JOHN ANDERSON.

WHEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the road which the railway crosses between the stations of Getahetta and Kendangamuwa, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, and set out in the schedule hereto, to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare the said road to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance as from and after October 10, 1917, and that such "minor crossing" shall not be closed by gates.

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by sub-section (5) of section 7 of the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that all ports other than ports in India, the Straits Settlements, and the Federated Malay States shall be ports to which the said sub-section (4) of section 7 of the said Ordinance shall apply.

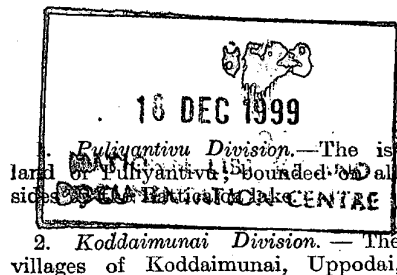

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorized by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A list consolidating all previous lists was published on June 22, 1917 (the Consolidating List No. 29a), which, together with Lists No. 30 and 31 of July 6 and 20, 1917, respectively, and the list herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks. The lists are published in the *London Gazette* and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

* **NOTE (2).**—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of June 25 and November 10, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimize as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph, he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the list. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the list as they appear. The lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H. M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

† **NOTE (6).**—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English Company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under Berg and Komeet respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

RULES REFERRED TO.

I.

1. Every employer shall, at least 24 hours before applying to the Collector of Customs for a pass under section 5 (2) of the Ordinance, notify in writing the Port Surgeon or Medical Officer appointed under the Ordinance that he desires to obtain a medical certificate of general health and physical fitness to emigrate for the intending emigrants.

2. The notification to the Port Surgeon or Medical Officer appointed as aforesaid shall specify—

- (a) The name of the vessel by which emigrants are to be shipped.
- (b) The date of departure of such vessel.
- (c) The names and number of intending emigrants.

The Port Surgeon or Medical Officer appointed under the Ordinance shall then notify to the employer the time and place for medical examination.

II.

The certificate of the Port Surgeon or Medical Officer shall be as nearly as possible in the form in the schedule

hereto annexed, and shall certify that he has examined individually the emigrants named therein, and shall specify those who are, in his opinion, physically fit to emigrate, and those whom he considers unfit, with reasons therefor.

In the event of the Port Surgeon or such Medical Officer refusing to certify to the physical fitness to emigrate of any emigrant, the employer shall at once deposit with the Port Surgeon such sum as, in the opinion of the latter, shall be sufficient to cover the cost of returning the emigrant to his village.

III.

The employer shall pay the Port Surgeon (or other officer appointed under this Ordinance) a fee of Rs. 10.50 for each batch of 20 or less intending emigrants examined by him.

AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS REFERRED TO.

1. *Rule 1.*—Add at end of rule 1: "The Chairman may at his discretion nominate a substitute to act for the presiding officer in the event of that officer's absence from the polling place, and may also appoint one or more persons to assist the presiding officer in the performance of his duties."

2. *Rule 3.*—Insert the words "not less than" before the word "eighteen" in the third line of rule 3.

3. *Rule 4.*—Add at the end of rule 4: "No voter on the list for any division may subscribe more than one nomination paper for such division. In the event of more than one nomination paper being submitted for the same division bearing the subscription of a particular voter, the subscription of such voter on each nomination paper for the said division shall be deemed to be void."

4. In place of rule 6 the following rule shall be substituted:—

6. The nomination paper shall be substantially in the Form I. at the end of these rules, and shall contain the particulars therein set out.

5. After rule 7 the following rule shall be added, rule 7 being re-numbered 7 (1):—

7. (2) The Chairman shall decide on the validity of every nomination paper, and his decision shall be final.

6. After rule 11 (e), the following rule shall be added and shall be numbered (f), the rules numbered (f), (g), and (h) being re-numbered (g), (h), and (i):—

(f) If, as the result of any decision under section 22 of the Ordinance, it should appear that a person has by falsely personating a qualified voter recorded a vote, the person entitled to vote shall be permitted to exercise his right, and the Chairman shall declare the vote recorded by the false personation void, and on the opening of the ballot box shall on tracing the ballot paper accepted by reason of the false personation have the same removed, so that it shall not be counted among the votes recorded.

7. The following rules shall be added at the end of rule 11, and shall be numbered 12 and 13 respectively:—

12. Each candidate may, by writing signed by him, or if he is absent from the Island, then his proposer or seconder may, by writing signed by him, appoint a person (in this schedule referred to as the candidate's representative) to attend the proceedings for nomination before the Chairman on behalf of the candidate, and this appointment must be delivered to the Secretary before 11 o'clock in the forenoon of the day fixed for delivery of nomination papers.

13. Each candidate and his representative may during the time appointed by the Chairman for the inspection of the nomination papers object to the nomination paper of any other candidate for the same division.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Bakeries.

1. "Bakery" shall mean any premises on which bread, biscuits, or confectionery are baked for sale as food for man, and also includes any premises on which such food is prepared for baking, or on which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.

2. No person shall keep a bakery without an annual license from the Chairman. Every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued or until the license is cancelled. The Chairman is empowered to refuse such license to any person failing to comply with these rules. Such license shall further be subject to such fees as the Local Board shall from time to time determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.

3. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of these rules, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Local Board. Upon such cancellation of a license by a court, the Chairman of the Local Board is empowered, in his discretion, to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person.

4. The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 12 feet by 15 feet. There shall be a free external air space on at least two sides, not less than 7 feet wide, to permit of through ventilation. The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room. Every kneading room shall be provided with a ceiling.

5. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls in every part shall not be less than 7 feet in height, and be built of brick, stone, or cabook; the inside thereof shall be limeplastered and white-washed every six months. The roof shall be of some permanent material. The ceilings shall be plastered and limewashed four times yearly, or they may be made of closely fitting boards varnished or painted. The floor shall be cemented throughout, and adequate drainage provided. Every room shall be provided with windows capable of being opened, and having a superficial area of not less than 1/16th of the superficial floor space.

6. The troughs and all the utensils used in the making of bread and pastry shall be kept scrupulously clean, and must be capable of being moved

about for the purpose of cleaning the floor.

7. The floor shall be carefully scraped and swept at least once every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings shall be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle and removed from the bakery daily.

8. Every bakery shall be kept in a cleanly state, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cesspit, or other nuisance.

9. No bakery shall be within 50 feet of any cesspit, manure heap, open sewer, or privy.

10. No furniture or other articles are to be stored in the bakery other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry.

11. The tops of the tables are to be made of well-seasoned closely-fitting planks, or some non-harmful impervious material, and are to be scraped and cleaned daily.

12. No animals shall be kept in the bakery on any pretence whatever.

13. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of the bakery has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any such case, shall be

permitted by any such person to enter the bakery or take part in the manufacture or sale on the premises of bread, biscuits, or confectionery.

14. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread making, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body, and also a white cap or turban.

15. Clean water and soap shall be provided for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits, and confectionery.

16. All bread, biscuits, confectionery, and sweetmeats exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed

glass cases free from flies. The cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

17. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome, and the flour shall be kept on a platform raised 3 feet above the ground.

18. All refuse around the premises of a bakery shall be removed daily, and the drains shall be well flushed.

19. No place on the same level with the bakery and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is effectually separated from the bakery by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling. No water-closet, earth-closet, privy, or ash pit shall be within or

communicate directly with the bakery.

20. It shall be lawful for a Local Board Inspector or other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.

21. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.

22. It shall be lawful for any Inspector, duly authorized in writing by the Chairman, to take for examination by the Medical Officer samples of bread or of materials used in making bread.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 29, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 105 (2 Europeans, 15 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 11 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 20.4, as against 17.1 in the preceding week, 18.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 119 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 56 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.2, as against 12.7 in the previous week, 29.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 119 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as against 18 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 7 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana, and 1 in Slave Island. Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered. Of these, 1 was in San Sebastian and the other in Maradana. No deaths were registered in the previous week. Two cases were reported this week, as against 1 last week.

4. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana. No deaths were registered in the previous week, and the weekly average for last year was 3.

5. Fourteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 from *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 56 from *Other Causes*.

6. There were reported 12 cases of *Measles*, as against 18 in the previous week; and 4 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 6 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air, was 78.4°, against 79.3° in the preceding week and 80.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.876 in., against 29.873 in. in the preceding week and 29.871 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 8.76 in., against 2.38 in. in the preceding week and 1.20 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
