### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall  
on Friday, July 13, 1917.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 6, 1917.

*Present* :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Major A. W. de Wilton ; Mr. L. B. Fernando ; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. Arthur Alvis ; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene ; Dr. E. V. Ratnam ; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo ; Mr. J. A. Perera ; Mr. F. R. Senanayake ; Mr. C. H. Wellard ; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford ; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles ; Mr. W. A. Cave ; and Mr. J. K. Hormusjee.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 15, 1917, having been previously printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 15, 1917, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following :—

Since our last Meeting only 1 case, and that too a doubtful case, of plague has been reported. The case was reported by the Registrar of Deaths as one of septicæmic plague, but the history of the case makes it a doubtful case. The patient was not seen by any medical man while alive, and no *post mortem* or bacteriological examination was held. Still, treating it as a case, it brings the total number of cases up to 174 for the year, as against 132 last year. 3 cases of rat plague were discovered, the rats having been caught at (1) Nagalagam street, (2) Layard's Broadway, and (3) 2nd Gabo's lane.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved :—(a) That plans and estimates be prepared for the widening and improvement of Arab lane, Maradana ; (b) that in the meantime street lines be laid down for the said street.—Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

The Chairman stated that he realized on inspection of the street that an improvement scheme should be taken up for the area. He did not think it would be politic to lay down street lines till the general question of improvement was considered, and suggested the omission of the words "in the meantime" in 3 (b).

This was agreed to by the mover and consented by the Council. The motion, as amended, reading :—(a) That plans and estimates be prepared for the widening and improvement of Arab lane, Maradana ; (b) that street lines be laid down for the said street, was put to the meeting and declared carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that street lines be laid down for the Old Kolonnawa road. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman stated that it was very necessary that these street lines should be laid down and that he would ask the Municipal Works Engineer to undertake work as soon as possible. The motion was put to the Meeting and declared carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 5 to 11 (inclusive) on the agenda. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

- (3) To consider (b) The draft additions to the Municipal Ordinance with regard to the drainage.—Recommended that the Draft Ordinance be adopted by the Council for submission to Government to be incorporated in the Municipal Ordinance.

With regard to the above item (corresponding to items Nos. 2, 6, and 2 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Law and General Subjects of June 6, Works and Finance (meeting together) of June 8, and the Special Committee on Drainage Works of June 29, 1917, respectively), it was resolved that the consideration of the matter be postponed till the report of the Special Committee *re* Municipal Commission is adopted by the Council.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage Works of June 29, 1917.*

- (2) To consider the draft additions to the Municipal Ordinance with regard to the drainage.—Recommended that the draft Ordinance, as amended by the Municipal Commission Committee, be adopted by the Council for submission to Government to be incorporated in the Municipal Ordinance.

Resolved that the consideration of the matter be postponed till the report of the Special Committee *re* Municipal Commission is adopted by the Council.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of July 3, 1917.*

- (2) To consider the question of the rates to be charged for stalls in the Municipal markets.—Recommended that, as suggested by the Financial Assistant, tenders be called for the letting of the meat stalls at Dean's road market for a period of one year and that a condition be inserted that no butcher shall be allowed to hold more than 2 stalls.
- (5) To consider letter No. 133 of March 23, 1917, and the estimate of Rs. 500 from the Medical Officer of Health for the improvement of the appearance of the Liveramentu cemetery by the construction of roads, paths, &c.—Recommended.

With regard to item No. 2 (corresponding to item No. 4 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of July 6, 1917), Mr. J. A. Perera moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred, and that the papers be circulated. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item be adopted.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of June 6, 1917.*

- (2) To consider the draft additions to the Municipal Ordinance with regard to the drainage.—Recommended that the Council do approve of the proposed draft Ordinance.

*Resolution of Council of June 15, 1917.*

With regard to the above item (corresponding to item No. 6 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of June 8, 1917), it was resolved that the consideration of the matter be postponed till the Special Committee on Drainage Works has made its recommendation.

Resolved that the consideration of the matter be postponed till the report of the Special Committee *re* Municipal Commission is adopted.

- (2) To consider letter No. 1,846 of June 28, 1917, from the Hon. the Attorney-General, with regard to quarries.—Recommended that Government be asked to repeal the Proclamation of December 5, 1890, bringing the Town of Colombo under the provisions of Ordinance No. 8 of 1889.
- (4) To recommend the adoption, in terms of regulation No. 50 of Ordinance No. 18 of 1917, of the new form of agreement for the supply of water by meter for shipping purposes.—Recommended that the form (*vide* page 886) be adopted.
- (6) To consider the alterations proposed by the Government Electrical Engineer, with regard to the rules *re* public performances.—Recommended that the proposed alterations with regard to the supply of electricity be adopted.

With regard to item No. 4 (corresponding to item No. 16 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of July 6, 1917), Mr. Arthur Alvis queried whether, in view of the provisions of section 63 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Waterworks Engineer has the power to enter into a contract on behalf of the Council.

The Chairman explained that the form was only an amendment of the form given in form A of the Waterworks Ordinance, No. 18 of 1907, where the Waterworks Engineer is authorized to sign.

Mr. Arthur Alvis said he would not press the point. Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Law and General Subjects and Finance (meeting together) of July 4, 1917.*

- (1) To consider the motion of Mr. E. G. Jayewardene, in Council of June 15, 1917, with regard to premises No. 17, Brassfounder street, vested in the Council.

Mr. J. A. Perera moved that the rival claimants be called upon to obtain an adjudication as to their title from a court of competent jurisdiction, and that the Council do transfer the premises to the party or parties declared to be entitled, upon payment of the amount due to the Council. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

Mr. J. A. Perera, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene, the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, and the Chairman voted for the motion. Mr. Arthur Alvis and Mr. L. B. Fernando voted against it. The motion was carried.—Recommended to Council.

With regard to the above item, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. J. A. Perera seconded.—Carried.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of June 8, 1917.*

- (6) To consider the draft additions to the Municipal Ordinance with regard to the Drainage.—Recommended.

Resolved that the consideration of the matter be postponed till the report of the Special Committee *re* Municipal Commission is adopted.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of July 6, 1917.*

- (2) To consider whether premises No. 19, Dematagoda, vested in the Council, should be pulled down or disposed of by sale or lease.—Recommended that the property, with the exception of the portions reserved for the passage and the public drain, be conveyed to the heirs of P. B. Sinne Lebbe, on payment of all arrears and costs.
- (5) To recommend that Mr. H. R. Krickenbeck, Maintenance Inspector, Works Department, draw increments of Rs. 60 per annum till a maximum of Rs. 2,160 is reached.—Recommended.

- (7) To recommend the transfer of a sum of Rs. 300 from Vote E 30 (Veterinary Department), Lighting Carts, to E 32, Miscellaneous, the excess having been incurred as the lavatory at the Narahenpitiya conservancy depôt had to be re-built.—Recommended.
- (8) To sanction (a) The scale of rate mentioned in letter, dated June 12, 1917, from the Manager, Colombo Gas and Water Co., Ltd., Colombo, for lamps which have been reduced in illuminating power to meet the conditions consequent on the military orders *re non-lighting*; (b) the payment of 75 cents per month per lamp for the upkeep of lamps which are not lit.—Recommended.
- (9) To consider the alterations proposed by the Government Electrical Engineer with regard to the rules *re public performances*, and to recommend the provision of a vote of Rs. 300 for the payment of fees to the Government Electrical Engineer at Rs. 50 per month for the half year from July 1 to December 31, 1917, for inspecting and reporting upon the electric installations.—Recommended.
- (10) To consider the question whether Mr. Stanley Mack, Superintendent, Madampitiya Treatment Works, may be allowed to draw a fee for giving expert evidence in a court case.—Recommended that permission be granted.
- (11) To recommend the purchase from the sole agents, Messrs. Brown & Co., Ltd., Colombo, of 60 drums of 400 lbs. each floatine (refined asphaltum) at Rs. 35 per drum, for coating the internal surface of walls of the Elie House Reservoir.—Recommended.
- (12) To recommend that sanction be given to the Works Engineer to place orders for cement up to 5,000 barrels at the most favourable ruling rates, and as supplies are available.—Recommended.

With regard to item No. 9 Mr. J. A. Perera opposed the recommendation if, as he was led to believe, an Officer of the Council, namely, the Superintendent of the Madampitiya Treatment Works, was a trained Electrical Engineer and could be called upon to do the work.

The Chairman explained that the work called for a highly trained officer and in view of the proposed Public Performances Ordinance, the most highly competent expert should be employed.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the recommendation be referred back to the Committee to inquire into the question whether Mr. Stanley Mack, the Superintendent of the Madampitiya Treatment Works, is qualified to do the work. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of July 6, 1917.*

- (4) To consider the question of the rates to be charged for stalls in the Municipal Markets.—Recommended that, as suggested by the Financial Assistant, tenders be called for the letting of the meat stalls at Dean's road market for a period of one year and that a condition be inserted that no butcher shall be allowed to hold more than two stalls.
- (7) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 695, as follows:—(a) Rs. 195 under E 33 (Veterinary Department) salaries and wages; (b) Rs. 500 under E 35 (Veterinary Department) upkeep of ambulance and reception cart. To meet the payment, respectively, of wages to the carter of the reception cart for the removal of carcasses, and the cost of the maintenance of the two bulls to draw the cart.—Recommended.
- (9) To recommend that the sanction of Council be given for the appointment of a draughtsman on Rs. 720 per annum, provided in the Budget of 1917 (item No. 35 on page 18) for the work in connection with the building regulations under Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended as part of the original staff.
- (12) To recommend the sanction of a supplementary sum of Rs. 500 under Vote G 9 of the 1916 Budget (Fire Brigade)—Motor First Aid Hose Escape Tender, the excess having been caused by increased cost of freight, insurance, &c.—Recommended.
- (13) To consider letter No. 133 of March 23, 1917, and the estimate of Rs. 500 from the Medical Officer of Health for the improvement of the appearance of the Liveramentu cemetery by the construction of roads, paths, &c.—Recommended.
- (14) To recommend the sanction of Council for the purchase from Messrs. H. W. Cave & Co., Colombo, of 200 reams of double demy printing paper at Rs. 9 per ream.—Recommended.
- (16) To recommend the adoption, in terms of regulation No. 50 of Ordinance No. 18 of 1907, of the new form of agreement for the supply of water by meter for shipping purposes.—Recommended that the form (*vide* page 886) be adopted.
- (23) To consider the question of the rate of pay for the conservancy coolies.—Recommended that the rate of pay be raised to 60 cents by an increase of 5 cents per day.
- (24) To recommend the provision of Rs. 10.95 for the repairs to be effected to the boat kept at Grandpass for patrolling of Police in flooded areas.—Recommended.
- (25) To consider letter No. 1,846 of June 28, 1917, from the Hon. the Attorney-General, with regard to quarries.—Recommended that Government be asked to repeal the Proclamation of December 5, 1890, bringing the Town of Colombo under the provisions of Ordinance No. 8 of 1889.

*Form of Agreement referred to in Items Nos. 4 and 16 of the Extracts of the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Law and General Subjects and Finance of July 4 and 6, 1917, respectively.*

AGREEMENT for a supply of water by meter for shipping purposes, between — (hereinafter styled the "Consumer") on the one part, and the Municipal Council of Colombo on the other part.

2. In consideration of being allowed a supply of water for shipping, the Consumer hereby agrees to abide by the conditions hereinafter set forth:—

(a) That the water shall be supplied through a — inch meter.

(b) That the consumer shall pay or cause to be paid to the Municipal Council the sum of Rupees — a quarter in advance for the rent of the meter.

(c) That the Consumer shall pay or cause to be paid to the Colombo Municipal Council at the rate of Rupees — per thousand gallons for the quantity of water supplied during each month. The first payment to be made on the first day of —.

(d) That the Consumer shall deposit with the Municipal Council a sum of Rs. — as security.

3. If the rent of the meter or the charges for water are not paid to the Municipal Council on the due date, the right to the use of the service shall be forfeited, and the Chairman of the Municipal Council may discontinue the supply.

4. The provisions of Ordinance No. 18 of 1907, and of the regulations made thereunder shall be taken as part of this agreement, and any regulations which may be made hereafter under any sections of the said Ordinance or any statutory modification thereof shall also be binding on the parties to this agreement.

5. The agreement may be determined by either party giving to the other party 15 days' notice of his or its intention to determine the same.

6. As security for the due payment of the rent of the meter and the charges for water supplied, and all sums of money due under, by virtue or in respect of, this agreement the Consumer doth hereby mortgage and hypothecate to and with the Municipal Council the sum of Rupees — (Rs. —) deposited by him with the Municipal Council of Colombo on the — day of —, 191— as per receipt hereto annexed.

7. The Chairman of the Municipal Council shall have the power to require the Consumer to provide such further or other security as he may deem necessary.

8. It shall not be lawful to the Consumer to assign or transfer any right under this agreement and, in the event of any Consumer attempting or purporting to do so, the Chairman may discontinue the supply.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

##### Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council, Galle, held in the Municipal Office, on Saturday, June 9, 1917.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 2, 1917.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena; Mr. H. M. Makan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subesinghe; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; Mr. A. C. Hayley; Mr. J. E. Perera; and Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten.

1. Before proceeding with the business laid down in the Agenda, the Chairman, with the leave of the Council, moved:—

(1) "That the Council desires to place on record its high appreciation of the services of the late Mr. Moreira, as Secretary, its keen sense of the loss the Council has sustained by his decease, and its deep sympathy with his bereaved family."

(2) That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the bereaved family.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardena seconded.—Carried unanimously.

2. The Council resolved (1) to invite applications for the post of Secretary in the local papers, and that the salary of the post be Rs. 1,920 per annum, rising to Rs. 4,000 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 180, with a commuted travelling allowance of Rs. 480 per annum; (2) that Mr. L. Subesinghe moved the following motion which was deferred from the meeting held on May 12, 1917:—That the strip of land by the Hirimbure road at Dangedera, where Mr. Ephraums recently met with a serious accident, be acquired by the Council, and the arecanut trees standing thereon be cut down at a cost of Rs. 20. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried unanimously.

5. Submitted the New Water Works By-law suggested by the Colombo Municipal Council.—Resolved that the Council has no objection to the proposed amendment.

Resolved that the present arrangement of employing one cooly for destruction of rats, under the supervision of the

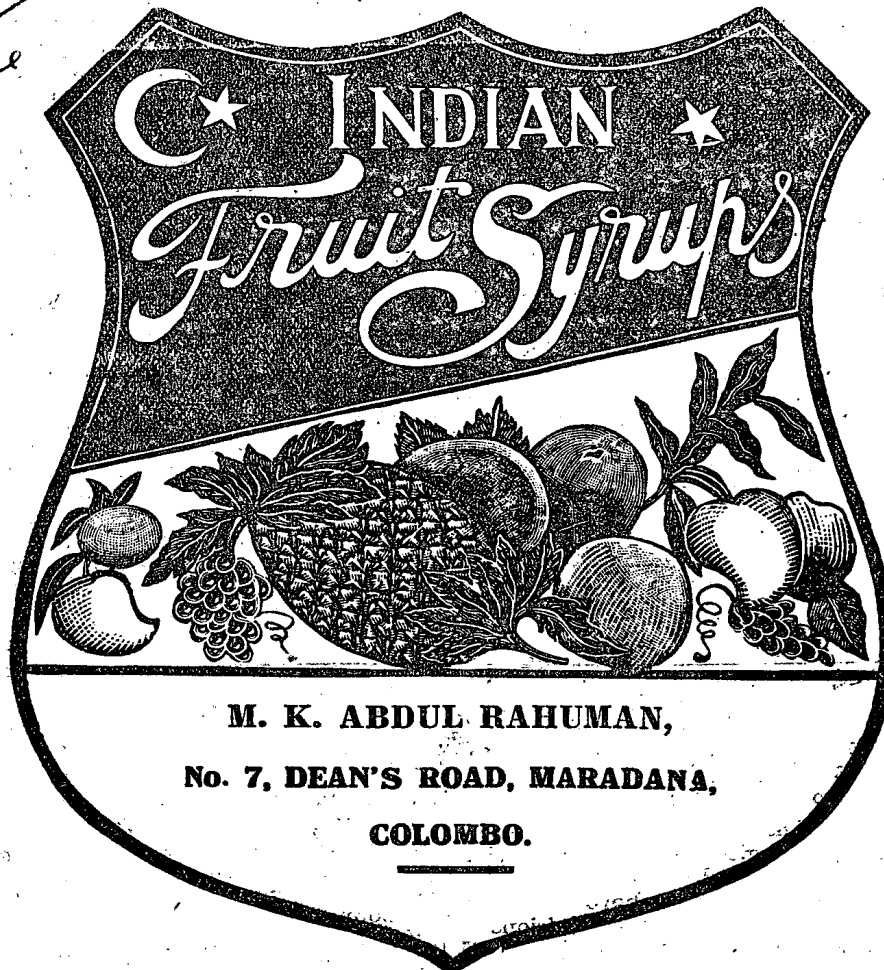
