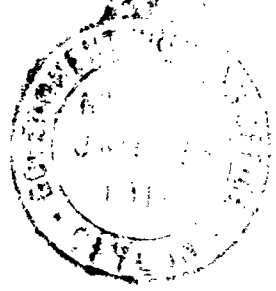
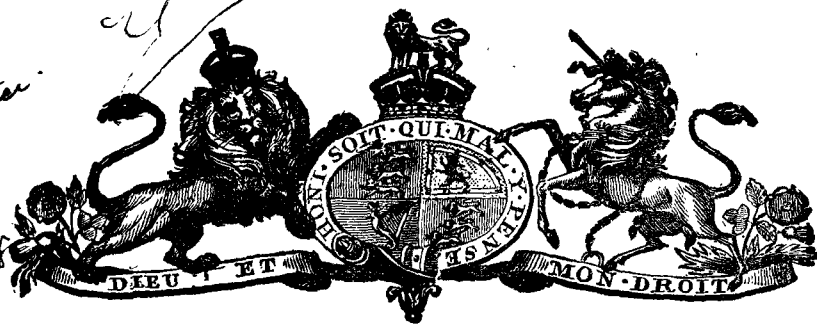

KNOW YE that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim that His Majesty has issued the Royal Proclamation, the text of which, without the recitals, is published in the schedule hereto, and call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Island to govern themselves accordingly.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eighteen.

SCHEDULE.

"(1) On and after the 1st day of February, 1918, the Order in Council of the 12th day of December, 1885, shall be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder or to any proceedings commenced before the said date, and part 2 of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to the group of British Possessions and Protected States thereunder mentioned, that is to say, British India, Ceylon, Hong Kong, the Straits Settlements, the Federated Malay States, Johore, Kedah and Perlis, Kelantan, Trengganu, Brunei, North Borneo, Sarawak.

"(2) The Governor-General of India and the Governors of Ceylon, Hong Kong, and the Straits Settlements shall cause this Order to be proclaimed in the territories and Colonies under their respective Governments.

"(3) The Governor as defined in the Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Order in Council, 1916 and 1917, shall cause this Order to be proclaimed in the Protected States in which he exercises the functions of Governor for the purpose of the Fugitive Offenders Acts, 1881 and 1915."

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Chapter VIII., By-law No. 45.

The occupier of any house or premises within or upon which any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, or pig may die shall, within four hours after its death, or if death occur at night, within four hours after daylight, report its death to the Municipal Veterinary Inspector of the division in which such premises may be situated, and after inspection of the carcass by the said Inspector shall either remove it at his own expense in such manner as may be directed and to such place as may be appointed by the Chairman, or shall pay the Inspector the expense of removing or burying the carcass at such rate as the Chairman shall determine.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

Chapter XIII.

Entrances from a public street to a garage.

219 A. The owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises used or intended to be used as a garage for motor vehicles which adjoins any street by the side of which a drain or pavement runs shall not have any access for motor vehicles to such street over or across such drain or pavement, except at such place or places as may be appointed therefor by the Chairman, and subject to such restrictions as may be imposed by the Chairman.

"THE TOWN SCHOOLS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Matara under sections 7 and 8 of the above-mentioned Ordinance, and confirmed by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

By-laws made by the Local Board of Matara under Sections 7 and 8 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

1. *Definitions.*—In these by-laws—

The terms "boy," "girl," and "child" mean respectively a boy, or a girl, or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person who has actual custody of a child.

The term "Code" means the Code for Aided Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "local authority" means the Local Board of Matara.

The term "school" means a school specified in the Schedule B hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a "child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the meaning defined in sub-section (1) (b) of section 8 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

The term "Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector of Schools appointed by His Excellency the Governor and includes a Sub-Inspector.

2. *Children bound to attend School.*—The parent of every boy not less than 6 years old and not more than 12 years old and of every girl not less than 6 years old and not more than 10 years old shall cause such boy or girl to attend one of the schools specified in the schedule hereto, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. In the case of Muhammadan children, however, a parent shall cause boys and girls not less than 8 years old and not more than 12 and 10 years old respectively to attend school. Provided that no girl shall be compelled to attend school from a distance of more than two miles, and that no boy shall be compelled to attend from a distance of more than three miles.

3. *Time of Attendance.*—The time during which every boy or girl shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be opened for the instruction of children of similar age.

4. *Religion.*—Provided always that nothing in these by-laws—

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the hours when religious instruction is given, as provided by sub-section (2) (d) of section 9 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

(b) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the child's parent belongs.

5. And provided always that when a child between 10 and 12 years of age being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Local Board of Matara has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic, the Fourth Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, he shall not be required to attend school.

6. Every parent who shall not observe or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 20 for each offence, and an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 10 per day in the case of a continuing offence. No parent shall be prosecuted unless his child is absent in any month over one-fifth of the number of days during which the school shall be open that month.

NOTE.—The following are the portions of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906," referred to in section 1 of these by-laws:—

Sub-section 1 (b) of Section 8.—A parent shall be deemed to have made adequate and suitable provision for the education of his child, if he proves that his child is in regular attendance at a school registered by the Director of

Education for the receipt of a grant in aid, or at a school with regard to which an application for a grant in aid is under consideration, or at a school certified by the Director of Education to provide adequate and suitable instruction; or if he proves that he has made such other provision for his child's education as the Director of Education shall certify to be adequate and suitable, or if he produces a certificate from the Director of Education recommending that the child be exempted from compulsory attendance. Provided that no parent shall be convicted for not causing his child to attend, if he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he has reasonable excuse for not causing his child to attend. A parent shall be deemed to have a reasonable excuse for not causing his child to attend school if he proves that the child is prevented from attending by sickness or other unavoidable cause.

Sub-section 2 (d) of Section 9.—No schools in which religious instruction is given shall be named in any by-law made under clause (a) of the last preceding section as a school in which efficient provision is made for vernacular education, unless the Local Board is satisfied—

(a) That religious instruction is given only during the time specified in the school time table;

(b) That religious instruction is not given to pupils of other denominations than that to which the school belongs if the parents object;

(c) That pupils who do not attend religious instruction are employed in other studies during the hours allotted to religious instruction;

(d) That such pupils if their parents object to their being present in the room where religious instruction is given are either allowed to study in some other part of the school premises during the hours when such instruction is given, or their presence in the school during such hours is excused; and

(e) That a copy of this section in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages is conspicuously posted up in the school.

The above by-laws were made by the Local Board of Matara at a meeting held on October 26, 1916.

Limits of the Local Board, Matara.

North.—The road at Naimana ferry where the road reaches the Nilwala-ganga, thence the southern edge of the road westwards for a distance of 900 feet to the point where the road referred to meets the road leading towards Tennahena, thence along the southern edge of the latter road as far as the foot of the hill called Tennahena, thence along the foot of the hill westwards to the Walpola paddy fields, thence along the southern edge of these fields to the Hakmana road 150 feet south of Kitulawala iron bridge, thence westwards along the road trace through Tudawa, thence along the southern edge of the road from the Nupe canal to the Akuressa road at the $\frac{3}{4}$ milepost.

West.—The eastern edge of the Akuressa-Matara road from the $\frac{3}{4}$ milepost to a point 270 feet south of that post, thence by the eastern edge of the Gansabhawa road southwards to the first milepost on the Matara-Welegoda road, thence westwards along the southern edge of the latter road to a point 550 feet from the first milepost thereon, then southwards along the eastern edge of the Gansabhawa road as far as the 98 $\frac{1}{2}$ milepost on the Galle-Matara main road, thence along the southern edge of the latter road westwards as far as the 98 milepost, thence a straight line southwards at right angles to the road as far as the Talanwila canal, thence along the southern bank of the canal westwards as far as the Polhena cross roads, thence southwards along the eastern edge of the latter road as far as its junction with the Madiha-Polhena road, thence a line to the sea at right angles to the latter road.

South.—The sea.

East.—A line from the sea to the Eliyakanda Wesleyan Mission School, the line being a continuation of the direction of the Eliyakanda-Meddawatta road, thence the western edge of the Eliyakanda-Meddawatta road to the Tangalla road, thence a line at right angles to the Tangalla road to a distance of 700 feet north of the Tangalla road, thence in a westerly direction a line to the Nilwala-ganga crossing the Kekanadura and Naimana roads at points respectively 700 feet from the Tangalla road, thence the Nilwala-ganga in a northerly direction as far as the Naimana ferry.

And whereas the third and fourth instalments of the said sum so secured have not been paid, and whereas the Commissioner proposes to proceed to allot the compensation payable by the inhabitants and owners of property in the said division as though such bond had not been accepted:

And whereas that portion of the Colombo District in which the said administrative division of Bolawalana is situated has, by Notification dated January 18, 1916, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,772 of January 21, 1916, been declared a riot area under "The Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915":

It is hereby directed by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 14 of the said Ordinance, that the sum of Rs. 3,300, being the amount apportioned in respect of damages and costs to the said division, shall be a charge payable by the said division.

Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council under "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by "The Enemy Property (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1917."

WHEREAS it is provided by section 8 A (1) of "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by "The Enemy Property (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1917," that the Governor in Executive Council may, by Order in Council, vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property any property belonging to an "enemy subject" within the meaning of the said Ordinance, and confer on the Custodian such powers of selling, managing, or otherwise dealing with the property as to the Governor in Executive Council may seem proper:

And whereas the immovable property described in the schedule hereto belongs to Anton Gueth *alias* Bhikshu Nyanatiloka and the movable property enumerated in the said schedule belongs to the said Anton Gueth and to certain other persons, all of whom are enemy subjects now interned in Australia, and it appears expedient to vest the said property in the said Custodian:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor is pleased, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the aforesaid property is vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property, who is empowered to sell it in such manner as he may determine.

By order of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, this Sixteenth day of January, One thousand Nine hundred and Eighteen.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 19, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 126 (13 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 10 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1918, viz., 272,234) was 24·1, as against 29·9 in the preceding week, 34·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 126 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24·1, as against 28·2 in the previous week, 24·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 126 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 46 in the preceding week, 25 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Wellawatta, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 3 in Wellawatta, and 1 in Pettah, as against 17 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 in Kotahena and 1 in Maradana, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. One case was reported, as against 4 in the previous week.

5. Eleven deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 10 from *Enteritis*, 9 from *Debility*, 3 from *Tetanus*, 1 from *Diarrhœa*, and 58 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twenty-two cases of *Chickenpox* and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 11 of *Chickenpox* and 1 of *Measles* in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 76·9°, against 77·2° in the preceding week and 77·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·896 in., against 29·894 in. in the preceding week and 29·916 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·01 in., against 2·81 in. in the preceding week and 3·14 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, December 7, 1917.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 30, 1917.

Present:—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; Mr. Harold Creasy; and Mr. J. K. Hormusjee.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 2, 1917, having been previously printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of November 2, 1917, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following:—Since the last Meeting 10 cases of human plague and 11 cases of rat plague have been recorded, making the total for this year of 201 human (exclusive of 2 cancelled cases) and 68 rat cases, as against 259 human and 59 rat cases during the corresponding period of last year, while in the preceding year there were 99 cases of human plague. Of the 10 human cases, 8 were septicaemic and 2 bubonic in character. All proved fatal. Of the 11 infected rats, no fewer than 9 were killed by means of the Clayton machine, while 1 was trapped and 1 was found dead. In only one of the houses, where human plague occurred, was an infected rat found. In this same house a mummified rat, which had presumably died of plague, was also discovered. Four of the infected rats were caught in Fourth Cross street and 3 in Fifth Cross street.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. L. Villiers asked the Chairman:—For what reason and under what authority have the branches of the trees planted along the streets in the Fort Ward been so ruthlessly cut down?

The Chairman replied as follows:—The branches of the trees in York street were cut back on the authority of the Chairman. Representations were made to me by the representatives of the principal firms occupying premises along York street, and complaints were also made in the local press with regard to the nuisance occasioned by the crows which congregated in the branches of the trees. The nuisance was a serious one. For not only were persons in the adjoining buildings disturbed by the noise of the crows, but pedestrians and persons in cars and carriages on the road were liable to receive the droppings of the crows upon their heads and clothes. Further than this, the effluvia from the droppings made the street unhealthy. The trees themselves had outgrown the size requisite for street purposes. They had become top heavy. Some were considered unsafe and the foliage had grown so poor and thin that they were of little use as shade trees. It was decided that it was best to pollard them. That course was adopted. It has had the desired effect. The crows no longer infest these trees. The trees themselves have been brought into uniformity and are now putting forth new branches which are covered with fresh green leaves.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 4 to 7 (inclusive) on the Agenda. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

4—6. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees, named, were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of November 28, 1917.

(6) To consider the decision of the Supremo Court *re* the mandamus as to the eating house License for No. 5, Main street, and whether the by-law should not be amended with a view to giving the Chairman a discretion in the issue of such licenses.—Recommended that the following by-law be passed:—

CHAPTER XI.—A.

(a) No place shall be used as an eating-house or restaurant without an annual license from the Chairman, who is hereby empowered, at his discretion, from time to time to grant such licenses and impose such terms therein as to him shall appear expedient.

(b) It shall be lawful for the Chairman to suspend or revoke any such license if it shall appear necessary to him to do so.

(c) No person shall act as the manager of an eating-house or restaurant without a license from the Chairman, who is hereby empowered, at his discretion, to grant any such license on such conditions as may appear to him to be necessary, and in any case where any such license has been granted, to revoke or suspend the same.

(d) Every application for a license to act as manager of an eating-house or restaurant shall be accompanied by a certificate of character from two or more householders, who may be called upon to give security for the carrying out of the terms of the license by the manager of the eating-house or restaurant.

(7) To re-consider, in view of the further representations from Government, the question whether the Council should contribute a moiety towards the cost of repairs to the bridge over the canal at Kirillapone. The total cost of the repairs is estimated as Rs. 1,500.—Recommended that the Government be informed that the Council is prepared to meet half the cost of the re-construction.

(9) To consider letter No. 152 of October 6, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with regard to the land to be reclaimed from the lake near Vauxhall street for the purpose of providing washing tanks and drying grounds for dhobies.—Recommended that the Council do consent to indemnify Government against any damages, provided that the land is vested in the Council.

(14) To recommend the adoption of street lines for Charlemont road.—Recommended.

(15) To consider letter No. 167 of November 10, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with regard to the amendment of by-law No. 45 of Chapter VIII. of the by-laws.—Recommended that the by-law, as amended, be passed, namely: The occupier of any house or premises within or upon which any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, or pig may die shall within four hours after its death, or if death occurs at night within four hours after daylight, report its death to the Municipal Inspector of the division in which such premises may be situated and after inspection of the carcase by the Inspector shall either remove it at his own expense in such manner as may be directed and to such place as may be appointed by the Chairman, or shall pay the Inspector the expense of removing or burying the carcase at such rate as the Chairman shall determine.

(17) To consider letter No. 170 of November 15, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* the Municipal Magistrate of Colombo.—Recommended that the proposal of the Government to withdraw the whole time Magistrate be accepted, and that the Council agree to pay an allowance to the Commissioner of Requests as on former occasions, while acting as Municipal Magistrate, in addition to his own duties. It is considered that the Council should not undertake to pay half the salary of the Commissioner of Requests.

(18) To consider an application from the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, for a supply of water for domestic purposes for the small towns of Waga and Hanwella.—Recommended that the concession be granted at the rate of Re. 1 per 1,000 gallons.

(19) To consider a letter from Messrs. Miller & Co. regarding the price quoted for iron.—Recommended that Messrs. Miller & Company be absolved from their contract as the mistake was due to a clerical error in writing a pound for an ounce.

(21) To consider a letter from Mr. C. M. Young, the Financial Assistant, tendering his resignation from the Council's service. The letter is read.—Resolved that the matter be placed before the Council.

With regard to item No. 6 (corresponding to item No. 29 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of November 30, 1917), Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred till the next Meeting of the Council. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 7 (corresponding to item No. 9 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of November 30, 1917), it was resolved that the recommendation be adopted together with the further suggestion as embodied in the recommendation of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together).

With regard to item No. 15, the Chairman moved that the recommendation be adopted with the addition of the word "Veterinary" between the words "Municipal" and "Inspector." Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 17 (corresponding to item No. 17 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of November 30, 1917), it was resolved that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted.

With regard to item No. 18 (corresponding to item No. 21 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of November 30, 1917), Mr. T. L. Villiers raised the question as to whether there was a sufficient supply of water to permit of this concession being allowed, as once the concession were granted it would be difficult to discontinue it.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene referred him to the recommendation on the same subject from the Committees on Municipal Works and Finance.

The Chairman quoted the opinion of the Waterworks Engineer.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance be adopted.

With regard to item No. 19 (corresponding to item No. 28 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of November 30, 1917), it was resolved that the recommendation of the Law Committee be adopted.

With regard to item No. 21 (corresponding to item No. 27 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of November 30, 1917), Mr. Arthur Alvis spoke at length on the subject and moved:—"That the Chairman be requested to apply to Government to second for service a member of the Ceylon Civil Service to act as Financial Assistant to the Chairman till the post is permanently filled up. In the event of the Government acceding to this request, that the Chief Clerk of the Financial Department, who is discharging the duties of the Assistant Accountant, be appointed to act as Assistant Accountant on the initial salary of the post of Assistant Accountant, and that the Sub-Accountant, on whom extra duties will devolve, be granted an allowance equal to one-third of his salary. If the services of a member of the Civil Service cannot be secured, then, till the appointment of Financial Assistant be made, that the Secretary be appointed to generally supervise the Department and be entrusted with the duties of issuing licenses, ordering prosecutions in regard to taxes, dealing with road tax defaulters and other connected duties, visiting public markets and cab-stands, supervision of the Revenue Inspectors and Division Officers, and be granted a special allowance of Rs. 1,800 per annum. That the other duties of the Finance Department be performed by Mr. H. P. Beling assisted by the Sub-Accountant. That Mr. Beling be granted an allowance equal to one-third of his salary and the Sub-Accountant be paid a similar allowance for the extra duties which will devolve on them during the period of the above arrangement. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

The Chairman stated that he was unable to acquiesce in the second part of the motion, as it was absolutely necessary to have a separate officer in full charge of the Department. He moved as an amendment that in place of the words "that the Secretary be appointed the above arrangement," the words "that, as a provisional measure, an advertisement be inserted in the local and Indian papers calling for applicants for the post of an Accountant on a salary of Rs. 6,000 per annum, together with an allowance of Rs. 1,800 per annum, on three years' probation, subject to his service being terminated on three months' notice." Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman put the amendment as the substantive motion and declared it carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of November 30, 1917.

(6) To consider letter No. 152 of October 6, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with regard to the land to be reclaimed from the lake near Vauxhall street for the purpose of providing washing tanks and drying grounds for dhobies.—Recommended that the Council consent to indemnify the Government against any damages, provided that the land is vested in the Council.

(9) To re-consider, in view of further representations from Government, the question whether the Council should contribute a moiety towards the cost of repairs to the bridge over the canal at Kirillapone. The total cost of the repairs is estimated at Rs. 1,500.—Recommended, and that it be suggested that in the case of any other bridge, e.g., Nugegoda road bridge or the Pamankadde road bridge requiring repairs, that half the cost should be borne by the outside local body.

(11) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 15 under Vote I. (i) 61 (Works Department) Sundries (Postage Stamps), as the vote is insufficient to meet the probable expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(12) To recommend the sanction of Council for the purchase of 150 kegs of blasting powder from Messrs. Lee, Hedges & Co., for the use of the Works Department at a cost of Rs. 3,450.—Recommended.

(16) To recommend the adoption of street lines for Charlemont road.—Recommended under Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.

(17) To recommend the purchase for the Works Department of 12,000 gallons asphaltum from the Standard Oil Co., at Re. 1.30 and Re. 1.38 per gallon, less 8 cents rebate, and 20,000 gallons tarco from Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., Ltd., at Re. 1.15 per gallon, less 7 or 8 cents rebate.—Recommended.

(18) To recommend the purchase for the Works Department, through Messrs. Tarrant & Co., Colombo, of 2,000 barrels of cement at Rs. 18 per barrel, c.i.f., Colombo.—Recommended.

(19) To recommend the adoption of street lines for Ferry street.—Recommended under section 172 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

(20) To consider an application from the Waterworks Divisional Inspectors asking for the grant to them of uniforms.—Recommended.

(21) To consider an application from the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, for a small supply of water for domestic purposes for the small towns of Waga and Hanwella.—Recommended that the concession be granted at the rate of Re. 1 per 1,000 gallons, reserving to the Council the right of withdrawing the concession whenever it may consider fit.

(22) To sanction the purchase for the Works Department of 280·98 cubes of 2-in. metal from Brumphy Singho, at Rs. 21 per cube, for the year ending December 31, 1917.—Recommended for sanction.

(23) To consider the question of the purchase of 2-in. metal for the City Sanitation Department.—Recommended that the City Sanitation Engineer be authorized to purchase 2-in. metal at Rs. 21 per cube for 1918.

(25) To consider the question of putting up to public auction the lease for five years of Municipal Council land at Armour street adjoining the public latrine, with permission to build on the usual terms.—Recommended that the lease be put up for auction on the usual conditions at an upset price of not less than Rs. 7·50 a month.

(26) To recommend an application from the Acting City Sanitation Engineer for supplementary provision of Rs. 150, under Loan Account Estimate No. M. 33 L. to meet the excess expenditure in connection with the construction of the Tipping Depot at Urugodawatta road.—Recommended.

(27) To consider letter No. 177 of November 22, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with regard to the Supplementary Report of the Municipal Commission Committee.—Recommended that the Government be informed that the Council considers that the whole duty and responsibility in apportioning the loans should remain with the Council, as the Council is solely responsible for the recovery of the individual advances and the re-payment of the loan to Government.

With regard to item No. 23, it was resolved that the contract be given to S. Velupillai.

With regard to item No. 27, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo and Mr. T. L. Villiers spoke on the subject.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Dewangso, in consideration of the payment of Rs. 529·37, being amount of taxes and costs which would have been due had the property not been vested in the Council—to recommend that the property be re-transferred to Nona Oooryani, widow of the late R. (6) To recommend the transfer of Rs. 100 from Vote M. 8 (Sanitation Department) Furniture to M. 16 Miscellaneous, as the vote is insufficient to meet the expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(8) To recommend: (a) The transfer of Rs. 200 from Vote H. (a) 12 (Public Health Department) Miscellaneous to Vote H. (a) 7 Uniforms; (b) the transfer of Rs. 200 from Vote H. (a) 4 (Public Health Department) Prevention of Infectious Diseases to Vote H. (d) 22 Tools and Equipment for Markets, as these votes are insufficient to meet the expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(9) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 500 under Vote D. 9 (Finance Department) Postage and Receipt Stamps, as the vote is insufficient to meet the expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(11) To consider an application from Mr. F. Ginger, Correspondence Clerk, Finance Department, for three months' privilege leave from January 1, 1918, prior to retirement.—Recommended.

(12) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 300 under Vote D. 10 (Finance Department) Train and Tram Fare Allowances, as the vote is insufficient to meet the probable expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(14) To consider a petition from certain members of the Finance Department, with regard to remuneration to them for extra work in connection with the collection of riot tax. The Financial Assistant recommends the payment of a sum of Rs. 1,957·05.—Recommended.

(15) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 415 under Vote E. (d) 34 (Veterinary Department) Capture of Dogs, as the vote is insufficient to meet the probable expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(16) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 75 under vote E. (c) 31 (Veterinary Department) Disinfectants, as the vote is insufficient to meet the probable expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(17) To consider letter No. 170 of November 15, 1917, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, re the Municipal Magistrate of Colombo.—Recommended that the proposal of Government to withdraw the whole time Municipal Magistrate be accepted as a temporary measure, and that the Council agree to pay an allowance of Rs. 1,000 to the Commissioner of Requests as on former occasions while performing the duties of Municipal Magistrate. The Committee does not recommend that the Council should undertake to pay half the salary of the new Commissioner of Requests.

(18) To consider an application from Mr. S. Reason, Assistant Waterworks Engineer, for payment by the Council of the premium on his security bond.—Recommended.

(19) To consider an application from Mr. James de Silva, Municipal Court Interpreter, for special remuneration for translating into Sinhalese and Tamil the draft rules re public performances.—Recommended that a sum of Rs. 100 be paid as special remuneration.

(20) To consider an application for three months' full pay leave, owing to ill health, from disinfecting cooly Siman Appu of the Public Health Department.—Recommended that the case be dealt with as one in which the cooly is drawing Rs. 300 per annum, and that the leave applied for be granted.

(21) To recommend the following supplementary votes:—(a) Rs. 2,000 under Vote C. 5 (Secretariat) Stationery; (b) Rs. 200 under vote C. 9 (Secretariat) Train and Tram Fare Allowances; (c) Rs. 100 under vote C. 12 (Secretariat) Binding Materials.—Recommended.

(22) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 200 under vote H. (c) 19 (Public Health Department) Diet, as the vote is insufficient to meet the probable expenses for the year.—Recommended.

(24) To recommend the sale by public auction of the premises No. 785/59, Timbirigasyaya road, vested in the Council for arrears of rates.—Recommended.

(27) To consider a letter from Mr. C. M. Young, the Financial Assistant, tendering his resignation from the Council's service.—Recommended that, as a provisional measure, an advertisement be inserted in the local papers calling for applicants for the post of Assistant Accountant on a salary of Rs. 6,000 per annum, together with the allowance, on three years' probation, subject to his services being terminated on three months' notice.

(28) To consider a letter from Messrs. Miller & Co. regarding the price quoted for trial.—Recommended that Messrs. Miller & Co. be released from the contract.

(29) To consider the decision of the Supreme Court re the mandamus as to the eating-house license for No. 5, Main street, and whether the by-law should not be amended with a view to giving the Chairman a discretion in the issue of such licenses.—Recommended that the following by-law be passed:—

CHAPTER XI.—A.

(a) No place shall be used as an eating-house or restaurant without an annual license from the Chairman, who is hereby empowered, at his discretion, from time to time to grant such licenses and impose such terms therein as to him shall appear expedient.

(b) It shall be lawful for the Chairman to suspend or revoke any such license if it shall appear necessary to him to do so.

(c) No person shall act as the manager of an eating-house or restaurant without a license from the Chairman, who is hereby empowered, at his discretion to grant any such license on such conditions as may appear to him to be necessary, and in any case where any such license has been granted, to revoke or suspend the same.

(d) Every application for a license to act as a manager of an eating-house or restaurant shall be accompanied by a certificate of character from two or more householders, who may be called upon to give security for the carrying out of the terms of the license by the manager of the eating-house or restaurant.

(30) To consider letter No. 5,537 of November 28, 1917, from the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, *re cost of meals to be supplied to the Police on duty at the forthcoming elections.* The amount incurred in 1914 was Rs. 32.75.—Recommended that a vote of Rs. 100 be passed to meet any incidental expenses at the elections, including this cost.

(31) To consider a petition from Mr. L. B. Perera, Municipal contractor, praying that the rate per cartload of coir be raised from Re. 1.58 to Rs. 2 under his contract for next year, owing to war conditions.—Recommended that the increased rate be sanctioned for the first three months of 1918, and the vote be increased by Rs. 500.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee, as amended, be adopted.

The report of the Special Committee appointed on January 15, 1915—(a) To formulate a scheme for reducing the cost of establishment without impairing the efficiency; (b) to inquire into the present rates of pay of all Municipal officers with a view to ascertain the adequacy or otherwise of such pay; (c) to frame rules and regulations governing the appointment, duties, salaries, and promotions of all Municipal officers; (d) generally to make such recommendations in regard to the working of the various departments as will ensure greater efficiency, coupled with a reduction in the cost—having been previously printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, was considered.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred for the next Meeting of Council to be held in January, and that in the interval the report, together with copies of proceedings of the Committee and copies of the Scheme drawn up in 1913, be circulated amongst the Members. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Mr. T. L. Villiers opposed the motion.

Mr. F. R. Senanayake spoke in favour of it.

The Chairman put the motion to the Meeting and it was declared lost.

Mr. Arthur Alvis formally moved that the report of the Special Committee be adopted and that it be given effect to as early as possible. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the maximum of the Secretary's salary be increased from Rs. 9,000 to Rs. 10,500, per annum. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

(Dr. E. V. Ratnam and Mr. L. B. Fernando left the Meeting at this stage.)

Mr. Arthur Alvis's motion, namely, that the report of the Special Committee be adopted and be given effect to as early as possible, was put to the Meeting and it was unanimously carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume and that the resolutions of Council in Committee, as amended, be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, as amended, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

The Draft Budget for 1918 containing—(a) An estimate of available Municipal income; (b) details of proposed expenditure, as printed and published in the *Government Gazette* and circulated among the Members according to the provisions of section 97 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, was submitted to the Council. Its further consideration was deferred for the Special Meeting called for December 14, 1917.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the following items on the Agenda, viz., Nos. 9 to 12 (inclusive), be adopted. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated December 7, 1917, to finally consider the Budget for the year, 1918, in accordance with the provisions of section 98 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

Present :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. L. B. Fernando; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. T. L. Villiers; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; Mr. W. A. Cave; Mr. Harold Creasy; and Mr. J. K. Hormusjee.

The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider the Draft Budget for 1918. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman read out the various items of the Budget seriatim with regard to Estimated Expenditure (page 4).

A.—Non Effective Charges. Resolved that this item be reduced from Rs. 1,049,832 to Rs. 984,828.

C.—Secretariat. Resolved that the item be increased from Rs. 54,520 to Rs. 54,760.

I.—Works Department. Resolved that the item be increased from Rs. 1,602,906 to Rs. 1,668,406.

K.—Waterworks Department. Resolved that the item be increased from Rs. 295,353 to Rs. 296,053.

A.—Non-effective Charges (page 5). 3.—Pensions. Resolved that the item be reduced from Rs. 33,302 to Rs. 33,298.

Resolved that the following items be transferred to page 9 I (k) and be numbered 77—Land Acquisition, Rs. 65,000; 17—Land acquisition for widening Darley road, Rs. 40,000; 18—Land acquisition, Rs. 25,000.

C.—Secretariat. Resolved that a sum of Rs. 240 be provided for the payment of allowances to the bicycle orderlies, and that the vote be numbered C 2, and that the numbers following be re-numbered consecutively.

I.—Works Department.—(c) Roads, Bridges, Culverts, Drains, &c. 30.—Repairs to Bridges, Culverts, Drains, &c. Mr. T. L. Villiers moved that the vote be reduced by Rs. 100, with a view to drawing attention to the cutting down of the trees in the Fort. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The Chairman offered a few remarks with regard to the cutting of the trees.

Mr. T. L. Villiers, with the permission of the Council, withdrew the motion.

I.—Works Department.—(k) Extraordinary. 73—Granite setts, Malay street. Resolved that the words "Malay street" be deleted.

K.—Waterworks Department.—18.—Uniforms. Resolved that the item be increased from Rs. 450 to Rs. 1,150.

Mr. T. L. Villiers moved that a sum of Rs. 10,000 be voted, under the heading of Education, to provide for a meal a day to be served to the children of the poor attending schools, under conditions to be determined hereafter. The Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford seconded. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo and Mr. C. P. Dias supported the motion.

The Chairman questioned the financial advisability of adopting such a policy.

The motion was put to the Meeting and declared carried.

The item was included in the Budget under No. 17A.—Non-effective Charges.

The Chairman moved that the detailed statement of the Municipal Staff, their salaries, increments, and allowances be omitted and that a fresh statement be submitted by the Financial Assistant to be attached to a Supplementary Budget to be drawn up in conformity with the report of the Establishment Committee adopted by Council at its last Meeting. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that a tax (as provided for on page 22 of the Draft Budget) payable under section 129 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 in six days labour, or a sum of Rs. 2 in commutation of such labour, and such further labour and money commutation as is provided for under the provisions of the Road Ordinance of 1861 and of the amending Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, be imposed and enforced. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the Council do resume and that the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved in Council that the Budget, as amended, and the resolutions of Council in Committee with regard thereto be adopted. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that a tax (as provided for on page 22 of the Draft Budget) payable under section 129 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 in six days labour, or a sum of Rs. 2 in commutation of such labour, and such further labour and money commutation as is provided for under the provisions of the Road Ordinance of 1861 and of the amending Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, be imposed and enforced. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Chairman do convey to the Financial Assistant the thanks of the Council for, and its appreciation of, the excellent manner in which the Budget for 1918 had been prepared. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried unanimously.

The Chairman said he would have much pleasure in conveying the Council's appreciation to Mr. C. M. Young.

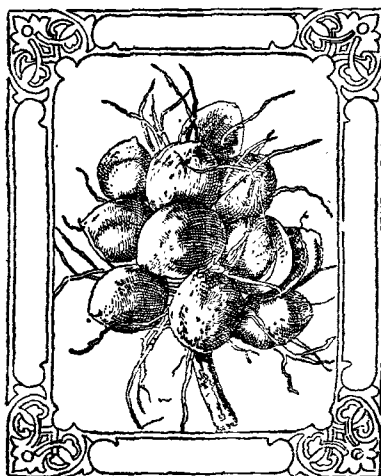
