A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom. GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms. ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation :

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly :

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited :

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :---

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz. :-

Bacon.	f	Hams.
Butter.	and the second	Lard (other than neutral lard).

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 19) Proclamation, 1917.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorized by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A list (the Consolidating List No. 33a), consolidating all previous lists was published on August 17, 1917 and which, together with Lists No. 34 cf August 31, 1917, and the list herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of June 25 and November 10, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).-In order to minimize as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph, he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the list. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the list as they appear. The lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H. M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

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

(b) From Nilaveli saltern platforms.

(c) From Nilaveli salt store platforms.

2. In case (a) the contractor shall weigh and receive the salt; in cases (b) and (c) the manufacturers will deliver the salt at the scales and put it in the bags to be provided by the contractor.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 27, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 97 (2 Europeans, 16 Burghers, 45 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 12 Moors, and 4 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 18.9, as against 23.4 in the preceding week, 22.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 110(1 European, 7 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 14 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.4, as against 16.2 in the previous week, 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 110 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 5 in Kotahena, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

2. Five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 11 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Kotahena, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in New Bazaar.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Kotahena and the other in Maradana.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered. Of these, 1 was in Pettah and the other in Wellawatta. No deaths were registered in the previous week. Three cases were reported as against 1 in the previous week.

5. Twelve deaths from Debility were registered, 6 from Dysentery, 6 from Enteritis, 5 from Infantile Commissions. 4 from Diarrhæa, 1 from Tetanus, and 50 from Other Causes.

6. Seven cases of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 23 in the previous week; and 2 cases of *Chickenpox*, same as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.3°, against 78.8° in the preceding week and 80.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.890 in., against 29.852 in. in the preceding week and 29.910 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.20 in., against 2.08 in. in the preceding week and 0.30 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.




