## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 21, 1917, at 8.50 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 17, 1917.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman ; Mr. E. Beven ; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene ; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy, Dr. Allan de Saram ; Mr. H. F. Tomalin ; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu ; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte ; and Mr. L. H. S. Pieris.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 16, 1917, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1916 to June 30, 1917, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's report for June.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June.

(e) The reservoir readings for June.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during June.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 12 of June 14, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor approves of the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 100 to the widow and minor children of the late Mr. U. B. Dehigama, Street Lighting Inspector.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 12 of June 22, 1917, intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order that the Crown land adjoining Ward street, and situated between the Kandy Club and the Planters' Association buildings be vested in the Municipal Council of Kandy.—Read.

(3) Letter of July 4, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to Mr. F. G. Morley, Acting Colonial Auditor, nominating him to be an Auditor of the accounts of the Municipalities of Colombo, Kandy, and Galle during the absence of Mr. W. W. Woods, on leave—for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 1,931 of June 19, 1917, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, intimating that the Railway Department will undertake the erection of a water trough for draught cattle in the Kandy goods yard premises.—Read.

(5) Application of July 5, 1917, from the Hon. Secretary, Central Town Library, for a yearly grant to the Library.

Mr. Beven proposed—“ That sanction of Government be applied for to pay a grant of Rs. 25 a month for two years to the Central Town Library to be spent on books in view of the stoppage of the Government grant, on the same conditions that Government imposes.” Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris moved—“ That as much of the Municipal Fund as may be available for investment be devoted to the purchase of Ceylon War Bonds.”

On the Chairman's suggestion the mover agreed to the following amendment :—“ That as much of the Municipal Fund as the Standing Committee on Finance may consider available for investment be devoted to the purchase of Government to the purchase of Ceylon War Bonds, under Ordinance No. 11 of 1917, and that the Standing Committee on Finance

be asked to report what sum, if any, is available for such purpose." Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded.—Carried unanimously.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

*Law and General Subjects.*

(i.) That the rent of the land to be leased for a Muhammadan School be fixed at Rs. 2·50 per annum instead of Rs. 10 per annum as sanctioned at the Meeting of March 17, 1917, and that a notarial lease at applicant's expense be given for 50 years with no promise of renewal.

(ii.) That the following by-law be adopted:—From and after the passing of this by-law the road known as Jail road, leading from Ward street on the north to Mosque road on the south, shall not be used by any motor vehicle between the hours of 6 P.M. and 6 A.M.

*Finance and Assessment.*

(iii.) That the payment of Rs. 20 a month to the Assessment Clerk for extra work in connection with the collection of riot compensation and the employment of the extra clerk engaged for the work be continued for a further period of one year from July 1, 1917.

*Municipal Works.*

(iv.) That the following estimates be sanctioned:—(1) Standpost in Deiyannewela, Rs. 250; (2) retaining wall to protect the slaughter-house, Rs. 390; (3) burying 200 concrete theodolite stations, Rs. 660.

(v.) That the following applications for water-service be allowed on usual terms:—(1) 226, Trincomalee street, A. Ratwatte; (2) 78, Castle Hill street, J. Senanayake.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted, except (ii.) which was deferred pending report on the proposed by-law from the Police authorities.

7. To sanction the purchase of 150 night-soil drums at Rs. 12·50 per drum.

Resolved—That the sanction be given.

8. With the leave of the Council Mr. Pieris moved—"That the Postmaster-General be requested to include in the estimates for the next financial year, provision for renting out a building in a central part of the town as a Temporary Post Office, pending the construction of the proposed new Post Office. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—Carried.
