MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, July 10, 1903.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 4, 1903.

Present:—Mr. C. D. Vigors, Acting Chairman; Mr. P. D. Khan; Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, C.M.G.; Major A. W. de Wilton; Dr. A. Perry; Mr. F. C. Allen; Mr. L. Creasy; Mr. G. H. Alston; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; the Hon. Mr. Stanley Bois; Dr. W. H. de Silva; and Mr. H. Tiruvilingam.

The Minutes of June 12, 1903, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved-That the Minutes of June 12, 1903, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved—That the report of the Special Committee appointed under resolution of the Municipal Council, October 8, 1897, together with the connected papers, be referred to the Standing Committees on Public Works and Sanitation to consider and suggest to this Council the best mode of giving effect to the recommendations of the Special Committee and the suggestions contained in the various reports on the subject.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

2. The following extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of June 23, 1903, Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of June 23, 1903, and Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 4, 1903, were laid before the Council:—

- (8) Letter No. 542 of June 15, 1903, from Superintendent of Works, requesting that the amount of Rs. 2,042 of the estimate No. 324 for pipe culvert and house connections, Layard's broadway, be credited to the estimate No. 313 of 1902, drainage, Layard's broadway. Sanctioned.
- (11) Papers with reference to additional amount of Rs. 558.87 required for supply of coir dust.

 Approved. To be included in Supplemental Budget.
- (12) Copy of letter dated June 15, 1903, to Auditor-General from Colonial Secretary, with reference to employment of an extra clerk at Rs. 480 per annum, the expenditure to be charged to Drainage Scheme Funds.
 The appointment is recommended. Provision to be made in Supplemental Budget.
- (17) Supplementary vote of Rs. 350 on furniture account.

 Approved. To be included in Supplemental Budget.
- (23) Memorandum from Medical Officer of Health, asking to be supplied with uniform suits, badge, and buttons for Inspector Gunawardene.
 Rs. 150 voted. To be included in Supplemental Budget.
 - Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 4, 1903.
- (2) Papers with reference to street name plates.

 The Standing Committee recommend that the enamelled plates be tried in Kollupitiya.
- (4) Papers with reference to land proposed to be acquired from premises Nos. 8, 9, and 10, Hulftsdorp street.
 - The Standing Committee recommend that the necessary land should be purchased or acquired to enable a new wall to be built.
- (6) Papers re proposed charge in form of estimate. The Standing Committee recommend that the form suggested be adopted.
- (7) Estimate for underpinning and protecting the Galle Face sea wall, Rs. 255. (Passed by Finance and Assessment Committee No. 3 of June 23, 1903.)
 Approved. The Standing Committee wish for a report on the condition of the Galle Face and the steps most advisable to protect it.
- (8) Estimate for repairs to certain old roads and construction of new roads at the night soil depôt,
 Narahenpitiya, Rs. 372:44. (Passed by Finance and Assessment Committee No. 5 of June 23, 1903.)
 The work is approved of.
- (9) Estimate for making a model of a stall for the Edinburgh market, Rs. 100. (Passed by the Finance and Assessment Committee and Markets and Sanitation Committee No. 4 of June 23, 1903.)

 The Standing Committee recommend that a stall be built on the plan suggested.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations contained in the foregoing extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committees be adopted.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

3. Memorandum by the Chairman, dated June 22, 1903, suggesting a consolidating Ordinance embodying the various Medical Ordinances now in force, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That (1) that the subject of the consolidation of the Municipal Councils' Ordinances be referred to the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects for report and for consideration of all points in the existing Ordinances requiring amendment, so that such amendments may be included, and any necessary additions made at the same time; (2) the Standing Committee under section 176 be the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

4. A letter No. 78/012076 of June 24, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, with regard to Mr. Richards's services for the Municipal Printing Office, was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That His Excellency the Governor be thanked for the permission conveyed in the Hon. the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 78/012076 of June 24, 1903.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

5. A letter No. 9n of June 24, 1903, from the Municipal Engineer, regarding the Colombo lake, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chai man moved—That the letter of the Municipal Engineer No. 98 of June 24, 1903, be referred to the

Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Markets and Sanitation for consideration and report.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

6. A letter No. 843c of June 17, 1903, from the Director of Public Instruction, with reference to Municipal schools on the grant-in-aid system, together with the Chairman's memorandum thereon, was laid before the Council having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That Messrs. C. P. Dirs and James Peiris and the Chairman be deputed to confer with

the Acting Director of Public Instruction and thereafter to report on the subject to the Council.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.

A letter No. 559 of June 6, 1903, from the Municipal Engineer with Chairman's note thereon, with reference to resolution No. 17 of June 12, 1903, from which clerks and overseers are to draw increments to their salaries, was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That the date fixed by resolution No. 17 of June 12, 1903, be adhered to. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Papers regarding electric motor to Survey Office were laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—(1) With reference to the Electrical Adviser's letter No. 50 of July 1, 1903, that the additional regulations therein set out be adopted and forwarded to Government for approval and publication; (2) that the permission requested by Messrs. Boustead Brothers' letter of June 29, 1903, be granted for twelve months from the date of notification of the permission to Messrs. Boustead Brothers, subject to the additional conditions set out in letter No. 50 of July 1, 1903, from the Electrical Adviser, which Messrs. Boustead Brothers must agree to accept. Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. Papers regarding Mr. Ondatjie's leave, preparatory to retirement, were laid before the Council, and the Chairman explained that there was some difficulty in deciding when leave should be granted without the Council being put to expense.

Mr. C. Perera moved—That the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Papers regarding Mutwal quarry were laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved-That the matter be deferred to next Meeting of Council for further report.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

11. To obtain authority of Council to pass the surcharge re Mr. Dassenaike's salary, as required by the Auditor-General in his further remark on query No. 195 on the expenditure accounts for March, 1902.

With reference to item 11 in the Order of the Day, the Chairman moved—That the authority of Council be given to pass the surcharge re Mr. Dassenaike's salary, as required by the Auditor-General in his further remark on query No. 195 on the expenditure accounts for March, 1902.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

12. To amend revised by-laws as follows :-

By inserting the words "on Finance and Assessment" after the words "Standing Committee" in lines 5 and 7 in by-law 1, chapter I., also in line 3 of by-law 4, chapter IV.

With reference to item 12 in the Order of the Day, the Chairman moved—That the words "on Finance and Assessment" be inserted after the words "Standing Committee," where these words occur in section 1, chapter I., and after the same words in section 4, chapter IV., of the revised by-laws.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

- 13. Auditor-General's remarks for November, 1902, were laid on the table.
- 14. Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to June 30, 1903, and Progress Report of Work done for the same period, were laid on the table.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall Kandy, on Saturday, July 18, 1903, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 13, 1903.

Present:—Hon. Mr. S. Haughton, Chairman; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.; Dr. J. H. Ebell.

- 1. The Mfhutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 20, 1903, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- The following documents were submitted: -Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1902 to June 30, 1903, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of June, 1903.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during the month of June, 1903.
 - 4. Correspondence.—The following letters were submitted:—

(a) Letters Nos. 9 and 13 dated May 26 and June 16, 1903, respectively, from the Colonial Secretary, respecting the purchase of a photometer and results of tests of electric pressure maintained on the electric mains in Kandy, with an explanation called for by Secretary's letter No. 710 of June 22, 1903, from the Resident Engineer, Colombo Gas and Water Company.

Resolved—That the Government be asked if they will pay half the cost of a voltmeter, to be procured as suggested by the Government Electrical Adviser in his letter of May 14, 1903; the readiness of Government to meet half cost of a photometer was stated by the Provincial Engineer in his letter No. 293 of December 12, 1903, to the Government

Agent.

(b) Letter No. 14 dated June 27, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, stating, in reply to the 5th paragraph of Chairman's letter No. 7 of February 3, 1903, that Government is prepared to consider the propriety of conserving the Kandy lake at the expense of public revenue, and asking for a statement showing annual cost of conservancy during the last ten years.

Resolved-That a statement of expenditure incurred during ten years by the Council in dredging the lake be

(c) Letter dated June 14, 1903, from Mr. Tivy, Honorary Secretary, Ceylon Croquet Association, thanking the Council for allowing the Committee the use of the esplanade for purposes of a croquet tournament.

(d) Letter dated June 29, 1903, from Mr. J. P. Lewis, late Chairman, thanking the Council for resolution

- adopted on June 20, 190
- 5. Memorandum dated June 22, 1903, by the Chairman, embodying recommendation by the Standing Committee on "Municipal Works," respecting extra labour for the improvement of the recreation ground and the necessity for employment of extra guards, was laid on the table, after having been circulated amongst Members.

Resolved-That the sanction for employment of extra guards be confirmed, provision being made in the

Supplemental Budget for the year.

- 6. At the request of Mr. C. Vanderwall, the questions of which Mr. R. W. Jonklaas had given notice that he would bring forward were allowed to remain over till next Meeting, as he, Mr. Jonklaas, was unavoidably absent.
- 7. In accordance with notice, Mr. Gibbon asked—What steps are being taken to have increased postal facilities in the shape of pillar-boxes, receiving offices, &c., now that the General Post Office is removed so far from the business part of the town.
- Reply.—Colonial Secretary's letter No. 10 of June 2, 1903, in reply to an application for a branch Post and Telegraph Office in the town, was submitted on June 20, 1903. It was stated therein that it is regretted that the suggestion cannot be entertained. In his letter of March 17, 1902, the Postmater-General intimated that his estimate proposal for increasing postal facilities had not received the approval of Government.

Mr. Gibbon gave notice that at the next Meeting he would bring forward a motion on the subject.

8. In pursuance of notice, Mr. Gibbon asked—What steps are being taken by the Council to have the lands other than the catchment area taken over by Government at the price paid for it by the Municipal Council, and the expenditure of such money on the drainage of the town, which in some parts is believed to be in an insanitary condition.

Reply.—Letter No. 7 of February 3, 1903, was addressed to the Government on the subject. The Colonial Secretary's letter No. 14 of June 27, 1903, referring to this letter, was submitted at the Meeting this day. No other communications received.

9. Read recommendation by Standing Committee on "Law and General Subjects."
That the lease of premises No. 210, Peradeniya road, to Mr. P. D. Siebel, be renewed for a further period of five years on the same terms as before, it being understood that the Council will be allowed to occupy a small portion of the ground to the south of the cattle exposing shed, if required, for purposes of erecting a shed for sheep and goats, without claim for compensation.

Proposed by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the recommendation be adopted.

On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried.

10. Read recommendation of the Standing Committee on "Municipal Works."—That the following applications for house service pipes be granted:—V. S. Sivagurunader, No. 106, Castle Hill street, M. Keppitipola, 240, Trincomalee street.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of June, 1903.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town has been fairly well carried out during this month. The cuttings from the trees on the sides of Perudeniya road, particularly at Getambe, have been allowed to remain too long; this I consider is the fault of the Public Works Department, who seem to think that the town carts can possibly take away all the rubbish they have. This has been reported to the Secretary.

Drainage.—Owing to the rains the drains have been kept well flushed.

Water Supply.—Good. I attach an analysis of the water taken from a standpipe in Ward street.

Alleys.—The alleys are being kept as clean as possible, considering their construction and the people who live in them.

Laundries .- Well kept.

Dairies.-Clean and well kept.

Bakeries .- Well kept.

Market.—Generally well kept. All food stuffs were inspected and found good.

Cattle passed this Month. - Cattle, 504; buffaloes, 54; sheep, 116; goats, 226.

Slaughter House and Exposing Shed .- Clean and well kept.

House of Shelter.—The house at Devennewella I found kept in an insanitary state. This was reported to the Secretary.

Boutiques .- Well kept.

Night Soil Depôt. -Well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General Health. -Good. A few cases of chickenpox have been reported; one case of enteric fever in Ward street was reported and visited by me. On June 1 a patient was isolated and treated at home. Every precaution has been taken, and now the patient is well. The Ward Inspector has been ordered to see the place thoroughly. disinfected.

- (y) To distribute among the Shareholders in specie any property of the Company, whether by way of dividend or upon a return of capital, but so that no distribution amounting to a reduction of capital be made, except with the sanction for the time being required by law.
- (z) To do all such other things as may be necessary, incidental, conducive, or convenient to the attainment of the above objects or any of them. It being hereby declared that in the foregoing clause (unless a contrary intention appears) the word "person" includes any number of persons and a corporation, and that the "other objects" specified in any one paragraph are not to be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph.
- 4. The liability of the members is limited.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE CEYLON RUBBER COMPANY, LIMITED.

IT is agreed as follows :-

1. Table C not to apply; Company to be governed by these Articles.—The regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

2. Power to alter the Regulations.—The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles

or not.

3. None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or be lent on shares of the Company.

INTERPRETATION.

Interpretation Clause. - In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context

-The word "Company" means "The Ceylon Rubber Company, Limited," incorporated or established Company.

by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The Ordinance.—"The Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinances, 1861, 1888, and 1893," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

Special Resolution and Extraordinary Resolution.—"Special resolution" and "extraordinary resolution" have the meanings assigned thereto respectively by "the Ordinance."

These Presents.—"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

'Capital.—"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of

the Company.

Shares .-- "Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided. Shareholder.-"Shareholder" means a Shareholder of the Company.

Presence or Present.—" Presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or

by attorney duly authorized.

Directors.—"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled at a Board.

Board.—"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

Persons.—"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated

by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office.—"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company. Seal.—"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

Month.—" Month" means a calendar month.

Writing.—" Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Singular and Plural Number.—Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa. Masculine and Feminine Gender.—Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and vice versá.

PRELIMINARY.

Commencement of Business.—The Company may proceed to carry on business and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit, and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed or applied for or allotted, they shall do so as soon as in the judgment of the Directors a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

6. Business to be carried on by Directors.—The business of the Company shall be carried on by or under the management or direction of the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with

these presents.

CAPITAL.

7. Nominal Capital.—The nominal capital of the Company is Seven hundred and Fifty thousand Rupees (Rs. 750,000), divided into Seven thousand Five hundred (7,500) shares of One hundred Rupees each.

8. Arrangement on Issue of Shares.—The Company may call up the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit, and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the property of calls to be paid and the time of payment of such calls. in the amount of calls to be paid, and the time of payment of such calls.

9. Payment of Amount of Shares by Instalments.—If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the

Company by the holder of the share.

10. Increase or Reduction of Capital.—The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution from time to time, increase the capital by creation of new shares of such amount per share and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct, and the Company in General Meeting may by special resolution reduce the capital as such special resolution shall direct.

11. New Shares.—The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct; and if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine, and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the

dividends and in the distribution of assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right to voting.

12. How carried into effect.—Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined; and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine.

13. Same as Original Capital.—Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the provisions herein contained with reference to the payments of calls and instalments, transfer and transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise.

SHARES.

14. Issue,—The shares, except where otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares shall first be offered by the Directors to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares already held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the Shareholder or Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been offered, within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors, may be disposed of by the Directors in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company. Provided also that the Directors may at their discretion allot any shares in payment for any setates or lards or other proporty anywhered or accounted by the Company. any shares in payment for any estates or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company

15. Acceptance.—Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing

under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

16. Payment.—Payment for shares shall be made in such manner as the Directors shall from time to time determine and direct.

17. Shares held by a Firm.—Shares may be registered in the name of a firm, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies.

18. Shares held by Two or more Persons not in Partnership .- Shares may be registered in the name of two or more

persons not in partnership.

19. One of Joint-holders other than a Firm may give Receipts: only one of Joint-holders resident in Ceylon entitled to Vote.—Any one of the joint-holders of a share other than a firm may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint Shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shures shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

20. Survivor of Joint-holder, other than a Firm, only recognized.—In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company

as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

21. The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments

and calls due in respect of such share.

22. Company not bound to Recognize any Interest in Share other than that of Registered Holder or of any Person under Clause 38.—The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 38 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

23. Certificates.—The certificates of shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company, and signed by two

Directors or by one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries of the Company.

24. How issued.—Every Shareholder shall be entitled to one certificate for all the shares registered in his name, or to several certificates, each for one or more of such shares. Every certificate shall specify the number of the share in respect of which it is issued.

25. Renewal of Certificate.—If any certificate be worn out or lost, it may be renewed or replaced after due advertisement by the owner in the Guzette and local papers, and on proof of the fact to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as they shall require being given, and on payment of Rs. 2.50 for every new certificate in addition to the necessary stamp duty.

26. Certificate to be delivered to the first-named of Joint-holders not a Firm .- The certificate of shares registered

in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the person first-named on the register.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. Exercise of Rights.—No person shall exercise any rights of a member until his name shall have been entered in the Register of Members, and he shall have paid all calls and other moneys for the time being payable on every share in the Company held by him.

28. Transfer of Shares.—Subject to the restriction of these Articles, any Shareholder may transfer all or any of

his shares by instrument in writing.

29. No Transfer to Infant or Person of Unsound Mind.—No transfer of shares shall be made to an infant or person of unsound mind.

30. Register of Transfers. The Company shall keep a book or books to be called "The Register of Transfers."

in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

31. Instrument of Transfer.—The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed both by the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

32. Board may decline to Register Transfers.—The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the

Company have a lien or otherwise; or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved by them.

83. Not bound to state Reason.—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

34. Registration of Transfer.—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Rs. 2.50, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid; and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 32, 33, and 35, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

35. Directors may authorize Registration of Transferees. - The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the

Directors for that purpose.

36. Directors not bound to inquire as to validity of Transfer .- In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but if at all, upon the transferee only.

Transfer Books when to be closed.—The Transfer Books shall be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the First General Meeting; also, when a dividend is declared, for the three days next ensuing the meeting; also at such other times as the Directors may decide, not exceeding further ten days in any one year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

38. Title to Shares of Deceased Holder.—The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

39. Registration of Persons entitled to Shares otherwise than by Transfer.—Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any other way then by transfer shall made securing such evidence that he systains the character in respect of which he proposes to than by transfer, shall, upon securing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Company think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares on payment of a fee of Rs. 2.50; or may,

subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

40. Failing such Registration, Shares may be sold by the Company.—If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 39 shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such decased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money, and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such share, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same, and the net proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SHARES (SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE).

41. The Directors may accept Surrender of Shares.—The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed, a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company.

42. If Call or Instalment be not paid, Notice to be given to Shareholder.—If any Shareholder fail to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may, at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder, requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the

Company by reason of such non-payment.

Terms of Notice.—The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) and a place or places at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares

in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

In default of Payment, Shares to be forfeited.—If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, interest, and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

Shareholder still liable to pay Money owing at time of Forfeiture.—Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay, and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment, at 9 per cent. per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

43. Surrendered or forfeited Shares to be Property of Company, and may be sold, &c.—Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise

disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

44. Effect of Surrender or Forfeiture.—The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly

45. Certificate of Surrender or Forfeiture. - A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be effected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

Forfeiture may be remitted .- The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further

holders of such share or snares, and an expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit, as they shall think fit, not being less than 9 per cent. on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share bond fide sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 43 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

46. Company's Lien on Shares.—The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders, or otherwise, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls resolutions for which shall have been passed by the Directors, although the times appointed for the payment thereof holders, or otherwise, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all caus resolutions for which shall have been passed by the Directors, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons; and the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

47. Lien how made available.—Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company and default shall

writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or massed in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

48. Proceeds how applied.—The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

49. Certificate of Sale.—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that the power of sale given by clause 47 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

50. Transfer on Sule how executed.—Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchasor thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a

complete title to such shares.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

- 51. Preference and deferred Shares .- Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right of preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or at such a premium, or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may from time to time by special resolution determine.
- 52. Resolutions affecting a particular Class of Shares.—If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolutions could have been affected without it could have been affected without it.

53. Meeting affecting a particular Class of Shares.—Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing

by any members personally present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

54. Directors may make Calls.—The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the holders of registered shares in respect of moneys unpaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholder of the time and place appointed for payment of each call.

Calls, Time when made.—A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution authorizing

the call was passed at a Board Meeting of the Directors.

Extension of Time for Payment of Call.—The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof, on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension,

except as a matter of grace or favour.

55. Interest on unpaid Call.—If the sum payable in respect of any call or instalment is not paid on or before the day appointed for the payment thereof, the holder for the time being of the share in respect of which the call shall have been made, or the instalments due, shall pay interest for the same at the rate of 9 per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of the actual payment, but the Directors may, when they think fit, remit altogether or in part any sum becoming payable for interest under this clause.

56. Payments in anticipation of Calls at Interest.—The Directors may at their discretion receive from any

Shareholder willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit. all or any part of the amount of his

shares beyond the sum actually called up.

Borrowing Powers.

57. Power to Borrow.—The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company to such extent, in such manner, and upon such terms and conditions as they may think fit. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be arred or exchanged as the Directors and the part of the pa may think fit, and may contain any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued. A declaration under the Company's seal contained in or endorsed upon any of the documents mentioned in this Article and subscribed by two or more of the Directors or by one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, to the effect that the Directors have power to borrow the amount which such document may represent, shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors, and no such document containing such declaration shall, as regards the creditor, be void on the ground of its being granted in excess of the aforesaid borrowing power, unless it shall be proved that such creditor was aware that it was so granted.

MEETINGS.

58. First General Meeting.—The First General Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the registration of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

59. Subsequent General Meetings.—Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time

and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time

and place as may be determined by the Directors.

60. Ordinary and Extraordinary General Meetings.—The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings, all other Meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

Extraordinary General Meeting.—The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary Ganeral Meeting, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-seventh of the number of Shareholders holding not less than one-seventh of the issued capital and entitled to vote.

62. Requisition of Shareholders to state object of Meeting; on Receipt of Requisition Directors to call Meeting, and in default Shareholders may do so.—Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. 63. Seven Days' Notice of Meeting to be given.—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, day, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given to the Shareholders entitled to be present at such meeting in manner hereinafter mentioned, but an accidental omission to give such notice to any Shareholder shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.

64. Business requiring and not requiring Notification.—Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors retiring in rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors, and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever, of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

65. Notice of other Business to be given.—With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially

mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

66. Quorum to be Present.—No business shall be transacted at a General Meeting unless there shall be present

in person at the commencement of the business three or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

67. If the Quorum not present, Meeting to be dissolved or adjourned; adjourned Meeting to transact Business.—If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if

but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and it at such adjourned meeting, a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

68. Chairman of Directors or a Director to be Chairman of General Meeting; in case of their absence or refusal a Shareholder may act.—The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

69. Business confined to Election of Chairman while Chair Vacant.—No business shall be discussed at any General

70. Chairman with consent may adjourn Meeting.—The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice shall be given.

71. Minutes of General Meeting.—Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

72. Votes.—At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by the votes of the Shareholders present in person or by proxy or by attorney duly appointed, and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded in writing by at least three members present in person and not by proxy or by attorney at the meeting and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

73. Poll.—If a poll be duly demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which

the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any, business other than the question ou which a poll has been demanded.

74. Poll how taken.—If at any meeting a poll be demanded by notice in writing signed by three Shareholders present in person and not by proxy or by attorney at the meeting and entitled to vote, which notice shall be delivered during the meeting to the Chairman, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such a manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

75. No Poll, on Election of Chairman or on Question of Adjournment.—No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

76. Number of Votes to which Shareholder entitled.—On a show of hands every Shareholder shall have one vote aonly In case of a poll every Shareholder shall (except as provided for in the Article immediately following) have one vote for every one share held by him up to ten. He shall have an additional vote for every ten shares held by him, beyond the first ten shares. When voting on a resolution involving the winding up of the Company, every Shareholder shall have an additional vote for every ten shares held by him. Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

77. Guardian of Infant, &c., when not entitled to Vote.—The parent or guardian of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid if more than the state of the parent of the place of such infant lunatic formula or deceased as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

78. Voting in Person or by Proxy.—Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or attorney duly authorized.

79. Non-shareholder and to be appointed Proxy.—No person shall be appointed a proxy or attorney who is not a

Shareholder of the Company.

80. Shareholder in Arrear or not registered at least Three Months previous to the Meeting not to Vote.-No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote or speak at any General Meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares, or any of them, shall have been paid; and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, or person acquiring by marriage, shall be entitled to vote or speak at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of or as the holder of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been at least three months previously to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote or speak duly registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote

81. Proxy to be Printed or in Writing.—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written, and shall be signed by the appointor, or if such appointor be a corporation, it shall be by the common seal of such

82. When Proxy to be deposited.—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

Their Qualification and Remuneration.—The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least ten shares in the Company, upon which all calls for the time being shall have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors. As a remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding One thousand Rupees (Rs. 1,000) annually, to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future; and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company.

88. 92. Duration of Office of Director appointed to Vacancy.—Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors subsequent to First Ordinary General Meeting may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

93. To retire Annually.—At the Second Ordinary General Meeting and at the Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 94.

103. No Contribution to be required from Directors beyond Amount, if any, unpaid on their Shares. - No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in

Powers of Directors.

104. Powers of Directors.—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through the Managing Director, or by an agent or agents, secretary or secretaries of the Company, in such manner as the Directors shall determine; and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase,

lease, or acquisition of estates and lands, and the opening, clearing, planting, cultivation, inspection, and supervision thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company.

105. Board may appoint Committees.—The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board; all acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

Regulation of Proceedings of Committees.—The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors so far as the same are applicable thereto, and be not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committees respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

118. Resolution in Writing by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a Meeting of Directors.—A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

duly called and constituted.

119. Minutes of Proceedings of the Company and the Directors to be recorded.—The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, videlicet:—

(a) Of all appointments of officers and committees made by the Directors.

(b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors and of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the Committee.

Of the resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings.

(d) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors and of the committees appointed by the Board.

(e) Of all orders made by the Directors.

120. Signature of Minutes of Proceedings and effect thereof.—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsover, be prima facis evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman.

121. When the Business of the Company shall commence.—The Directors shall be at liberty to carry on the business of the Company shall think fit notwithered in the which a smithly may not have been subscribed

121. When the Business of the Company shall commence.—The Directors shall be at injerty to carry on the business of the Company as soon as they shall think fit, notwithstanding the whole capital may not have been subscribed

122. The use of the Seal.—The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed or instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries of the Company, who shall attest the sealing thereor, such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner of the said firm signing for and on behalf of the said firm as such Secretaries.

ACCOUNTS.

123. What Accounts to be kept.—The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being, or, if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company; and the accounts shall be

kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

124. Accounts how and when open to Inspection.—The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be opened to the inspection of the Shareholders; and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company, except as conferred by the statutes, or authorized

by the Directors, or by resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

125. Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet to be furnished to General Meetings.—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the profit and loss account of the preceding year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the previous year.

126. Report to accompany Statement.—Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company, and as to the amount which they recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of

dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

127. Copy of Balance Sheet to be sent to Shareholders.—A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

128. Declaration of Dividend.—The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but uo dividend shall be payable except out of nett profits.

129. Interim Dividend.—The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to

be paid to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend on the then current year.

130. Reserve Fund.—Previously to the Directors recommending any dividend, they may set aside, out of the profits of the Company, such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and shall invest the same in such securities as they shall think fit, or place the same in fixed deposit in any bank or banks.

131. Application thereof.—The Directors may from time to time apply such portion as they think fit of the reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the report or plant company of the property or plant company of the repair or serve or plant company of the repair. property or plant connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they from time to time deem expedient.

132. Unpaid Interest or Dividend not to bear Interest.—No unpaid interest or dividend shall ever bear interest

against the Company.

133. No Shareholder to receive Dividend while Debt due to Company.—No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

134. Directors may deduct Debt from the Dividends.—The Directors may deduct from the dividend payable to any Shareholder all sums of money due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding such sums shall not be payable until after the date when such dividend is payable.

135. Notice of Dividend; Forfeiture of unclaimed Dividend.—Notice of all interest or dividends to become payable shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto; and all interest or dividends unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Board of Directors for the benefit of

the Company, and if the Directors think fit may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.

136. Shares held by a Firm.—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm, or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

137. Joint-holders other than a Firm.—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly other than a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

AUDIT.

138. Accounts to be audited.—The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined and the

correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

139. Qualification of Auditors.—No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during his continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.

140. Appointment and Retirement of Auditors.—The Directors shall appoint the first Auditors of the Company and fix their remuneration; and all future Auditors, except as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be appointed at the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and shall hold their office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after their respective appointments or until otherwise

ordered by a General Meeting.

141. Retiring Auditors eligible for Re-election.—Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

142. Remuneration of Auditors.—The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the

Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

143. Casual Vacancy in Number of Auditors how filled up.—If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor shall not be supplied at any Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur, the Directors shall (subject to the approval of the next Ordinary General Meeting) fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person who shall hold the office until such meeting.

144. Duty of Auditors.—Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and

vouchers relating thereto and to report thereon to the meeting generally or specially as he may think fit.

145. Company's Accounts to be open to Auditors for audit.—All accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company shall at all times be open to the Auditors for the purpose of audit.

146. Notices how authenticated.—Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or other persons appointed by the Board to do so.

147. Shareholders to register Address.—Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon, which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

Service of Notices.—A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder, either personally or by sending through the post in a prepaid letter, addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode; and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served for all purposes, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless and until his executors or administrators shall have given to the Directors or to the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries of the Company their own or some other address in Ceylon.

148. Notice to Joint-holders of Shares other than a Firm.—All notices directed to be given to Shareholders shall,

with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled other than a firm, be sufficient if given to any one of such persons, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

149. Date and Proof of Service.—Any notice if served by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address; and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the retire was properly addressed and put proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a Post Office or post box, and the entry into the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to each address of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

150. Non-resident Shareholders must register Addresses in Ceylon.—Every Shareholder residing out of Ceylon shall name and register in the books of the Company an address within Ceylon at which all notices shall be served upon him, and all notices served at such address shall be deemed to be well served. If he shall not have named and registered such an address, he shall not be entitled to any notices.

ARBITRATION.

151. Directors may refer Disputes to Arbitration.—Whenever any question or other matter whatsoever arises in dispute between the Company and any other company or persons, the same may be referred by the Directors to arbitration.

EVIDENCE.

152. Evidence in Action by Company against Shareholders.—On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was when the claim arose on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof of the matters aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISION RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

153. Purchase of Company's Property by Shareholders.—Any Shareholder, whethe a Director or not, or whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof, in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects, or any part thereof, shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.
