India, West—Bombay Coast—Caution—Derelict reported off Vengurla Rocks.

The Bombay Government has given notice (No. 116 of 1903) that the Master of ss. Shirley reports having on November 11, 1903, at 9.45 A.M. in latitude $15^{\circ} 50' N.$, long. $73^{\circ} 22' E.$, passed a floating mast about 30 feet long, Vengurla rocks, bearing N. E. by E., distant 8 miles, at 10 A.M. from 200 to 300 cases of kerosine oil, and at 10.30 A.M. in lat. $15^{\circ} 56' N.$, long. $73^{\circ} 22' E.$, a derelict buggalow, awash, no spars standing, Vengurla rocks light-house bearing E. by S., distant 5 miles.

This derelict is dangerous to navigation.

China Sea—Rhio Strait—Little Karas Island Light—Character altered.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 215, dated June 15, 1903, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 905 of 1903) that the character of little Karas island light in Rhio strait has been altered from white fixed to a white flashing light every twenty seconds, thus : flash, five seconds ; eclipse fifteen seconds. The new light is of the fifth order, and its light power is 1,100 candles.
