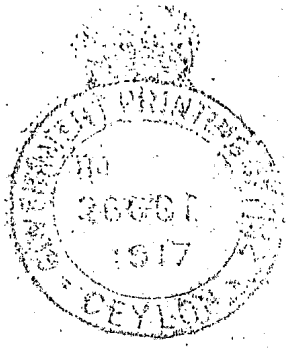
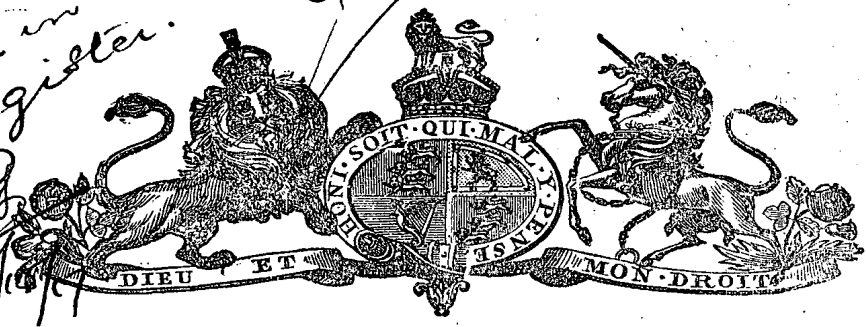

BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation :

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly :

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited :

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz. :—

All machinery driven by power and suitable for use in cutting, working, or operating on wood, including—

Sawing machines of all descriptions.

General joiners.

Mortise, tenon, and boring machines.

Lathes and rounding machines.

Box- and cask-making machines, and all machines accessory thereto.

Scraping and sandpapering machines.

Wheelwright machinery.

Firewood-making and bundling machinery.

Wood wool fibre and pulp machinery.

Saw-sharpening and setting machines.

Saw stretchers and brazing apparatus.

All machines for grinding, planing, or moulding irons.

Electrical motors up to one-half horse power.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 18) Proclamation, 1917.

- (c) Fibres, vegetable, not otherwise prohibited, and tissues and manufactures of such fibres, not otherwise prohibited.

- Linen manufactures, the following :—
- (c) Goods manufactured wholly or partly of flax, not otherwise prohibited.
- (c) Marjoram leaves.
- (c) Pyrites cinders.
- (A) Quercitron bark and extracts thereof.
- (A) Tanning extracts and substances for use in tanning.
- (A) Telegraphs (including wireless) and telephones, and instruments and material for, including valves for wireless telegraphic apparatus.
- (c) Thyme leaves.
- (A) Vanadium ore.
- (c) Vanillin, vanilla, and vanilla pods.
- (A) Wire, iron, and articles wholly manufactured thereof.
- (A) Wire, steel, and articles wholly manufactured thereof.

“THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898.”

IT is hereby notified that the following by-laws made by the Local Board of Moratuwa, under section 56 (5) of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, in substitution for the by-laws made by the said Board, and published in the *Government Gazette* of September 10, 1915, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and are hereby published for general information.

BY-LAWS *re* BAKERIES.

1. “Bakery” shall mean any premises on which bread, biscuits, or confectionery are baked for sale as food for man, and also includes any premises on which such food is prepared for baking, or on which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.

2. No person shall keep a bakery without an annual license from the Chairman. Every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued or until the license is cancelled. The Chairman is empowered to refuse such license to any person failing to comply with these rules. Such license shall further be subject to such fees as the Local Board shall from time to time determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.

3. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of these rules, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Local Board. Upon such cancellation of a license by a court, the Chairman of the Local Board is empowered, in his discretion, to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person.

4. The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 12 feet by 15 feet. There shall be a free external air space on at least two sides, not less than 7 feet wide, to permit of through ventilation. The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room. Every kneading room shall be provided with a ceiling.

5. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls in every part shall not be less than 7 feet in height, and be built of brick, stone, or cabook; the inside thereof

shall be limeplastered and white-washed every six months. The roof shall be of some permanent material. The ceilings shall be plastered and limewashed four times yearly, or they may be made of closely fitting boards varnished or painted. The floor shall be cemented throughout, and adequate drainage provided. Every room shall be provided with windows capable of being opened, and having a superficial area of not less than 1/16th of the superficial floor space.

6. The troughs and all the utensils used in the making of bread and pastry shall be kept scrupulously clean, and must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor.

7. The floor shall be carefully scraped and swept at least once every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings shall be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle and removed from the bakery daily.

8. Every bakery shall be kept in a cleanly state, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cesspit, or other nuisance.

9. No bakery shall be within 50 feet of any cesspit, manure heap, open sewer, or privy.

10. No furniture or other articles are to be stored in the bakery other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry.

11. The tops of the tables are to be made of well-seasoned closely-fitting planks, or some non-harmful impervious material, and are to be scraped and cleaned daily.

12. No animals shall be kept in the bakery on any pretence whatever.

13. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of the bakery has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attend-

ance on any such case, shall be permitted by any such person to enter the bakery or take part in the manufacture or sale on the premises of bread, biscuits, or confectionery.

14. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread making, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body, and also a white cap or turban.

15. Clean water and soap shall be provided for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits, and confectionery.

16. All bread, biscuits, confectionery, and sweetmeats exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. The cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

17. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome, and the flour shall be kept on a platform raised 3 feet above the ground.

18. All refuse around the premises of a bakery shall be removed daily, and the drains shall be well flushed.

19. No place on the same level with the bakery and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is effectually separated from the bakery by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling. No water-closet, earth-closet, privy, or ash pit shall be within, or communicate directly with, the bakery.

20. It shall be lawful for a Local Board Inspector or other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.

21. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.

"THE DOG REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1901."

THE following by-laws framed under section 5 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901 for the Sanitary Board towns in the District of Ratnapura of the Province of Sabaragamuwa are published for general information. The by-laws dated July 4, 1905, published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,062 of July 7, 1905, are hereby repealed.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. A registration fee of 25 cents per annum shall be paid upon each dog kept within the town limits.

2. Such registration fee shall be due on and after July 1, and shall be paid in advance before August 1 in each year.

3. To facilitate the recovery of such registration fee the occupier of every house within the town shall, on or before June 1 in each year, furnish to an officer authorized by the Government Agent to demand the same a list, in the form in schedule annexed, of the dog or dogs kept in such house and the names of the owners thereof.

4. On payment of the registration fee on any dog the Government Agent shall, unless the owner provides his own collar to be stamped, furnish the owner with a stamped collar to be worn by such dog on payment of a fee of 25 cents.

5. Every inhabitant within the town limits becoming possessed of any

dog or dogs, after the furnishing of the list referred to in by-law 3, shall furnish the officer appointed by the Government Agent mentioned in the said by-law with an additional list of such dog or dogs within one month after acquiring the same, and the owner of such dog or dogs shall become liable to the registration fee for the current year within fifteen days after the list required by this by-law becomes due.

6. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to require the production of any dog for which registration is applied for, and to decline to issue a certificate of registration until it is produced.

7. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to refuse to issue a certificate of registration, or to cancel a certificate already issued for any dog which, in his opinion, is so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live, or which

is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.

8. The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the house of the officer appointed by the Government Agent at a time to be stated in the notice and deliver it to the said officer, and every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Government Agent shall think fit.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 20, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 120 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 20 Moors, 8 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 23.4, as against 22.6 in the preceding week, 27.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 83 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 32 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 12 Moors, 5 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 16.2, as against 19.9 in the previous week, 28.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 83 total deaths, 21 were of infants under one year of age, a similar number was registered in the preceding week, against 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, a similar number was registered in the previous week, against 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 7 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Slave Island. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered, both in this week and in the previous week. One case was reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

5. Nine deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 7 from *Debility*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Enteritis*, 1 from *Worms*, and 28 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twenty-three cases of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 6 in the previous week; and 2 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 3 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.8°, against 80.4° in the preceding week and 79.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.852 in., against 29.894 in. in the preceding week and 29.839 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.03 in., against 0.26 in. in the preceding week and 2.05 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Maha season : in some divisions fields are being sown, and in some parts plants are thriving well.
 Yala season : in almost in all the divisions paddy has been reaped and threshed.
 Other products : flowering and prospects of coconuts are fairly good. The estimated crop for the month is 20,200,000 nuts. Fruits and vegetables are to be had in fair quantity.
 Prices of staple products : (a) imported rice is sold at Rs 5·50 to Rs. 6·50 per bushel ; (b) coconuts are sold at Rs. 15 to Rs. 20 per 1,000.
 Harvest prospects : generally good.
 Rainfall : heavy rain prevailed during the month.
 Health of inhabitants : generally good, except for a few cases of chickenpox, dysentery, and enteric fever.
 Health of cattle : unsatisfactory. There have been two cases of hoof disease and many cases of rinderpest in Colombo Mudaliyar's division, 4 cases of rinderpest in Salpiti korale, a few cases in Siyane korale west, 26 cases in Alutkuru korale south, and few cases in Alutkuru korale north.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy : the yala harvest was gathered in during the month.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 15, 1917, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 11, 1917.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; and Mr. L. H. S. Pieris.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 18, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1916 to August 31, 1917, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for August.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of August.
- The reservoir readings for August.

Resolved that statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during August, 1917.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 14 of August 23, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction on the same conditions as are imposed by Government the payment of a grant of Rs. 25 per mensem for two years to the Central Town Library, Kandy, to be spent on books.—It was agreed that the grant be made as from September 1, 1917.

(2) Letter No. 15 of September 3, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* proposed by-law relating to the screening of privies.—Resolved that the amendment suggested be agreed to.

(3) Endorsement No. 5 of September 3, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, inquiring whether the Chairman's Administration Report for 1916 cannot be reduced in bulk to some extent in view of the necessity for economy in paper.—Resolved that the report be reduced as proposed.

(4) Letter No. 175 of August 15, 1917, from the Government Agent, Central Province, asking the Council to nominate an Unofficial Member as representative on the Excise Advisory Committee for the Kandy Municipal area.—Mr. Pieris proposed that Mr. Wijegoonewardene be nominated. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—Carried.

(5) Letter No. M 16 of September 4, 1917, from the Acting Director of the Colombo Museum *re* the introduction of Gourami fish into the Kandy lake.—Resolved that the proposal be approved, and that the Director be asked to convey the thanks of the Council to Mr. W. C. Lloyd of Kotagala.

(6) Letter No. 16 of September 11, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that it is regretted that Government is unable to accept the proposal that provision be made by Government for a sum of Rs. 2,500 to meet the cost of Kandy vagrants for 1917.—Resolved that the Colonial Secretary be informed that the Council desire to discontinue the arrangement referred to in paragraph 2 of the letter No. 16 of September 11, 1917, and request that the necessary instructions may be given to the Inspector-General of Police. As regards vagrants now in the Home, the Council request that they may be discharged at the end of October, as the Council's vote of Rs. 2,500 will then be exhausted.

5. The following motion, which stood in Mr. Beven's name, was withdrawn with the leave of Council :—“That the thanks of the Council be conveyed to Hon. Mr. C. van der Wall for obtaining a vote in the Legislative Council which would provide Kandy with postal facilities.”

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Pieris moved—“That in view of the draft of the proposed Ordinance to amend ‘The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910,’ published in the *Government Gazette* of August 31, 1917, it is desirable that Government be informed that this Council has not decided to pay the balance of the loan of Rs. 250,000 made under Ordinance No. 18 of 1884, and that the resolution passed at the Meeting of December 16, 1916, did not commit the Council to any such repayment of the total amount of loan now outstanding.” Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded.

On the Chairman's suggestion the mover agreed to the following amendment :—“That in view of the draft of the proposed Ordinance to amend ‘The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910,’ published in the *Government Gazette* of August 31, 1917, it is desirable that Government be informed that this Council has not as yet decided to pay off immediately the balance now outstanding on account of the loan of Rs. 250,000 made under Ordinance No. 18 of 1884.”

Mr. Beven spoke against both the original resolution and the amendment. The resolution as amended was put to the Meeting and carried.—Mr. Beven dissenting.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris moved—"That tenders for the privilege of selling beef and mutton for one year in a site in Hill street, approved by the Medical Officer of Health, be called for." Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—Carried.

8. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That cattle seizers be given a reward of 25 per cent. of the fines imposed in cases instituted by them. Minimum reward to be Re. 1.

(2) That M. Cassim be allowed permission on a ticket of occupancy to plant grass on the slope of the Meda-ela along Torrington road on payment of a rent of 25 cents a month.

Finance and Assessment.

(3) That the lease of the old toll house at Katugastota to Dr. J. W. Attygalle be renewed for a further period of two years from January 1, 1918, and that the rent be reduced from Rs. 18.33 to Rs. 15 a month.

(4) That Mr. H. F. Tomalin be paid a fee of Rs. 1,250 for his report on the Kandy water supply, on the understanding that no further fee will be paid for the supplementary report called for.

(5) That A. M. Meaya Lebbe's tender of Rs. 9,250 per annum for the privilege of collecting the market daily rents be accepted for the years 1918 and 1919.

Municipal Works.

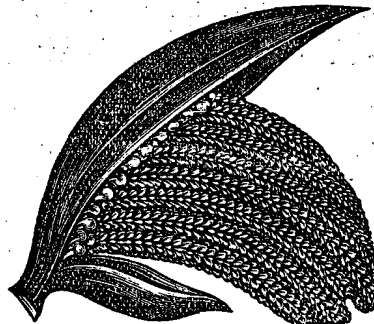
