### Passport Regulations.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause III. of the Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 21st day of March, 1916, which were brought into operation in the Colony by Proclamations dated the 6th day of August, 1914, and the 20th day of May, 1916, respectively, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to make the following regulations:—

No Indian other than a bona fide labourer leaving India after the date hereof shall enter or attempt to enter the

Colony unless he is in possession of a passport.

2. No Indian shall leave or attempt to leave the Colony for a destination other than the Federated Malay States, Johore, North Borneo, or Sarawak without a passport issued or viséd by the competent authority in the Colony or the Federated Malay States; provided that this regulation shall not apply (a) to any bona fide labourer returning to India; or (b) to natives of Southern India who are bona fide labourers proceeding to Kelantan, Kedah, or Perlis.

3. No Indian shall leave or attempt to leave the Colony for North Borneo or Sarawak without a pass issued or viséd by the Chief Police Officer of any Settlement of the Colony.

4. Nothing done under the authority of any law for the time being in force relating to the engagement of persons for service on merchant ships shall be deemed to be an offence against these regulations.

5. Any person guilty of offence against these regulations shall be liable on conviction before a Police Court to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months, or to a fine not exceeding eight hundred dollars, or to both.

6. The fee for a passport issued under these regulations shall be fifty cents. No fee shall be charged for a visé, or for a pass or visa issued under regulation 3.

7. For the purpose of these regulations—

"Competent authority" means any person authorized by the Governor, or by the Government of the Federated

Malay States, to exercise the powers of a competent authority under these regulations. "Labourer" means a person who is a servant in husbandry, artificer, miner, or domestic servant, or otherwise a member of the labouring classes.

"Native of Southern India" means a person of the Tamil, Telegu, or Malayalam race.

Nothing in these regulations shall apply to any person whose age is, or appears to the competent authority to be, less than fifteen years.

Regulations relating to the Landing of Alien Seamen.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-clause I (A) of clause III. of the Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 21st day of March, 1916, which were brought into operation in the Colony by Proclamations dated the 6th day of August, 1914, and the 20th day of May, 1916, respectively, the Governor is pleased to make the following regulations:

1. Landing of Alien Seamen.—(i.) An alien, being the master or a member of the crew of a vessel arriving at any of the ports of Singapore, Penang, Malacca, or Labuan, or at any place to which these regulations are applied by order of the Governor, shall not land at such port or place unless he has in his possession a passport issued to him not more than two years previously by or on behalf of the Government of the country of which he is a subject or a citizen, or some other document satisfactorily establishing his nationality or identity, to which passport or document there must be attached a photograph of the alien to whom it relates.

(ii.) Where an alien is under the provisions of these regulations prohibited from landing at any port or place, the Master Attendant or Harbour Master of such port or, in the case of a place to which these regulations are applied, such other officer as the Governor may appoint in that behalf, may nevertheless grant him temporary permission to land for such purposes and subject to such conditions as the Governor may from time to time prescribe, either generally or as respects

any particular port or place or vessel.

2. Penalty.—Any alien committing a breach of any of these regulations, or failing to comply with any condition imposed on him under these regulations, shall be tried by a Police Court, and shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months, or to a fine not exceeding eight hundred and fifty dollars, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

Persons aiding and abetting.—Any person who aids or abets any alien in any contravention of these regulations, or knowingly harbours any alien whom he knows or has reasonable grounds for supposing to have acted in contravention of these regulations, shall be liable on conviction before a Police Court to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months, or to a fine not exceeding eight hundred and fifty dollars, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

4. Arrest.—Any person who acts in contravention of these regulations, or is reasonably suspected of having soacted or being about so to act, may be taken into custody by any port officer or police constable.

Commencement.—These regulations shall come into operation on the First day of August, 1916.

General Passport Regulations.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause III. of the Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 21st day of March, 1916, which were brought into operation in the Colony by Proclamations dated the 6th day of August, 1914, and the 20th day of May, 1916, respectively, the Governor is pleased to make the following regulations and to rescind the passport regulations published as Notification No. 617 and as Notification No. 358 in Gazettes Extraordinary of the 24th May, 1916, and the 26th March, 1917, respectively:

1. No European passenger, whose age exceeds, or appears to exceed, fifteen years, coming from any place outside the Malay Peninsula shall land in the Colony, unless he produces a valid passport, which has been issued or renewed to him not more than two years before his arrival in the Colony by or on behalf of the Government of the country of which he is a subject or a citizen, and which, in the case of a passenger coming from a foreign country, has been issued or viséd by the British Ambassador or a British Consular Officer in that country, and, in the case of a passenger coming from any part of

the British Dominions, has been issued or viséd by some public official thereof duly authorized in that behalf.

2. No other passenger, whose age exceeds, or appears to exceed, fifteen years, coming from any place outside the Malay Peninsula shall land in the Colony unless he produces either such a passport as aforesaid or a certificate of nationality, which has been issued to him not more than two years before his arrival in the Colony by or on behalf of the Government of the country of which he is a subject or a citizen, and which, in the case of a passenger coming from a foreign country, has been issued or endorsed by the British Ambassador or a British Consular Officer in that country, and, in the case of a passenger coming from any part of the British Dominions, has been issued or endorsed by some public official thereof duly authorized in that behalf. In such certificate the name, nationality, and description of the passenger must be stated, and in the endorsement thereon the destination of the passenger, the name of the vessel by which he is travelling, and the date of the sailing of such vessel must be stated.

3. Every such passport and certificate of nationality as aforesaid shall have a photograph of the person to whom

it relates so affixed as to obviate the possibility of its removal and the substitution of another.

Any passenger who lands or attempts to land, or is reasonably suspected of having landed or being about to land in the Colony in contravention of the regulations, may be taken into custody by any port officer or police constable,

and may be forcibly returned to the vessel from which he landed, or may be forcibly prevented from landing.

5. Any passenger who lands or attempts to land in the Colony in contravention of these regulations, and any passenger having so landed who resists arrest, or who refuses to return to the vessel from which he landed when ordered so to do by any port officer or police constable, and any person who aids or abets any such passenger in any contravention of these regulations are the contravention. of these regulations, or who knowingly harbours any such passenger whom he knows or has reasonable grounds for supposing to have acted in contravention of these regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

6. Any person who-

- (a) Forges, alters, or tampers with any passport or certificate of nationality or any endorsement thereon, or without lawful authority uses or has in his possession any such forged, altered, or irregular passport or certificate or any passport or certificate with any such forged, altered, or irregular endorsement; or
- (b) Personates, or falsely represents himself to be or not to be a person to whom such a passport or certificate or such a passport or certificate with such an endorsement has been duly issued, or, with intent to obtain any such passport or certificate or such endorsement thereon, knowingly makes any false statement; or
- (c) Allows any other person to have possession of any such passport or certificate issued for his use alone, or without lawful authority has in his possession any such passport or certificate issued for the use of some person other than himself,

shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

Any person guilty of an offence against these regulations shall be liable on convicton before a Police Court to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months, or to a fine not exceeding eight hundred and fifty dollars, or to both imprisonment and fine.

These regulations shall not apply to any passenger coming from any place in the Malay Peninsula or to any bona fide Chinese or Netherlands Indian labourer, and shall in no way affect the regulations published as Notification No. 785 and as Notification No. 581 in Gazettes Extraordinary of the 29th June, 1916, and the 12th May, 1917, respectively.

These regulations may be cited as the General Passport Regulations, 1917.

sleepers and scantlings should be sawn from sound matured wood, free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

(5) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in., and narrow gauge sleepers 5 ft. by 9 in. by 4½ in., or 5 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. The sizes of scantlings to be sawn are—

(6) Sleepers and scantlings should be rectangular in form, and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs, sleepers, or scantlings with an adze or axe be allowed.

(7) Sleepers and scantlings should be covered with sawdust or immersed in water and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn until they can be transported to delivery depots, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger.

(8) Rejected sleepers or scantlings will not be paid for, and they will lapse to Government, as well as all refuse wood in the sleeper operations. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.

(9) The contractor may be paid a proportionate rate up to December 31, 1917, for sleepers and scantlings sawn but not removed to delivery depôts owing to the difficulty of transport in the north-east monsoon.

#### SCHEDULE.

### Service (a).

To fell a sufficient number of palu trees standing in the forest known as Amanamukalana, in Kalagam korale, Kalagam palata; bounded on the north by Ulagalla-Turuvilla road, east by footpath from Machchegama to Ittikattiya, south by Talawa-Kekirawa minor road, and west by Turuville-Andiyagala minor road; to convert the trees felled into 2,000 broad gauge and 1,000 narrow gauge sleepers (more or less) and as many scantlings as possible; to transport the sleepers and scantlings and to deliver them stacked at the Anuradhapura Depôt, near the railway station, the distance of transport being 25 miles, 18 of which are along main road.

#### Service (b).

To fell a sufficient number of palu trees in Habaranamukalana, in Matombuwa korale, Hurulu palata; bounded on the north by Maradankadawela-Habarana road, east by Habarana-Matale road, south by Kekirawa-Dambulla road, and west by Kekirawa-Ganewalpola road; to convert the trees felled into 2,000 broad gauge and 1,000 narrow gauge sleepers (more or less) and as many scantlings as possible; to transport the sleepers and scantlings and to deliver them stacked at Anuradhapura Depôt, near the railway station, the distance of transport being about 42 miles, 35 of which are along main road.

#### Service (c).

To fell a sufficient number of trees in forest known as Kala-oyamukalana, in Willachchiya korale, Nuweragam palata; bounded on the north by minor road from Moregawa to Mettikewa, on the east by footpath from Mettikewa to Kala-oya, on the south by Kala-oya, and on the west by Puttalam-Anuradhapura road; to convert the trees felled into 6,000 broad gauge and 1,000 narrow gauge sleepers (more or less) and as many scantlings as possible; to transport the sleepers and scantlings and to deliver them stacked at Anuradhapura Depôt, near the railway station, the distance of transport being 29 miles, 24 of which are along main road.

Note.—The felling operations are to be completed practically by end of March. Not less than 40 per cent. of the sleepers shall have been sawn by end of March, 80 per cent. by end of June, and the full number by middle of July. By end of April not less than 25 per cent. of the sleepers shall have been transported and stacked at delivery depôts, by

end of June not less than 50 per cent., by end of July not less than 90 per cent., and by the end of August the full number due on each contract.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will

be supplied upon application at the Forest Office, Matara, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made

either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

7. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the

contract.

8. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of the bond, and all other necessary information, can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in section 5. A further security in cash of 5 per cent. of the value of the contract will be required of the contractor when entering into the bond.

9. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly

fulfilled.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the

right of accepting any portion of a tender.

11. The contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board previously obtained, nor shall the contractor issue a power of attorney to a person whose name is in the list of defaulting contractors authorizing him to carry on the contract. 12. Separate rates per sleeper, broad gauge and narrow

gauge, and also rate per cubic foct for scantling, must be quoted, written both in words and figures.

13. Persons desirous of tendering are advised to acquaint themselves carefully of the nature of the work and of the contract they will be required to sign.

14. For any further information and for inspection of the draft contract, application should be made to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Galle Division, Matara.

## General Conditions.

1. Trees are to be felled within 6 inches from the ground by saw or axe and saw combined.

Only such trees as are stamped and marked by the Forest Ranger are to be felled, and no sound trees below 4 feet 6 inches in girth will be marked or should be felled.

- All suitable dead and hollow trees and branchwood within the forest such as are marked by the Forest Officer, though below 4 feet 6 inches in girth, should, in addition to all matured sound trees marked by him, be utilized for conversion into sleepers and scantlings or scantlings alone as may be directed. Contractors should understand that only such portions of trees as cannot be converted into sleepers may be sawn into scantlings.
- 4. Part of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts of logs are not to be sawn into sleepers or scantlings.

  The sleepers and scantlings should be sawn from sound matured wood, free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.
- 5. Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 feet by 10 inches by 5 inches, and narrow gauge sleepers 5 feet by 10 inches by 5 inches, or 5 feet by 9 inches by 4½ inches, and scantlings may be ordered from 3 inches by 2½ inches
- 6. Sleepers and scantlings should be rectangular in form, and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs, sleepers, or scantlings with an adze or axe be allowed.
- 7. Sleepers and scantlings should be covered with saw dust, or immered in water and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn, until they can be transported to delivery depôts, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger.
- 8. Only such sleepers as are practically certain to be accepted by the Railway authorities will be allowed to be

- stacked at delivery depots; payment may be made for sleepers and scantlings accepted by the Assistant Conservator of Forests at delivery depôts.
- 9. Rejected sleepers or scantlings will not be paid for, and they will lapse to Government, as well as all refuse wood in the sleeper operations. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.
- 10. Further information as to quantities and lengths of scantlings to be sawn can be obtained from the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Galle Division, Matara.

#### SCHEDULE.

To fell suitable na trees in Dediyagalamukalana, in the Matara District, bounded on the north by the Galle District, south by Kohugoda and Ketanwila villages, boundary of Galle District, Panatibugala, and Maliduwa villages, east by Lenama village: to convert the trees felled into sleepers and scantlings and to transport and deliver these at Matara railway station, properly stacked as directed by a Forest Officer.

In the financial year 1917-18 1,000 broad gauge and 300 narrow gauge of approved quantity must be delivered and with them from time to time scantlings incidental to the conversion, and in each of the years 1918-19 and 1919-20 similar supplies must be made. The contractor will be responsible for the sleepers and the scantlings until they have been delivered to the indenting Department.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 21, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 93 (10 Burghers, 44 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 14 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 18·1, as against 18·7 in the preceding week, 20·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 88 (4 Burghers, 47 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 17·1, as against 21·4 in the previous week, 32·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 88 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 43 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

Principal Causes of Death.—Nine deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 21 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 Wellawatta.

- 2. Six deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against II in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in New Bazaar, 1 in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kollupitiya.
- 3. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 in Kollupitiya.
- 4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Slave Island and the other in Wellawatta. One case of *Suspected Plague* was reported; no cases were reported in the previous week.
- 5. Fifteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 11 from Debility, 5 from Worms, 3 from Enteritis, 2 from Tetanus, 1 from Dysentery, and 30 from Other Causes.
- 6. There were reported 20 cases of *Measles*, as against 16 in the previous week; and 12 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 5 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.7°, against 82.8° in the preceding week and 79.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.809 in., against 29.822 in. in the preceding week and 29.794 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.01 in., against 0.02 in. in the preceding week and 1.55 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
