"Improvements in the manufacture of a substitute for horsehair."

Abstract :—Palm-leaf or other suitable vegetable fibres are treated to produce a substitute for horsehair for use for upholstery and other purposes. The treatment consists in washing and cleaning and then drying the fibres, after which they are teased and combed. Waves or corrugations are formed in the fibres by passing them between pairs of fluted heated rollers. The fibres are finally combed or teased to give them bulk and may be subjected finally to high pressure steam. The rollers are hollow and heated by gas-jets, hot irons, &c. The lower roller is fixed and the upper one is carried in vertically adjustable bearings.

The claims are :—

1. The described manufacture of a substitute for horsehair, such manufacture consisting in washing and drying suitable vegetable fibre (such as palm-leaf fibre), teasing and combing it, and passing it between pairs of revolving fluted, heated rollers, to give it waves or corrugations, and in then combing and teasing the fibre to give it bulk and treating (or not) with high pressure steam substantially as described.

2. Vegetable fibres treated substantially as described for forming a substitute for horsehair.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 17, 1917, at 8.30 a. m., in accordance with notice dated March 13, 1917.

Present: The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; E. L. Wijegoonewardene, Esq.; C. A. LaBrooy, Esq.; Dr. Allan de Saram; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.; V. M. Saravanamuttu, Esq.; J. C. Ratwatte, Esq.; and L. H. S. Pieris, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 17, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1916 to February 28, 1917, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for February.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for February.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during February.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 2 of February 24, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* the repayment of the total amount outstanding on account of the principal of the Waterworks Loan. Resolved—That Mr. Tomalin's report on the water supply be awaited before any further steps are taken.

(2) Letter No. 3 of February 24, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Katugastota, and land appertaining to it being handed over to the Municipal Council, Kandy.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 4 of March 2, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary asking for the usual statement of accounts for the Blue Book for 1916.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 3,157 of March 2, 1917, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, *re* the letting of the Empire Theatre to Theatrical Companies. Resolved—That a copy of the letter be sent to Mr. Warwick Major.

5. Papers *re* land adjoining Ward street and situated between Kandy Club and Planters' Association buildings. Resolved—That application be made to Government for the land to be vested in the Council.

6. Papers *re* the appointment of Mr. K. Abdue as Assistant to the Superintendent of Municipal Works.

On Mr. LaBrooy's motion the Council went into Committee.

Mr. Tomalin moved that Mr. Abdue be discontinued after a month's notice. Dr. de Saram seconded.

This was carried, Mr. Saravanamuttu being the only dissident.

The Council resumed, and the resolution passed in Committee was carried, Mr. Saravanamuttu dissenting.

7. Papers *re* the re-conveyance of land described in title plan Nos. 294,952, 294,953, and 294,954, acquired for the construction of the Lewella-Alutgantota road to Mr. E. G. Simpson.—Tabled.

8. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That sections 18 (b), (c), and (d) of the by-laws to regulate the use of mechanically propelled vehicles be made applicable to the Kandy Municipality.

(2) That the waste land No. 255, Katugastota road, belonging to the Municipal Council, be leased at Rs. 10 per annum for the erection of a Muhammadan Boys' School.

(3) That the Colombo Gas & Water Co. be asked to pay a quit rent of Re. 1 per annum for the premises occupied by them.

Finance and Assessment.

(4) That a Supplementary Vote of Rs. 500 be taken for the conservancy of the lake.

(5) That the Supervisor of Conservancy be given a supervision allowance of Re. 1.50 a day for three days for the special work during the Esala Perahera.

(6) That the salary of the Assistant Sinhalese Teacher, Municipal School, be increased from Rs. 240 to Rs. 276 per annum.

(7) That the following amounts expended in excess of votes for 1916 be sanctioned :—
