SCHEDULE BEFERRED TO.

By-law No. 2.—The parent of every boy of not less than 6 nor more than 14 years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, or in the case of Muhammadan and Tamil girls of not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age, shall cause such boy or girl to attend one of the schools specified in the schedule hereto. unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance.

By law No. 5.—And provided always that when a child between 10 and 14 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Village Committee. has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he or ele line presed in reading, writing, and arithmetic, the fourth at related prescribed by the Code for the time being hear the shall not be required to attend school. By-law No. 5 A.—Any person who desires to open a school or give instruction in English or in any other language in any school room or in any building not previously used by him for the purpose to any class or classes attended by children of school-going age is required to report to the nearest Education Inspector at least one month before commencing such school work or instruction, and thereafter to supply such information as may be required by the Director of Education with regard to his class or classes and the course of instruction which he property to give therein.

Bylaw No. 5 B.- The Chairman, District School Committee, may in his discretion exempt any child of school-going age from attending school for such period as he thinks fit.

"THE FOREST ORDINANCE, 1907."

THE following regulations made by the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 16 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1907," for the management of the portion of forest specified in the schedule annexed to the Proclamation dated May 8, 1918, constituting such portion of the forest a village forest for the benefit of the village community of Weralupe, in the Uda pattu of Kuruwiti korale, Ratnapura District, of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, are published for general information.

The provisions of Sub-sections (c), (e), and (f) of Section 9 contained in Chapter II. of "The Forest Ordinance, 1907," and the following Regulations shall apply to the Forest which has been proclaimed under Section 14 to be a Village Forest for the benefit of the Village Community of Weralupe.

1. If in the opinion of the Divisional Officer the forest cannot bear all the produce claimed in one year by the villagers, the amount granted to each villager shall be reduced proportionately according to the probable yearly

outturn of the forest.

2. If in the opinion of the Divisional Officer the forest can bear heavier fellings than are required to satisfy the requirements of the villagers, the available balance of produce shall be brought out and sold, and the revenue obtained from the sale utilized for improvements of the village, such as roads, irrigation works, Gansabhawas, &c., or on re-afforestation.

3. No villager may claim his share of forest produce

except for his own personal requirements.
4. Dead or fallen timber for firewood, grass for litter and thatching, canes and creepers, may be taken by villagers

without permit.
5. When any villager requires any forest produce not mentioned in the fourth rule from, or wishes to pasture cattle in, the forest of his village, he shall apply to the Chief Headman of his village for a certificate showing that he is entitled to such produce or to graze such cattle. The Headman, after satisfying himself that such produce is actually required for the villager's own personal wants,

shall give him such certificate. This certificate shall be sent to the local Kachcheri with an application for a permit to fell or collect produce or to pasture cattle, as the case

may be 6. The permit shall be substantially in the forms given in Appendices B to F of the rules prescribed under section 21, Chapter IV., of Ordinance No. 16 of 1907, and shall provide for the stamping of trees by the Headman or Forest Officer duly empowered in that behalf.

7. A permit to remove timber, for which a permit to fell has been granted, shall be obtained from the Ratemahatmaya of the Kuruwiti korale. Such permit, which shall be substantially in the form K, shall be granted only on return of the permit to fell with the endorsement of the Headman that the conditions of such permit have been observed, and that the timber has been felled and logged.
8. Should it become apparent that the village forest is

being systematically pilfered by the villagers or other persons, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to appoint one or more special officers for the conservancy of the forest, and to charge their pay to revenue obtained from the forest. The privileges of the villagers will then, if

necessary, be proportionately reduced.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following order issued by the General Officer Commanding, Southern Brigade, India, under date July 10. 1916, is published for general information:-

In exercise of the powers delegated to him in Government of India, Home Department, notification No. 908, dated 22nd August, 1914, and in supersession of order No. 232/533-G., dated 22nd April, 1916, and of the order, dated 29th April, 1916, the General Officer Commanding, Southern Brigade, prohibits all non-Asiatic foreigners and all subjects of the Ottoman Empire from entering into, or remaining in, the district of the Nilgiris, excepting the South-East Wynaad, unless such foreigners shall have been certified by the Chief Secretary to Government or other competent civil authority to be eligible for exemption from such prohibition.

Such certificates may be issued, in respect of foreigners resident in the Madras Presidency, by the District Magistrate

of the district in which they reside and, in the City of Madras, by the Commissioner of Police.

In the case of foreigners residing within the territories of any Native State in political relations to the Government, the certificate should be issued by the Political Officer accredited to that State. Such certificates when issued should be forwarded by the issuing officers direct to the District Magistrate of the Nilgiris, copies being sent to the General Officer Commanding, Southern Brigade; the foreigner concerned shall merely be notified that permission is accorded to him to proceed to, or remain in, the Nilgiris.

Residents of Ceylon desiring to visit the Nilgiris should apply for the necessary certificate through the Colonia l Secretary's Office.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the

2. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall always be kept clean.

3. The walls of all eating-houses and tea or coffee boutiques shall be plastered and limewashed, and the rooms shall be well ventilated and lighted.

4. All refuse and dirt in or about the premises of any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall be removed twice daily.

5. No person suffering, or who, to the knowledge of any person in charge of an eating-house or tea or coffee boutique, has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of the eating-house or tea or coffee boutique to be employed in or about any such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique.

6. The sugar used in such places shall be kept in glass-stoppered wide-mouthed bottles.

7. All cakes, sweetmeats, &c., exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. No food stuffs shall be exposed to the contamination of flies. The glass cases used shall be kept scrupulously clean.

8. No waste tea, coffee, or milk, or remnants of food or cooking waste, shall be thrown on the ground, but shall be collected in a proper receptacle and removed daily.

9. No adulterated milk shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale or kept on the premises of any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique.

For the purposes of this rule adulterated milk shall mean milk to which water or any other foreign liquid or substance has been added for the purpose of augmenting its quantity or enhancing its apparent quality and not for the purpose of preparing tea or coffee or any other beverage for the immediate consumption of customers.

10. These by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every such eating-house or tea or coffee

boutique.

CHAPTER IV .- SECTION 21 (1) (c).

Save in regard to clearing and burning of chenas under permits provided for in rules under section 21 (1) (a) and (b) and to free grants provided for in the rules under section 21 (1) (g), no person shall fell, cut, girdle, lop, tap, or injure by fire or otherwise saw or convert any tree or the timber of any tree or cut bamboos, canes, or rattans for local use or otherwise, nor shall any person who is not the owner of land within a forest, or who has not resided in any village within any forest for two years, collect or appropriate plants, flowers, fruits, seeds, roots, juice, catechu, bark, gum, resin, varnish, lac, or honey, except under a permit issued by a duly empowered Forest Officer, and except on the conditions prescribed in such permit.

2. The permit above referred to shall be substantially in the following forms:—

(i.) Form B annexed hereto, for the felling and conversion of

- trees, and collecting or cutting firewood and poles.

 (ii.) Form D appended to the rules dated April 21, 1909, for collecting minor forest produce and cutting bamboos, canes, or rattans.
- Such permits shall be current only for such reasonable periods as will admit of complete conversion of the produce concerned, and shall not be transferable, nor shall the original quantity of forest produce covered by such permits be subsequently altered. During the operations in the forest the permits shall always be in the possession of the permit holder or his responsible agent who shall either work or supervise the work in the forest.

4. The period of a permit may be extended on payment of 10 per cent. of the royalty value of the produce covered by the permit on justifiable reasons for non-conversion being shown to the satisfaction of the Forest Officer before the date of expiry of

the permit.

(i.) No permit shall be current for a longer period than twelve months, save in the most exceptional circumstances, and no permit shall be allowed to run for a longer period than three months without the sanction of the Conservator of Forests previously obtained in writing.

(ii.) Permits shall be liable to cancellation for any breach of

forest rules.

(iii.) Any forest produce not converted for the purpose of removal by the time the permit for the same expires shall revert to the Crown, and the permit holder shall have no claim to a refund or rebate on account of such unconverted material, neither shall the permit holder have any claim for defects in trees

felled or converted.

6. Before issue of a felling or collecting permit the Forest Officer will ascertain the royalty due for the forest produce applied for in situ, exclusive of the top and branchwood of standing trees, and demand payment in full, save in the case of permits to Government Departments; he shall not deliver the

- permit till such payment is made.
 7. Save in the case of clear-fellings on behalf of the Conservator of Forests on contract, no permit holder shall fell trees covered by his permit until and unless such trees have been marked by a Forest Officer; after felling and conversion the produce concerned shall not be removed until duly checked and stamped by a Forest Officer and until the necessary removal permit has been issued on payment of any royalty due for the top and branchwood to be removed. In the event of such top and branchwood being not paid for or of any forest offence being committed in respect of the operations under the felling or collecting permit, the removal permit is liable to be refused or
- 8. All permits granted under the above rules shall be produced by the permit holder or on his behalf by his agent whenever

called for by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, any Forest Officer, Police Officer, or a Headman.

9. For local trade, as well as for the supply of a town or a manufactory or for any manufacturing purposes, timber for firewood may be collected and removed or permit issued by the Forest Officer; but where the Forest Department establishes or has established fuel depôts for this purpose, such permits shall not be issued within such limits as may be decided by the Conservator of Forests.

Any species of timber or minor forest produce the sale of which is prohibited by Government shall not be sold on a permit or otherwise without the previous authority of Government, and except on such conditions as may be sanctioned by

the Government in each case.

11. The Conservator shall have the power to prohibit the felling of any particular species of trees in any defined area where he considers such felling inimical to reproduction or where departmental working would be adversely affected.

CHAPTER V.—SECTION 24.

1. Forest produce shall not be exported from the Island except from ports which have been proclaimed as such under the Ordinance relating to the regulation of Customs in the Island and from such export, out-bay, or shipping depôts established for the shipping and export of timber, and subject to the rules and conditions relative to such depôts, as notified from time to time in the Government Gazette by the Governor in Executive Council.

2. (a) No person shall remove or cause to be removed any forest produce or timber from Crown land in any part of the Colony except under a permit from the Forest Officer in the

form G in the appendix hereto.

(b) No person shall remove or cause to be removed any forest produce or timber from any land, whether Crown or private, in any area specified by the Governor in Executive Council by notice in the Government Gazette as an area to which this rule applies, either within the said area or to any place outside the same except under a permit issued by the Expect Officer in the same, except under a permit issued by the Forest Officer in the forms G or H in the appendix hereto.

(c) When any permit provided for in this rule has been issued, no forest produce or timber in respect of which it has been granted shall be removed otherwise than in accordance with the

conditions of such permit.
3. No permit shall be granted for the removal of timber until it has been felled and logged, nor shall a permit for the removal of forest produce be granted until it has been made up into bundles or packages ready for transport.

4. The holder of a permit for the removal of forest produce

4. The holder of a permit for the removal of forest produce or timber shall produce it for inspection and endorsement at any checking station prescribed therein, and also on the demand of any Forest Officer, Police Officer, or Headman.

5. The period of time during which any permit for the removal of any forest produce or timber shall be in force shall be at the discretion of the person issuing the permit, but any person who requires further time for the removal of his property produced and the property of the permit of the removal of his property person who requires further time for the removal of his property person who requires further time for the removal of his property person who requires further to such officer. For timber from may apply for an extension to such officer. For timber from Crown land an extension fee of 10 per cert, of the royalty value of the timber or produce will be charged.

Every permit for the removal of forest produce or timber shall be returned to the office of issue within two days after its expiry. Should any permit expire before the forest produce referred to therein has been removed, or while the same is in transit, the removal of such forest produce shall not be commenced or continued until the owner or other person in charge has obtained an extension of the time allowed in the permit.

7. No person shall remove or cause to be removed any forest produce or timber from any private land in any area specified by the Governor in Executive Council by notice in the Government Gazette as an area to which this rule applies, either within the said area or to any place outside the same, except under a permit signed and dated by the owner of the land or other person in charge thereof, showing his proper address, the nature and dimensions of each piece of timber, the description of the land from which it was transported, and its destination. A true copy of such permit shall be delivered or posted by the owner or other person in charge on the day on which it was owner or other person in charge on the day on which it was signed to a Superior Headman of the district in which such land signed to a superior neadman of the district in which such fand is situate. Provided that this rule shall not apply to any case in which the person desiring to remove such forest produce or timber shall have obtained a permit from a Forest Officer authorized to issue the same in form H, and where such a permit has been issued by the Forest Officer, no copy need he delivered or posted by the owner of the land to the Chief Headman of the district.

8. It shall be the duty of the person moving such timber to produce the permit and give all such information concerning such timber as lies in his power to any Headman, Police Officer, or Officer of the Forest Department whenever called upon to do so.

9. When a checking station has been established under section 24 (1) (f) (vide rule 11) on any road or river, any permit issued by the owner of any land from which timber has been brought shall be exchanged for a permit issued by the Forest Officer at the place appointed to which the timber covered by

the permit is brought.

10. No person other than the owner thereof, or person acting on behalf of such owner or of the Crown, shall loosen or set adrift any floating timber or stranded timber, or any timber raft moored in or to the bank of any river.

ratt moored in or to the bank of any river.

11. The Conservator of Forests may, in his discretion, with notice in the Government Gazette, establish checking stations on any roads or rivers where all forest produce in transit may be checked, and for that purpose may cause to be constructed or put up booms, chains, toll bars, or any other necessary barriers.

12. All persons having charge of forest produce in transit shall stop at such checking stations and produce their passes for the inspection of the officer in charge.

13. Any forest produce in respect of which no permit or pass.

Any forest produce in respect of which no permit or pass as hereinbefore provided is produced may be stopped in transit by any Forest or Police Officer or Superior Headman, who may

by any Forest or Police Officer or Superior Headman, who may thereupon examine and mark such timber, and who shall report the matter to his superior officer or to the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent having jurisdiction.

14. The Forest Officer may appoint any place or places in his division where forest produce that has been stopped in transit may be brought, pending his order or that of the Magistrate regarding the final disposal of such produce. The Forest Officer may, however, in his discretion give such produce in charge of the officer seizing it or any other officer of Government.

15. Timber, the property of Government, may be transported across any land, and all acts necessary or convenient for such transport may be done under the written authority of the such transport may be done under the written authority of the Forest Officer. Compensation shall be paid for any damage done to private property by reason of the transport of such timber upon assessment of such damage by a Superior Headman or other competent officer named by the Government Agent.

16. No person shall in any way close up or obstruct, or do any act tending to close up or obstruct, the channel of any river used for the transit of timber. Any Forest Officer may prevent

or remove any obstruction in the channel of any such river, and the cost of such prevention or removal may be recovered from the person, or by the sale of any timber, causing the obstruction.

17. No person shall, without previously obtaining a permit from the Forest Officer, establish a saw pit or mill within any Crown forest. The permit shall be substantially in the form J in appendix hereto annexed.

18. No person not being a Forest Officer (unless he be the or remove any obstruction in the channel of any such river, and

20. All property marks shall be registered at the office of the Forest Division from which the timber is to be exported. No person shall be allowed to register a mark already registered in favour of another person, nor any mark used by Government.

21. A Forest Officer may refuse to register any mark which in his judgment so closely resembles a mark used by Government.

22. A fee of Re. 1 shall be payable to Government for each registration, and a certificate showing the mark registered, and the period for which it holds good and acknowledging payment of the fee, shall be given to every person registering his mark.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 4, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 143 (21 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 24 Moors, 11 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1918, viz., 272,234) was 27.4, as against 25.5 in the preceding week, 25.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 101 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 44 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 15 Moors, Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 19.4, as against 17.6 in the previous week,

24 3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 101 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

Principal Causes of Death.—Fifteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Maradana, 4 in Kotahena, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

- 2. Seven deaths from Phthisis were registered, 4 in Maradana, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. One death from Enteric Fever was registered of a non-resident in Maradana (hospital), as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- Nine deaths from Debility were registered, 6 from Infantile Convulsions, 3 from Tetanus, 2 from Diarrhæa, 1 from Dysentery, and 53 from Other Causes.
- 5. No deaths from Plague were registered during the week, 3 were registered in the previous week, and the weekly average for last year was 3. No cases were reported during the week, as against 2 in the previous week.
- 6. Twenty-seven cases of Chickenpox, 1 of Smallpox, and 3 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 57, 2, and 2, respectively, during the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.5°, against 81.9° in the preceding week and 79.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.828 in., against 29.888 in. in the preceding week, and 29.838 in. the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.39 in., against 1.32 in. in the preceding week and 4.77 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, March 9, 1918.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 4, 1918.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena; Mr. D. W. Subesinghe; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; Mr. A. C. Hayley; Mr. J. E. Perera; and Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on February 9, 1918, a copy thereof having been previously sent to each Councillor, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subesinghe moved:—"That the full amount due as riot compensation having been recovered, the instalments still payable by some tax-payers be waived, and the cases instituted against them for non-payment be withdrawn."

Speaking on the motion the mover commended it to the sympathetic consideration of the Council for the following reasons:—(1) That only those who could not afford to pay the tax had failed to do so; (2) He questioned the legality of the Council recovering more than the assessed amount of compensation; and (3) the Council stood to lose nothing by waiving further payments, as, already, more than was required for paying compensation had been recovered. Mr. G. E. Abeywardena seconded.

The Chairman opposed the motion. He said that no scheme could possibly yield an exact specified amount. scheme, as passed by Council, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, was now law, and should be carried out by the Council, and he questioned the right to exempt en masse those who had evaded payment. The tax was recovered only from persons in sound health and able to earn, and he was constantly exempting defaulters who were reported by the Medical Officer of Health as "unfit" and who had no means of paying the tax. But to exempt the lower classes en masse as was suggested would be to exempt many who had benefitted by the riots.

On the motion being put only the mover and the seconder voted for it; and it was declared lost.

3. Appointment of a Superintendent of Works. The Chairman moved Council into Committee.

Council in Committee.

The Chairman moved that Mr. F. B. Toussaint, Senior Inspector, Public Works Department, be appointed Superintendent of Works and, if elected, that the Hon. the Director of Public Works be asked to second him for six months, as a period of probation. Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten seconded.

Mr. D. W. Subesinghe moved, as an amendment, that Mr. J. A. W. Rodrigo, Inspector, City Sanitation Department, Colombo Municipal Council, be appointed Superintendent of Works. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.

The amendment on being put was declared lost; 3 voting for, and 6 against it. The Chairman's original motion was then put, and carried.

On Council resuming, the Chairman formally moved that the recommendation of the Committee be adopted, and

that Mr. Toussaint be appointed Superintendent of Works. Dr. C. B. Lourensz seconded.

Mr. D. W. Subesinghe moved, as an amendment, that Mr. J. R. Grenier be appointed Superintendent of Works.

Mr. G. E. Abeywardena.—Seconded. The amendment was declared lost, three voting for and six against it. The original motion was then put, and

carried.

4. Employment of a Municipal midwife. Resolved that a midwife, whose services would be at the disposal of the poor, be employed on a salary of Rs. 480 per annum, and that a selection be made from the list of certified midwives furnished by the Principal Civil Medical Officer.

(9) Messrs. Hoare & Co's, estimate for making 25 spindles with push for standposts, at Rs. 7.25 cach, Rs. 181.25.— Approved.

(10) Estimate for rebuilding Athoya bridge on Circular road, Rs. 1,030.—Approved, and that tenders be called for.

(11) Estimate for repairs to 6 night-soil carts, Rs. 190.—Approved.
(12) Estimate for a wheelbarrow for Ward No. 3, Rs. 30.—Approved.

(13) Applications for water service to: -26, Wakwella road; 17, Church street; 7, Havelock road; and 14,

Dangedera.—Recommended.

(14) Letter from District Engineer, Galle, asking if he may level a part of the Victoria Park supply himself with the necessary earth for protecting the Marker's shelter. Also asking permission to form two firing platforms at points 200 and 400 yards from the Victoria Park target on the esplanade side of canal, and to form at these spots 2 fire trenches, 4 ft. 6 in. in depth and 12 ft. in length.—Recommended that the District Engineer be allowed to remove earth from the mound adjoining the hollow in Victoria park, but the Committee does not recommend the formation of firing platforms and trenches on the ground, as they would injure the amenities of the Esplanade.

Resolution.

Resolved-That the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted.

Any application by registered owners for re-transfer to be specially considered by Council.

(18) Papers re the adoption of the re-assessment of premises for the year 1919.—Recommended that rates be levied for 1919 on the basis of the new assessment.

(19) List of unserviceable night soil buckets.—Recommended that they be destroyed.

(20) Report on demolished buildings in wards Nos. 2, 3, and 4 west to be struck off the assessment register,-Recommendation approved.
