#### NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for washing blankets, mattresses, kit bags, haversacks, hospital linen, &c., at Diyatalawa and Colombo, from January 1 to December 31, 1918.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for washing Bedding, &c., of the Ceylon Volunteer Force" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on January 15, 1918.

The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Volunteer Headquarters, Slave Island, Colombo, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

A deposit of Rs. 50 only will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

Sufficient/sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of each contract. The amount of \ security required will be Rs. 150. All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in section 5.

9. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 22, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 126 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July I, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 24.5, as against 28.2 in the preceding week, 23.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 136 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils. 19 Moors, 2 Malays and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.5, as against 27.8 in the previous week, 25.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 136 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the precedir g week. 56 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eleven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 3 in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kellupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Five deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

- 2. Five deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 1 in San Sebastian and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. One death from Plague was registered in Maradana, as in the previous week. Two cases were reported, as against 1 in the previous week.
- 5. One death from Measles was registered in Kotahena, as against 2 in the previous week. Two cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.
- 6. Nineteen deaths from Debility, were registered, 18 from Enteritis 5 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Diarrhea, 4 from Worms, 2 from Dysentery. 1 from Tetanus, and 58 from Other Causes.
  - 7. Nine cases of Chickenpox were reported during the week, as against 2 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 77.5°, against 78.8° in the preceding week and 78.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.909 in, against 29.867 in. in the preceding week and 29.890 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.42 in, against 1.41 in, in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
