WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle and such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Galle in the months of April and the month of September in every year:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said Ordinance that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reason to him appearing, after previous consultation with the Judges, to alter the dates above-mentioned, and to fix any other date for the commencement of the Sessions at any place:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to alter as hereinafter ordered the date fixed by the said Ordinance for holding second Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Galle:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reason to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges, do hereby order that the Sessions of the Supreme Court appointed to be holden at Galle in the month of September shall this year be holden at Galle on or about Monday, October 22, 1917.

No. 1,019.—THE IMPERIAL ORDER IN COUNCIL OF THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1896.

#### *Amendment of General Passport Regulations.*

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause III. of the Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 21st day of March, 1916, which were brought into operation in the Colony by Proclamations dated the 6th day of August, 1914, and the 20th day of May, 1916, respectively, the Governor is pleased to make the following amendment to the General Passport Regulations, 1917, published as Notification No. 794 in *Gazette Extraordinary* of 4th July, 1917:—

Regulation 6 of the General Passport Regulations, 1917, is cancelled, and the following regulation is substituted therefor:—

6. Any person who—

- (a) Forges, alters, or tampers with any passport or certificate of nationality, whether issued in the Colony or elsewhere, or any endorsement thereon, or without lawful authority uses or has in his possession any such forged, altered, or irregular passport or certificate or any passport or certificate with any such forged, altered, or irregular endorsement; or
- (b) Personates or falsely represents himself to be or not to be a person to whom a passport or certificate of nationality, whether issued in the Colony or elsewhere, has been duly issued or, with intent to obtain a passport or certificate of nationality or any endorsement thereon, knowingly makes any false statement; or
- (c) Allows any other person to have possession of any passport or certificate of nationality issued for his use alone, or without lawful authority has in his possession any passport or certificate of nationality issued for the use of some person other than himself,

shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

This regulation may be cited as the General Passport (Amendment) Regulation, 1917.

## "THE EXCISE ORDINANCE, No. 8 OF 1912."

*Excise Notification No. 61.*

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the conditions and rules regarding the hours of opening and closing places licensed for the sale of liquor, it is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 24 and 31 (1) of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," has been pleased—

- (a) To cancel, with effect from October 1, 1917, general condition 6 of conditions dated March 4, 1914, and published in Excise Notification No. 29 in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 6,615 of March 13, 1914.
- (b) To cancel, with effect from October 1, 1917, the rules dated May 11, 1917, published in Excise Notification No. 59 in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 6,871 of May 11, 1917.
- (c) To make the rules in the schedule hereto, and to declare that the same shall be in force from October 1, 1917.

## SCHEDULE.

*Toddy Taverns.*—For the 1917-18 rent periods, *i.e.*, for the periods ending in the Northern and Eastern Provinces on June 30, 1918, and in the rest of Ceylon on September 30, 1918, toddy taverns shall remain open between the hours of 6 A.M. and 8 P.M., and shall be kept closed at all other hours. The Government Agent may, with the approval of the Excise Commissioner, extend the hour of closing to suit local conditions, and shall enter such hour of closing in the license. No sale shall take place between the time at which the tavern is required to be closed at night and 6 A.M. next morning.

*Arrack Taverns.*—Arrack taverns shall on and after October 1, 1917,

remain open between the hours of 8 A.M. and 6.30 P.M., and shall be kept closed at all other hours. The Government Agent may, after consulting the Advisory Committee, extend the hour of closing any such taverns in towns, and for special reasons outside towns, to such hour as he may fix, not being later than the closing hour of such taverns in April, 1917, and in no case later than 9 P.M., and shall enter the hour of closing in the license. No sale shall take place between the time at which the tavern is required to be closed at night and 8 A.M. next morning.

*Places licensed for the Sale of Foreign Liquor.*—The hours for opening and

closing will be noted on the license by the Government Agent, provided, however, that in cases for which Excise Notification No. 60, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 6,894 of August 24, 1917, has prescribed hours, such prescription of hours shall hold good. No sale of liquor shall take place between the hour at which the premises are required to be closed and the hour fixed for opening. Taverns (including places licensed for the sale of beer and porter only) and bars shall remain closed between the hour fixed for closing and the hour fixed for opening.

## "THE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE, 1891."

WHEREAS an association has been founded, called "The Ceylon Indian Association League," for the following objects:—

- (a) To support the War Loan of 1917 by the purchase of premium bonds issued by the Ceylon Government in connection with such loan;
- (b) To retain, re-invest, and accumulate all moneys received through repayment of any premium bonds which may be drawn for repayment, or from interest, prizes, or other profits, until all the premium bonds purchased shall have been repaid;
- (c) As soon as practicable, after all the premium bonds purchased shall have been repaid, to distribute all moneys received (less working expenses) amongst the subscribers in proportion to the amounts subscribed by them:

And whereas the said association is to be governed, directed, and managed by a Board of Control composed of seventeen members:

And whereas application has been made under section 3 (2) of the above-named Ordinance for the registration of the said association as a specially authorized society under the said Ordinance, to be known as "The Ceylon Indian Association League":

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice of the Executive Council, have been pleased; by virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 3 (2) of the said Ordinance, to authorize that the purpose for which the said association has been founded is a purpose to which the powers and facilities of the said Ordinance ought to be extended.

## "THE TOWN SCHOOLS ORDINANCE, 1906."

IT is hereby notified that the following by-laws made by the Local Board of Jaffna for the town of Jaffna, in exercise of the powers vested in it by sub-section (1) of section 7 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1906, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

*By-laws made under Sections 7 and 8 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906," for the Area described in the Schedule A hereto by the Local Board of the Jaffna Town.*

## 1. In these by-laws—

The terms "boy" and "child" mean respectively a boy or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person who has the actual custody of a child.

The term "Code" means the Code for Aided Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "local authority" means the Local Board of the town of Jaffna.

The term "school" means a school specified in Schedule B hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the meaning defined in section 3 (1) (b) of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

The term "Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector of Schools appointed by His Excellency the Governor.

2. The parent of every boy of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age shall cause such boy to attend one of the schools specified in Schedule B, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance.

3. The time during which a boy shall attend school shall be the whole time on each day for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of the age of such boy.

4. Provided always that nothing in these by-laws—

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the hours when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 9 (2) (d) of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

(b) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which its parent belongs.

5. And provided always that when a child between 10 and 12 years of age, being beneficially employed to the

satisfaction of the Chairman of the Local Board of Jaffna, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that it has passed in reading, writing, and arithmetic, the fourth standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, it shall not be required to attend school.

6. Every parent who shall not observe, or shall neglect or violate, these by-laws or any of them shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 20 for each offence, and an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 10 per day in the case of a continuing offence.

No parent shall be prosecuted unless his child is absent in any month over one-fifth of the number of days during which the school shall be open that month.

NOTE.—The following are the portions of the Town Schools Ordinance referred to in sections 1 and 4 of these by-laws:—

*Section 3 (1) (b).*—A parent shall be deemed to have made adequate and suitable provision for the education of his child, if he proves that his child is in regular attendance at a school registered by the Director of Education for the receipt of a grant in aid, or at a school with regard to which an application for a grant in aid is under consideration, or at a school certified by the Director of Education to provide adequate and suitable instruction; or if he proves that he has made such other provision for his child's education as the Director of Education shall certify to be adequate and suitable, or if he produces a certificate from the Director of Education recommending that the child shall be exempted from compulsory attendance. Provided that no parent shall be convicted for not causing his child to attend such school, if he proves to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that he has reasonable excuse for not causing such child to attend. A parent shall be deemed to have a reasonable excuse for not causing his child to attend school, if he proves that the child is prevented from attending by sickness or other unavoidable cause.

*Section 9 (2).*—No school in which religious instruction is given shall be named in any by-law made under clause (a) of the last preceding section as a school in which efficient provision is made for vernacular education, unless the local authority is satisfied—

(a) That religious instruction is given only during the times specified in the school time table;

(b) That religious instruction is not given to pupils of other denominations than that to which the school belongs if the parents object;

(c) That pupils who do not attend religious instruction are employed in other studies during the hours allotted to religious instruction;

(d) That such pupils if their parents object to their being present in the room where religious instruction is given are either allowed to study in some other part of the school premises during the hours when such instruction is given, or their presence in the school during such hours is excused; and

(e) That a copy of sub-section (2) of this section in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages is conspicuously posted up in the school.

## BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

A public market having been established at Kamachchodai, in the Local Board of Negombo, for the sale of fresh fruit and vegetables, and due notice having been given as required by by-law 1 of Chapter IV. of Schedule D of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, the following by-laws, supplementary to those appearing in the said Chapter IV., have been made by the said Local Board:—

By-law 3A. Provided further that where the owner or lessee of an already existing private fruit and vegetable market approved by the Board is

desirous of commuting with the Chairman of the Local Board of Negombo for the payment of the amount of such licenses in respect of persons exposing for sale in such private market fresh fruit or vegetables, it shall be lawful for the Chairman, in return for a monthly payment of not less than Rs. 5, to be fixed by the Board, to issue a license to such owner or lessee for the use of such private market as a place for the sale of fresh fruit and vegetables, and all persons selling therein, not at any one time in excess of the number for which

accommodation is available as set out in the license, shall be at liberty to sell fresh fruit and vegetables in such market (but nowhere else within the Local Board limits) without the license required by rules 2 and 3.

By-law 3B. Any owner or lessee of a private market allowing persons at any one time in excess of the number appearing in the permit issued to him expose for sale fresh fruit or vegetables or other articles in such market shall be guilty of an offence.

## "THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892."

## REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

*Prohibition of Cesspits and Establishment of Closets on the Dry-earth System.*

1. The Board may order cesspits to be closed when, in the opinion of the proper authority, they are likely to be a danger to the public health, &c.—The Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, when specially empowered thereto by resolution of the Board, may, by notice in writing, require the owner or occupier of any house or building or land having a cesspit in his premises to close such cesspit and substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

2. Permission to bury in private premises.—Permission may be granted in writing by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, to any householder to have night soil from his own premises buried, or otherwise disposed of on his own premises.

3. Removal of night soil to the depot.—Every person (unless especially

exempted in writing thereto by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, under regulation 2), on whose premises the dry-earth system is in operation, is hereby required to cause the daily removal of night soil to a depot appointed by the Board for the disposal of the night soil.

4. Name of person removing night soil to be registered at the Board Office.—Any householder not having received written permission under regulation 2 may employ any person for the purpose of the removal and disposal of night soil. Provided that in the case of such private arrangements being entered into, the name of such person so employed shall be registered at the office of the Board, and the place to which the night soil shall be removed and the method in which it is to be

disposed of shall be submitted to the Board for approval. Permission may be refused by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, to authorize the use of any place for the disposal of night soil.

5. Fee for removal of night soil.—Every person employing a Sanitary Board Officer for the removal of night soil shall pay to the Board such sum as shall be determined by the Chairman, not exceeding Rs. 2 per mensem, for each bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer. Such sum shall be paid to the Chairman of the Sanitary Board on or before the 10th day of the month immediately following that for which the same is due.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 8, 1917.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 105 (4 European, 8 Burghers, 51 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 18 Moors, 9 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 20·4, as against 16·0 in the preceding week, 16·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 89 (10 Burghers, 49 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 9 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 17·3, as against 24·1 in the previous week, 25·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·1 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 89 total deaths, 21 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 16 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 17 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Kotahena, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Slave Island, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

2. Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 10 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Maradana.

4. One death registered in Maradana was supposed to be due to *Plague*. There were 2 deaths from *Plague* in the previous week, and the weekly average for last year was 4. No cases were reported during the week. One case was reported in the previous week.

5. Nine deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Dysentery*, 5 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Tetanus*, 3 from *Diarrhœa*, 2 from *Worms*, and 32 from *Other Causes*.

6. There were reported 11 cases of *Measles*, as against 29 in the previous week; and 3 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 8 in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80·6°, against 81·6° in the preceding week and 80·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·866 in., against 29·903 in. in the preceding week and 29·827 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·99 in., against 0·39 in. in the preceding week and 1·01 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted :—

No. 1,536 of June 13, 1917.

George Ernest Moore &amp; James Hugh Marshall.

"Improvements in apparatus for sorting, classifying, or grading tea leaf or other produce."

Abstract :—The inventors state :—

According to this invention two, three, or more sieves are carried in a retaining box or frame (which can be held in another frame), to which horizontal circular motion is imparted (preferably by means of cranks) from below, although, if preferred it may be swung on swivel joints from above. The said sieves are preferably mounted one above another, and are so arranged that their angle of inclination can be adjusted as required. The topmost sieve is the one of largest mesh, and may be horizontal, the sizes of the meshes of the sieves decreasing downwards, the sieve or sieves below the top one being inclined. Below each sieve is a shoot (preferably corrugated) so arranged and inclined in a direction contrary to that of the sieve above as to convey the leaf which passes through a sieve to the upper end of the inclined sieve immediately below it. Each sieve is provided with a delivery spout, or the like, so as to deliver the leaf, from the tops of the respective sieves, into suitable receptacles.

When the apparatus is in action the leaf which does not pass through the top sieve is discharged therefrom by tipping action. The said top sieve can be provided with a suitable retaining shutter or door, which swings open when the sieve is tilted and closes again when the said sieve returns to its original position. The leaf which passes through the top sieve passes down the inclined shoot below it and falls into the upper end of the inclined sieve immediately beneath it, and, by this sieve, the leaf is again sorted, the leaf which does not pass through the sieve being delivered by the means of the

spout, or the like, into any suitable receptacle, and the leaf which falls through the sieve being conveyed by the inclined shoot below it to the upper end of the next sieve immediately below, where it is again sorted, and so on, with as many sieves as may be used, as it will be understood that two or more sieves may be used in accordance with the number of grades into which it is required to sort the leaf.

The leaf discharged from the top sieve or from any sieve or sieves may be cut or broken, if desired, in any machine suitable for the purpose, and be either passed through the sorting machine again, or be passed through a second machine, should further classification be desired.

The claims are :—

1. In apparatus for sorting, grading, or classifying tea leaf or other produce, the combination of two or more sieves provided with delivery spouts and arranged one above another in a box or frame, to which motion of the character aforesaid is imparted the sieve or sieves below the top sieve being inclined, and each sieve above the bottom one having shoots reversely inclined to the inclination of the sieve or sieves, so that the tea leaf or other produce which passes through a sieve is delivered to the upper end of a sieve beneath it, substantially as hereinbefore explained.

2. An apparatus in accordance with the preceding claiming clause in which the top sieve is arranged so that it can be tilted and is provided with a shutter or door, which opens when the said sieve is tilted and closes when it is returned to its normal position.

3. An apparatus for the purposes aforesaid, the said apparatus being constructed or arranged, substantially as hereinbefore described and illustrated in the accompanying drawings.
