By His Excellency Sir JOHN ANDERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

**K**NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers in Us vested by Clause III. 1 (A) of the Order in Council dated October 26, 1896, issued by Her Majesty the Queen, as amended by the Order in Council dated March 21, 1916, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated June 5, 1916, have been pleased to make the following regulations, in place of the regulations published by Our Proclamations dated April 5, 1917, and July 30, 1917, and appearing in the *Government Gazettes* dated April 5, 1917, and August 3, 1917, respectively.

And We hereby call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Colony to govern themselves accordingly.

#### REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. No passport shall be deemed to be a valid passport for the purpose of these regulations, unless it satisfies the following conditions:—

- (a) It must have been issued or renewed not more than two years previously by or on behalf of the Government of the country of which the person to whom it relates is a subject or citizen.
- (b) If issued or visé for a particular journey, it must be used in respect of that journey only.
- (c) In the case of a person coming to the Colony from any country other than the United Kingdom or India or a British Possession, it must have been issued or visé by the British Ambassador or British Consul or British resident in that country.
- (d) It must have attached to it a specimen of the signature and a photograph of the person to whom it relates, and further, the photograph must

bear the seal or stamp of the office issuing the passport.

2. Except in the cases specified in regulation 5, no person shall leave the Colony for any destination except India, or shall enter the Colony from any country except India, unless such person is the bearer of a valid passport.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of the above regulations, or is reasonably suspected of having so acted or of being about so to act, and any persons aiding and abetting such person to contravene the above regulations, may be taken into custody by a Police or Customs officer without a warrant, and shall be liable to be detained.

4. Any person acting contrary to the above regulations or attempting so to do, and any person aiding and abetting such person to act contrary to the above regulations, shall be guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction before a Police Magistrate with imprisonment, simple or rigorous, for a period not exceeding six months, or a fine not exceeding one thousand five hundred rupees, or both.

5. Nothing contained in the regulations aforesaid shall apply to—

- (a) Any member of His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, or of the Allied Naval or Military Forces, entering or leaving the Colony on duty;
- (b) Any member of the crew of any vessel who has been lawfully engaged in the Colony for an over-sea voyage;
- (c) Any person landing under a special permit in writing issued by the Colonial Secretary, the Principal Collector of Customs, or the Inspector-General of Police, and acting in accordance with the conditions of such permit;
- (d) Any Indian ordinarily resident in India leaving for any destination other than India. Any such Indian is required to produce a valid passport issued to him in India according to regulations for the time being in force in India allowing him to leave India for the same destination.

**W**HEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Western Circuit, four times at least in each year at Colombo and such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Colombo on January 10, March 20, July 10, and October 10, in each year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Negombo, a place included within the said Western Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Negombo, in the said Western Circuit, on or about Monday, November 5, 1917.

SCHEDULE.

*North.*—The village boundary of Gorakapola and Walana eastwards as far as the old road.

*East.*—The old road as far as its junction with the First Cross road; the First Cross road to a point 5 chains to the east of the old road. A line drawn southwards parallel to the old road at a distance of 5 chains to the east of the said road. Boundaries enclosing the frontages to a distance of 5 chains on either side of the Gonabendiduwa District Road Committee road and Udahamulla-Arugoda Village Committee road as far as the Tantrimulla-ela and the Malamulla

village boundary respectively, excluding the paddy fields. A line drawn due north and south through a point exactly a quarter of a mile to the east of the junction of the Fourth Cross road and Gravets road, excluding paddy fields. From the last named boundary a line drawn southeastwards and eastwards parallel to the Horana road 5 chains to the north of that road as far as the western boundary of the Wekada mosque. A line drawn north and south through the western boundary of the Wekada mosque to a distance of 5 chains on either side of the Horana road. From the last named boundary a line drawn

westwards parallel to the Horana road 5 chains to the south of the said road as far as the Moravinna road. The Moravinna road southwards to the Nalluruwa-Mahawila Village Committee road. The said Village Committee road southwestwards to a point 5 chains to the east of the Colombo-Galle road. A line drawn southwestwards parallel to the Colombo-Galle road and 5 chains to the east of the said road as far as the boundary of the Pinwatta village.

*South.*—The boundary of the Pinwatta village to the sea.

*West.*—The sea and the centre of the Panadure river.

## "THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Nawalapitiya, under section 56 (5) of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

1. "Bakery" shall mean any premises on which bread, biscuits, or confectionery are baked for sale as food for man, and also includes any premises on which such food is prepared for baking, or on which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.
2. No person shall keep a bakery without an annual license from the Chairman. Every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued or until the license is cancelled. The Chairman is empowered to refuse such license to any person failing to comply with these rules. Such license shall further be subject to such fees as the Board shall from time to time determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.
3. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of these rules, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Board. Upon such cancellation of a license by a court, the Chairman of the Board is empowered, in his discretion, to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person.
4. The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 12 feet by 15 feet. There shall be a free external air space on at least two sides, not less than 7 feet wide, to permit of through ventilation. The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room. Every kneading room shall be provided with a ceiling.
5. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls in every part shall not be less than 7 feet in height, and be built of brick, stone, or cabook; the inside thereof

- shall be limeplastered and white-washed every six months. The roof shall be of some permanent material. The ceilings shall be plastered and limewashed four times yearly, or they may be made of closely fitting boards varnished or painted. The floor shall be cemented throughout, and adequate drainage provided. Every room shall be provided with windows capable of being opened, and having a superficial area of not less than 1/16th of the superficial floor space.
  6. The troughs and all the utensils used in the making of bread and pastry shall be kept scrupulously clean, and must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor.
  7. The floor shall be carefully scraped and swept at least once every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings shall be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle and removed from the bakery daily.
  8. Every bakery shall be kept in a cleanly state, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cesspit, or other nuisance.
  9. No bakery shall be within 50 feet of any cesspit, manure heap, open sewer, or privy.
  10. No furniture or other articles are to be stored in the bakery other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry.
  11. The tops of the tables are to be made of well-seasoned closely-fitting planks, or some non-harmful impervious material, and are to be scraped and cleaned daily.
  12. No animals shall be kept in the bakery on any pretence whatever.
  13. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of the bakery has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attend-

ance on any such case, shall be permitted by any such person to enter the bakery or take part in the manufacture or sale on the premises of bread, biscuits, or confectionery.

14. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread making, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body, and also a white cap or turban.

15. Clean water and soap shall be provided for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits, and confectionery.

16. All bread, biscuits, confectionery, and sweetmeats exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. The cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

17. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome, and the flour shall be kept on a platform raised 3 feet above the ground.

18. All refuse around the premises of a bakery shall be removed daily, and the drains shall be well flushed.

19. No place on the same level with the bakery and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is effectually separated from the bakery by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling. No water-closet, earth-closet, privy, or ash pit shall be within or communicate directly with the bakery.

20. It shall be lawful for the Local Board Inspector or any other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.

21. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.

4. The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 12 feet by 15 feet. There shall be a free external air space on at least two sides, not less than 7 feet wide, to permit of through ventilation. The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room.

Every kneading room shall be provided with a ceiling.

5. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls in every part shall not be less than 7 feet in height, and be built of brick, stone, or cabook; the inside thereof shall be limeplastered and white-washed every six months. The roof shall be of some permanent material. The ceilings shall be plastered and limewashed four times yearly, or they may be made of closely fitting boards varnished or painted. The floor shall be cemented throughout, and adequate drainage provided. Every room shall be provided with windows capable of being opened, and having a superficial area of not less than 1/16th of the superficial floor space.

6. The troughs and all the utensils used in the making of bread and pastry shall be kept scrupulously clean, and must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor.

7. The floor shall be carefully scraped and swept at least once every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings shall be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle and removed from the bakery daily.

8. Every bakery shall be kept in a cleanly state, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cesspit, or other nuisance.

9. No bakery shall be within 50 feet of any cesspit, manure heap, open sewer, or privy.

10. No furniture or other articles are to be stored in the bakery other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry.

11. The tops of the tables are to be made of well-seasoned closely-fitting planks, or some non-harmful impervious material, and are to be scraped and cleaned daily.

12. No animals shall be kept in the bakery on any pretence whatever.

13. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of the bakery has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any such case, shall be permitted by any such person to enter the bakery or take part in the manufacture or sale on the premises of bread, biscuits, or confectionery.

14. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread making, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body, and also a white cap or turban.

15. Clean water and soap shall be provided for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits, and confectionery.

16. All bread, biscuits, confectionery, and sweetmeats exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. The cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

17. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome, and the flour shall be kept on a platform raised 3 feet above the ground.

18. All refuse around the premises of a bakery shall be removed daily, and the drains shall be well flushed.

19. No place on the same level with the bakery and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is effectually separated from the bakery by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling. No water-closet, earth-closet, privy, or ash pit shall be within or communicate directly with the bakery.

20. It shall be lawful for the Local Board Inspector or any other person authorized in writing by the Chairman at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.

21. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.

#### "THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Gampola, under section 56 (5) of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

Colombo, September 26, 1917.

1. "Bakery" shall mean any premises on which bread, biscuits, or confectionery are baked for sale as food for man, and also includes any premises on which such food is prepared for baking, or on which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.

2. No person shall keep a bakery without an annual license from the Chairman. Every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued or until the license is cancelled. The Chairman is empowered to refuse such license to any person failing to comply with these rules. Such license shall further be subject to such fees as the Board shall from time to time determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.

3. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of these rules, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Board. Upon such cancellation of a license by a court, the Chairman of the Board is empowered, in his discretion, to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person.

4. The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 12 feet by 15 feet. There shall be a free external air space on at least two sides, not less than 7 feet wide, to permit of through ventilation. The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room. 21. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.

Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council under "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by Ordinance No. 5 of 1917.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 8 A (1) of "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by "The Enemy Property (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1917," that the Governor in Executive Council may, by Order in Council, vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property any property belonging to or held or managed for an enemy subject, and may confer on the Custodian such power of selling or otherwise dealing with such property as to the Governor in Executive Council may seem proper :

And whereas the property enumerated in the schedule hereto belongs to Leila Sybil Luedecke, wife of Alfred Luedecke, an enemy subject, and it appears expedient to vest the said property in the Custodian :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor is pleased, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said property is vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property.

## NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of 80,000 broad gauge sleepers and 30,000 narrow gauge sleepers, more or less, for the Ceylon Government Railway, in accordance with the following specification and conditions:—

(a) The broad gauge sleepers for 5 ft. 6 in. gauge to be supplied are to be 9 ft. long, 10 in. wide, and 5 in. deep. The narrow gauge sleepers for 2 ft. 6 in. gauge to be supplied are to be 5 ft. long, 9 in. wide, and 4½ in. deep.

(b) All sleepers shall be cut from well-matured trees of the true species of timber named in paragraph 18, felled in the proper season when the sap is not in circulation, and shall be of good quality and sound throughout.

(c) Sleepers shall be sawn or hewn, and shall be rectangular, with straight and parallel faces, free from sapwood, shakes, large or dead knots, dry rot, splits, or any imperfection likely to affect the strength, utility, or life of the sleepers and timbers. Small firm knots not exceeding 2 in. in diameter may be allowed, provided none such occur within 6 in. of either rail seat.

(d) A certain amount of wane may be allowed on each corner of the upper side of sleepers, provided it does not occur within 6 in. of either rail seat, and that it does not measure more than 1½ in. on any face, or reduce the normal sectional area by more than one-eighth.

(e) Sufficient allowance for shrinkage shall be made to insure that the sleepers are fully up to the specified dimensions at port of loading and generally at Colombo; not more than 5 per cent. of any lot may consist of sleepers of short width up to ¼ in. or short length up to 1 in.

2. Consignments to be delivered at Colombo as early as possible, and delivery of the total quantity must be completed by July 30, 1918. Should the contractor fail to complete delivery by that date, he shall be liable to a deduction as damages of 10 per cent. on the value of the sleepers not then delivered, except in so far as conditions apply as stated in paragraph 27.

3. Should the contractor at any time during the execution of the contract find that he will be unable to deliver the sleepers or any portion of them within the period named, he shall at once give notice accordingly to the General Manager of the Railway.

4. The sleepers shall be subject to inspection as stipulated in paragraphs 21 and 22, and any sleepers rejected at such inspection will not be accepted by the Ceylon Government.

5. If at any time any question, dispute, or difference shall arise between the General Manager of the Railway and the contractors upon or in relation to or in connection with the contract, either party may forthwith give the other notice in writing of the existence of such question, dispute, or difference, and such question, dispute, or difference shall be referred to arbitration of a person mutually agreed upon. The award of such arbitrator shall be final, conclusive, and binding on both parties.

6. The suppliers shall inform the General Manager by telegraph immediately the steamers commence to load, stating the probable date of sailing. As each consignment is shipped the contractor must send direct to the General Manager in care of the master of the vessel conveying the sleepers—

One bill of lading (stamped).

One copy of invoice.

7. The contractors shall take all risk of accident or damage to the sleepers from whatever cause arising, and shall insure them against all marine risks with a first class insurance company or companies whose names have been approved by the Government of Ceylon.

8. All tenders should be in duplicate, and must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract. The documents must be sealed under one cover, marked "Tender for Sleepers" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

9. Tenders should be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or sent through

the post, so as to reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than noon on Tuesday, December 18, 1917.

10. The tenders are to be made on forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the General Manager, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

11. A deposit of Rs. 100 will be required to be made at the Treasury, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued.

12. Applications accompanied by a draft on the Bank of Madras in favour of the Hon. the Treasurer of the Colony will be considered on intimation being received from the Bank that such draft has been placed to the credit of Government.

13. Applicants must satisfy the General Manager that they are in a position to execute the contract in a satisfactory manner, documentary or other evidence being produced for the purpose if called for.

14. Should any tenderer decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Ceylon Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

15. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of each contract. The amount of security required will be Rs. 5,000 in cash or fixed deposit.

16. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

17. The Ceylon Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender. If any special conditions attach to the acceptance of part of a tender or of lots in other numbers than those specified they must be clearly laid down in the tender.

18. Tenders for the whole supply will be considered for the following woods:—Jarrah, Ironbark, Java Teak, or Pynkadu (Burmese).

19. Tenders for supply of lots of broad gauge sleepers up to 20,000 and narrow gauge sleepers up to 10,000 will be considered of the following species:—Blackbutt, Sal (Himalayan grown), Chenghai, Maiyang, Mai Teng (Shorea Obtusa), Mai Rang (Shorea Siamensis), Japanese Oak, Siberian Oak.

20. Tenders should state the number of each species they are prepared to supply, and if more than one kind is offered in any tender, the rate for each kind should be specified with the minimum and maximum number of a kind that can be supplied. Tenders must also state whether sleepers are sawn or hewn.

21. In case of Australian woods, all sleepers must be passed before shipment by the Government Inspector of the State from which the timber is obtained.

22. Arrangements will be made for inspection before shipment of sleepers from India (including Burma) or the Straits Settlements. In the case of sleepers from other countries delivery will be accepted in Colombo, subject to the sleepers being strictly in accordance with the specification.

In case of failure to comply with the specification the General Manager may deduct such sum from the payment, as he may consider justifiable, by reason of the inferior quality of sleepers supplied, or may reject the sleepers, in which case they shall be removed forthwith by the contractor. Any dispute to be referred to the arbitrators as stated in paragraph 5.

23. The price quoted in the tender is to include all costs, including inspection and freight, till delivered in ship's slings at vessel's side in Colombo Harbour, and sleepers to be at risk of contractors till so delivered.

24. Payment will be made to the contractors by the Treasurer for each separate shipment according to the

quantity specified in the bill of lading in exchange for such document.

25. The contractor shall not assign or transfer the contract without the permission of the General Manager of the Railway.

26. Delivery may commence from date of acceptance of tender, and must be completed by July 30, 1918. Delivery shall be made in as large lots as possible.

27. If any contractor fails to supply the sleepers or any of them in accordance with his contract, or commit a breach of any of the covenants of the contract, the General Manager of the Railway shall be at liberty, by notice in writing, to forthwith determine the contract; and thereupon the contractor will be liable to pay the excess cost of purchasing sleepers elsewhere at such price as the General Manager of the Railway shall deem fit to the quantity which he contracted to supply and shall, in addition, be liable to forfeit the sum of Rs. 5,000 (named in paragraph 15) deposited as security.

28. In the event of war, or disturbance, or pestilence, epidemical sickness, earthquakes, fires, storms, floods, or other hindrances, being the act of God or beyond the control of the contractors, the contract shall be subject to such modification as the circumstances may warrant.

This sum of Rs. 10 will be held by the Assistant Government Agent as a security for tenderer's entering into the contract with him, in the event of his tender being accepted, for carrying out the work in a satisfactory manner and will be confiscated, if he fails to enter into such a contract within a reasonable time after his tender was accepted.

5. The tenderer should name an address at Puttalam, where letters for him may be left or delivered.

6. The work should be completed within four weeks after the contract was entered into.

7. Further particulars may be obtained from the Salt Inspector, Puttalam.

*Description of the Work to be done.*

All the decayed or otherwise worthless cadjan, timber, and other materials that are on the building now should be removed and replaced by new and sound materials.

The roof of the kitchen in the supervisor's quarters and the houses of the first class constable and the six patrols should be rethatched with new cadjan, and pootus should be placed thereupon to serve as weights.

The floor of all the houses and out-houses should be raised with clay, levelled, stamped, and cowedged.

The walls should be repaired and plastered wherever necessary, and should also be whitewashed.

All the fences enclosing the various premises should be repaired, new sticks being planted wherever necessary.

The doors, windows, posts, and wall plates should all be painted.

The water-closets in the supervisor's and the first class constable's premises should be repaired.

The walls of the kitchen should be plastered and the exterior thereof should be lined with cadjan.

In the supervisor's house the floor should be repaired wherever necessary with cement, and the tiles should be shifted wherever necessary.

The kottu bearing No. 5 should be pulled down, and the sound materials that are found in it should be utilized in building a new kottu bearing No. 2 between Ariyakuda and Sengalputty.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 6, 1917.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 119 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 15 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 23·2, as against 20·4 in the preceding week, 22·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 102 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 46 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 19·9, as against 23·2 in the previous week, 28·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·1 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 102 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, same as in the previous week, against 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Four deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Pettah, 1 in Maradana, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya. Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana and 1 in New Bazaar.

4. One death registered in Kotahena was supposed to be due to *Plague*. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered in the previous week. Three cases were reported, as against 2 in the previous week.

5. Nine deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 8 from *Debility*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Enteritis*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, and 51 from *Other Causes*.

6. There were reported 4 cases of *Measles*, as against 12 in the previous week; and 1 case of *Chickenpox*, as against 4 in the previous week. One case of *Smallpox* was also reported during the week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 79·7°, against 78·4° in the preceding week and 80·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·901 in., against 29·876 in. in the preceding week and 29·854 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·15 in., against 8·76 in. in the preceding week and 0·35 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

2. Candidates must not be less than 18 or more than 25 years of age, and must furnish the certificates enumerated below, and also state their height and chest measurements in their applications:—

- (a) A certificate of age.
- (b) A health certificate from a Government Medical Officer testifying to the candidate's sound constitution, good vision and hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island.
- (c) A certificate of respectability and good moral character from two or more persons whose social or official position can be accepted as a guarantee of reliability.
- (d) A certificate that the candidate has passed one of the following tests:—

- (1) The Entrance Examination or the First Examination in Arts (Calcutta);
- (2) The London College of Preceptors Examination, 1st Division;
- (3) The Matriculation Examination of the London University. A knowledge of mensuration is also indispensable;
- (4) The Cambridge Junior or Senior School Certificate Examination or the Cambridge Junior or Senior Local Examination, but a pass in English and Mathematics is compulsory; or
- (5) Tests of educational qualifications corresponding to or not below any of the above, of which proof must be produced.

3. Candidates need only furnish copies of certificates, which will not be returned. No intimation will be given to unsuccessful candidates, nor will letters inviting attention to applications tendered be replied to.

4. Candidates must submit their applications in person through the Deputy or Assistant Conservator of Forests

within whose division they reside, and post copy of same direct to the Conservator of Forests. The originals of the certificates should be produced to the Deputy or Assistant Conservator of Forests, who should certify to the correctness of the copies of certificates attached to the applications. Any candidates already in the service of Government must submit their applications similarly through the Head of their Department and the Deputy or Assistant Conservator of Forests.

**MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.**

**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 11, 1917.**

The Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 6, 1917.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena ; Mr. H. M. Makan Marikar ; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe ; Dr. C. B. Lourensz ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena ; and Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 14, 1917, having been previously typewritten, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 14, 1917, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardena asked—(1) What steps are taken by the Medical Officer of Health on receipt of a report of a case of infectious disease in the town ?

The Chairman replied that when a case of infectious disease is reported to the Medical Officer of Health, he orders the Inspector to proceed at once to the place, and to give the householders the necessary instructions—which differ in various diseases—and to take all necessary steps to prevent the spread of the disease. The Inspector makes house to house inspections, and he gives instructions for disinfection. The Medical Officer of Health makes it a point to visit the patient's house at the earliest opportunity, and to see that his orders are properly carried out. If the patient is not removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital, the Inspector reports daily on the progress of the case, and continue his house to house inspections. Disinfectants are supplied to those who are unable to buy them ; and every effort is made to trace the source of infection.

(2) What steps are taken in case of death from such infectious disease ?

The Chairman replied that in that case the room which the patient occupied and all the articles used by him are disinfected by the Inspector. Stricter and additional measures will be taken in cases of suspected cholera, smallpox, or plague.

(3) What is the method adopted by the Municipality for the destruction of stray dogs in the town ?

The Chairman replied that stray dogs are destroyed by being shot. He had appointed a special officer for the purpose, and he was paid Re. 1.25 for each dog he shot. The police also shoot stray dogs.

(4) How many dogs have been so destroyed during the six months ended July 31, 1917 ?

The Chairman replied that 241 dogs were shot by the special officer and 219 by the police.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. G. E. Abeywardena asked—(5) What is the cause of the delay in the construction of the Bope bridge ?



The Chairman replied that the Superintendent of Works reported, in last April, that moulds had been made for casting the concrete piles, iron shoes were being made by Messrs. Clark, Spence & Co., iron, cement, &c., had been collected, and that the making of the piles would be commenced in a fortnight's time. But he reported in August that as during June and July he had the important work of supervising the scraping of the water mains, both by day and by night, the work of making the concrete piles was put back. But it will be undertaken as soon as the scraping of the 8-in. main from the old police station to Bikke reservoir is completed (in August).

(6) Why is the report of the Special Committee, appointed on June 13, 1914 (and re-elected this year), to investigate the effect on the town water of the timber existing in the bed of the Hiyare reservoir withheld from the Council.

The Chairman said the reply was the same as that given by him a year ago. A summary of the steps taken appeared in the Administration Report of 1914, section 15, paragraphs 48 to 50. But in view of the cost, and the impossibility of obtaining a loan from Government at that time, the work had to be postponed; and the Special Committee had not pressed its work to a conclusion owing to this difficulty. The report will be made at an early date.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved—(1) That the recovery of a commission of 9 per cent. from the fishermen at the fish auction shed be discontinued.

Mr. Subasinghe after speaking to the motion withdrew it, on the Chairman explaining the situation with regard to the fish auction shed.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved—(2) That some method, more effective than the one in vogue now, be adopted for the destruction of stray dogs in the town. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

The Chairman explained the difficulty there has been to get any one at all to destroy dogs, and said that inquiry was being made for employing dog seizers.

The Chairman proposed that the rate of payment for the destruction of dogs be increased from Re. 1·25 to Re. 1·50 for every dog shot. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene seconded.—Carried.

The Secretary was directed to inquire from Kandy if the services of two dog seizers can be had. The Council to pay their train fare (both ways), and to pay 62½ cents for each dog that was seized and brought to the pound. The dog seizers to provide the necessary implements and ropes, &c., and to find their own accommodation.

6. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved—That the attention of the Public Works Department be drawn to the absence in some places of a built drain along the south side of the Galle-Colombo road from the Mahamodara Hospital down to the Victoria Park, and to the condition of whatever built portion there is of such drain, and to request the said Department to be so good as to build a proper drain in this section of road, thereby abating the nuisance now created by the absence of a drain. Mr. G. E. Abeywardena seconded.—Carried.

Resolved—That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Director of Public Works.

7. Applications from Mr. F. R. E. Nicholas, Superintendent of Works, for one month's leave of absence.

Resolved—That the Council is not prepared to grant leave at once, in view of the work on Bope bridge and on the roads being seriously behind hand. The application may be renewed later if he can make suitable arrangement for the performance of his duties.
