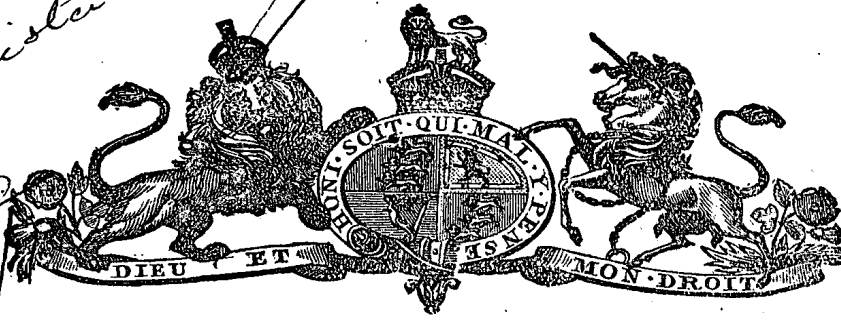

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Chapter VIII.

27. (a) No privy shall be erected except on a site and according to plans approved of by the Chairman.

PROVISO REFERRED TO.

REGULATION REFERRED TO.

Whenever any private street or private lane leads into or intersects a public road, it shall be lawful for the Sanitary Board to name such street or lane and to paint up such name at the point where the street or lane intersects the public road.

And it shall be lawful for the Chairman to remove any notice board containing any name other than that given by the Sanitary Board, which may have been erected by any person at any point facing such street or lane, or by written order to direct the person who erected such notice board to remove the same within a period to be fixed by such written order, and any person failing to comply with such written order shall be guilty of an offence.

BY-LAWS re CESSPITS.

1. No occupier or owner shall build or cause to be built on his land or premises any privy, cesspit, or latrine without having first obtained the permission of the Chairman in writing.

2. (a) Upon any application for such permission under by-law 1 it shall be competent to the Chairman or the Board to require that any particular type of privy, cesspit, or latrine approved by the Board and no other shall be constructed.

(b) The Chairman or the Board may further prescribe the position in which such privy, cesspit, or latrine shall be constructed, and refuse permission to construct any privy, cesspit, or latrine in any other position.

(c) It shall further be competent to the Chairman or the Board to refuse permission to construct any privy, cesspit, or latrine at all upon any premises should the Chairman or the Board be of opinion that such construction should not be permitted on sanitary grounds.

3. (a) It shall be competent to the Board to order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises in which a privy, cesspit, or latrine has been constructed without permission or in any way contrary to the terms of any permission issued by the Chairman or the Board to demolish and fill up the said privy, cesspit, or latrine within such reasonable time as may be prescribed by the Chairman or the Board.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

4. (a) The Board may order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises to construct within the time prescribed by such order a privy or latrine of such a type and size and in such a position and with such connecting drains as the Board may prescribe.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

5. (a) The Board may order in writing the owner or occupier of the premises upon which any privy, cesspit, or latrine exists either to repair, alter, or reconstruct the same in such manner and within such time as the Board may prescribe, or to demolish and fill up the same within such prescribed time, if in the opinion of the Board such privy, cesspit, or latrine is structurally defective or is unsuitable for the purpose to which it is put, or is liable to give rise to a nuisance, or if it does not abut upon and cannot be conveniently conserved from a sanitary lane established by the Board under by-law 8, or otherwise the Board may require the owner or occupier of the

premises upon which the privy, cesspit, or latrine exists either to repair, alter, or reconstruct the same in such manner and within such reasonable time as the Board may prescribe or within such prescribed time to demolish and fill up the same.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

6. *Definition.*—For the purposes of the following by-laws—

"Cesspit" shall mean and include all forms of closets or latrines other than those on the dry-earth system.

"Specified area" shall mean and include such area or areas within the limits of the Board as the Board may from time to time specify; such area may comprise the whole of such limits or a portion or portions thereof.

7. The Board may by resolution prohibit within any specified area or portion of a specified area the use of any particular kind of cesspit of whatever kind, and direct that all latrines and closets be conducted on the dry-earth system.

8. Whenever such a resolution shall have been passed, and notice in writing shall have been given to the owner or occupier of any house or building or land in or on which such cesspit or cesspits are situated to close such cesspit or cesspits and substitute a dry-earth closet or closets therefor, it shall be incumbent on such person or persons to comply with such notice within such time as the Board may determine from the service of such notice. Any owner or occupier failing within a reasonable time to comply with such notice shall be guilty of an offence. Provided that for the erection of any closet or latrine under this by-law the permission of the Chairman under by-law 1 shall be necessary, so that the Chairman may give necessary instructions as to type, situation, &c.

9. It shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of any premises upon which any privy or latrine stands to keep the said privy or latrine in good repair and in a clean and sanitary state and to see that no nuisance is caused thereby. Any owner or occupier failing so to do shall be guilty of an offence.

10. In order to secure the efficient removal of night soil it shall be lawful for the Board by resolution to require the owner or occupier of any houses, buildings, or lands in any specified area to provide and maintain at their own expenses a conservancy lane not exceeding 8 feet wide at the back of or running through their premises in such position as may be determined by the Chairman.

11. Within any specified area all conservancy shall be carried out by the Board, and it shall not be lawful for any person either to carry out such work himself or by means of an agent or servant or to employ any person to do such work for him without the written permission of the Chairman, which permission the Chairman is empowered at his discretion to refuse, if he is of opinion that all such services within the area can be adequately carried out by the Board.

12. All owners or occupiers of premises furnished with closets or latrines within any specified area shall pay monthly to the Board such conservancy fees as shall be fixed by the Board for the removal of their night soil. All such fees should be paid before the 10th day of the month following that during which the service was rendered. In default of payment the Police Magistrates having local jurisdiction are required and empowered to recover the same in the same manner as a fine imposed by them.

13. Any persons requiring the services of day coolies may apply to the Board therefor in writing, and such coolies will be supplied upon such terms as the Board shall decide. Fees for the services of such coolies shall be paid, and shall be recoverable in the same manner as conservancy fees under by-law 12.

14. Any person outside a specified area who desires that the conservancy of his closet or latrine be undertaken by the Board or that he be given the services of a day cooly shall notify the Chairman in writing to that effect, and the Board may thereupon undertake such conservancy. The fees due from such person shall be payable and recoverable in the same manner as conservancy fees under by-law 12.

15. Whenever the Board shall consider the construction of a new catchpit or the alteration, repair, or reconstruction or filling up of an existing catchpit to be necessary, it may require any owner or occupier of any land or premises by notice in writing signed by the Chairman either to construct a new catchpit or to alter, repair, or reconstruct or fill up any existing catchpit, and may further give directions as to the position, level, and size of such catchpit, the materials to be used, the manner in which the work is to be carried out, and any other details in connection with such works. Any such owner or occupier who shall after receipt of such notice fail within such time as the Board shall determine to carry out such requirements of the Board shall be guilty of an offence.

16. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to notify the owner or occupier of

any land or premises upon which there is any catchpit into which filthy water flows and collects that the Board will henceforth undertake the daily removal of such water, and thereafter such owner or occupier shall be bound to pay such reasonable fees for the removal of such dirty water as the Board shall determine. Such fees

shall be payable and recoverable in the same manner as conservancy fees under by-law 12.

17. The owner or occupier of any land or premises upon which there is any catchpit into which dirty water flows and collects, and who shall not have been notified by the Chairman under by-law 16 shall be responsible

for the daily removal of such water to such place as the Chairman shall approve so that no nuisance is caused thereby. Any such owner or occupier failing to carry out such removal as above required shall be guilty of an offence.

"THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892."

THE following resolution passed by the Legislative Council at the meeting held on October 31, 1917, is published for general information:—

That the town of Wadduwa, in the Panadure totamune, Kalutara District, Western Province, be brought under the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, No. 18 of 1892, as from and after January 1, 1918, and that the limits of the said town shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be as follows:—

North: The village boundary of Pinwatta and Nalluruwa running from the sea eastwards.

East: A line running southwards from the northern boundary parallel to the Galle road and 5 chains to the east of it as far as the Talpitiya canal. The Talpitiya canal eastwards. A straight line drawn from the southern angle of the canal adjoining title plan No. 52,552 in the village of Talpitiya to the point at which the District Road Committee road to Morontuduwa crosses the ela which forms the boundary of the villages of Wadduwa and Melegama. The said boundary of Wadduwa southwards as far as title plan No. 62,947 in the village of Wadduwa; a line drawn southwards parallel to the Galle road at a distance of 5 chains to the east of it as far as the southern boundary.

South: A line drawn east and west through the 21½ milepost on the Galle road from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary to the sea.

West: The sea.

From these boundaries all paddy fields are excluded, except such fields as form the frontage of any road, that is, come within 2 chains of the centre of such road.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 3, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 108 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 50 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 23 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 21.0, as against 18.9 in the preceding week, 23.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 91 (4 Burghers, 39 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 19 Moors, 7 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 17.7, as against 21.4 in the previous week, 22.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 91 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 25 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.—Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 17 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Kotahena, 4 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Pettah, and 1 in New Bazaar.

2. Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana (both non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Slave Island, 2 in Wellawatta, and 1 in Kotahena. One death from *Bronchitis* was registered.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered (in Kotahena), as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered. Two were registered in the previous week. One case was reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

5. Thirteen deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 9 from *Enteritis*, 9 from *Debility*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Dysentery*, and 36 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eleven cases of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 7 in the previous week; and 7 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 2 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.3° same as in the preceding week, against 80.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.877 in., against 29.890 in. in the preceding week and 29.891 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, September 8, 1917.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 3, 1917.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. H. M. Makan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subasingha; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; Mr. A. C. Hayley; and Mr. J. E. Perera.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on August 11, 1917, having been previously typewritten, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting held on August 11, 1917, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. G. E. Abeywardena asked—

(1) What are the costs recovered from the ratepayers who have made default in the payment of assessment tax. ?

The Chairman replied that the costs of recovery as leviable under section 139 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 are as follows :—(a) A charge of 10 per cent. on the amount of rate or tax due by way of costs on the issue of a warrant; (b) For seizure and removal of goods seized, in case such removal takes place, a charge not exceeding five cents for every fifty cents of rates or tax due; (c) For keeping the same in safe custody in case of detention a charge not exceeding five cents per day; (d) For keeping a person in possession in case of seizure of immovable property, or if goods seized are not removed, a charge not exceeding seventy-five cents a day; (e) For the expenses of sale, when any takes place, a charge not exceeding twenty-five cents on every ten rupees of the nett proceeds of sale.

(2) Does any officer of the Council inquire whether the costs charged have been actually incurred ?

The Chairman replied that the inquiry is made by the Secretary.

(3) Did the Shroff Mudaliyar of the Galle Kachcheri draw the attention of the Secretary to the absence of watchers in premises Nos. 233 and 238; if so, why were costs recovered from him ?

The Chairman replied (a) That the answer to the first part of the question is "Yes"; (b) to the second part that when it was ascertained no watcher was placed, under section 139 (d) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the costs were refunded.

(4) Why are watchers kept in premises seized ?

The Chairman replied that in the case of seizure of immovable property persons are kept in possession to safeguard the Council's interests.

(5) To what is the green-fly nuisance inside the Fort attributable ?

The Chairman replied that the Medical Officer of Health reports that it is due to the copra store in the Fort.

(6) Are these flies injurious to the health of the public ?

The Chairman replied that no special injuriousness has been found in the fly, but the flies cannot but be prejudicial to some extent to the health of public when they are found in large numbers in a crowded locality.

(7) Have any steps been taken to remedy this nuisance ?

The Chairman replied that the proprietor of the store referred to in (5) expects to ship the copra at an early date, and no more copra will be brought to the store.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. W. Subasingha moved :—

That officers of the Council to whom warrants are issued for the recovery of rates and taxes be directed not to place watchers on properties seized, unless the Chairman considers same to be necessary and orders them to do so.—Mr. G. E. Abeywardena seconded.

Resolved—That the tax collectors be ordered not to keep a person in possession in case of seizure of immovable property, without the permission of the Chairman, unless they have very special reasons for so doing. In every instance the name and address of the person kept in possession should immediately be reported.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. C. Hayley moved :—(1) That the well on the ramparts near the District Judge's bungalow be filled in. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

(2) That a Member be appointed to confer with the Chairman of the Galle Planters' Association regarding alterations to the train services. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

The Council was in favour of a train service to Colombo at about 7 or 8 A.M., a down train reaching Galle about 8 P.M., and an extra daily train service to Matara.

The Chairman proposed that Mr. A. C. Hayley be appointed to confer with the Chairman of the Galle Planters' Association. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

(3) That steps be taken towards either removing or repairing the mosques damaged during the riots, and for which the Municipality has already paid compensation. Mr. G. E. Abeywardena seconded.

On the suggestion of the Chairman it was agreed that the Superintendent of Works be asked for an estimate for the repairs, specially of the roof, of the Meera mosque at Gintota, opposite Don Davith's, to see if the compensation would be sufficient to effect the repairs.

Mr. A. C. Hayley with the permission of the seconder and of the Council withdrew his motion.

5. List of demolished buildings in Wards 4 east and 5 to be struck off from the Assessment Register.

Council adopted the recommendation of the Committee that they be struck off.

6. Application from Mr. F. R. E. Nicholas, Superintendent of Works, for one month's leave of absence.

Resolved—That the Superintendent of Works be granted one month's leave on full pay from the 5th instant.

The Chairman proposed, Mr. D. W. Subasingha seconded, that Mr. A. H. Erskine, Superintendent of Minor Roads, be asked to act for the Superintendent of Works for a month on an allowance of Rs. 250 to be provided for in Supplemental Budget No. 2.—Mr. Erskine agreed to take up duties from Monday, the 10th instant, on the terms offered.

7. Notice of action received from Proctor Mr. G. D. Jayasundara for recovering damages for injuries caused to a horse belonging to W. A. Walis de Silva on Cripp's road.

Mr. C. E. de Vos proposed that a sum of Rs. 300 be offered as damages, without prejudice. Mr. D. W. Subasingha seconded.—Carried.

(Dr. C. B. Lourensz left the Meeting at this stage of the proceedings.)

8. Papers re election of an Unofficial Member of the Council to serve on the Excise Advisory Committee for the year 1917-1918.

Mr. G. E. Abeywardena proposed that Mr. D. W. Subasingha be nominated to serve on the Excise Advisory Committee for the Galle Municipal area for the year 1917-1918. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

9. List of counterfoils of receipts 1907-1914 to be destroyed.—The Council sanctioned that the counterfoils be destroyed.

"Improvements in knives for scraping and cutting bark and the like from rubber and other trees."

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is described in the claims:—

1. In knives for scraping and cutting bark and the like from rubber and other trees, a flat blade with the end bent at right angles and a concave cutting edge ground at that extreme end substantially as described and illustrated.
2. In knives for scraping and cutting bark and the like from rubber and other trees a portion of the bent part of the blade claimed in claim 1, punched out at three edges and bent at right angles about the previously described bent edge so that the two parts lie in the same plane and a convex cutting edge ground at the end of that punched and bent portion substantially as described and illustrated.
3. In knives for scraping and cutting bark and the like from rubber and other trees an additional cutting and scraping edge formed at one edge of the flat blade claimed in claim 1 about a half way in its length by punching or shearing and bending substantially as described and illustrated.
4. In knives for scraping and cutting bark and the like from rubber and other trees an additional cutting and scraping edge formed at one end of the shank of the blade by bending the end of it and grinding a cutting edge at the end of it substantially as described and illustrated.
5. In knives for scraping and cutting bark and the like from rubber and other trees a flat blade bent and ground to a concave cutting edge at the end as claimed in claim 1, punched and bent and ground to a convex cutting edge as claimed in claim 2, cut and bent and ground to a cutting or scraping edge formed at one edge of the flat blade as claimed in claim 3, and bent and ground to a cutting or scraping edge at the end of the shank as claimed in claim 4, all substantially as described and illustrated in combination.
