## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 28, 1917, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated April 24, 1917.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman ; Mr. E. Beven ; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene ; Mr. C. L. LaBrooy ; Dr. Allan de Saram ; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu ; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte ; and Mr. L. H. S. Pieris.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 17 having been previously submitted to the Chairman, for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1916 to March 31, 1917, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for March.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of March.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for March.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during March.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 6 of March 17, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary forwarding copy of report by the Inspector General of Police on the question of dealing with the vagrant nuisance and the cost of the same to this Council.

Mr. Pieris proposed that the report be referred back to the Members who formed the Special Committee appointed to deal with the matter for reply. Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.

(2) Letter No. 7 of March 27, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary inviting attention to his letter No. 1 of January 20, 1917, regarding the question of the water supply to the Peradeniya Gardens. Resolved—That a copy of Mr. Tomalin's report of April 25, 1917, on the subject be forwarded to Government.

(3) Letter No. 8 of April 4, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that instructions have been issued for widening the culvert near the second milepost on the Katugastota road. Resolved—That the letter be acknowledged with thanks.

(4) Letter No. 9 of April 19, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the by-laws *re* head lights for motor vehicles being varied so as to make them applicable to the Kandy Municipality as well.—Read.

(5) Endorsement No. 2 of March 13, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* water supply to insanitary areas. It was agreed that the Kandy Municipal Council have no objection to the proposed amendment, but the present supply of water or possible supply of water in the near future would not allow of action being generally taken under the proposed clause.

(6) Letter No. 800 of February 27, 1917, from the Chief Engineer of Telegraphs and Telephones applying for permission to erect two telephone posts, one opposite the Queen's Hotel and the other in Peradeniya road. Resolved—That the permission applied for be granted.

(7) Petition of March 31, 1917, from residents of Katukele Lake road praying for the removal of the public latrine at Katukele Lake road. Resolved—That petitioners be informed that their request for removal of the latrine cannot be granted, but that steps will be taken to improve the surroundings.

(8) Letter No. 800 of April 23, 1917, from the Surveyor-General *re* survey of road from Peradeniya bridge to Lewella ferry. Resolved—That the Council approve of the work being undertaken on the terms proposed by the Surveyor-General.

5. Pursuant notice Mr. Saravanamuttu moved—That all memorials, petitions, complaints, and communications addressed to the Council shall, in the first instance, be laid before the Council as provided in by-law No. 6 (c). Mr. LaBrooy seconded.

The Chairman suggested the substitution of the words "after circulation to the Members" for the words "in the first instance." This was agreed to, and the motion as amended was carried.

6. The following motions which stood in Mr. Saravanamuttu's name it was agreed, on Mr. Beven's suggestion, to refer to a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. Saravanamuttu, LaBrooy, Tomalin, and the Chairman for report :—

(1) "That all articles and stores of every description required by the Municipality be first received into the store and then issued by the Storekeeper to the party requiring the same, and that books be kept to show the number or quantity so received and issued."

(2) (a) "That steps be taken to number all coolies, labourers, workmen, and others employed by the Council, and whose wages shall be calculated at a daily rate, by the introduction of a disc system, such as is in vogue in certain departments under Government."

(b) "That the payment of wages to the aforesaid coolies and others be made by the Shroff under the supervision of the Accountant."

(c) "That some responsible officer, who is not connected with the department employing the labour, be authorized to make surprise inspections of working parties and check their attendance and report to Council."

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—That a Special Committee may be appointed to consider and report as to the advisability of abolishing the place of Assistant to the Superintendent of Works and the transference of some of the work now entrusted to the Superintendent of Works to the Superintendent of Sanitation. Mr. Beven seconded.

8. Applications for the post of Assistant to the Superintendent of Works. Resolved—That consideration of the applications be deferred pending the report of the Special Committee appointed in accordance with resolution 7 proposed by Mr. LaBrooy.

9. To sanction the estimate of Rs. 1,070 for the construction of two plague camps. Resolved—That the estimate be passed.

10. The Colonial Auditor's Report for 1916.—Tabled.

11. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Finance and Assessment.*

(1) That the estimate of Rs. 54·60 submitted by the Court Clerk for overtime pay to prepare a return of records for destruction be approved.

*Municipal Works.*

(2) That the following estimate be passed :—Repairs to Infectious Diseases Hospital, Katugastota, Rs. 160.

(3) That application be made to Government for the lots 1 and 2 in preliminary plan 6,751 to be vested in Council for use as a play ground for children.

(4) That a private water service be allowed on usual terms to No. 203, Colombo street, P. S. Hamidon.
