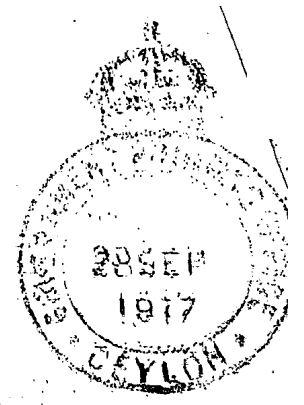
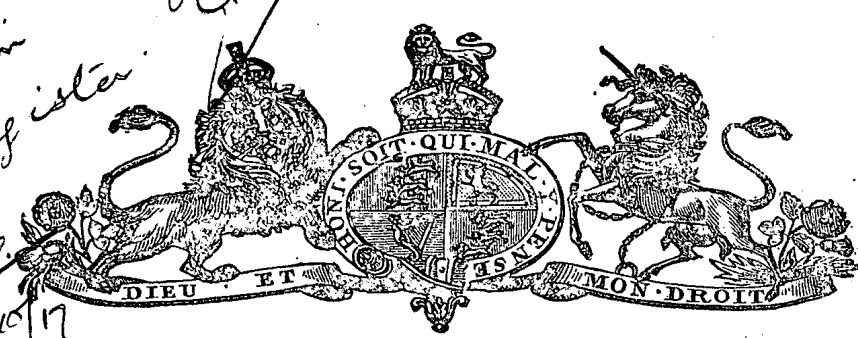

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PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir JOHN ANDERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

JOHN ANDERSON.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated May 27, 1914, the existing northern boundary of the North-Central Province, that is to say, the boundary between the Wilachchiya korale in the said Province and the Northern Province, was re-defined :

And whereas it is expedient to further alter and define in manner hereafter appearing the said boundary between the Northern and North-Central Provinces :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim and appoint that from and after the date hereof the said northern boundary of the North-Central Province, that is to say, the boundary between the Wilachchiya korale in the said Province and the Northern Province, shall be as follows :—

Starting from the point where the existing boundary crosses the Silavaturai-Anuradhapura road the boundary shall be a straight line drawn approximately south to the Kumpidumalai Trigonometrical Station, and thence a straight line drawn approximately south again to the Tekkam on the Modaragam-aru called the Piramadu or Modaragam-aru Tekkam, and thence along the Modaragam-aru to the sea.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fifth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seventeen.

"THE VOLUNTEER ORDINANCE, 1910."

THE following amendment to the regulations for the Ceylon Volunteer Force, made by the General Officer Commanding the Troops under the provision of sections 9 and 12 of "The Volunteer Ordinance, 1910," and approved by His Excellency the Governor, is published for general information :—

Delete paragraph 193 and substitute the following :—

193. Mileage at 50 cents per mile when travelling to and from camp will be paid to all ranks affected by Ordinance No. 42 of 1916 who live ten miles or more from the nearest railway station. Those who draw mileage will not draw batta under paragraph 189 for the days on which they travel.

"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Ratnapura, under section 56 (5) of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are hereby published for general information.

BY-LAWS *re* BAKERIES.

1. "Bakery" shall mean any premises on which bread, biscuits, or confectionery are baked for sale as food for man, and also includes any premises on which such food is prepared for baking, or on which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.

2. No person shall keep a bakery without an annual license from the Chairman. Every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued or until the license is cancelled. The Chairman is empowered to refuse such license to any person failing to comply with these rules. Such license shall further be subject to such fees as the Local Board shall from time to time determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.

3. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of these rules, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Local Board. Upon such cancellation of a license by a court, the Chairman of the Local Board is empowered, in his discretion, to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person.

4. The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 12 feet by 15 feet. There shall be a free external air space on at least two sides, not less than 7 feet wide, to permit of through ventilation. The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room. Every kneading room shall be provided with a ceiling.

5. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls in every part shall not be less than 7 feet in height, and be built of brick, stone, or cabook; the inside thereof shall be limeplastered and white-

washed every six months. The roof shall be of some permanent material. The ceilings shall be plastered and limewashed four times yearly, or they may be made of closely fitting boards varnished or painted. The floor shall be cemented throughout, and adequate drainage provided. Every room shall be provided with windows capable of being opened, and having a superficial area of not less than 1/16th of the superficial floor space.

6. The troughs and all the utensils used in the making of bread and pastry shall be kept scrupulously clean, and must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor.

7. The floor shall be carefully scraped and swept at least once every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings shall be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle and removed from the bakery daily.

8. Every bakery shall be kept in a cleanly state, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cesspit, or other nuisance.

9. No bakery shall be within 50 feet of any cesspit, manure heap, open sewer, or privy.

10. No furniture or other articles are to be stored in the bakery other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry.

11. The tops of the tables are to be made of well-seasoned, closely-fitting planks, or some non-harmful impervious material, and are to be scraped and cleaned daily.

12. No animals shall be kept in the bakery on any pretence whatever.

13. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of the bakery has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any such case, shall be

permitted by any such person to enter the bakery or take part in the manufacture or sale on the premises of bread, biscuits, or confectionery.

14. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread making, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body, and also a white cap or turban.

15. Clean water and soap shall be provided for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits, and confectionery.

16. All bread, biscuits, confectionery, and sweetmeats exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. The cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

17. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome, and the flour shall be kept on a platform raised 3 feet above the ground.

18. All refuse around the premises of a bakery shall be removed daily, and the drains shall be well flushed.

19. No place on the same level with the bakery and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is effectually separated from the bakery by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling. No water-closet, earth-closet, privy, or ashpit shall be within or communicate directly with the bakery.

20. It shall be lawful for a Local Board Inspector or other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.

21. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.

"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 57 of the Local Boards Ordinance, No. 13 of 1898, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the following by-laws made by the Local Board of Matara, in pursuance of section 56 (21) of the said Ordinance, and they are hereby published for general information.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated waters within the limits of the Local Board of Matara for the purposes of sale without giving one month's previous notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.

2. No aerated factory shall be situated within less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling house.

3. All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted and ventilated, must have cemented floors, must be provided with suitably built drains to carry off waste material, and must be kept clean and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate fly-proof room. All chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be kept scrupulously clean.

4. The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately protected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Board. It shall be transported to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory in properly constructed tanks or reservoirs connecting with the aerating apparatus.

5. All water used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have power to exempt from the operation of this rule water derived from an approved public supply.

6. Whenever the Secretary or Inspector of the Board is satisfied that any aerated water, either manufactured within the limits of the Board or introduced into such limits from outside, is of such bad quality as to be unfit for human consumption, he may seize such waters and produce them before the Health Officer or Police Magistrate,

and if it appears to such Health Officer or Police Magistrate that such waters are unfit for human consumption, he may order the same to be destroyed. Any person manufacturing any aerated water which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the court to be unfit for human consumption shall be guilty of an offence.

7. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with filtered water, and shall be kept scrupulously clean.

8. Every bottle containing aerated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Board.

9. No person under 12 years of age shall be employed in any aerated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.

10. All persons engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine-meshed wire face- and neck-shields and leather gloves.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 22, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 88 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 50 Sinhalese, 9 Tamils, 12 Moors, and 5 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 17.1, as against 16.9 in the preceding week, 22.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 65 (4 Burghers, 37 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 9 Moors, 1 Malay, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 12·7, as against 14·8 in the previous week, 26·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 65 total deaths, 18 were of infants under one year of age, as against 15 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 8 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana (all non-residents in hospitals), 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta. One death from *Bronchitis* was registered.

3. No deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered during the week. Four deaths registered in the previous week, against 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered either in this week or in the previous week. One case was reported during the week. No cases were reported in the previous week.

5. Eight deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 7 from *Debility*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Enteritis*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 31 from *Other Causes*.

6. There were reported 18 cases of *Measles*, as against 22 in the previous week; and 6 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 4 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·3°, against 81·0° in the preceding week and 81·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·873 in., against 29·826 in. in the preceding week and 29·861 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·38 in., against 0·03 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
