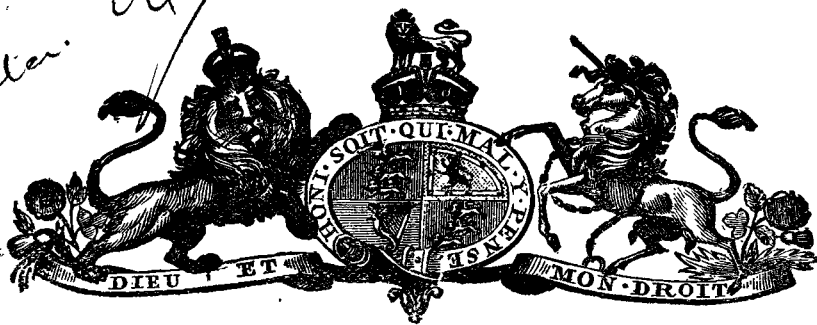

## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

### "THE VOLUNTEER ORDINANCE, 1910."

THE following rules made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 40 (b) of "The Volunteer Ordinance, 1910," as amended by "The Volunteer (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 42 of 1916," are hereby published for general information.

Rules made by the Governor in Executive Council under Section 40 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910,  
as amended by Ordinance No. 42 of 1916.

1. The following rules apply only to persons subject to Part IV, of the Ordinance.
2. In these rules—
  - A "Commanding Officer" means the Commanding Officer of the unit to which the person in question belongs or is attached for the time being.
  - A "superior officer" means any officer in command of the person in question on the ground, and includes a non-commissioned officer.
  - A "unit" means any of the following detachments, *i.e.*, the C. A. V., the C. E. V., the T. G. A., the C. M. R., the C. L. I., the C. P. R. C., the C. M. C. C., and the C. V. M. C.
3. Any person who—
  - (a) Without due excuse, the proof whereof shall lie on him, fails to perform within the period laid down by regulations made under the Ordinance such number of drills or to undergo such course of training as may be prescribed thereby;
  - (b) Without due excuse, the proof whereof shall lie on him, fails to attend at such time or place as may be appointed by his Commanding Officer for the purpose of courses of training, parades, and drills prescribed by regulation or for the purpose of any punishment drills to which he may be sentenced under these rules, or to perform a such training, parades, or drills at the time and place appointed [see *Army Act*, s. 15 (2), and *Regulation published in the "Government Gazette" No. 6,867 of April 20, 1917*];
  - (c) Without due excuse, the proof whereof shall lie on him, leaves the place of parade or rendezvous appointed his Commanding Officer, or goes from thence without leave before he is relieved, or without urgent necessity quits the ranks [see *Army Act*, s. 15 (2)];
  - (d) Disobeys in such manner as to show wilful defiance of authority any lawful command given personally by superior officer in the execution of his office, whether the same is given orally or in writing or otherwise [see *Army Act*, s. 9];
  - (e) Disobeys any lawful command given by his superior officer [see *Army Act*, s. 9];
  - (f) Strikes, or uses, or offers any violence to his superior officer, or uses threatening or insubordinate language to his superior officer [see *Army Act*, s. 8];
  - (g) Is drunk on parade or when he appears at the place of parade [see *Army Act*, s. 19];
  - (h) Being a soldier acting as sentinel, commits any of the following offences, that is to say:—
    - (i.) Sleeps or is drunk on his post, or
    - (ii.) Leaves his post before he is regularly relieved [see *Army Act*, s. 6];
  - (i) Being under arrest or in confinement or otherwise in lawful custody, escapes or attempts to escape [see *Army Act*, s. 22];
  - (j) Fails to obey any summons issued for his attendance for the purpose of any proceedings under these rules;
  - (k) Is guilty of any act, conduct, disorder, or neglect, to the prejudice of good order and military discipline [see *Army Act*, s. 46];

shall be liable on conviction before his Commanding Officer to the following punishments, that is to say:—

- (1) Such extra drills as the Commanding Officer may direct; provided that any such drill shall not exceed one hour in duration, and that not more than ten of such extra drills shall be awarded to an offender in respect of one offence, and that the offender shall not attend more than two such drills in any one day;
- (2) A fine not exceeding two hundred rupees; or
- (3) In default of payment of such fine, military detention for a period not exceeding twenty-eight days.
4. In the case of any offence under these rules, the Commanding Officer may in his discretion, at the conclusion of the evidence, order the case to be tried by Court Martial.

5. Any person charged before his Commanding Officer with an offence under these rules may, at the conclusion of the evidence, require that the case shall be tried by Court Martial.

6. If a case is referred for trial by Court Martial—

- (1) The Commanding Officer (if he has not already done so) shall cause the evidence to be taken down in writing in the presence of the accused before himself, or such other officer as he may direct;
- (2) The accused may put questions in cross-examination to any witness, and the effect of the evidence so given shall be added to the evidence of the witness;
- (3) The evidence of each witness when taken down shall be read over to him and signed by him. Any statement of the accused material to his defence shall be added in writing.

7. For the purpose of the trial of any offence under these rules, the Commanding Officer of any unit may convene a Regimental Court Martial. Every such Court Martial shall be constituted and conducted as nearly as possible in accordance with the rules of procedure regulating Regimental Courts Martial under the Army Act.

8. If the Commanding Officer of any unit is not able to convene a Court Martial for the trial of any offence owing to the fact that a sufficient number of officers of his unit are not available, he shall report the case to the Commandant, who may nominate an officer or officers from any other unit to serve as a member or members of the court.

9. No officer shall be qualified to sit upon a Court Martial unless he has completed one full year's efficient service of a commissioned rank.

10. Any person convicted of any offence before a Court Martial under these rules shall be liable to the following punishments, that is to say:—

- (a) Such extra drills as the court may direct; provided that such drill shall not exceed one hour in duration, and that not more than ten of such extra drills shall be awarded an offender in respect of one offence, and that the offender shall not attend more than two such drills in any one day;
- (b) A fine not exceeding two hundred rupees; or
- (c) In default of payment, or if the court directs without the option of a fine, military detention for a period not exceeding three months;

and if a non-commissioned officer, in addition to any punishment to which he may be otherwise sentenced, to reduction of rank.

11. No sentence of a Court Martial under these rules shall be executed unless it shall have been confirmed by the Commandant.

12. (1) The Commanding Officer of any unit may (with the approval of the Commandant) by order delegate to any officer of his unit power to try cases of such minor offences against discipline as may be specified in the order, and any person guilty of any such offence (being an offence for which he might have been tried and sentenced under rule 3) may, at the discretion of such officer, be tried before such officer, and shall be liable on conviction to such punishment drills, not exceeding three, of one hour each, as such officer may direct.

(2) Any person aggrieved by any sentence passed by an officer under this rule may require it to be submitted for confirmation or otherwise to the Commanding Officer of the unit.

13. The Commandant may take all necessary measures and give all necessary directions for the purpose of enforcing any sentence of military detention under these rules.

#### *Redress of Wrongs.*

14. If an officer thinks himself wronged by his Commanding Officer and, on due application made to him, does not receive the redress to which he may consider himself entitled, he may complain to the Commandant, and if he thinks himself wronged by the Commandant, to the Governor, in order to obtain justice. [See *Army Act, s. 42.*]

15. If any soldier thinks himself wronged in any matter by any officer other than his Captain, or by any soldier, he may complain thereof to his Captain, and if he thinks himself wronged by his Captain, either in respect of his complaint not being redressed or in respect of any other matter, he may complain thereof to his Commanding Officer, and if he thinks himself wronged by his Commanding Officer, either in respect of his not being redressed or in respect of any other matter, he may complain thereof to the Commandant, or if he fails to obtain redress from the Commandant, to the Governor, and every officer to whom a complaint is made in pursuance of this rule shall cause such complaint to be inquired into, and shall, if on inquiry he is satisfied of the justice of the complaint so made, take such steps as may be necessary for giving full redress to the complainant in respect of the matter complained of.

##### *Particular Repairs, &c.*

In the Storekeeper's bungalow the front walls of the kitchen should be plastered with clay. The water-closet should be repaired. A covered way, 17 ft. long and 7 ft. broad, should be built between the main building and the kitchen and thatched with cadjan. Three sides of the main building should be whitewashed, the broken and defaced parts of the walls being plastered.

In the 1st Class Constable's house, wherever necessary, the floor of the main building should be repaired with brick and mortar. The front walls of the kitchen should be plastered with clay, and the exterior thereof should be lined with cadjan. In the verandah a side post and a side beam should be replaced.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 12, 1918.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 156 (2 Europeans, 21 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 24 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1918, viz., 272,234) was 29.9, as against 19.6 in the preceding week, 33.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 147 (13 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 29 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.2, as against 26.1 in the previous week, 27.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 147 total deaths, 46 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

**Principal Causes Death.**—Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 13 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 15 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Plague* were registered, 3 in Maradana and 1 in Slave Island, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Four cases were reported, as against 2 in the previous week.

4. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital) and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 2 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Nineteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Enteritis*, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Worms*, 3 from *Tetanus*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eleven cases of *Chickenpox* and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 6 of *Chickenpox* and none of *Measles* in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 77.2°, against 77.0° in the preceding week and 79.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.894 in., against 29.916 in. in the preceding week and 29.950 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.81 in., against 0.24 in. in the preceding week and 0.74 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

"Improvements in self-closing doors or windows."

Abstract:—

The object of this invention is to enable a door or window when opened to rise clear of the transome at the top of its frame, and, without the use of springs, automatically to close by its own weight.

The invention consists of (1) two or more hinges each with a roller or slide working on a guide rod, (2) a ramp fixed to the floor or sill, and (3) a roller or shoe fixed to the bottom of the door or window.

The claims are:—

1. In self-closing doors or windows, hinges fastened to the door or window characterized by a roller or slide working on a guide rod fixed to the frame, substantially as described and illustrated, and for the purpose described.

2. In self-closing doors or windows, a ramp substantially as described and illustrated, and a roller or shoe fixed to the door or window substantially as described and illustrated, and for the purpose described.

3. In self-closing doors or windows, hinges as claimed in claim 1, a ramp and roller or shoe as claimed in claim 2, in combination, for the purpose described.
