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**VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1903.

**I.—Population.**

THE estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,702,804, an increase of 18,922 on the previous quarter, due to an excess of 12,984 births over deaths and a further excess of 5,938 arrivals over departures of Indian coolies. Table I. in the Appendix gives the area of each Province and district of the Island with its estimated population on the first day of the quarter, and the number of marriages, births, and deaths registered in the quarter.

2. *Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.*—The number of Indian coolies who arrived in the Island during the quarter was 16,446, and fell short of the average for the corresponding quarter of the last five years (16,800) by 354. The departures numbered 10,508, and were less than half the average (21,787).

**II.—Marriages.**

3. *Marriages.*—The number of general marriages (*i.e.*, marriages other than Kandyan or Mohammedan) registered during the quarter was 3,782 and of Kandyan marriages 1,808.

4. Table VI. in the Appendix shows the marriages solemnized in the general community in each Province and district in the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnization, the number of bridegrooms and brides who signed the register with marks, &c.

5. Table VII. in the Appendix gives similar information in respect of the Kandyans.

6. *First Marriages; Re-marriages.*—Of the 3,782 general marriages, 3,340 (equal to 88 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 311 between widowers and spinsters, 81 between bachelors and widows, 45 between widowers and widows, 2 between divorced men and spinsters, 2 between divorced women and bachelors, and 1 between a widower and a divorced woman. Of the 1,808 Kandyan marriages, 1,380 (equal to 76 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 180 between widowers and spinsters, 74 between widowers and widows, 66 between bachelors and widows, 47 between divorced men and spinsters, 33 between divorced women and bachelors, 17 between divorced women and widowers, 6 between divorced men and widows, and 5 between divorced men and divorced women.

7. *Age at Marriage.*—The mean age at marriage among the general community for males was 27·7 and for females 20·3, and among the Kandyans 28·4 for males and 21·2 for females.

8. *Minors.*—In the general community 4 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 49 per cent. of the brides, and among Kandyans 12 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 64 per cent. of the brides, were under 21 years of age.

9. *Mixed Marriages.*—There were 38 mixed marriages in the quarter: 15 between Sinhalese and Tamils, 12 between Burghers and Sinhalese, 6 between Europeans and Burghers, 1 between a European and a Sinhalese, 1 between a European and a Tamil, and 3 other mixed marriages.

10. *Signatures in Marriage Register.*—Of the 7,564 persons married in the general community during the quarter, 930 men and 2,742 women signed the register with marks; that is to say, 75 per cent. of the men and 27 per cent. of the women were able to write their names. Of the 3,616 Kandyans married, 655 men and 1,751 women signed the register with marks; in other words, only 64 per cent. of the men and 3 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

**III.—Births and Deaths.**

11. *Births.*—The births registered during the quarter numbered 38,869 (35 Europeans, 174 Burghers, 28,460 Sinhalese, 7,717 Tamils, 2,326 Moors, 94 Malays, and 63 Others), and were in the proportion of 43·5 to 1,000 persons living per annum, as against 40·8 the average for the corresponding quarter of the period 1898–1902.

12. *Deaths.*—The deaths registered in the quarter numbered 25,885 (22 Europeans, 146 Burghers, 15,219 Sinhalese, 8,467 Tamils, 1,876 Moors, 70 Malays, and 85 Others), and corresponded to an annual rate of 29·0 per 1,000, as against 30·9, the average in the five first quarters of the period 1898–1902.

13. The births and deaths in this quarter are compared in the following Table A with the figures for the previous quarter, the first quarter of the previous year, and the average for the first quarters in the years 1898–1902, from which it will be seen that the birth-rate shows an improvement on the average by 2·7 and that the death-rate has fallen 1·9 per 1,000:—

Table II. in the Appendix gives information similar to that given in Table A in regard to each Province and district; Table I. gives the births and deaths according to sex, with the marriages, population, and area of each Province and district; Table VIII. the births according to nationality and sex; Table IX. the deaths for each month of the quarter, according to nationality, in each Province and district. The causes of death are shown in Table X. for each district; and in Table XI. for the estates in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province; and in Table XII. for the town of Colombo (according to wards and nationalities). Table XIII. shows for the various races the period of life at which deaths occurred in each district.

15. *Sex.*—Of the total number of births (38,869), 19,974 were males and 18,895 females, i.e., 1,057 males to 1,000 females. Of the total number of deaths (25,885), 13,086 were males and 12,799 were females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex, there died 900 males to 1,000 females.

16. *Infant Mortality.*—The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 6,668, and were in the proportion of 172 to 1,000 registered births. The rate of infant mortality varied in different districts, from 452 (for Tamils) in Mullaittivu, 440 (for Tamils) in Mannar, 362 (for Tamils) in Trincomalee, 349 (for Moors) in Puttalam, 342 (for Sinhalese) in Anuradhapura, 333 (for Sinhalese) and 259 (for Tamils) in Puttalam, to 115 (for Sinhalese) in Chilaw, 118 (for Sinhalese) in Colombo, 111 (for Sinhalese) in Kalutara, 108 (for Sinhalese) in Matara, and 86 (for Sinhalese) in Negombo.

#### IV.—State of Public Health.

17. The general health of the population during the quarter was better than usual, the death-rate being (29·0), as against (30·9), the average of the five first quarters of the period 1898–1902. Compared with the average six of the nine Provinces showed improved health, the exceptions being the Northern, the North-Central, and the Uva Provinces.

18. Tables III., IV., and V. in the Appendix show the births and deaths, the birth-rates and death-rates for all ages in the several Provinces and districts in the Island and in the revenue subdivisions of those districts for the quarter under review, the preceding quarter, the corresponding quarter of last year, and the average rates for the five first quarters of the period 1898–1902. The rates shown are for the Sinhalese only in the districts which are mainly inhabited by the Sinhalese, and for Tamils only where the Tamils form the bulk of the population. In the Puttalam District, where the Sinhalese and Mohammedans are found in almost equal numbers, and in the Batticaloa District, which is inhabited by Tamils and Mohammedans, in equal numbers, the rates are separately given for the different sections of the population.

19. The healthiest Province was, as usual, the Western (23·0). The healthiest district Negombo (17·7), and the healthiest division Panawal korale of the Kegalla District (14·4).

20. *Western Province.*—The Western Province with an estimated population of 784,236 Sinhalese showed a Sinhalese death-rate of 20·7 during the quarter, a rate which though slightly in excess of the preceding quarter (20·1), shows an improvement when compared with the average (22·2) and the rate for the corresponding quarter of the last year (23·9). Each of its three districts showed improved health as compared with the period 1898–1902.

21. In the Colombo District the Sinhalese who number about 445,000, showed a death-rate of 21·4 during the quarter, as against 22·1, the average of the first quarters in the period 1898–1902, 24·7 the rate for the corresponding quarter of the last year, and 20·3 the rate in the preceding quarter. Compared with the average all its subdivisions, except the Colombo Municipality, showed improved health. This division is dealt with at greater length in chapter VII. The birth-rate of the district (42·4), though lower than in the corresponding quarter of last year (44·3), was an improvement on the average (41·9), as well as the rate in the preceding quarter (39·7). The highest birth-rate in the district was in Hewagam korale (50·2), and the highest death-rate in the Colombo Municipality (37·6).

22. The Negombo District showed a death-rate of 16·5, a considerable improvement on the average (20·9), and the rate for the corresponding quarter of last year (21·6). Each of its three subdivisions shared in the improvement, notably the Negombo Local Board, where the death-rate declined to 25·1 during the quarter from an average of 35·5. The healthiest division in the district was Alutkuru korale north (14·9). The births registered in the district were at the rate of 44·8 per mille per annum, as against an average of 51·1 per mille during the period 1898–1902. The highest birth-rate was in the Hapitigam korale 48·5, and the lowest in the Negombo Local Board (33·8).

23. In the Kalutara District the deaths registered were in the proportion of 22·2 per 1,000 per annum almost identical with the rate in the previous quarter (22·1), but lower than the average in the period 1898–1902 (23·4), and the rate for the corresponding quarter of the preceding year (23·5). The lowest death-rate among the subdivisions was in Pasdun korale east (19·1), and the highest in Kalutara Local Board (24·1). The birth-rates in the subdivisions ranged between 47·8 in the Pasdun korale west and 38·7 in the Kalutara Local Board.

24. *Central Province.*—The health of the Sinhalese inhabitants in the Central Province was satisfactory, their death-rate during the quarter (29·3) being lower than the average (32·3) as well as the rates in the preceding quarter (32·2), and in the corresponding quarter of the last year (33·3). Two of its three districts, viz., Kandy and Matale, showed lower death-rates than the average as well as the rates in the previous quarter and the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

25. The Kandy District showed a rate of mortality of 28·2 per 1,000 persons living, an improvement on the average (29·6), as well as the rates in the previous quarter (31·3) and in the corresponding quarter of 1902 (31·1). Eight out of its ten subdivisions showed better health than usual. The healthiest division was Uda Bulatgama (20·5) and the unhealthiest Uda Dumbara (36·3), followed by Harispattu (29·2). The Kandy Municipality showed a death-rate of 27·8 for all ages and 226 for infants, the latter being the highest rate recorded in the quarter in any division of the district. The birth-rate of the district during the quarter (55·5) was an improvement on the average (52·3). The highest birth-rate in the district and in fact in the Province was in Harispattu (68·1).

26. The health of the inhabitants of the Matale District showed a great improvement on the average, their death-rate for the quarter (34·4) being over ten per 1,000 less than the average. The healthiest division in the district was Matale south (30·2), and the unhealthiest Matale north (37·9) followed by Matale east (37·7). This division also showed the highest rate of mortality in the Province among infants, 274 per 1,000 births registered.

27. The Nuwara Eliya District recorded a death-rate of 27·2 per mille during the quarter and was the healthiest district in the Central Province. This rate was lower than the average (27·3), and the rate in the previous quarter (32·0), but in excess of the rate for the corresponding quarter of the last year (26·9). Nuwara Eliya Local Board (16·2) showed the lowest death-rate in the district and in the Province, and the highest death-rate recorded in the district was in Uda Hewaheta (33·2).

28. *Northern Province.*—The inhabitants of the Northern Province, consisting chiefly of Tamils, who at the beginning of the quarter were estimated to number about 335,000, showed a deterioration in health, their death-rates rising to 48·7 from an average of 37·7. Each of its three districts, Jaffna, Mannar, and Mullaittivu contributed to this deterioration. The birth-rate during the quarter (41·1) was an improvement on the average (35·2), the improvement being confined to the Jaffna and Mannar Districts.

29. In the Jaffna District the death-rate in the quarter was 10·5 per 1,000 in excess of the average and the birth-rate (40·7) was about 6 per 1,000 above the average for the period 1898–1902. All its subdivisions showed worse health than usual, except Valikamam west (31·0), Vadamaradchi west (34·1), and Punakari (49·2). The two former were the healthiest divisions in the district during the quarter, the unhealthiest divisions being Vadamaradchi east (92·7), Tenmaradchi (83·7), and Karaichchi (73·2). These three divisions showed an increase of 34·8, 37·8, and 44·5 on their respective averages, remittent (or malarial) fever being largely responsible for the increased mortality.

30. The death-rate in the Mannar District was in the proportion of 71·2 and the birth-rate was 47·2 per mille per annum, as against the averages of 53·8 and 37·3 respectively, showing an increase of 17·4 in the death-rate and of 9·9 in the birth-rate. The three subdivisions ranged in the following order in point of health, Mantai division 58·6 (average 56·7), Nanaddan 76·0 (average 65·4), and Mannar Islands division 79·8 (average 44·0).

31. The Mullaittivu District showed a lower birth-rate (43·1) and a higher death-rate (70·3) than the averages 43·6 and 52·8 respectively. Two of its three subdivisions showed enhanced death-rates, the exception being Maritime pattu, where the death-rate fell to 52·9 from the average 56·5. The decline in health in the Vavuniya south division, where the rate of mortality rose to 102·4 from an average of 46·9, while the birth-rate fell to 43·3 from an average of 43·4 is especially noticeable.

32. *Southern Province.*—The Southern Province, which contains an estimated population of over 550,000 Sinhalese, showed a Sinhalese death-rate of 24·9 for the quarter, as against an average of 26·6 for the first quarter in the period 1898–1902. The birth-rate was 48·2 which is an improvement of nearly 2 per 1,000 on the average (46·5). Of the three districts Galle shows a lower birth-rate and a higher death-rate than the average, while both Matara and Hambantota show higher birth-rates and lower death-rates than the average.

33. The rise in the death-rate of Galle District in the quarter (26·2), as compared with the average (25·8), is slight. Of the subdivisions Gangaboda pattu, Wellaboda pattu, and Talpe pattu show improved health as compared with the average, while the rest show a deterioration.

34. Matara District showed improved health in the quarter as compared with the average, the death-rate declining to 22·9 from 24·5. The improvement in health is shared by all its subdivisions, except the Four Gravets beyond Local Board limits, and Weligam korale, the death-rate of the former rising from an average of 20·3 to 23·1 in the quarter, and of the latter from an average of 22·5 to 22·6 in the quarter.

35. The death-rate of Hambantota District fell from an average of 31·2 to 25·3 in the quarter. The improvement in health extended to all the subdivisions of the district, except the town and gravets, where the rate rose to 40·4 from an average of 38·6.

36. *Eastern Province.*—The Tamil death-rate of the Eastern Province fell to 30·4 from an average of 33·7, the improvement in health being shared by both its districts.

37. In the Batticaloa District, which has a population of about 82,000 Tamils and 56,000 Moors, both races showed improved health in the quarter, their death-rates 28·8 and 26·4 being lower than the averages 30·7 and 27·9 respectively. The highest death-rate for Tamils was in Korallai pattu (37·0 against an average of 45·0), and the lowest in Eruvil and Poratuvu pattus (20·4 against an average of 25·3). The unhealthiest division for Moors was Manmunai pattu north, with a death-rate of 47·2, as against an average of 46·6, and the healthiest Eravur and Rukam pattus, where the death-rate was 14·6 against its average 24·1.

38. The comparatively small community of Sinhalese in the district, numbering about 7,600, usually fare worse than the Tamils and Moors. The death-rate for Sinhalese in the district was as high as 46·9 in the quarter, as against an average of 42·3. In only three out of the eleven subdivisions of the district do the Sinhalese number more than a thousand. In Bintenna the death-rate fell to 40·6 from an average of 46·2. In Akkarai pattu the rate was as high as 62·7, being more than double the average 39·7. In Panawa pattu the rate rose to 51·6 from the average 51·2.

39. In the Trincomalee District the death-rate (for the Tamils) fell to 38·0 from an average of 47·3. The improvement in health was shared by all the subdivisions of the district, the healthiest being Tampalakamam division, where the rate fell to 24·7 from the average 44·0. The birth-rate in the district (35·1) also showed an improvement on the average (30·2), Koddiyar pattu 45·0 (average 42·0) showing the highest and Trincomalee town 29·9 (average 23·8), the lowest birth-rate among the subdivisions in the district.

40. *North-Western Province.*—The Sinhalese in the North-Western Province enjoyed better health in the quarter than in any corresponding period for which rates are available. The reduction in the death-rate (23·6), as compared with the average (37·9), amounts to 38 per cent. This large improvement in health was shared by all the three districts.

41. The death-rate for Sinhalese in Kurunegala District fell to 24·8 from an average of 41·8. Every subdivision shared in the improved health. The highest rate was as usual in the town of Kurunegala (46·2), and the lowest as usual in Katugampola hatpattu (14·8), nearly the lowest in the Island (this quarter). In the remaining divisions the rates ranged from 21·3 in Dambadeni hatpattu to 35·0 in Wanni hatpattu the unhealthiest (as usual) of all the seven rural divisions of the district.

42. In the Puttalam District the death-rate for Sinhalese fell to 33·5 from an average of 44·4. The Tamil and Moor death-rates (40·5 and 48·9 respectively) show like improvement as compared with the average (49·2 and 55·9 respectively). Of the divisions the lowest death-rate was in Puttalam division (16·8 for Sinhalese, 25·1 for Tamils, and 34·1 for Moors), and the highest, excluding the town, in Kalpitiya division (53·8 for Moors and 47·8 for Tamils).

43. In the Chilaw District the Sinhalese death-rate fell to 17·6 from an average of 21·9. The improved health was shared by three out of the four divisions of the district. In the remaining division, Pitigal korale south, the healthiest in the district and one of the healthiest in the Island, the rate in the quarter (16·0) was identical with the average.

44. *North-Central Province.*—Anuradhapura District had a death-rate of 58·1 in the quarter, as against the average 53·8, both these rates being higher than the corresponding birth-rate. Excluding from consideration the small division of the town, two divisions, Kalagampala and Tamankaduwapalata, showed lower death-rates as compared with the average (46·4 for the former and 35·7 for the latter, against their respective averages 54·5 and 63·3), while the other two divisions, Nuwaragampala and Hurulupalata together containing three-fourths of the population of the district showed enhanced rates, the former division 58·9, as against the average 54·3, and the latter 67·5, as against the average 52·0.

45. *The Province of Uva or Badulla District* enjoyed better health than usual, the death-rate having declined to 38·3 from an average of 39·8. The improvement in health was shared by all its divisions, except Wellawaya, the unhealthiest division in the quarter, with a death-rate 57·0 (nearly 30 per cent. in excess of the average 44·0), and Wiyaluwa (37·5 as against the average 36·8). The healthiest divisions were Yatikinda and Udukinda, whose death-rates were 29·5 and 29·6 respectively.

46. *Province of Sabaragamuwa.*—This Province, too, fared better than usual. The death-rate 26·3 was lower than the average by 4·9 per 1,000 and was less than half the birth-rate 57·3. Both the districts forming the Province show lower death-rates as well as higher birth-rates than usual.

47. In the Ratnapura District the death-rate (29·8) showed a reduction of 16 per cent. below the average. The improvement in health extended to all the divisions, except Kolonna korale, whose rate rose to 35·9 from the average 31·3. The unhealthiest division was Kadawat korale (37·1), which too, however, fared better than usual, its average rate being 51·2. The healthiest division was Kukulu korale with a death-rate of 22·2.

48. In the Kegalla District the death-rate fell to 23·5 from an average of 26·4. Eight out of the nine divisions shared in the improvement, the exception being Dehigumpal korale, whose rate rose to 25·6 from the average 23·4. Panawal korale was the healthiest division with a death-rate of 14·4. This was also the healthiest division in the Island in the quarter.

#### V.—Causes of Deaths.

49. The causes of deaths registered in the Island during the quarter are given in Table X., and are summarized below:—

50. *Fever and Diarrhoeal Diseases.*—Of the 25,885 deaths registered in the Island, 5,609 were reported as due to various forms of fever and 5,084 to diarrhoeal diseases, i.e., fever and diarrhoeal diseases contributed 41 per cent. of the total number of deaths.

51. *Cholera.*—Under the head “Diarrhoeal Diseases” are included 5 deaths from cholera, all of which occurred in the Kandy District. There were only 3 cases of smallpox this quarter (2 in Colombo and 1 in Matara); 4 deaths were due to chickenpox (1 each in Colombo, Kandy, Nuwara Eliya, and Kegalla), and 95 to measles (83 in Jaffna, 3 in Galle, 2 each in Kalutara, Batticaloa, Anuradhapura, and Kegalla, and 1 in Ratnapura). Eighteen deaths resulted from whooping cough (10 in Galle, 7 in Colombo, and 1 in Negombo). Diphtheria and cerebro-spinal fever were responsible for 1 death each. Influenza caused 12 deaths, of which 8 occurred in Nuwara Eliya, 2 in Badulla, and 1 each in Kalutara and Kandy.

52. The other chief cause of deaths were infantile convulsions 2,511, debility 1,304, phthisis 808, pneumonia 794, anaemia 748, general dropsy 735, worms 353, old age 551, puerperal convulsions 320, malarial cachexia 239, premature birth 237, thrush 217, bronchitis 178, rheumatism 155, paralysis 105, dochmimus duodenalis 79, and cancer 63.

53. *Deaths by Violence.*—Of the 399 deaths attributed to accidents, 98 were due to falls from trees, 84 to drowning, 50 to snake bite, 28 to burns or scalds, 23 to suffocation, 21 to gunshot wounds, 20 to injuries at birth, 10 to falls of heavy substance, 6 to falls from heights, 4 to poison, 4 to being run over by train, 4 to explosions of gunpowder, 2 to injuries caused by hornets, 2 to being caught in machinery, 2 to cutting or stabbing, 2 to injuries caused by leopards, 2 to injuries caused by crocodiles, 1 to injuries caused by blows, and 1 to injuries caused by an elephant. One death was due to rat-bite, 1 to the stings of bees, 1 to lightning, 1 to a fall into a pit, and 1 to being run over by a cart.

54. *Suicide.*—Thirty-eight deaths were attributed to suicide, of which 26 were by hanging, 4 by drowning, 4 by gunshot wounds, 3 by poison, and 1 by cut or stab.

55. *Homicide.*—Thirty-four deaths were attributed to homicide (6 in Colombo, 4 each in Kalutara and, Kegalla, 3 in Negombo, 2 each in Kandy, Galle, Batticaloa, and Badulla, and 1 each in Jaffna, Mullaithivu, Trincomalee, Kurunegala, Chilaw, Anuradhapura, and Ratnapura).

56. *Executions.*—Judicial executions registered in the quarter numbered 4 (2 in Colombo, and 2 in Kandy.)

#### VI.—Health of the Estate Population.

57. The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province was 2,695 (11 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 2,568 Tamils, 21 Moors, 8 Malays, and 3 Others), and the total number of deaths was 2,451 (3 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 73 Sinhalese, 2,357 Tamils, 10 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 Others), corresponding to an annual birth-rate of 26·0 and a death-rate of 23·6 per mille, as against the respective averages of 20·5 and 27·4 for 1898–1902. The causes of death are given in Table XI., and may be summarized as follows:—

59. *Kandy District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kandy District was 983 (3 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 23 Sinhalese, 943 Tamils, 7 Moors, and 4 Malays), and the deaths numbered 796 (2 Europeans, 1 Burgher, 17 Sinhalese, 770 Tamils, 5 Moors, and 1 Other). The birth-rate during the quarter was 25·6, as against 20·8, the mean rate for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902; and the death-rate was 20·8, as against 27·0, the mean rate for the corresponding period of 1898-1902. The most fatal causes of death were, as usual, diarrhoeal diseases, 258 (5 from cholera, 117 diarrhoea, and 136 dysentery) deaths, or nearly 32 per cent. of the total number of deaths (796). The other chief causes were debility (mostly of infants from inability to suck) 177, general dropsy 52, pneumonia 49, infantile convulsions 37, malarial cachexia 31, old age 26, anaemia 13, dochmimus duodenalis 13, and premature birth 12.

60. *Matale District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Matale District was 129 (1 European, 5 Sinhalese, 119 Tamils, 2 Moors, and 2 Malays), and the deaths numbered 174 (1 Burgher, 11 Sinhalese, and 162 Tamils). The birth-rate recorded for the quarter (20·0) was in excess of the corresponding quarters in the period 1898-1902 (18·9); and the death-rate was 27·6, as against the mean rate 34·7 for the first quarters of 1898-1902. Dysentery and diarrhoea were responsible for 32 deaths. The chief causes of death were fevers 27, general dropsy 22, pneumonia 22, debility 16, old age 10, malarial cachexia 6, and infantile convulsions 6.

61. *Nuwara Eliya District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Nuwara Eliya District was 700 (2 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 14 Sinhalese, 670 Tamils, 8 Moors, and 2 Others), and the deaths numbered 496 (2 Burghers, 16 Sinhalese, 475 Tamils, and 3 Moors). The birth-rate during the quarter was 27·4, as against the mean rate 17·9 for the corresponding period of 1898-1902; and the death-rate 19·4, as against the average (18·1) for the period 1898-1902. The chief causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases 155 (88 dysentery and 67 diarrhoea), which caused nearly 32 per cent. of the total number of deaths (496). Debility caused 112 deaths (mostly of infants from inability to suck), pneumonia 41, general dropsy 24, infantile convulsions 19, fevers 17, bronchitis 12, and old age 10.

62. *Badulla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Badulla District was 397 (1 European, 1 Burgher, 8 Sinhalese, 384 Tamils, 1 Moor, and 2 Malays), and the deaths numbered 360 (1 European, 4 Sinhalese, 354 Tamils and 1 Malay). The birth-rate for the quarter was 31·1, as against the average for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902, 22·7; and the death-rate was 28·2, as against the average 22·2. The chief causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 148 deaths (87 diarrhoea and 61 dysentery), or nearly 41 per cent. of the total number of deaths (360). The other chief natural causes were debility 90 (mostly of infants from inability to suck), pneumonia 21, fevers 15, infantile convulsions 12, old age 11, and general dropsy 8.

63. *Ratnapura District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Ratnapura District was 101 (2 Europeans, 3 Sinhalese, 95 Tamils and 1 Moor), and the deaths numbered 122 (3 Sinhalese, 118 Tamils, and 1 Moor). The birth-rate for the quarter was 24·6, as against 24·9, the average for the corresponding period of 1898-1902; and the death-rate was 29·7, as against the average 39·8. Here, as elsewhere, the chief natural causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 51 deaths (33 dysentery and 18 diarrhoea), or nearly 42 per cent. of the total number of deaths (122). The other chief causes of death were debility 12, malarial cachexia 8, infantile convulsions 7, old age 7, dochmimus duodenalis 5, and pneumonia 5.

64. *Kegalla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kegalla District for the quarter was 230 (1 European, 17 Sinhalese, 210 Tamils, and 2 Moors), and the deaths numbered 298 (14 Sinhalese, 283 Tamils, and 1 Moor). The birth-rate for the quarter (11·3), showed a decrease of 14·4 from the average for the corresponding period of 1898-1902 (25·7); and the death-rate was 14·6, as against the average 38·6. The chief natural causes were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 107 deaths (59 diarrhoea and 48 dysentery), or nearly 36 per cent. of the total number of deaths 298. The other chief causes were debility 34 (mostly of infants from inability to suck), malarial cachexia 32, infantile convulsions 20, fever 15, pneumonia 13, dochmimus duodenalis 10, childbirth 8, phthisis 6, and anaemia 5.

65. *Colombo District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Colombo District was 41 (2 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, and 1 Other), and the deaths numbered 53 (3 Sinhalese, 48 Tamils, and 2 Others). The birth-rate during the quarter was 20·0, as against the average 17·0 for the corresponding period of 1898-1902; and the death-rate was 25·9, as against the average 57·6. Here, too, as elsewhere, diarrhoeal diseases caused the largest number of deaths, i.e., 20 or nearly 38 per cent. of the total number of deaths (53). The other chief natural causes of death were fevers 11, ascites 4, debility 3, and phthisis 3.

66. *Kalutara District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kalutara District was 114 (1 European, 4 Sinhalese, and 109 Tamils), and the deaths numbered 152 (5 Sinhalese and 147 Tamils). The birth-rate recorded for the quarter was 27·7, as against the average 14·8 for the preceding five first quarters, and the death-rate was 36·9, as against 43·5 the average. As usual, the most fatal causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases 47 (33 diarrhoea and 14 dysentery), debility 27, malarial cachexia 14, fever 11, general dropsy 10, old age 5, and phthisis 5.

#### VII.—Health of the Town of Colombo.

67. The births registered in the town of Colombo numbered 979 and corresponded to an annual rate of 24·6 per mille, an increase of 2·0 per mille on the average (22·6).

68. The deaths registered numbered 1,432. To these have been added 2 deaths of town residents, which occurred in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta (outside the town limits), and which were registered by an extra urban registrar, making a total of 1,434 deaths, and corresponding to a rate of 36·0 per mille per annum, also nearly 2 per mille higher than the average 34·4.

69. As usual, in the town, the death-rate exceeded the birth-rate, due mainly to the preponderance of males over females (chiefly among Europeans, Indian Tamils, and Mohammedans), to the presence of hospitals, which add to the normal mortality of the town, and to the registration of births being still defective.

70. The subjoined Table E gives the births and deaths and their rates for each race in the first quarters of 1903 and 1902, and the average for the first quarters in 1898–1902:—

71. Too much reliance should not be placed on the birth- and death-rates given in the above table for Europeans Malays, and the races classed together as "Others" as their population is too small for purposes of rate calculation.

72. Excluding the rates for these sections, the lowest death-rate was among the Burghers (30·5, an increase of 4·3 on their average), followed by the Moors (32·9, against an average of 33·9 in 1898–1902), and the highest death-rate was among the Tamils (38·9, against an average of 37·8), followed by the Sinhalese, who also show a high rate (37·6, against an average of 35·1).

73. The highest birth-rate (31·7) was among the Sinhalese, followed closely by the Burghers (28·9). The lowest birth-rate was among the Tamils (12·2), the low birth-rate and the high death-rate of this community are due to their including a male adult floating population and a large number of poor and destitute immigrant coolies.

74. The number of births and deaths of the different wards in the town, their rates per mille per annum, the principal zymotic causes of death, &c., during the quarter are shown in the following table F:—

75. The low birth- and death-rates of the Fort and Galle Face and the Pettah Wards are due to their population being chiefly a floating male adult one. Excluding these two divisions, the healthiest division in the town was, as usual, the Kollupitiya Ward, with a death-rate of 17·4 per 1,000 per annum, and the unhealthiest the New Bazaar Ward, where the death-rate was 33·2. The highest birth-rate was in the New Bazaar Ward (26·9) and the next highest in Kotahena (23·4), followed by Maradana (23·3).

76. There were no deaths from cholera or measles. One death from smallpox and one from chickenpox occurred in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta, to which the patients were removed from the town.

77. Phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia were fatal in 319 cases (against an average of 250 in the corresponding period of the last five years), diarrhoea and dysentery in 231 (average 214), fever in 129, including 28 of enteric fever (average 24), and 36 of remittent fever (average 43), infantile convulsions in 118 (average 113), old age in 64 (average 69), tetanus in 70 (average 24), premature birth in 26 (average 27), diseases of the circulatory system in 23 (average 26), worms in 20 (average 29), dochmias duodenalis in 17 (average 18); malarial cachexia in 14 (average 23), parturition in 8 (average 22).

78. Twenty-four deaths were attributed to accidents, of which 5 were due to drowning, 4 to burns and scalds, 1 to cutting or stabbing, 1 to being gored by a bull, 2 to being run over by carts, 1 to being run over by a train, 3 to falls from trees, 1 to a fall from a height other than a tree, 3 to the fall of heavy substances, 1 to being caught in machinery.

79. Four deaths were attributed to homicide and three to suicide.

#### VIII.—Health of other Towns.

80. The following Table G shows the birth- and death- rates in each of the principal towns of the Island for the first quarters of 1903 and 1902, and the average rates for the first quarters in 1898–1902:—

81. The death-rates are given inclusive of hospitals and jail deaths as well as exclusive. In some of the towns, which attract large numbers of estate coolies and destitute poor to the hospitals, the difference between the two rates is striking, *e.g.*, Panadure 48·1 and 28·6, Nawalapitiya 56·6 and 16·7, Matale 80·3 and 27·8, Badulla 51·8 and 20·6, Ratnapura 53·2 and 24·2, Kegalla 42·0 and 15·6. Exclusive of deaths in hospitals and jails, the lowest death rate was in Nuwara Eliya 11·5, followed by Tangalla 14·3, Kegalla 15·6, Nawalapitiya 16·7, Kandy 18·5.
