NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted:—

"Improvements in or relating to the production of dyes or stains."

Abstract:—The inventors state:—

This invention relates to the production of dyes or stains and its chief object is to utilize for the preparation of such colouring substances material of an inexpensive nature and partly or wholly a waste product obtainable in very large quantities.

According to our invention and as the result of numerous experiments we have found that a fruit or a portion of a fruit (skin, pulp, or stalk, or a mixture thereof in various proportions) of the banana class (banana or plantain) can be employed as the basic material from which dyes and stains can be prepared. For this purpose the fruit material is subjected to the action of a suitable chemical reagent, usually dilute mineral acid or an alkaline solution, which reacts with the colour generating ingredient in the said material to convert it into the colouring matter. The acid or alkali, probably both, act as hydrolizing agents. The prepared solution is neutralized, but preferably so as to make it slightly acid and not perfectly neutral, and this may be effected by preparing separate acid and alkali solutions of the fruit material and mixing them.

The strength of the solution required may be varied, but a ten per cent. solution of acid or alkali has been found suitable. In general, the fruit substance, after grinding or otherwise dividing into particles of suitable size, is allowed to stand in the solution for some time, either cold or warm. The mixture may be gently heated to the boiling point.

For example:—

A soft or old rose colour is obtained by treating about equal parts green pulp and green stalk in two solutions, one of caustic potash and the other of nitric acid, about equal quantities of solution and banana substance being employed with a strength of solution obtained by dissolving solid caustic potash and strong commercial nitric acid respectively in about five times their weight of water. After boiling and leaving the two mixtures for some time, one of them is added to the other until neutralization is effected. The neutral solution is then boiled, and on dipping a fabric treated with alum as a mordant in the hot solution the fabric is dyed a rich old rose colour. Dipping when cold gives a somewhat different rose colour.

On varying the above process by adding nickel oxide to about equal parts of green pulp and green skin in the potash solution and using hydrochloric instead of nitric acid a gray colour is obtained with fabric treated with tannic acid.

Pinks, yellows, browns, tans, greens, violets, blues, and lavender dyes and stains of various shades and black stain and dye is obtained by other modifications of the process and with other mordants.

The claims are:—

1. In the preparation of a dye or stain the employment of the pulp, skin, or stalk of a fruit of the banana class, or a mixture of two or all of such fruit elements, as the basic material from which the dye or stain is prepared.

2. A process for the preparation of dyes or stains, in which a fruit or a portion of a fruit of the banana class is subjected to the action of a suitable hydrolizing agent.

3. A process for the preparation of dyes or stains in which the pulp or the pulp and skin of a fruit of the banana class is subjected to the action of an alkaline solution, with subsequent neutralization or partial neutralization.
4. A process for the preparation of dyes or stains in which the pulp or the pulp and skin of a fruit of the banana class is subjected to the action of a mineral acid, with subsequent neutralization or partial neutralization.
5. A process for the preparation of dyes or stains in which the pulp or the pulp and skin of a fruit of the banana class is subjected to the action of a solution of potash or soda and the solution is then neutralized or partially neutralized with a mineral acid, for example, hydrochloric, nitric, or sulphuric acid.
6. A process for the preparation of dyes or stains in which the pulp or the pulp and skin of a fruit of the banana class is subjected to the action of an alkaline solution in the presence of a metallic compound.
7. A process for the preparation of dyes or stains in which the pulp and skin of a fruit of the banana class is subjected to the action of an acid in the presence of a metallic compound.
8. A process for the preparation of dyes or stains from the fruit of the banana class carried out in accordance with any one of the examples given in the foregoing description.
