BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

(By-law made under Sub-section (1) (a 1) of Section 20 of the Rural Schools Ordinance.)

7. Any person who desires to open a school or give instruction in English or in any other language in any schoolroom or in any building not previously used by him for the purpose to any class or classes attended by children of school-going age shall report to the nearest Education Inspector or Sub-Inspector at least one month before

commencing such school work or instruction, and thereafter shall supply such information as may be required by the Director of Education with regard to his class or classes and the course of instruction he proposes to give therein

SCHEDULE A.

1. No person shall pull or draw a jinriekshaw for hire unless he holds a license from the Chairman. The license shall be in force from the date of its issue until December 31 next following. It shall contain the licensee's name and address in full, and the licensed number, his nationality, the print of his left thumb and two forefingers, and any other particulars which may ensure his complete identification. Such license must be always carried by the licensee, and such licensee shall be bound to produce his license to any passenger or would-be passenger demanding the same. Every such licensee shall wear in a conspicuous place on his right arm a metal badge bearing his license number, to be provided for him by the Board.

2. Every person licensed by the Chairman to pull or draw a jinrickshaw for hire shall keep within the box under the seat of his jinrickshaw a printed table offares, which shall be supplied free to him by the Local Board, and he shall be bound to show such table of fares to any passenger or would-be passenger demanding the same. He shall also have his jinrickshaw equipped with the necessary waterproof aprons, and have a bicycle bell securely attached to the front of the right hand shaft of his jinrickshaw.

3. It shall be lawful for the Chairman before granting the license to make or cause to be made such inquiry as he may consider necessary regarding the character of the applicant for license and his physical fitness for the work of pulling or drawing a jinrickshaw, and to examine him or cause him to be examined as to his knowledge of the rule of the road. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to refuse to grant a license to any applicant, and also to cancel, withdraw, or suspend any license granted by him for such grounds as to him may seem reasonable.

4. Every person pulling or drawing a jinrickshaw for hire shall, at any time when required to do so by an officer of Police not under the rank of Sub-Inspector, furnish proof of his identity by producing his license and by allowing the impression of his thumbs and fingers to be taken in such manner and at such places as the said officer may require.

5. It shall be the duty of every person pulling or drawing a jinrickshaw for hire to produce immediately for inspection his license when required to do so by any person who employs him for hire.

6. No person shall employ or permit another to pull or drawa jinrickshaw for hire unless such other person holds a license from the Chairman, Local Board, Chilaw, under by-law 1.

SCHEDULE B.

North.—A line starting from the sea, along the eastern shore of the Chilaw lake up to the canal, and thence along the western bank of the canal up to the bridge over the canal.

South-east.-A line from the south-eastern corner of Mr. Advocate Corea's land, along its southern boundary, and along the southern boundary of Mr. de Mel's estate, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 487 V 3, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 487 5, southern boundary of lot 5/39, eastern boundaries of lots L 1230, M 1230, N 1230, southern boundaries of lots N 1230, M 1230 to Colombo road, thence along the eastern side of Colombo road to a point opposite the northern corner of lot 1079 across the road, along the northern and western boundaries of the said lot to the railway line, thence along the eastern side of the railway line to lot Y marked in town plan, thence across the railway line, along the southern boundaries of lots X and Y in the said plan and along the southern boundaries of lot V 214 and lot W 214 to the Chilaw lake, thence along the eastern shore of the Chilaw lake to northwest corner of lot 13233, thence a line across the lake to the north-eastern corner of lot L 1194, along the northern boundary of the said lot L 1194, along the road marked in the town plan to the north-eastern corner of lot 205394 in town plan.

South.—A line starting from the north-east corner of lot 205394, along the northern and western boundaries of the said lot 205394, southern boundaries of lots 205421 and 316, and thence a straight line starting from the north-east corner of the general cemetery along its southern boundary to the sea.

West.—The sea.

A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom. GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation.

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of

certain goods has been prohibited accordingly.

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

Molasses and invert sugar and all other sugars and extracts from sugar which cannot be completely tested by the polariscope, and on which Customs duty is not otherwise charged.

Plaiting of all descriptions not otherwise prohibited.

Rattans and Malacca canes.

Weighing machines, scales, and balances of all descriptions not otherwise prohibited.

Wood flour.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited at the Prohibition of Import (No. 23) Proclamation, 1918.

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VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 1, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 96 (3 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 51 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 9 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1918, viz., 272,234) was 18.4, as against 14.4 in the preceding week, 22.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 97 (I European, 5 Burghers, 51 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 13 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 18.6, as against 20.7 in the previous week, 20.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 97 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 25 in the preceding week, 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eleven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 6 in Kotahena, 4 in Slave Island, and 1 in Maradana, as against 17 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

- 2. Five deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 in San Sebastian, as against 9 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Maradana, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.
 - 4. No deaths from Plague were registered and no cases were reported either this week or the previous week.
- 5. Nine deaths from Debility were registered, 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Enteritis, 3 from Tetanus, 1 from Dysentery, 1 from Worms, and 46 from Other Causes.
- 6. Twenty cases of Chickenpox, 6 of Measles, and 1 of Smallpox were reported during the week, as against 13, 4, and nil respectively during the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·2°, against 79·4° in the preceding week and 82·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·885 in., against 29·851 in. in the preceding week and 29·825 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·01 in., against 7·29 in. in the preceding week and 2·49 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Teachers' Courses for 1919-20. English Classes (Men and Women).

THE Annual Examination for admission to the courses of training for teachers in English schools will be held at the Training College on November 4, 5, and 6, 1918, at 10.30 A.M. Forms for admission can be obtained from the Principal of the College from August 1 to September 15, after which date no forms will be issued. These forms must be returned to him duly filled up on or before October 10. Candidates will then be informed whether they have been selected to appear at the examination.

2. Selected students will be trained for the posts of teachers in Grant-in-aid and Government schools. The following classes will be established in January, 1919:-

(a) A one-year course in the theory and practice of teaching for Graduates and those who have passed the Intermediate Examination of the University of London in Arts or Science.

(b) A two-year course for English school teachers in (1) Arts, (2) Science, (3) Mathematics, (4) Manual Training and Drawing, in addition to the theory and practice of teaching.

(c) A two-year course for Infant school teachers (women students only). The certificate awarded to successful students at the end of this course is that referred to under clause 49 (c) of the Code for 1916.

(d) A two-year course for English teachers in Government anglo-vernacular schools.

3. About 40 or more studentships are offered for competition. The number and value of studentships for each course will depend on the standard attained by competitors. Selection will not depend only on examination results, but on general considerations of fitness. &c.

4. It must be understood that all students are appointed on probation for the first three months, but that even after the probationary period they are liable to be discontinued

unless a reasonable degree of promise is shown.

5. All students in training must devote the whole of their time to College work. Board and residence will be provided on payment of the prescribed charge during the time the College is in session. Those for whom residence is not available must live within a convenient distance of the College, and must be able to satisfy the Principal that their place of residence is suitably situated for study and under healthy conditions.

6. Each selected candidate must satisfy the College Medical Officer that he or she is physically fit for the

teaching profession.

7. All students will receive free passes by rail to and from their homes during vacations.

8. The Entrance Examination will comprise the following for course (b):-

I.—Compulsory subjects :-

(a) English Language and Literature (general paper).(b) English Composition.

(c) Reading aloud from the work of a standard author.

(d) Arithmetic.

(e) A General Knowledge paper, including questions on

History and Geography of the British Empire.

* Needlework (for women only)—a test will be set on the work of Standards I. to IV.of English schools.

II.—Optional Subjects:—

1. Mathematics

Algebra: to binomial theorem.

Geometry: the subject-matter of Euclid's Books I. to IV. (experimentally and theoretically).

2. Languages:

(a) Latin: Translation, Grammar, and Composition. (b) Sinhalese: Ummagga Jataka and Guttila. Grammar and Composition.

(c) Tamil: Panchatantra, Puthu Neethimanchari, and Ilakkanachchurukkam. Composition.

N.B.—Only one of 2(a), (b), or (c) can be taken.

No. 1,544 of August 2, 1917.

"Improvements in rubber compositions and processes for the production thereof."

Abstract.—The inventors state :-

This invention relates to rubber or similar vulcanizable plastic compositions and to processes for producing the same. It is more particularly directed to a softened rubber composition and the process employed in its production.

Softened rubbers heretofore known have consisted of natural rubbers of high resin content or material produced by the admixture of castor or other oils or resins with rubber. Natural rubbers of high resin content have little ability to withstand wear and oil-or resin-treated rubbers are comparatively expensive.

One object of the present invention accordingly is to produce an inexpensive rubber composition having ability to withstand wear, good addressive properties, and other desirable characteristics. Another object is to improve the curing properties of the rubber. Another object is to provide a simple process for the production of such material.

The preferred material is made according to the following process:—Hevea or other rubber-producing latex is treated with 0.2 per cent. of sodium floride based on the weight of the latex. After five to eight hours the latex thickens or becomes coalesced, whereby its viscosity is increased and a medium produced in which various materials, such as oils, fibres, &c., may be uniformly suspended. The term "coalesced" as here employed is intended to designate a thick molasses-like state assumed by the latex as distinguished from the stiff form which the latter assumes upon coagulation. To the coalesced latex are added pulped Hevea seeds which have previously been hulled and ground to an emulsion. quantity of pulped seed employed will vary in accordance with the desired characteristics of the resultant product. a somewhat soft rubber suitable for tube stock and the like, a small proportion of the seed based on the coalesced latex will be used. For a sticky rubber suitable for rubber tape and the like, a relatively larger percentage will be employed. The pulped seed emulsion is disseminated throughout the mass and is retained in substantially uniformly suspended condition until coagulation occurs. Sulphur or other vulcanizing agent may be added along with the pulp or the addition may be made prior to that of the pulp, or at any time before vulcanization. The rubber may then be vulcanized.

A composition of matter comprising an admixture of a vulcanizable plastic material and a naturally oleaginous vegetable tissue, substantially undeprived of its original oil content.

- 2. A composition of matter comprising an admixture of rubber and seeds, substantially undeprived of their original oil content.
- 3. A composition of matter comprising an admixture of a vulcanizable plastic and rubber seed pulp, substantially undeprived of its original oil content.

4. A composition of matter comprising an admixture of rubber and Hevea seed pulp, substantially undeprived of its original oil content.

5. A composition of matter comprising rubber derived from latex coagulated in the presence of a naturally oleaginous vegetable tissue, substantially undeprived of its original oil content.

6. A composition of matter comprising rubber derived from latex coagulated in the presence of seed pulp, substantially underived of its original oil content.

7. A composition of matter comprising rubber derived from latex coagulated in the presence of rubber seed pulp, substantially undeprived of its original oil content.

8. A composition of matter comprising rubber derived from latex coagulated in the presence of Hevea seed pulp, substantially undeprived of its original oil content.

9. The step in the process of treating vulcanizable plastics which consists in incorporating a naturally oleaginous vegetable tissue, substantially undeprived of its original oil content with a vulcanizable plastic.

10. The step in the process of treating vulcanizable plastics which consists in incorporating seeds, substantially undeprived of their original oil content with a vulanizable plastic.

11. The step in the process of treating vulcanizable plastics which consists in incorporating a naturally oleaginous vegetable tissue, substantially undeprived of its original oil content with rubber-producing latex.

12. The step in the process of treating vulcanizable plastics which consists in incorporating seeds of a rubber-producing plant, substantially undeprived of their original oil content with a vulcanizable plastic.

13. A process of the kind described which comprises, incorporating a naturally oleaginous vegetable tissue, substantially undeprived of its original oil content with rubber-producing latex, and congulating the latex.

14. A process of the kind described which comprises, incorporating oily seed pulp, substantially undeprived of its original oil content with rubber-producing latex, and coagulating the latex.

15. A process of the kind described which comprises, causing coalescence in rubber-producing latex in any suitable or well known manner adding thereto an oleaginous vegetable tissue, substantially undeprived of its original oil content, and coagulating the latex.

16. A process of the kind described which comprises, causing coalescence in rubber-producing latex in any suitable or well known manner adding thereto oily seed pulp, substantially undeprived of its original oil content, and coagulating the latex.

17. A process of the kind described which comprises, causing coalescence in rubber-producing latex in any suitable or well known manner adding thereto pulped Hevea seeds, substantially undeprived of their original oil content, and coagulating the latex.

payable in respect of such share.

10. The certificate of title to shares shall be issued under the Seal of the Company and signed by two Directors

and the Secretary, or in such manner as the Directors shall prescribe.

11. Every Shareholder shall be entitled on payment of 50 cents to one certificate for all shares registered in his name, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon. He shall also pay the amount of stamp duty required by law for such certificate.

12. If such certificate be worn out or lost it may be renewed on payment of 50 cents.

13. No person shall exercise any rights of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the Register of Shareholders, and until he shall have paid all moneys payable for the time being on every share held by him.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

14. The Company may decline to register any transfer of shares made by a Shareholder indebted to them.

Any Shareholder may, with the consent of the Directors previously obtained, transfer all or any of his shares. The instrument of such transfer shall be in writing signed both by the transferor and the transferce. And the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share or shares until the name of the transferee is entered in the register.

16. The instrument of transfer shall be presented to the Company accompanied by such evidence as they may require to prove the title of such transfer, and thereupon the Company may register the transferee as a Shareholder.

17. The Transfer Books shall be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding the Ordinary General

Meeting in each year.

18. The executors, administrators, or heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to his share. Provided, however, that the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall not be recognized as Shareholders, unless letters of administration be taken out to the estate of the said deceased Shareholder if , the law so requires it.

19. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or insolvency of any Shareholder, or in consequence of the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any way other than by transfer, may be registered

as a Shareholder upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time be required by the Company.

20. 28. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the incorporation

of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

29. Subsequent General Meetings may be held at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in a General Meeting, and if not so prescribed, then at such place and at such time in the month of July in each year as the Directors shall determine.

The above-mentioned General Meetings shall be called Ordinary Meetings. All other General Meetings shall

be called Extraordinary.

31. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, and shall upon a requisition made in writing by any number of Shareholders holding in the aggregate not less than one-fifth part of the shares of the Company, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting.

32. Any requisition so made by the Shareholders shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, and

shall be left at the registered office of the Company.

33. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene a General Meeting; if they do not proceed to convene the same within twenty-one days from the date of the requisition, the requisitionists or any other Shareholders holding the required number of shares may themselves convene a meeting.

34. Twenty-one days' notice at least, specifying the place and the hour of meeting, and the purpose for which any General Meeting is to be held, shall be given by advertisement or in such other manner, if any, as may be prescribed by

the Company.

35. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than seven days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to the meeting.

Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company. 36.

No business shall be transacted at any meeting, except the declaration of the dividend, unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business, and such quorum shall be ascertained as follows, that is to say, if the Shareholders belonging to the Company at the time of the meeting do not exceed twenty in number, the quorum shall be ten; if they exceed twenty, there shall be added to the above quorum one for every additional ten Shareholders, with this limitation that no quorum shall in any case exceed forty.

38. If within one hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, it shall

- be adjourned sine die.

 39. The Chairman, if any, of the Board of Directors shall preside at every meeting of the Company. If there be no such Chairman, or if at any meeting he is not present, the Shareholders present shall choose one of the members to be the Chairman of the meeting.
- 40. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.
- 41. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is demanded by at least five Shareholders, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried and any entry to that effect in the book of proceedings of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against such resolution

42. If a poll is demanded in the manner aforesaid, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the results of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

43. Every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

- If any Shareholder is a minor, lunatic, idiot, or a prodigal, he may vote by the person legally appointed to the charge and administration of his property.
- 45. If two or more persons are jointly entitled to a share or shares, the person whose name stands first in the register of Shareholders as one of the holders of such share or shares, and no other, shall be entitled to vote in respect of the same. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any meeting, unless all moneys due from him to the Company **46**.

Votes may be given either personally or by proxy, and proxy shall be appointed in writing under the hand of 47. the appointer, or if such appointer is a corporation under that seal, and such writing shall be stamped according to the stamp law in force at that time.

48. No person shall be appointed proxy who is not a Shareholder, and the instrument appointing him shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote; but no such instrument shall be valid after the expiration of three months from the date of its execution.

DIRECTORS.

49. Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting, the number of Directors shall not be less than seven nor exceed fifteen.

50. The qualification of a Director shall be the holding of ten shares or the obtaining of the votes of a person or

persons holding twenty-five shares in the aggregate.

51. The first Directors shall be: (1) K. Kanakasabai, Esq., Proctor, Supreme Court, Jaffina; (2) K. Arulambel Esq., Proctor, Jaffna; (3) S. Muttokumarasamychettyar, Merchant, Jaffna; (4) A. Mylvaganam, Merchant, Jaffna; (5) M. Kumarasamy, Merchant, Jaffna; (6) E. Ramalingum, Planter, Nallore, Jaffna; (7) S. K. Kandiah Pillai, Marchant; and they shall hold office, except in the event of their becoming respectively disqualified, until the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company.

52. Any casual vacancy in the Board of Directors may be filled up by the Board, but any person so chosen shall

hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting.

53. As remuneration for the services the Directors shall be entitled to receive out of the funds of the Company such annual sum as may be voted by the Shareholders in General Meeting. Such remuneration shall be exclusive of any sum paid by way of salary or remuneration to any Managing Director or Directors, and shall be divided among the Directors, as they may determine.

The office of a Director shall be vacated— **54**.

(1) If he ceases to hold a number of shares or votes qualifying for the office.

(2) If by notice in writing to the Company he resigns.(3) If he becomes insolvent.

(4) If he is found lunatic or become of unsound mind.

55. The Company may, by special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his term of office and appoint any Shareholder in his stead.

56. At every Ordinary Meeting of the Company the whole of the Directors shall retire from office, but they shall

be eligible for re-election.

57. The Directors may from time to time appoint one or more of their body to be Managing Director or Directors of the Company, either for any fixed term or without any limitation as to the period for which he is to hold such office, and may, subject to any contract between him and the Company, from time to time remove or dismiss him from office and appoint another in his place. The remuneration of the Managing Director shall be fixed by the Directors and may be by way of salary, commission, percentage, or participation in profits, or by any or all of these modes. The Directors may from time to time entrust to and confer upon the Managing Director such of the powers exercisable by them as they think fit, subject to such terms and conditions as they may prescribe.

58. The Directors may meet together for despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they thin't fit; and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; until otherwise determined,

seven shall form a quorum.

A Director may, and the Secretary at the request of any Director shall, at any time convene a meeting of the Directors. Questions arising at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes of the Directors present, and in case of equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

60. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings and may determine the period for which he shall hold

If such Chairman has not been appointed, or if he is not present at the time appointed for a meeting, the Directors

present shall choose some one of those present to be Chairman of such meeting.

61. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books provided for and solely used for the purpose-

(1) Of all appointments of officers made by the Directors.

(2) Of the names of Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.

(3) Of all orders made by the Directors.

(4) Of all resolutions and proceedings of meetings of the Company and of the Directors. And any such minute as aforesaid, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of any meeting of Directors duly called and constituted, shall be receivable in evidence without further proof.

A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a

meeting of the Directors duly valled and constituted.

- 63. The Directors may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as they think fit, and may revoke the appointment of any such committee. Any such committee so formed shall, in the exercise of the powers so delegated, conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed on it by the
- 64. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee consisting of two or more members shall be governed by the provisions herein entered for regulating the meetings of Directors so far as the same are applicable thereto and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of the Committee or by any such regulations as aforesaid.

DIVIDEND.

65. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares.

66. No dividend shall be payable except out of the profits arising from the business of the Company and with the

sanction of the Directors.

67. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think fit as a reserve fund to meet contingencies or for equalizing devidends or for repairing or maintaining the works connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, and the Directors may invest the sums so set apart as a reserve fund upon such security as they may, with the sanction of the Company, select.

68. The Directors may deduct from the dividends payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be

due from him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.

- 30. No dividend shall bear interest as against the Company.
 70. Notice of any dividend that may have been declared shall be given to each Shareholder, or sent by post or otherwise to his registered place of abode; and all dividends unclaimed for three years, after having been declared, may be
- forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company.

 71. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the moneys received and expended by the Company and linking and link of all matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place and of the property, assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company. But no member shall have any right to insist on the inspection of any account book or document of the Company except as conferred by the Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by the resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

ACCOUNTS.

72. Once at least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the past year made up to a date not more than three months before such meeting.

The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived and the amount of gross expenditure distinguishing the

expense of the establishment, salaries, and other matters.

74. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting; and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item may be stated with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

75. At the Ordinary Meeting in each year the Directors shall lay before the Company a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company.

76. A printed copy of the balance sheet shall, twenty-one days previously to such meeting, be delivered or sent by post to the address of every Shareholder.

AUDIT.

77. The accounts of the Company shall be examined and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditors to be elected by the Company in General Meeting.

The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by the Company at the time of their election.

If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of Auditors, the Directors shall forthwith call an Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of filling such vacancy.

The Directors shall appoint the first Auditors to audit the accounts of the Company until the First Ordinary

General Meeting and fix the remuneration payable to them.

81. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet, and it shall be his duty to examine the same

with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto.

Every Auditor shall have a list delivered to him of all the books kept by the Company, and he shall at all reasonable times have access to the books and accounts of the Company. He may at the expense of the Company employ accountants or other persons to assist him in investigating such accounts and he may in relation to such accounts examine

the Directors or any other officers of the Company.

33. The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts, and in every such report they shall state, whether in their opinion, the balance sheet is full and fair containing the particulars required by these regulations and properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs; and in case they have called for explanations or information from the Directors, whether such explanations or information have been given by the Directors, and whether they have been satisfactory; and such report shall be read, together with the report of the Directors, at the Ordinary Meeting.

Notices.

84. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders may be served either personally or by

leaving the same, or sending the same through the post at their registered places of abode.

85. Every Shareholder shall give an address which shall be deemed his place of abode and shall be registered as

such in the books of the Company.

Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the letter containing the same is posted, and in proving such service, it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed. and put in a Post Office box or handed at a Post Office.
