NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 3 of "The Seashore Protection Ordinance, 1911," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the part of the seashore, as set forth in the Schedule A hereto, within the Kalutara District of the Western Province, to be an area from which no sand, stone, coral, or other substance shall be removed, as from and after the date hereof.

"THE SUPERVISION OF ALIENS ORDINANCE, No. 14 OF 1917."

THE following regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under section 9 of "The Supervision of Aliens Ordinance, No. 14 of 1917" (hereinafter referred to in the regulations as "the Ordinance"), are published for general information.

1. The persons liable to make returns and obtain permission under the Ordinance shall include all persons belonging to any of the following classes:—

(a) Aliens engaged in any religious work or occupation, whether of the nature of preaching, teaching, or worship, and including any work or occupation of a ceremonial, devotional, or probationary character;

REGULATIONS.

(b) Aliens engaged in any educational work, whether scholastic, technical, or physical;

(c) Aliens engaged in the administration of any society or institution which carries on religious work or educational work of any of the above-mentioned descriptions as part of its operations.

2. The preceding regulation shall come into operation on September 10, 1917. Any person to whom the said regulation will on coming into force apply, and who shall have failed to

comply with the obligations of section 8 (a) in the bona fide belief that he was not subject to the said obligations, shall, before the said date, furnish to the Colonial Secretary a return in duplicate in the form prescribed in the schedule to the Ordinance.

Any person making default in compliance with this regulation shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction before a Police Magistrate to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or on conviction before a District Court to a fine not exceeding one thousand rupees.

STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 4, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 87 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 47 Sinhales, 12 Tamils, 17 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 16.9, as against 14.2 in the preceding week, 18.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 98 (2 Europeans 6 Burghers, 46 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 17 Moors, 7 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 19.1, as against 25.7 in the previous week, 26.4 in the

corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 98 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 19 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eleven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 8 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Kotahena, 3 in New Bazaar, 3 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta. Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for Of these, 4 were in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana (both non-residents in hospitals), 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta.

3. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 4 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average

for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 in Kotahena. 4. Two deaths from Plague were registered, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

Of these, I was in Pettah and the other in San Sebastian. Two cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

5. Eleven deaths from Debility were registered, 10 from Infantile Convulsions, 2 from Enteritis, 2 from Worms, 1 from Diarrhea, 1 from Dysentery, I from Tetanus, and 42 from Other Causes.

6. There were reported 38 cases of Measles, as against 18 in the previous week, and 5 cases of Chickenpox, as

against 2 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.2°, against 80.9° in the preceding week and 80.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.867 in., against 29.882 in. in the preceding week and 29.872 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.21 in. against 0.43 in. in the preceding week and 0.53 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
