of working the process is to build a heap of alternate layers of fuel and mineral and to burn the fuel so as to keep the mineral at a red heat.

The Specification No. 1,509 by the same inventor is referred to.

The claim is :

In the manufacture of potash the process of burning crude minerals containing potash and so producing a residue containing potash substantially as described. No drawings.


