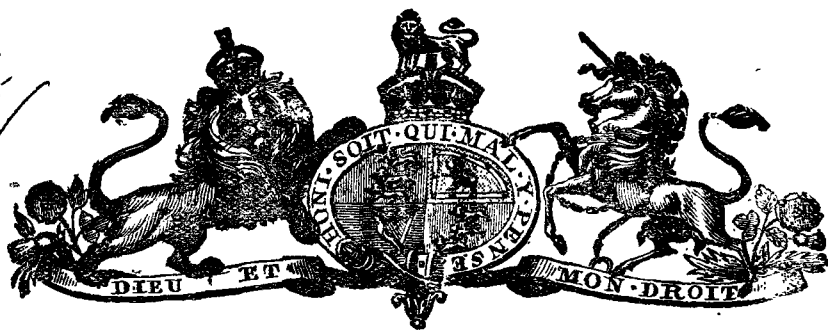

New rule to be inserted immediately after rule 32 of "Rules relating to the Conveyance of Traffic by Passenger Trains," and to be numbered 32 A:—

"32 A. Alcolite shall mean and include spirit of a strength not less than 50 degrees over proof (or such other strength as may be prescribed by the Excise Commissioner) that is rendered effectually and permanently unfit for human consumption by the admixture of such denaturants as are from time to time approved by the Excise Commissioner.

"The provisions in rule 32 relating to petrol shall apply to alcolite."

New rule to be inserted immediately after rule 44 of "Rules and Rates for the Conveyance of Goods Traffic," and to be numbered 44 A:—

"44 A. Alcolite shall mean and include spirit of a strength not less than 50 degrees over proof (or such other strength as may be prescribed by the Excise Commissioner) that is rendered effectually and permanently unfit for human consumption by the admixture of such denaturants as are from time to time approved by the Excise Commissioner.

"The provisions in rule 44 relating to petrol shall apply to alcolite."

"THE PROTECTION OF PRODUCE ORDINANCE, No. 38 OF 1917."

LAND SALE REGULATIONS.

NOTICE is hereby given in terms of section 39 of the land sale regulations that an application has been received from the Mirishena estate, Kalawellawa, for a perpetual lease to the estate, without competition, of an allotment of land situated in the village Bulatsinhala, in Gangaboda pattuwa of Pasdun korale east of the Kalutara District, Western Province, described as lot 1 in preliminary plan No. 16,576, containing in extent 60 acres 3 roods and 11 perches, and bounded as follows: north by Maha-ela Waturana *alias* Okanda Waturana (low land) belonging to Crown; east by Poonawalahena Manana Deniya belonging to Crown and Mirishena rubber estate claimed by Kalutara Rubber Company, Limited, T. BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Public stands for carriages and rickshas licensed to ply for hire shall be established at such places within Local Board limits as the Board shall resolve from time to time, and every such resolution shall be duly published by beat of tom-tom and by affixing copies in public places at least 15 days before such resolution shall take effect.

2. No person in charge of a licensed carriage or ricksha shall draw up his vehicle in any place in a public thoroughfare other than a public carriage or ricksha stand for the purpose of seeking or attracting the attention of possible fare.

3. Carriages and rickshas plying for hire shall be drawn up in single file at the above-mentioned public stands,

one behind the other in the order of their arrival at the stand.

4. The earliest arrival among those waiting at any public stand shall have the right to take the first fare, unless such fare himself chooses a later arrival for any reason he may have.

5. No person who is in charge of a licensed carriage or ricksha at a public stand shall refuse to ply such carriage or ricksha for hire for any reason whatever, if a fare insists on taking such carriage or ricksha.

"THE VEHICLES ORDINANCE, No. 4 OF 1916."

THE following by-law for the Local Board town of Negombo made by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 18 (1) (d) of "The Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916," is published for general information.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

1. (a) It shall be the duty of the licensee of every jinricksha to affix a copy of the approved table of fares, printed or inscribed and enclosed in a glazed metal frame, on some conspicuous part of the front of the seat of the jinricksha. Any licensee failing to comply with this rule shall be guilty of an offence.

(b) Licensees are hereby informed that copies of the approved table of fares, enclosed in glazed metal frames, can be obtained from the Board on payment of a sum of 40 cents.

"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

IT is hereby notified that the following by-law made by the Local Board of Matale, under the provisions of sub-section (21) of section 56 of the Local Boards Ordinance, No. 13 of 1898, has been confirmed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and is hereby published for general information.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

Preaching or holding meetings in streets prohibited.—No person shall preach or address any assembly or crowd or hold any meeting in any street within the Local Board limits of Matale, except in pursuance of a permit from the Superintendent of Police or the Chairman of the Local

Board, and within the times and limits specified in such permit. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 20.

Order of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Council under "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by Ordinances No. 5 of 1917 and No. 41 of 1917.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 8 A (1) of "The Enemy Property Ordinance, No. 23 of 1916," as amended by the Enemy Property (Amendment) Ordinances, No. 5 of 1917 and No. 41 of 1917, that the Governor in Executive Council may, by Order in Council, vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property any property belonging to or held or managed for an enemy or enemy subject, and may confer on the Custodian such power of selling or otherwise dealing with such property as to the Governor in Executive Council may seem proper:

And whereas the property enumerated in the schedule hereto belongs to the enemies or enemy subjects whose names appear above such property, and it appears expedient to vest the said property in the Custodian and to confer on him the power to sell the said property and to transfer title thereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government is pleased, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said property is vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property, and that the Custodian is hereby empowered to sell the said property and upon sale thereof to transfer title thereto.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 11, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 126 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 15 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1918, viz., 272,234) was 24.1, as against 27.4 in the preceding week, 22.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 75 (1 European, 2 Burghers, 40 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 11 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 14.4, as against 19.4 in the previous week, 24.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 75 total deaths, 15 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 23 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Fort, 1 in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 15 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

2. Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana, (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 in San Sebastian and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Eight deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Dysentery*, 5 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 from *Enteritis*, and 33 from *Other Causes*.

5. No deaths from *Plague* were registered either this week or the previous week. Two cases were reported during the week, as against nil in the previous week.

6. One death from *Smallpox* was registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta.

7. Sixteen cases of *Chickenpox*, and 2 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 27 cases of *Chickenpox*, 1 of *Smallpox*, and 3 of *Measles*, during the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.1°, against 82.5° in the preceding week and 81.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.790 in., against 29.828 in. in the preceding week and 29.892 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.77 in., against 2.39 in. in the preceding week and 0.24 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
