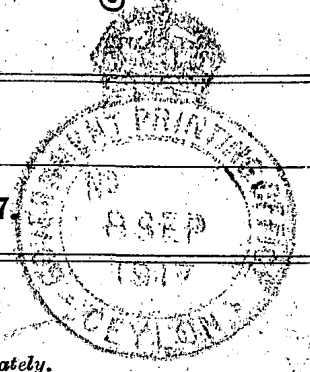

### PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir JOHN ANDERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

JOHN ANDERSON.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated February 25, 1893, issued under the provisions of section 19 of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1885, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,206 dated March 3, 1893, certain lots were set apart as village forests in accordance with section 34 of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 for the benefit of the village community of the Kumburugamuwa Gabadagama, in the Kolonnagam pattu of Kolonna korale, Ratnapura District, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, and whereas it is expedient to exclude from the list of said village forests the forest specified in the schedule hereto, and to that extent to vary the said Proclamation :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in the exercise of the power vested in Us by section 14 of Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, do hereby vary the said Proclamation, and declare that from and after September 1, 1917, the said forest specified in the schedule hereto shall cease to be a village forest constituted by the aforesaid Proclamation of February 25, 1893.

And We do in all other respects confirm the said Proclamation.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seventeen.

And We do hereby revoke all Our Proclamations published previous to this governing the treatment of articles as contraband of war.

SCHEDULE.

BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION consolidating, with Additions and Amendments, the Lists of Articles to be treated as Contraband of War.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS on October 14, 1915, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband during the continuance of hostilities or until We did give further public notice :

And whereas on January 27, and on April 12, and on June 27, and on October 3, and on November 23, and on December 29, 1916, We did, by Our Royal Proclamations of those dates, make certain additions to the lists of articles to be treated as contraband of war :

And whereas it is expedient to make certain additions to and amendments in the said lists, and to consolidate and re-issue the same in alphabetical order :

Now, therefore, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that the lists of contraband contained in the Schedules to Our Royal Proclamation of October 14, 1915, as subsequently amended by Our Proclamations of January 27, and of April 12, and of June 27, and of October 3, and of November 23, and of December 29, 1916, aforementioned, are hereby withdrawn, and that, in lieu thereof, during the continuance of the war or until We do give further public notice, the articles enumerated in Schedule I. hereto will be treated as absolute contraband, and the articles enumerated in Schedule II. hereto will be treated as conditional contraband.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorized by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A list consolidating all previous lists was published on June 22, 1917 (the Consolidating List No. 29a), which, together with the list herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The lists are published in the *London Gazette* and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

\* NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

† NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of June 25 and November 10, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph, he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the list. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the list as they appear. The lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H. M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

‡ NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English Company: For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under Berg and Komeet respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

## "THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897."

IT is hereby notified for general information that in pursuance of the powers committed to him by "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897," the following amendments and additions have been made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to the regulations under the said Ordinance dated July 28, 1914, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,636 of July 31, 1914.

Amendments and Additions to the Regulations framed under "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897," published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,636 of July 31, 1914.

1. In the definition of "disease" in rule 1 of the said regulations, after the word "trypanosomiasis," there shall be inserted the word "anchoylostomiasis."

2. The following new part shall be added to the said regulations:—

## PART V.

*Anchoylostomiasis.*

101. *Interpretation of terms.*—For the purpose of the application of this chapter, and of any of these rules and regulations to the prevention, observation, diagnosis, or treatment of anchylostomiasis, the proper authority shall be the Principal Civil Medical Officer, the Provincial Surgeon of the Province, the District Medical Officer and Assistant Medical Officer of the District, any officer of the Medical Department specially charged with duties in connection with anchylostomiasis, the Senior Sanitary Officer, and also any persons of medical or scientific qualifications appointed by the Governor as officers for the purpose of any campaign against the disease.

102. In any case in which the Principal Civil Medical Officer is satisfied that anchylostomiasis is prevalent within any estate, he may, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, declare such estate to be an "area infected with anchylostomiasis" for the purposes of this chapter.

103. The proper authority may, in the case of any estate declared an "area infected with anchylostomiasis" under this chapter—

- (a) By notice in writing, require the superintendent or other person in charge of the labourers on the estate to summon for examination or treatment in such manner to such place or places and at such time or times, as may be specified in the notice, any persons or class of persons employed on the estate or residing or being on or in the immediate vicinity of the estate.
- (b) By the said or any separate or further notice, require the said superintendent or person

to provide and afford, either generally or specifically, all facilities in his power for the purpose of such examination or treatment, or for the purpose of any other measure or operation undertaken by the proper authority in connection with such examination or treatment.

- (c) Require such superintendent or person to issue to any persons or class of persons employed on the estate, or resident or being thereon or in the immediate vicinity thereof, all such directions as the proper authority may deem necessary for the purposes aforesaid.
- (d) Require any person employed on the estate or resident or being thereon or in the immediate vicinity thereof to submit to any examination ordered by the proper authority.
- (e) Require any such person to furnish from time to time to the proper authority or to any person acting under his directions such specimens of the faeces of such person in such quantity as may be directed, and in such receptacle as may be provided by the proper authority.
- (f) Require any such person to submit to any medical treatment in such manner and during such period and at such times and places as may be directed by the proper authority.
- (g) Require any such person to remain within the infected area or within any place in the said area until the completion of any treatment which may be prescribed for such person by the proper authority, unless he shall receive permission in writing to quit the said area or place from the proper authority, or from any person to whom

the proper authority may delegate power to give such permission.

104. The Governor may, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, direct that the provisions of this chapter shall be applied to any area, other than an estate, which the Principal Civil Medical Officer may declare to be an area infected with anchylostomiasis, and in any such case all requirements which under this chapter may be addressed to the superintendent or other person in charge of the labourers on the estate may be addressed to such officer or person as the Governor may designate in the notice, and any requirement or direction which may under this chapter be issued or addressed to any person employed upon an estate may be issued or addressed to any person resident or being in the said area, and the provisions of this chapter shall, *mutatis mutandis*, be construed accordingly.

105. It shall be the duty of all persons to whom any requirement or direction may be communicated, issued, or addressed under this chapter, to comply with such requirement or direction.

*Note.*—By sections 6 and 7 of "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897," any person who without lawful authority or excuse (proof whereof shall be on him) contravenes any regulation made under the Ordinance, or does or omits to do anything which under any regulations made under the Ordinance he ought not to do, or omit to do, or who obstructs or impedes or assists in obstructing or impeding any officer appointed under the Ordinance or any regulation made thereunder, he is guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction before the Police Magistrate to imprisonment, either rigorous or simple, for a term not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding one thousand rupees, or to both.

3. Of the regulations published as aforesaid, the following shall not apply to anchylostomiasis, viz., Nos. 26, 29 A, 31, 41, 43, 47, 55, 56, 58, 63.

9. No carter, cart driver, or lorry driver shall load any goods into his cart or lorry or allow any goods to be so loaded within the Customs premises until he is in possession of the relative cart note, nor shall he, after goods have

been loaded, move his cart or lorry from any place of loading without having in his possession the relative cart note signed by the Landing Waiter, and no carter shall remove in his cart or lorry any goods other than those

described in the aforesaid cart note.

11. When a bullock cart is halted, the carter shall forthwith place under the cart pole a vertical support of such height as to take all weight off the necks of the bulls.

Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.

4. Applications should reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on October 18, 1917; any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

5. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. 6. The examination will be held at Colombo only, under the supervision of the Director of Education, in the places which will be notified to the candidates in due course. 7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for general competition will be twenty.

8. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

9. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B to this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting or half those allowed for Spelling or for Arithmetic will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred is that generally known as the "Civil Service" hand. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. ## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 1, 1917.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 82 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 50 Sinhalese, 8 Tamils, 14 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 16.0, as against 22.6 in the preceding week, 17.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 124 (10 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 21 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.1, as against 19.3 in the previous week, 23.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 124 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 18 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 3 in Kollupitiya, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in New Bazaar. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

2. Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 17 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered (in Kotahena), as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered. Of these 1 was in Pettah and the other in Maradana. No deaths were registered in the previous week. One case was reported during the week. No cases were reported in the previous week.

5. Fourteen deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 5 from *Tetanus*, 5 from *Debility*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Worms*, and 55 from *Other Causes*.

6. There were reported 8 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 6 in the previous week; and 29 cases of *Measles*, as against 22 in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81.6°, against 80.4° in the preceding week and 79.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.903 in., against 29.860 in. in the preceding week and 29.845 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.39 in., against 0.40 in. in the preceding week and 2.90 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

8. The examination will be competitive, and will be held under the supervision of the Director of Education in the place or places which will be notified to the candidates allowed to take up the examination.

9. The candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in the examination will, subject to their other qualifications being considered satisfactory, be selected up to the number required for admission as Learners. Before any candidate is so selected, he must undergo and pass a medical examination as to his fitness for service in any part of the Island. The medical examination will be held by the Principal Civil Medical Officer, and a fee of Rs. 10 for such examination will be charged.

#### Total Marks.

10. The subjects of examination will be—	
General English (including simple composition)	200
Dictation (spelling and handwriting 150 each)	300
Arithmetic 200 (the compound rules of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division, averages, G.C.M. and L.C.M., vulgar and decimal fractions, ratio and proportion, percentages, simple and compound interest, and extraction of the square root) and Totals	300
Elementary Physics (simple questions on the properties of matter, heat, and gases, and the use of thermometers and hydrometers)	100

English (oral)	100

11. Any candidate failing to obtain half the marks allotted for Writing, Spelling, and Arithmetic, respectively, will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Should any other candidate obtain less than one-third of the marks allotted for General English, Physics, or Chemistry and English (oral), respectively, such marks will not be counted in his favour.

12. Selected candidates will be required to undergo a course of training as Learners for a probationary period, which will usually be about six months, part of which will be spent in office, and part in outdoor work under Superintendents or Assistant Superintendents of Excise or experienced Excise Inspectors.

13. Learners will receive a subsistence allowance of Rs. 35 per mensem while attached to an office, and, in addition, a commuted travelling allowance of Rs. 35 per mensem while employed in outdoor work.

14. The payment of the allowance is contingent on the satisfactory behaviour of the Learner. A Learner who does not satisfy the Excise Commissioner as regards progress in the study of Excise work and good behaviour is liable to lose part or the whole of any allowance payable to him or to summary rejection and forfeiture of his allowance at any time during the period of training.

15. At the close of the period of training or at such other time as the Excise Commissioner may direct the Learners will be required to take up the subsequent examination in the following subjects:—

- (a) General Excise Work (Part II. of the Excise Manual regarding existing Departmental Orders and a knowledge of the Departmental Circulars issued by the Excise Commissioner will be required).
- (b) (i.) Excise Law. (A knowledge of the Excise Ordinance and of the notifications issued thereunder will be required).
- (ii.) Criminal Procedure Code (Sections 3, 11-12, 23-26, 33-37, 52-53, 70, 74-78, 133, 148-149, 167-168, 170-179, 187-199, 406-407, and 413 (i.)).
- (iii.) Ceylon Penal Code (Sections 19, 24-25, 75-76, 89-92, 101-109, 112, 138-139, 158-160, 181-186, 198-200, 214, 265, 340-342, and 344).
- (iv.) Evidence Ordinance (Sections 1-32, 53-54, 91-92, 101-106, 133, 137-138, 159-161).
- (c) Colloquial Sinhalese or Tamil.

16. Learners who in the examination referred to in Condition 15 above have acquitted themselves to the satisfaction of the Excise Commissioner will be appointed to be Excise Inspectors as vacancies occur, on probation for three years, on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem, and commuted travelling allowance at sanctioned rate. During the period of waiting for appointment as Inspectors, Learners will continue to draw the allowance specified in Condition 13 above.

17. Any Learner who has not done satisfactorily in the examination referred to in Condition 15 may be rejected, and will not be entitled to any allowance as from the day following that on which the decision of the Excise Commissioner as to his rejection has been officially notified to him in writing.

18. The Excise Commissioner may, if he thinks fit, extend the period of training of any Learner who has not been successful in the examination referred to in Condition 15. At the end of such extended period the Learner will be re-examined in the subjects specified in Condition 15, and will, if successful, be treated in accordance with Condition 16; if still unsuccessful, he will be finally rejected. The question of payment of any allowance during the extended period of training will be decided by the Excise Commissioner.

19. Learners who are rejected in terms of Conditions 14, 17, or 18 will not be eligible for admission to the Excise Department.

20. Leave to Excise Learners during the period of training will not be granted as a matter of course. The Excise Commissioner has the discretion of stopping either partly or wholly the payment of any allowance for the days during which a Learner has been on leave. Sick leave, if applied for, should always be supported by a medical certificate from a Government Medical Officer.

21. All persons passing into the Excise Department will be bound by such rules and regulations as have been, or may hereafter be, made for the Department.

50 per cent. of the bid and security Rs. 150 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid regularly in three monthly instalments within three months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.
