**Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council under "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by "The Enemy Property (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1917."**

WHEREAS it is provided by section 8 A (1) of "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by "The Enemy Property (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1917," that the Governor in Executive Council may, by Order in Council, vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property any property belonging to or held or managed for an enemy or an enemy subject, and may confer on the Custodian such power of selling or otherwise dealing with such property as to the Governor in Executive Council may seem proper:

And whereas the Governor in Executive Council by Order dated the First day of September, 1917, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,902 of October 12, 1917, vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property share in the Kalkudah Coconut Estate Co., Ltd., at Rs. 100, and empowered him to sell the same and upon sale transfer title thereto, and did in such Order state by error that the said shares were the property of Mrs. Minn Lienard Von Leynar:

### NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for washing blankets, mattresses, kit bags, haversacks, hospital linen, &c., at Diyatalawa and Colombo, from January 1 to December 31, 1918.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for washing Bedding, &c., of the Ceylon Volunteer Force" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on January 15, 1918.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 22, 1917.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 126 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghors, 69 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 24.5, as against 28.2 in the preceding week, 23.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 136 (1 European, 6 Burghors, 72 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.5, as against 27.8 in the previous week, 25.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 136 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

2. Five deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 in San Sebastian and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana, as in the previous week. Two cases were reported, as against 1 in the previous week.

5. One death from *Measles* was registered in Kotahena, as against 2 in the previous week. Two cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

6. Nineteen deaths from *Debility*, were registered, 18 from *Enteritis* 5 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Worms*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 58 from *Other Causes*.

7. Nine cases of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 2 in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 77.5°, against 78.8° in the preceding week and 78.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.909 in, against 29.867 in. in the preceding week and 29.890 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.42 in. against 1.41 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
