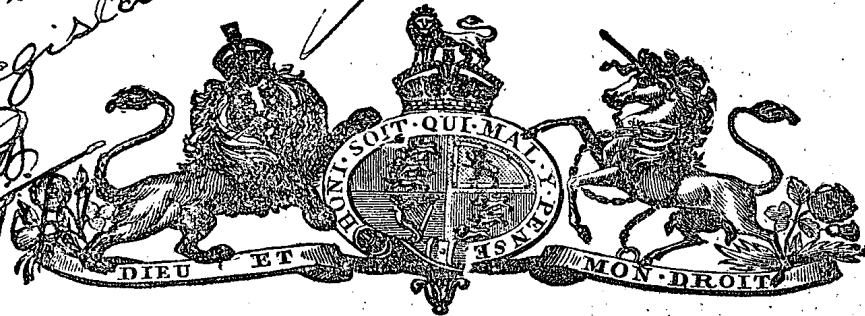

KNOW Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 4 (1) of Ordinance No. 3 of 1903, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereto, the said district requires police, and do hereby order that a police force consisting of one sergeant and four constables be quartered in the said district in the Western Province, as from and after November 7, 1917.

And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the said schedule.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seventeen.

A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation :

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly :

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited :

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz. :—

Bacon.
Butter.

Hams.
Lard (other than neutral lard).

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 19) Proclamation, 1917.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorized by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A list (the Consolidating List No. 33a), consolidating all previous lists was published on August 17, 1917 and which, together with Lists No. 34 of August 31, 1917, and the list herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The lists are published in the *London Gazette* and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

* NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

† NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of June 25 and November 10, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimize as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph, he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the list. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the list as they appear. The lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H. M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

‡ NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English Company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under Berg and Komeet respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

VITAL STATISTICS.**Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 27, 1917.**

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 97 (2 Europeans, 16 Burghers, 45 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 12 Moors, and 4 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 18.9, as against 23.4 in the preceding week, 22.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 110 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 14 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.4, as against 16.2 in the previous week, 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 110 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 5 in Kotahena, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

2. Five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 11 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Kotahena, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in New Bazaar.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Kotahena and the other in Maradana.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered. Of these, 1 was in Pettah and the other in Wellawatta. No deaths were registered in the previous week. Three cases were reported as against 1 in the previous week.

5. Twelve deaths from *Debility* were registered, 6 from *Dysentery*, 6 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Diarrhœa*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 50 from *Other Causes*.

6. Seven cases of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 23 in the previous week; and 2 cases of *Chickenpox*, same as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.3°, against 78.8° in the preceding week and 80.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.890 in., against 29.852 in. in the preceding week and 29.910 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.20 in., against 2.08 in. in the preceding week and 0.30 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Bids over Rs. 500 and up to Rs. 1,000.

50 per cent. of the bid and security of Rs. 75 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid regularly in two monthly instalments within two months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.

Bids over Rs. 1,000.

4. Should the required deposit not be made immediately on conclusion of the sale, the right to collect the produce will be at once offered again to public competition, and the person who failed in the first instance to make the required deposit will not be allowed to bid unless he deposits in advance a sum of Rs. 50, which will be forfeited if he again refuses to make the required deposit on acceptance of his bid.

5. The balance of the purchase amount, if any, shall be paid as specified in condition 3.

6. Should the person decline or fail to enter into an agreement within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Assistant Conservator of Forests of the Galle Division to the effect that his bid has been accepted by the Conservator of Forests or to pay the balance of the purchase amount when due, the deposits already made on account of the purchase and the security shall be forfeited, and the right to collect the produce in question re-sold at the risk of the original purchaser, who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such re-sale, but on the other hand he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by any re-sale.

7. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, re-sold, or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.
