NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorized by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A list consolidating all previous lists was published on June 22, 1917 (the Consolidating List No. 29a), which, together with List No. 30 of July 6, 1917, and the list herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The lists are published in the *London Gazette* and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

* NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of June 25 and November 10, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimize as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph, he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the list. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the list as they appear. The lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H. M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

† NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English Company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under Berg and Komeet respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 15, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 87 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 48 Sinhalas, 12 Tamils, 13 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 16.9, as against 20.4 in the preceding week, 19.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 76 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 41 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 12 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 14.8, as against 17.3 in the previous week, 23.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 76 total deaths, 15 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 7 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Six deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 7 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana and 1 in St. Paul's.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered during the week. One death registered in the previous week was supposed to be due to *Plague*. No cases were reported either in this week or in the previous week.

5. Eleven deaths from *Debility* were registered, 3 from *Enteritis*, 3 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 from *Diarrhæa*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 35 from *Other Causes*.

6. There were reported 22 cases of *Measles*, as against 11 in the previous week; and 4 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 3 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.0°, against 80.6° in the preceding week and 80.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.826 in., against 29.866 in. in the preceding week and 29.823 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.03 in., against 0.99 in. in the preceding week and 0.68 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1917.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Maha season : in some parts fields are being prepared for the maha season, and in some places plants are thriving well.
Yala season : in some divisions fields are ready for harvesting, and in some places plants are ripening.
Other products : flowering and prospects of coconuts are fairly good. The estimated crop for the month is 20,164,029 nuts.
Fruits and vegetables are to be had in fair quantity.
Prices of staple products : (a) imported rice is sold at Rs. 5 to Rs. 6.50 per bushel ; (b) coconuts are sold at Rs. 15 to Rs. 20 per 1,000.
Harvest prospects : generally good.
Rainfall : there was sufficient rain during the month.
Health of inhabitants : generally good, except for a few cases of chickenpox, enteric fever, dysentery, and measles.
Health of cattle : unsatisfactory. There have been several cases of rinderpest in Colombo Mudaliyar's division, 8 cases of rinderpest in Siyane korale east. Rinderpest is prevailing in the villages of Petiyagoda, Pattiwila, Enderamulla, Pamunuwila, Henaratgoda, and Sinharamulla in Siyane korale west. There were 8 cases of rinderpest in Alutkuru korale south, and few cases in Alutkuru korale north. Rinderpest is also prevailing in many villages in Hewagam korale, and there were 3 cases of rinderpest in Hapitigam korale.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy : the reaping of the yala harvest commenced during the month.
Dry grain : nothing worth reporting.
Other products : fruit was scarce. There was a fair supply of vegetables, except in Pasdun korale. The flowering of coconuts was fair. The crop of coconuts for the month is estimated at 3,115,000 nuts.
Prices of staple products : imported rice, Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 7 per bushel ; country rice in Pasdun korale east, Rs. 6 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 18 to Rs. 50 per 1,000 by retail.
Remarks on harvest prospects generally : a fairly good harvest can be expected, except in the totamunes.
Rainfall at Kalutara : total, 2.71 in. ; average, .08 in.
Health of people : satisfactory.
Health of cattle : rinderpest existed in the totamunes, Rayigam korale, and Pasdun korale east.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, August 3, 1917.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 27, 1917.

Present :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. L. B. Fernando ; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. Arthur Alvis ; Mr. H. L. de Mel ; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene ; Dr. E. V. Ratnam ; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo ; Mr. J. A. Perera ; Mr. F. R. Senanayake ; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford ; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles ; Mr. W. A. Cave ; Mr. Harold Creasy ; and Mr. J. K. Hormusjee.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 13, 1917, having been previously printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 13, 1917, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following :—There have been 6 cases of human plague, but no cases of rat plague since the last meeting, making a total up to July 31 last of 180 human and 51 rat cases, as against 154 human and 39 rat cases during the corresponding period of last year, while in the preceding year there were 36 cases of human plague. Of the 6 human cases, 2 of the cases mentioned, which were returned as cases of septicæmic plague, were not bacteriologically confirmed ; the rest were bubonic.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the Chairman : (a) How many prosecutions have been entered by the officers of this Council against Mr. K. G. Silva of Regent street in connection with his timber sawing mill at No. 13, Regent street ? (b) What expenses the Council has incurred in the shape of lawyers' fees in these cases ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(a) Three prosecutions. (b) The legal expenses were : first case Rs. 42, second case Rs. 115·50, third case Rs. 126 = Rs. 283·50, costs in appeal case Rs. 203·27 ; total Rs. 486·77.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the papers in connection with these prosecutions be circulated among the Members of this Council, and, in doing so, stated that there appeared to be an impression abroad that the defendant had not been merely prosecuted but persecuted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.

The Chairman stated that there had been no persecution, but that the Council's action had been entirely in the interests of the rate-payers of the vicinity, who were very much inconvenienced and annoyed by the noise created by the engine and sawing mill.

Mr. C. P. Dias spoke with regard to the nuisance, and hoped that the Chairman would take further steps to rid the neighbourhood of it.

The Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford and Mr. E. G. Jayewardene were of opinion that the nuisance should be suppressed.

The motion was put to the meeting and declared carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved that, in view of the impending departure of Mr. Cammack, the Y. M. C. A. Director of Games, the Chairman request him to oblige the Council by suggesting the steps to be taken for providing the poorer children with physical exercise and other amusements in the different parts of the city. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

The Chairman referred to the initiation of the games and physical exercises at Price park, and the happy results already attending the experiment. He invited members to visit Price park and to see for themselves the apparent benefits being derived from the scheme.

The motion was put to the meeting and declared carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 6 to 11 (inclusive) on the agenda. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 18, 1917, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 14, 1917.

Present : The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. C. A. La Brooy; and Mr. L. H. S. Pieris.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 21, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1916 to July 31, 1917, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for July.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, during the month of July.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for July.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during July.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 10,361 of August 6, 1917, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, *re* proposed by-law to close Jail road to motor traffic between the hours of 6 P.M. and 6 A.M. Resolved—That the by-law be adopted, the hours being altered to 9 P.M. and 3 A.M.

(2) Letter of August 1, 1917, from Mr. S. W. de Silva asking for permission to erect a porch in front of his house, No. 333, Trincomalee street. Resolved—That permission be allowed subject to the payment of rent according to authorized scale of fees for overhead encroachment.

(3) Letter of August 17 from Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu applying for the free use of the Town Hall for a meeting to consider the desirability of forming an association to conserve the interests of the inhabitants of the Central Province. Resolved—That the use of the Hall be allowed on payment of usual fee.

5. Application from the Municipal Staff for an advance of Rs. 3,450 for the purchase of Ceylon War Bonds.—It was agreed that the application be allowed on the following terms :—Bonds to be obtained in favour of Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy, and to be transferred on repayment of the advance to the different officers. Interest on the bond, pending transfer to the officer, to go to the Council—any premium won by the bond to go to the officer.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That half the cost of removal and re-erection on another site of the public latrine at the back of the land offered for a Muhammadan school be borne by the Council.

Market and Sanitation.

(2) That the fee for a special license to slaughter a goat or pig be fixed at Re. 1.

(3) That the following by-law be adopted :—Every privy shall be so screened that all parts of the interior of and entrance to such privy shall be effectually excluded from view from any street, railway, public garden, public park, or any domestic building other than that to which it belongs.

Finance and Assessment.

(4) That the following payments be passed :—(i.) Rs. 31·77 to Mr. W. Mathiesz, temporarily employed during the absence of the Storekeeper on military duty ; (ii.) Rs. 13·92 overtime claim by the Revenue Clerk.

(5) That Nuisance Watcher, Meerasa, be paid a gratuity of Rs. 255.

(6) That the cemetery coolies be provided with 6 uniform suits at Rs. 9·50 each.

(7) That the Supervisor of Conservancy be allowed a special remuneration of Re. 1·50 a day for six days for extra work during the Perahera.

Municipal Works.

(8) That the following by-law be adopted :—In the event of any building or premises which may front or abut upon any street being used for the purposes of a garage, it shall not be lawful for the owner or occupier of such premises, without the permission of the Chairman, to have more than one way of access for motor cars to such street in the case of a frontage not exceeding 35 feet, and more than two ways of access for motor cars, one for exit and the other for entrance, in the case of a frontage exceeding 35 feet. No such way of access shall, without the permission of the Chairman, exceed 10 feet in width.

(9) That the following estimates be passed :—(i.) Drain from Lady Gordon's road to Trincomalee street, Rs. 80 ; (ii.) for taking levels on Katusgastota road in connection with scheme for the proposed extension of the water service, Rs. 50.

(10) That the following applications for water service be allowed on usual terms :—56A, King street, S. A. Ratnayake ; 103, Trincomalee street, S. M. Cassim ; 207, Trincomalee street, T. Kamachi Amma ; 20, Katukel Lake road, D. S. Perera ; 12, Bahirawakanda road, P. Palawandrem. Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

"An improved machine for washing and disintegrating raw rubber and materials containing raw rubber or the like."

Abstract.—The inventor states:—

The object of the present invention is to provide an improved rubber-milling machine wherein the milling and macerating action is more efficiently performed, the primary feature of which is that the milling disc or discs is or are provided with ribs or projections upon both the side surfaces and the periphery or peripheries, so that milling action occurs

between all the surfaces of the disc or discs and adjacent surfaces of or within the shell. It will be readily seen that in this way the area of milling surfaces is very much increased and the milling action rendered much more efficient.

The claims are:—

1. An apparatus for washing, milling, and cleaning rubber and the like comprising a vertically disposed milling disc having ribs or projections on both its side surfaces and also its periphery, a shell or casing within which the milling disc is mounted to rotate, said shell being splayed at its upper end to form a hopper and conforming at its lower end to the shape of the disc, and ribs or projections upon the interior surfaces of the shell so arranged in relation to the ribs or projections of the milling disc that a milling action occurs between both the side and peripheral surfaces of the disc and the adjacent surfaces within the shell, substantially as specified.
2. An apparatus for washing, milling, and cleaning rubber and the like consisting of a plurality of rotating discs and interspaced stationary division plates, both the discs and the plates being provided with side and peripheral projections, between which discs and plates the rubber is milled, substantially as described.
3. An apparatus for washing, milling, and cleaning rubber and the like as claimed in Claim 2 and in which distance collars are provided separating the discs, between which distance collars and the inner edges of the division plates the rubber is also milled, substantially as described.
4. In an apparatus as claimed in Claims 2 and 3 the provision of blades such as 23 operating substantially as and for the purposes specified.
5. In an apparatus as claimed in any of the preceding claims a grating below the rotating discs constructed substantially as described and illustrated and for the purpose specified.
6. An apparatus for washing, milling, and cleaning rubber and the like substantially as described and illustrated in the accompanying drawings.
