SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Limits of the Town of Nuwara Eliya.

North-west.—Along the north-west boundary of T. Ps. 73,338 and 73,339 at the Kodigaha Gap.

North-east and North.—Along the north-east and northern boundaries of private property till it reaches the Talagala-oya, up the right bank of that stream and western edge of the reservoir of the waterworks to the point where the stream enters the reservoir, from that point straight to the waterfall at the north-west corner of Lovers' Leap estate.

East and North-east.—Along the eastern boundary of the old Military reserve till it reaches the boundary of T. P. 87,650, along a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of T. P. 87,650 as far as the landmark 3½ chains north of the railway line.

North and East.—From the said landmark along the landmarked boundary passing through T. Ps. 55,925, 90,516, 90,517, and 100,035 to the water-course about 2½ chains east of road within T. P. 87,649.

East and South-east.—Along the said water-course from point last mentioned and landmarked boundary passing through Pedro estate and the eastern boundary of the Sewage Farm, Pedro estate, and Crown forest as far as the dam of the Barrack

Plains reservoir, along the top of the dam and itdirection produced in a straight line until i reaches point 66 feet from the cent of the Moon Plains road and on the outer side of thatroad. From the last-mentined point taking a south-easterly course along a line 6 feet distant from and parall to the centre of the Moon Plains road on its outer side or a distance of 27 chains ong this line as far as the patana, and the due south aross the stream to the edge the forest, thence south and east along the forest to the extreme south-east corner of the tongue of the patana which comprises the Rifle Range. From this corner a direct south-westerly line to the porth-east corne of T. P. 78,049, then following the south-east boundary of T. B. 78,049 to the main road from Nuwara Eya to Badulla, across the road in a drect line to the south-east corner of the irrefence enclosing Baker's Farm provate lands, then ollowing the wire fence include Baker's Farm as far as Baker's Farm Triangulation Station.

South.—From this point in a direct line to le Gregory Lake dam, thence down the course of the Naju-oya to Blackpool.

South-west.—From Blackpool straight to Ce Tree Hill Triangulation Station, thence along the top of the ridge overlookin Nuwara Eliya to a point due west of Queen's Cottage, from that point straight Kikilimana Triangulation Station, thence straight to the north-west corner of T. 73,338.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. The keeping of pigs shall be in all cases subject to the regulation, supervision, and control of the Local Board.
- 2. (a) No person shall keep a pig within the limits of the Board without a license from the Chairman. Every person desiring such a license shall apply to the Chairman, or to any person authorized to receive applications on his behalf, stating his name and address and the premises at which he proposes to keep the pig.

 (b) No such license shall be granted in respect of any premises not complying

with the conditions of these rules.

- (c) If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by a court of any breach of these rules, it shall be lawful for the court upon a second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under these rules. Chairman may in his discretion refuse to issue any fresh license to a person whose license has been so cancelled.
- 3. No pig shall be kept except in a sty or enclosure situated at a distance of not less than 50 feet from any dwelling house or place of human habitation.
- No pigsty shall be kept so as to be a nuisance to any person residing in the town or making use of any public road.
- Every pigsty shall be subject to inspection by the officers of the Local Board, and shall be maintained in clean and sanitary condition.
- Every pig found straying outside the sty or enclosure in which it should be kept shall be liabe to seizure by any person thereunto authorized by the Chairman in writing.
- 7. Every pig so seized shall be placed in a pound, and the following charges shall be paid before the removal of any pig so impounded, viz.:

For occupation, 50 cents a head for a day or part of a day. For food if supplied, 15 cents a head for a day or part of a day.

Every pig seized and not claimed and removed within three days may be sold by public auction and the charges and costs recovered from the proceeds.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 30, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 67 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 36 Sinhalese, 8 Tamils, 10 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1917, viz., 263,629) was 13.3, as against 20.4 in the preceding week, 16.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 101 (3 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 48 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 13 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 20·0, as against 22·2 in the previous week, 29·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 101 total deaths, 13 were of infants under one year of age, as against 44 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of still births registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 5 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Ten deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered same as in the previous week, against 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta. Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year, of these 2 were in Maradana, and 1 in Kotahena.
- 4. One death from Plague was registered (in Slave Island); none were registered in the previous week. One case was reported; no cases were reported in the previous week.
- 5. Eight deaths from Debility were registered, 4 from Enteritis, 3 from Infantile Convulsions, 1 from Dysentery, 1 from Worms, and 49 from Other Causes.
- 6. There were reported 20 cases of *Measles*, as against 18 in the previous week; and 9 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 16 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.8°, against 80.4° in the preceding week and 81.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.839 in., against 29.878 in. in the preceding week and 29.902 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.01 in., against 1.47 in. in the preceding week and 0.04 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
