WHEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the road which the railway crosses between the stations of Pallewella and Mirigama, in the Western Province, and set out in the schedule hereto, to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare the said road to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance, as from and after January 23, 1918, and that such "minor crossing" shall not be closed by gates.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Aerated Water Manufactories.

1. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated waters within the limits of the Local Board for the purpose of sale without giving one month's previous notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.

No aerated water factory shall be situated within less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling

3. All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted, ventilated, and provided with a wood ceiling; must have cemented floors; must be provided with suitably built drains to carry off waste material; and must be kept clean and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate fly-proof room. All chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be scrupulously clean.

4. The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately protected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Board. It shall be transported

to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory in properly constructed tanks or reservoirs with dust-tight covers connecting with the aerating appa-

5. All waters used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have the power to exempt from the operation of this rule the water derived from an approved

public supply.

Whenever the Secretary or the Inspector of the Board is satisfied that any aerated water, either manufactured within the limits of the Board or introduced into such limits from outside, is of such bad quality as to be unfit for human consumption, he may seize such waters and produce them before the Medical Officer, and if it appears to such Medical Officer that such waters are unfit for human consumption, he may order the same to be destroyed. Any person manufacturing any aerated water which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the court to be unfit for human consumption shall be guilty of an offence.

7. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with filtered water, and shall be kept scrupulously clean.

8. Every bottle containing aerated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Board.

No person under 12 years of age shall be employed in any acrated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.

10. All employés engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine-meshed wire face- and neck-shields

and leather gloves.

11. It shall be lawful for the Medical Officer or the Secretary or the Inspector of the Board to enter any place used for the manufacture or sale of a crated waters at any time when such place is open and to take a sample bottle of any kind of aerated water which is there manufactured or kept for sale; and any proprietor or person in charge of such place who shall refuse to permit such samples to be taken shall be guilty of an offence.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 29, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 94 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 16 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1917, viz., 267,888) was 18·3, as against 24·5 in the preceding week, 20·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 137 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.7, as against 26.5 in the previous week, 30.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 137 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of the Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, November 17, 1917.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 12, 1917.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardene; Mr. A. C. Hayley; Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten; and Mr. J. E. Perera.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on October 13, 1917, a copy thereof having been previously sent to each Councillor, were taken as read.

With the leave of Council, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe called attention to an omission in item 8 of the Minutes of the last Meeting, namely, that Council went into Committee for the consideration of his amendment upon the Chairman's motion, and that the amendment was put to Committee. The Chairman was of the opinion that, automatically, Council had resumed after the discussion, and that the amendment was put to Council, and not to Committee.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting held on October 13, 1917, be confirmed.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. G. E. Abeywardene asked—(a) Has the Chairman convened a Meeting of the Special Committee appointed to investigate the effect on the town water of the timber existing in the bed of the Hiyare reservoir? (b) If so, have the labours of this long-standing Committee been concluded? (c) Will the Chairman submit to the Council the report of this Special Committee together with the connected papers?

The Chairman replied—(a) That three Meetings were convened; (b) that the Special Committee's investigations

were completed; and (c) that the report would be circulated.

- With the leave of Council, Mr. G. E. Abeywardene amended the motion standing in his name to read as follows: "That the rickshaw stand near the Oriental Hotel be extended to accommodate 12 rickshaws, and that a new stand be provided for 6 rickshaws on the plot of ground opposite the Fort market." Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.
- 4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved—(a) "That a Committee be appointed for the purpose of considering the matter of permitting buildings to be erected upon the line of existing public streets without making provision for the easy widening of such streets in the future, and for reporting thereon."

With the leave of Council, the following words were added to the motion:—" And suggesting remedial measures.

Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten seconded.—Carried.

Resolved-That Mr. D. W. Subasinghe, Mr. A. C. Hayley, Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten, and Mr. J. E. Perera do form the Committee.

(b) With the leave of Council, Mr. J. E. Perera amended his motion as follows:—" That the employés of Council be prohibited from making plans for private parties for the erection of buildings or additions thereto, and that such plans be not entertained by the Council." Mr. A. C. Hayley seconded.

Resolved—That the motion stand over till further inquiry is made.

- 5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved-"That the Superintendent of Works may be asked to make a report, including the probable cost, as to the cheapest way of raising the bottom of the hollow in the Victoria park, to a sufficient height to make the storm water to be carried away by the existing channel without remaining collected for some time as it does now." Mr. G. E. Abeywardene seconded.—Carried.
- Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved—"That the junction of Circular road with Morris road, at the turn to Miliduwa, be improved by straightening out the curve, and that the Superintendent of Works be requested to submit a plan and estimate for same." Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten seconded.—Carried.



The land called Thelbokulechena, situate at Keppetipola, in Galboda pattu of Galboda korale, in the Four Korales, in Kegalla District; bounded on the north by galweta, on the east by Mala-ela, on the south by the limit of the chena land of Udalawewa, and on the west by the canal; that of the land lying within the boundaries, which is of the extent of about 3 amunams of paddy sowing soil, excluding an undivided extent of low land which could be sown with I pela of paddy adjoining the eastern boundary, the third divided remaining extent and the plantations and all other things appertaining thereto including the buildings standing thereon.
