Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—Caution—Position of a Derelict.

BENGAL.—No. 320.

Bay of Bengal—Malacca Strait—Singapore—The New Light at Port Canning.

The Master Attendant, Straits Settlements, has given notice that the New Light at Port Canning, Singapore will be lit on October 12, 1903.

Description of Light.

A dioptric occulting light of the first order. One occultation of three seconds duration at periods of twenty seconds (*i.e.*, seventeen seconds light and three seconds dark).

The apparatus illuminates $92\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ of sea surface, $67\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ of white light, a sector of 10° of red light covering the Johore shoal on one side and one of 15° covering the dangers near Peak island on the other side.

Visible from S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. through E. to E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. Distance 18 nautical miles. Elevation 202 ft. above H. W. A steel lighthouse painted white.
