DRAFT ORDINANCE.**MINUTE.**

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend "The Pearl Fishery Ordinance, 1906."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Pearl Fishery Ordinance, 1906": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Pearl Fishery (Amendment) Ordinance, No. of 1918," and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the "Government Gazette," appoint.

Addition of new sub-section.

2 The following sub-section shall be added to section 5 of the principal Ordinance, the first part of the said section being numbered accordingly:

(2) Any person found in possession of pearl oysters within the limits named in such Proclamation, under such circumstances that there is reason to suspect that they were not lawfully obtained, shall be guilty of an offence, and liable to the same penalties as those prescribed in the last preceding sub-section, unless he gives to the Magistrate before whom he is tried a satisfactory account of such possession.

Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance.

3 In line 7 of section 6 of the principal Ordinance, immediately after the words "deemed satisfactory," there shall be inserted the following words: "or there is reason to suspect that such pearl oysters were not lawfully obtained."

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

It is provided in the principal Ordinance that it is unlawful for any person within limits prescribed by the Governor in Executive Council to fish, dive for, or collect pearl oysters without having first obtained a license. Persons have been detected in illicit possession of pearl oysters within a proclaimed area, but they could not be prosecuted to conviction under the provisions of the principal Ordinance, because of the absence of direct evidence of their having fished, dived for, or collected the oysters, although they have been convicted of theft under the Penal Code.

2. The object of the amendment is to render persons who cannot give a satisfactory account of their possession—

- (a) Guilty of an offence; and also
- (b) Liable to be taken before a Police Magistrate by any Police or Peace Officer or Fishery Guard.
