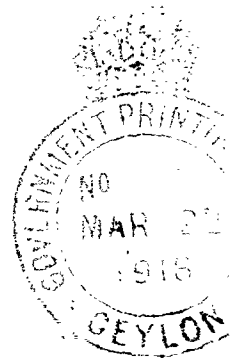
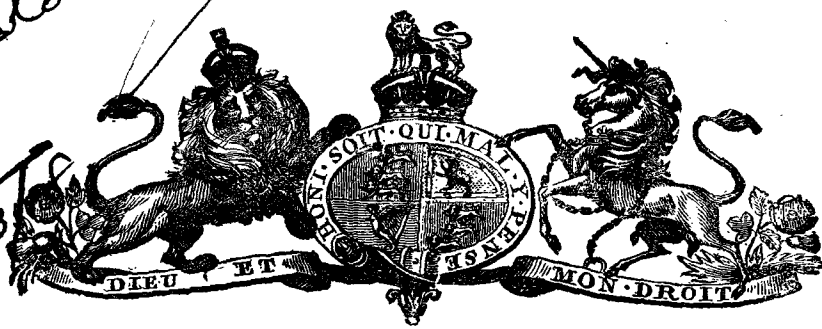

KNOW Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in Us vested by section 6 of "The Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865," and section 11 of "The Interpretation Ordinance, 1901," do hereby revoke rules 3, 4, and 18 of section VII. of the port rules promulgated by Proclamation dated June 15, 1900, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,697 of the same date, and substitute therefor the rules set forth in the schedule hereto as from and after May 1, 1918.

### SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

#### Rule 3 of Section VII. of the Colombo Port Rules.

All passenger boats and gigs, dhoby boats, tea boats, tally clerks' boats, dubash boats, stevedore boats, and all private boats, except cooly boats, licensed at the port of Colombo, shall moor when not in use within the following boundaries:—

*On the North.*—An imaginary line drawn between two buoys placed to the east of the Passenger Jetty, the west buoy 148 ft. east from the said jetty, and the east buoy 234 ft. east from the jetty.

*On the East.*—An imaginary line 300 ft. long from the eastern buoy of the northern boundary to black and white paint mark on the quay wall 158 ft. east of the Customs Slip.

*On the South.*—The quay wall from the Customs Slip to black and white paint mark 158 ft. east of the Customs Slip.

*On the West.*—An imaginary line 315 ft. long drawn from the west buoy marking the northern boundary to a point on the quay wall east of the Customs Slip and 51 ft. 6 in. from the Passenger Jetty.

Cooly boats when not in use shall moor off the Master Attendant's salved coal ground situated north of the Block Jetty.

#### Rules 4 and 18 of Section VII. of the Colombo Port Rules.

No passenger boat, passenger gig, dhoby boat, tea boat, tally clerk's boat, cooly boat, dubash boat, stevedore boat, or private boat licensed at the port of Colombo shall be beached for repairs or cleaning, however slight, on any part of the shore within the harbour, but shall be taken to the Master Attendant's salved coal ground situated north of the Block Jetty.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Existing By-law.

The parent of every boy of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than 6 years nor more than 12 years of age, and in the case of Muhammadan and Tamil girls the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age, shall cause such boy or girl to attend one of the schools specified in Schedule B, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided that no boy shall be compelled to attend school from a distance exceeding three miles, and that no girl shall be compelled to attend any school except a school for girls situated within two miles of her residence.

Altered By-law.

16. The proprietors of lands shall be liable to pay to the vel-vidane 4 kurunies per annum for every amunam of sowing extent cultivated for yala and maha as huwandiram. If there is an unpaid ele-vidane, he should recover one-fourth of the huwandiram paid to the vel-vidane. If the lands are cultivated for maha or yala only, huwandiram is payable at half the above rate.

## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following despatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, with its annexure, relative to articles the importation of which has been prohibited by the Government of the United States of America, is published for general information.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to transmit to you, for your information, a list of articles the importation of which has been prohibited by the Government of the United States of America. The object of this prohibition is to secure the control of the articles specified in the list, and import licenses will be issued to all recipients approved by the War Trade Board set up in the United States, either independently or on the recommendation of certain trade Associations.

2. The United States Government desire that certain of the articles in the list should be consigned to trade Associations, as follows:—

To the Textile Alliance: Wool, jute, flax and semi-manufactured products thereof, animal hair of all kinds and tops, noils and yarn thereof, wooled and haired skins, Egyptian cotton, mica, and palm oil.

To the Rubber Association of America: Rubber, including gutta-joolatong, gutta-percha, balata, gutt-siak, scrap and reclaimed rubber, and all rubber substitutes.

To the Plumbago Graphite Association, New York: Plumbago.

To the American Iron and Steel Institute, New York: Tin, chloride of tin, and tin ore.

To the Tanners' Council of America: Leather, hides and skins (other than wooled or haired skins) and tanning materials.

To the American Diamond Committee, 15, Maiden lane, New York: All classes of diamonds.

To the United States Shellac Importers' Association, New York: Shellac and lacs of all kinds.

These arrangements will supersede those under which certain of these articles have hitherto been consigned to British Consular Officers.

3. Particulars of the guarantees to be taken by the Associations in respect of each article have yet to be received from the United States.

4. In the case of rubber and tin, the name of the United States importer should be inserted in the margin of the bill of lading.

5. Licenses for the importation of wool will be granted on the condition that the United States Government reserves to itself the right of purchase of imported wool for a period of ten days, at a price of 5 per cent. below that of July 30, 1917, such price to be determined by the Valuation Committee of the Boston Wool Association.

6. I may add that, as intimated in my telegram of the 2nd instant, goods for the Textile Alliance should be consigned to the Alliance, and not to A. M. Patterson.

7. You will, of course, understand that, in the absence of special instructions from me, existing arrangements as to the grant of export licenses for the shipment to the United States of any of the articles in question still hold good, except in so far as relates to the method of consignment.

## "THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897."

BY virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 4 of "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897," We, the Governor in Council, have been pleased to make the following regulations for the purpose of preventing the spread of ancylostomiasis, and We do hereby declare that the same shall come into force in the Western, the Southern, and the Uva Provinces from the date of the publication hereof.

## REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

- For the purposes of these regulations the proper authority shall be the Government Sanitary Officer, or any officer authorized by him in writing.
- The owner, occupier, or lessee of every building shall, when notified in writing by the proper authority, provide latrine accommodation sufficient for the use of the occupants of the said building to the satisfaction of such proper authority within a period of two months from the date of such notification.
- The proper authority shall have the right to order the demolition or alteration of any pit, trench, or other latrine already in use on any land which shall, in his opinion, be a nuisance or likely to become a nuisance, or be dangerous or likely to be dangerous to the health of any person or persons residing or employed in the neighbourhood.
- Every latrine built after these regulations shall come into force, whether on orders of the proper authority under the preceding regulation or otherwise, shall be built on a site to be approved by the proper authority, and in accordance with plans to be approved by the proper authority. (Type plans may be had from the proper authority or the Sanitary Inspector of the district.)
- Every latrine shall be at all times kept in a clean and sanitary state and in a good state of repair, and the owner, occupier, or lessee of the building which the latrine serves shall cause to be carried out within the time to be allowed by the proper authority any alterations, repairs, additions, or other requirements directed by the proper authority which the proper authority may deem to be necessary for the purpose of abating any nuisance arising or likely to arise from the faulty condition or control of such latrine.
- The night soil from latrines shall be disposed of in such manner and at such place as shall be fixed by the proper authority.
- It shall be the duty of every householder to take every precaution to secure the effective operation of these regulations.

"THE REGISTRARS' PROCEEDINGS VALIDATION ORDINANCE, NO. 3 OF 1912."

*An Order in Council for the purpose of giving validity to certain Registrations of Births and Deaths in the Kalutara District of the Western Province.*

WHEREAS the registrations specified in the schedule hereto annexed of certain births and deaths by the Assistant Provincial Registrar of the District of Kalutara are invalidated by reason of the irregularities set forth in the second column of the said schedule :

And whereas no other means are by law provided by which the said registrations may be validated :

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the "The Registrars' Proceedings Validation Ordinance, No. 3 of 1912," and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and direct as follows :—

These estates are situated in the District of Ratnapura, and the events should have been registered by the Provincial Registrar, Ratnapura.

WITH reference to the Notification of December 14, 1908, appearing in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,283 of December 18, 1908, on the subject of the dress to be worn by Native Chiefs, His Excellency the Governor has ordered that the head dress to be worn by Low-country Sinhalese Chiefs when appearing at official functions shall be as follows :—

*Gate Mudaliyars.*—Black velvet hat, with round crown and brim turned up in front and behind ; crown surmounted by gold spike and trimmed with gold braid ; brim edged with gold lace ; front of brim bearing a gold crown.

*Mudaliyar and Gate Muhandirams.*—Same as above, but of silk or cloth ; crown surmounted by gold button, and surrounded by band of gold lace ; brim edged with gold lace.

*Muhandirams.*—Same as above, but of cloth ; crown surmounted by silver button, and surrounded by band of silver lace inlaid with gold stripe not more than one-fourth of breadth of band ; brim edged with silver lace.

*Note.*—Standard patterns of these hats may be seen at the Colonial Secretary's Office.

His Excellency has also ordered that the following rules with regard to footwear shall be observed in future by Chiefs on all public occasions when wearing their official uniforms :—

*Kandyan Chiefs.*—(1) "Jutas" are the only footwear allowed to be worn.

(2) The wearing of "jutas" is optional in the case of all Chiefs.

(3) "Jutas" must be removed in the presence of the Governor.

(4) The wearing of socks, shoes, and boots is prohibited.

*Low-country Sinhalese Chiefs.*—Black boots or shoes and black socks will be worn.

*Tamil and Moorish Chiefs.*—(1) With trousers, white shoes or boots, and white socks will be worn.

(2) With veddi or sarong cloth, no footwear, except "jutas" (without socks), will be worn. The wearing of "jutas" is optional.

(3) "Jutas" must be removed in the presence of the Governor.

*Note.*—All previous instructions regarding footwear of Chiefs are cancelled.

Order by His Excellency the Governor in Council under "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916."

WHEREAS by "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916," the Governor in Executive Council is empowered to declare any person carrying on business in Ceylon at the commencement of the present war, who is an enemy, to be an "enemy firm" within the meaning of the said Ordinance, and to appoint a liquidator or liquidators for the purpose of winding up the business of the said person :

And whereas Mr. F. A. Follen, a subject of the Emperor of Germany at the commencement of the present war, was carrying on business in Ceylon :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor is pleased, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

(1) That the said Mr. F. A. Follen is declared to be an "enemy firm" within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

(2) That Mr. P. G. D. Bell is hereby appointed liquidator for the purpose of winding up the business of the said firm.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 16, 1918.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 120 (1 European, 15 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1918, viz., 272,234) was 23.0, as against 26.1 in the preceding week, 23.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 97 (7 Burghers, 49 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 18.6, as against 22.6 in the previous week, 32.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 97 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 43 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, and 2 in New Bazaar, as against 10 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

2. Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana, 2 in Kollupitiya, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 12 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. One death from *Bronchitis* was registered.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 in Maradana, and the other in Slave Island, as against 8 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered, during the week; two were registered in the previous week, and the weekly average for last year was 3. One case was reported, as against 2 cases in the previous week.

5. Fourteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, and *Tetanus*, and 44 from *Other Causes*.

6. Forty-six cases of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 41 in the preceding week. No cases of *Measles* were reported. Four cases were reported in the preceding week.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 80·3°, against 80·6° in the preceding week and 79·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·934 in., against 29·944 in. in the preceding week and 29·886 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·34 in., against 0·83 in. in the preceding week and 2·16 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

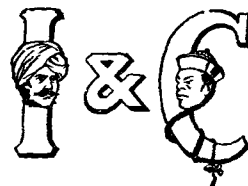

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

"Improvements in vaporizers for internal combustion engines."

*Abstract :—*The inventors state :—

The present invention relates to vaporizers for liquid fuel, especially to vaporizers for heavy hydrocarbons, the vaporization being carried out by allowing the liquid fuel to percolate over heated surfaces or heat accumulating bodies. Surface vaporizers of this type are generally based on the principle of carbureting a certain volume of air which is drawn or forced over the surface of heated bodies on which the liquid fuel is distributed.

We find that with such vaporizers, although the gas obtained is satisfactory, provided the temperature of the vaporizing chamber does not exceed a certain well defined limit varying with the kind of fuel used, as soon as the temperature in the vaporizing chamber exceeds that limit the vaporization is completely disturbed by a secondary phenomenon of slow combustion between the hydrocarbon and the oxygen in the air drawn through the vaporizer. This combustion, once started, continues indefinitely, and the temperature in the vaporizing chamber rises continuously until it exceeds the critical limit in certain parts of the chamber. The gas produced when this partial combustion occurs is not suitable for use, as it is very unsuitable and contains light gases, heavy tarry products, and even nascent carbon. These products on striking an obstacle, and especially on striking a cold surface, are deposited, causing an accumulation which requires frequent cleaning and makes the gas entirely unsuitable for use in internal combustion engines.

In the Specification of British Letters Patent No. 2,870 of 1912 a vaporizer is described in which the vaporization takes place in the absence of air. In such case the slow combustion phenomenon does not take place and the trouble above described is avoided. The vaporization of heavy hydrocarbons without the current of air in this vaporizer, however, is slow.

It has been proposed in vaporizers for vaporizing fuel for use in internal combustion engines to introduce exhaust products into the vaporizing chamber, but so far as we are aware no vaporizer supplying fuel to internal combustion engines has hitherto been constructed in which a constant even temperature is maintained and in which vaporization and the production of gas can be stopped and again commenced, or the rate of vaporization varied according to whether the engine is running under full or light load or even stopped for moderate periods of time.

The object of the present invention is to obtain rapid vaporization avoiding the trouble of slow combustion.

The invention consists in a vaporizer for heavy liquid hydrocarbons in which the vaporization takes place in a through current of exhaust gases from an internal combustion engine, the fuel percolating through heat accumulating bodies of considerable mass presenting a large surface for vaporization, thus maintaining an even temperature, preferably between 180 and 250°C. for paraffin and like oils with an upper limit of 350°C. air being excluded from the vaporizing chamber.

The invention also consists in the improved vaporizer.

For a four cylinder engine giving 40 horse power at a thousand revolutions with a compression pressure of 80 pounds per square inch, the vaporizing chamber may be about 10 centimetres in diameter by 70 centimetres in length.

With vaporizers constructed as described above, a motor lorry driven by an ordinary petrol engine of 110 millimetres bore and 140 millimetres stroke, running at 1,000 revolutions per minute, gives a consumption of 0·6 of a pint of paraffin for one B. H. P. hour.

The apparatus can be used for any type of internal combustion engine, or if desired the gas may be used for other applications, such as for heating furnaces or for lighting, in which case the products of combustion may be led back to the vaporizer.

The claims are :—

1. A vaporizer for heavy liquid hydrocarbons in which the vaporization takes place in a through current of exhaust gases from an internal combustion engine, the fuel percolating through heat accumulating bodies of considerable mass presenting a large surface for vaporization, thus maintaining an even temperature, preferably between 180 and 250°C. for paraffin and like oils with an upper limit of 350°C. air being excluded from the vaporizing chamber.

2. The improved vaporizer hereinbefore described and illustrated in the accompanying drawings.
