SCHEDULE.

Rules for the Conduct of Voting by Ballot for or against the Existence of Arrack Taverns for the 1919-20 Rent Period.

1. In these rules-

- (i.) The expression "area" means an area defined by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent.
- (ii.) The expression "tax-paying inhabitants" means persons residing within an area who during the previous twelve months-
  - (a) Have paid road tax as residents within such area : or
  - (b) Have been certified to the local authority of such area as bona fide efficient soldiers of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910.
- (iii.) The expression "estate arrack tavern" means and includes an arrack tavern which. in the opinion of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, mainly serves a population of Indian coolies.

2. If it be shown to the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent and his Advisory Committee that 75 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants of an area served by one or more arrack taverns are opposed to the existence of an arrack tavern or taverns within such area, such arrack tavern or taverns shall be abolished for the 1919-20 rent period.

Voters shall have the power to vote only for or against total abolition of arrack taverns, whichever they so desire, but they shall not have the power to vote for a reduction in the number of arrack taverns in any area.

Provided that estate arrack taverns shall not come under the operation of these rules.

Information as regards the boundaries or definitions 3. of areas can be obtained from Kachcheries.

4. Objections to the existence of an arrack tavern or taverns in any particular area will be accepted by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent up to September 30, 1918, and not later, as for the 1919-20 rent period.

Provided that the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall not make any arrangements to record votes, unless it be shown to his satisfaction that the number of persons raising any such objection represents not less than 25 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants in that area.

Provided further, that such objection shall be made in writing, and that unless the person objecting to the existence of an arrack tavern or taverns adds against his name the number of his last road tax receipt (or, in the case of a person exempted for military service, his rank, regimental number, and the unit to which he belongs), he will not be counted towards the 25 per cent. necessary to secure the ballot.

5. Where a Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent is satisfied that objections have been received on or before September 30, 1918, from 25 per cent, of the taxpaying inhabitants of any area against the existence of arrack taverns within such area, the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall fix a date, time, and place at which votes will be recorded for the purpose of ascortaining whether 75 per cent. of such tax-paying inhabitants are opposed to the existence of such tavens, and shall give due notice thereof.
6. Such notice shall be given by publication in one or

more local newspapers, by fixing copies of the notice at the Kachcheri, the local Police Court, and the Village Tribunal within the jurisdiction of which the said area is situated, and at prominent places within the said area, and by beat

7. The recording officer in charge of the ballot shall be the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or some person deputed by him in writing, who shall preside at the ballot, and have power to decide all questions arising in connection with the ballot.

- 8. No person shall be entitled to vote unless he either-
- (a) Produces at the time of voting a receipt for road tax paid by him within the twelve months preceding the ballot as a resident within the area served by the tavern or taverns proposed to be abolished; or
- (b) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as a *bona fide* efficient soldier of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910.

9. The votes shall be counted as soon as possible after the close of the ballot, and the result declared immediately after it has been ascertained.

10. Only ballot papers in the form annexed hereto and issued by the recording officer shall be used in recording votes. Each ballot paper shall have a number printed on the back, and shall have a counterfoil with the same number printed on the face.

11. At the time of voting the ballot paper shall be marked on both sides with an official seal and delivered to the voter within the polling station, and a number corresponding to the number of the voter on the list of road tax payers shall be marked on the counterfoil. A mark shall be placed in the list of road tax payers against the number of the voter to denote that he has received a ballot paper, but so that it shall not indicate which particular ballot paper he received.

The voter shall record his vote by marking a cross  $\times$  on the right-hand side of the ballot paper opposite the words "Abolition of existing arrack taverns" or "Retention of existing arrack taverns," as he may decide, and in no other way. He shall then fold it so as to conceal his vote, and place it in a closed box in the presence of the presiding officer, after having shown him the official mark. The presiding officer, on the application of any voter who states that he is unable to read, shall cause the vote of such voter to be marked on a ballot paper in manner directed by such voter, but he shall take such steps as will secure that no one but himself and the voter knows how such ballot paper was marked.

Ballot papers which do not comply with this rule shall not be considered in recording the votes.

12. No votes shall be recorded by proxy. All votes shall be given by the voters personally.

13. The Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall make all necessary arrangements for the ballot.

WHEREAS is is expedient to amend the rules relating to the constitution, powers, and duties of Advisory Committees, it is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 31 (1) of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," has been pleased to cancel, with effect from October 1, 1918, the rules contained in Chapter IV. of Excise Notification No. 9 published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,562 of May 16, 1913, as amended by Excise Notification No. 47 published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,733 of August 13, 1915, and Excise Notification No. 64 published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,909 of November 16, 1917, and to substitute therefor the rules shown in the schedule annexed hereto, and to declare (a) that rules 1, 2, and 4 to 8 shall be in force from October 1, 1918, (b) that rule 3 shall be in force from the date hereof.

### Schedule referred to.-IV.-ADVISORY COMMITTEES.

1. There shall be appointed from such date or dates as the Governor may determine Advisory Committees, whose period of office shall ordinarily be three years. Vacancies occurring during this period shall be filled by comination or election, as the case may be, for the remainder of the period.

2. The Advisory Committees shall as from October 1, 1918, be constituted as follows :---

(a) For the Colombo Municipal area-

The Government Agent (Chairman).

The Chairman, Municipal Council.

The Superintendent of Police, Colombo.

One Unofficial Member of the Municipal Council nominated by the Council.

- One Member of the Chamber of Commerce nominated by that body.
- One Unofficial Justice of the Peace resident in Colombo nominated by the Governor.
- Two other Unofficials nominated by the Governor. One Unofficial Member elected by the road tax payers.
- (b) For the Kandy and Galle Municipal areas-
  - The Government Agent (Chairman). The Senior Police Officer of the station.
  - One Unofficial Member of the Municipal Council nominated by the Council.
  - Two Unofficials nominated by the Governor.

One Unofficial Member elected by the road tax payers.

(c) For Local Board areas-

The Chairman of the Local Board (Chairman).

One Official nominated by the Governor.

One Unofficial Member of the Local Board nominated by the Board.

Two Unofficials nominated by the Governor.

One Unofficial Member elected by the road tax payers.

- (d) For Board of Improvement areas-
  - The Chairman of the Board of Improvement (Chairman).
  - One Official nominated by the Governor.
  - One Unofficial Member of the Board of Improvement nominated by the Board.
  - Two Unofficials nominated by the Governor.

One Unofficial Member elected by the road tax payers.

(e) For each Revenue District outside Municipal, Local Board, and Board of Improvement areas-

(i.) For districts where there is at present at least one Planters' Association (consisting of not less than ten members) affiliated to the Ceylon Planters' Association, and where there are not less than ten members of the Low-country Products Association either owning estates or resident— The Government Agent (Chairman).

One Official nominated by the Governor.

One representative of the Planters' Association resident in the district nominated by the Ceylon Planters' Association.

One representative of the Low-country Products Association nominated by the Low-country Products Association.

- One Unofficial nominated by the Governor.
- One Unofficial Member elected by the road tax payers.
- (ii.) For districts where only one of the above Associations is represented as above described-

The Government Agent (Chairman).

- One Official nominated by the Governor.
- One representative of the Association so represented nominated as provided for in (i.).

Two Unofficials nominated by the Governor.

- One Unofficial Member elected by the road tax payers.
- (iii.) For districts where neither of the above Associations is represented as above described— The Government Agent (Chairman).
  - One Official nominated by the Governor.

Three Unofficials nominated by the Governor.

One Unofficial Member elected by the road tax payers.

Provided that if any of the bodies above mentioned vested with the power of nomination fails or neglects to exercise such power, the Committee shall be deemed to be properly constituted without such nominee.

Provided also that if a person nominated by the Chamber of Commerce or a Municipal Council or a Local Board or a Board of Improvement ceases to be a member of the body which nominated him, he shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member of the Advisory Committee.

Provided also that two members of a Committee shall form a quorum.

Provided also that not less than ten days' notice of any meeting shall be given to the members of each Committee.

Provided further, that for the purposes of this rule the Judicial Districts of Chilaw and Negombo shall be considered to be Revenue Districts.

3. The following rules shall be observed in connection with the election of Unofficial Members by road tax payers :--

(i.) A general election shall be held at the District Kachcheri in respect of each district or area for which an Advisory Committee is appointed once every three years in the month of August; and the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall in every case cause notices (in Form A hereto) to be published in the *Government Gazette* twenty days at least before the day of such election, fixing the time and place of such election, and every such election shall be held at the time and place so fixed by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent.

(ii.) No person shall be eligible for election as a member of the Advisory Committee unless he shall be an inhabitant of the district or area for which the said Committee is appointed, and shall be able to read and write the English language.

(iii.) Every person intending to offer himself as a candidate shall give at least fifteen days' notice in writing to the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent of such intention, and it shall be the duty of the said Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent to publish at the District Kachcheri in which the election shall be held the names of the candidates who have given due notice. Such names shall be published at least seven days before the date of the election in a notice in the Form B hereto.

(iv.) At every election the voting shall be by ballot.

(v.) The recording officer in charge of the ballot shall be the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, or some person deputed by him in writing, who shall preside at the ballot, and shall have power to decide finally all questions arising in connection with the ballot.

(vi.) At every such election it shall be lawful for every male inhabitant between the ages of 18 and 55 years residing within the district or area for which the Advisory Committee has been appointed, and liable to perform labour under the Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, to vote in favour of any one candidate who has offered himself for election in accordance with sub-rule (iii.) above as a member of the Advisory Committee for the said district or area.

(vii.) No votes shall be recorded by proxy. All votes shall be given by the voters personally.

(viii.) No person shall be entitled to vote unless he either-

- (a) Produces at the time of voting a receipt for road tax paid by him within the twelve months preceding the ballot as a resident within the district or area for which a member of the Advisory Committee is to be elected; or
- (b) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as a *bona fide* efficient soldier of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910, and resides within the said district or area.

(ix.) Only ballot papers in the form annexed hereto and issued by the recording officer shall be used in recording votes. Each ballot paper shall have a counterfoil with a number printed on the face.

(x.) At the time of voting the ballot paper shall be marked on both sides with an official seal and delivered to the voter within the polling station, and a number corresponding to the number of the voter on the list of road tax payers shall be marked on the counterfoil. A mark shall be placed in the list of road tax payers against the number of the voter to denote that he has received a ballot paper, but so that it shall not indicate which particular ballot paper he received.

The voter having secretly marked his vote on the paper by setting a cross  $\times$  opposite the name of the candidate for whom he desires to vote. and having folded it up so as to conceal his vote, shall place it in a closed box in the presence of the recording officer, after having shown to him the official mark at the back. The recording officer, on the application of any voter who states that he is unable to read, shall cause the vote of such voter to be marked on a ballot paper in manner directed by such voter, but he shall take such steps as will secure that no one but himself and the voter knows how such ballot paper was marked.

Ballot papers which do not comply with this rule shall not be considered in counting the votes.

(xi.) The recording officer shall as soon as possible after the close of the ballot ascertain the result of the poll by counting or causing to be counted the votes given to each candidate, and shall publicly declare the name of the candidate for whom the greatest number of votes shall have been recorded; and shall forthwith publish in the *Government Gazette* (in the Form C hereto) the name of such candidate, who shall thereupon be deemed to be duly elected.

Provided that (1) no person shall be deemed to be duly elected who shall have less than five votes in his favour; and (2) if the votes in favour of two or more candidates be equal, the recording officer shall at his discretion select any one of them and declare him to be, and he shall thereupon be, deemed to be the duly elected member.

(xii.) The Government Agent or Assistant Government Âgent shall make all necessary arrangements for the ballot.

(xiii.) If in any district or area for which an Advisory Committee is appointed the road tax payers vested with the power of election fail or neglect to elect a member to serve on the Advisory Committee, the Governor may nominate the member.

(xiv.) In the case of the death, incapacity, resignation, or departure from the Island of any member so elected (or nominated in accordance with sub-rule (xiii.) above), a member in his place for the unexpired term for which he was elected shall (subject to the provision in the said sub-rule) be elected at the earliest possible date, in accordance with the foregoing procedure.
4. It shall be the duty of the Committees to advise the Government Agent with regard to questions of

4. It shall be the duty of the Committees to advise the Government Agent with regard to questions of establishing new taverns, or closing existing taverns, or transferring an existing tavern from one locality or area to another locality or area, and fixing the opening and closing hours of taverns.

5. The following shall be the procedure when the question of the actual site of a tavern has to be determined by the Government Agent :---

When a site has to be selected for a new tavern, or for a tavern removed from one locality to another, or when the site of an existing tavern is to be changed after sale, notice of the proposed new site shall be given without delay in the following manner :—

- (a) A notice in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil shall be drawn up to the effect that it is proposed to open a tavern on the site described in the notice, and that the Government Agent will be prepared to receive any written representation up to a given date, not less than one month from the date of the notice, and that on that date, at a place stated in the notice, he will be prepared to receive any verbal representation that may be made to him regarding such site.
- (b) One copy of this notice shall be posted or affixed on the front of the premises proposed for the tavern site; one copy shall be displayed at the house of the headman of the village in which the tavern is situated; one copy shall be posted on the notice board of the District Kachcheri; and publication shall also be made by beat of tom-tom at the site, and in such other manner as the Government Agent may direct.

Provided that the Government Agent may, in case of necessity, issue a temporary license for a site pending the taking of the steps prescribed by this rule.

6. The following shall be the procedure when it is proposed by the Committee or by the Government Agent to open, close, or transfer a tavern :---

- (1) Whenever it is proposed to open a new tavern in any locality, or to close an existing tavern, or to remove a tavern from one locality to another, the Government Agent shall give notice of such proposal by advertisement in the *Government Gazette* and in one local English newspaper.
- (2) He shall also in such advertisement fix a date, not less than six weeks from the date of the Gazette publication, up to which he will be prepared to receive any written representation, and on which, at a place stated in the notice, he will be prepared to hear any verbal representation regarding the opening, closing, or removal of the tavern.
- . (3) One or more copies of the *Gazette* notice in English and the local vernacular shall be posted in a conspicuous place or places within the locality affected and on the notice boards of the Provincial and District Kachcheries, and publication shall also be made by beat of tom-tom in the locality, and in such other manner as the Government Agent may direct.
  - (4) A copy of the *Gazette* notice shall be sent to all recognized bodies, such as Municipal Councils, Local Boards, Planters' or other local Associations, having an interest in the locality in question.

7. The Government Agent shall place before the Committee the representations made to him, and any other material pertinent to the question. The Committee shall also hear any verbal representations that any person may intimate to them that he desires to make.

Decisions arrived at in all cases shall be by a majority of the body, but it shall be open to the Government Agent in his capacity as Government Agent, and not as merely representing a minority, to refer the decision to the Governor in Executive Council for revision, it he considers that there are good reasons why the decision should be so revised. In such cases the Government Agent shall inform the remaining members of the Board that he is taking such action, and the majority of the Board shall then be entitled to put the reasons for their decision in writing, and hand them to the Government Agent within one week of his communicating his intention to them, and the Government Agent shall forward the reasons of the majority to the Governor, together with his report.

The decision of the Governor in Executive Council on any such reference shall be final.

8. When all questions regarding the opening, closing, or transfer of taverns, and the fixing of the opening and closing hours of the same, have been decided by the Government Agent and his Advisory Committee, and as early as possible before the date from which licenses for the next lease period begin to run, the Government Agent shall publish in the *Government Gazette* the list of taverns sanctioned for that period, together with the hours fixed for opening and closing arrack and toddy taverns.



#### No. 1,571 of January 19, 1918.

Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Company, Limited. "Improved method for multiplying the frequency of electric currents."

Abstract .-- This invention relates to a method of multiplying the frequency of electric currents.

This invention is based on the following principle :- If one of the mains from a source of alternating current includes a coil upon an iron core in which are no air gaps or at most very small ones, and which has a second winding in circuit with a source of direct current, and a choking coil with an open core, the curves for the current and voltage in the mains will possess the peculiarity that the amplitude on one side is much larger than that on the other, while that portion of the period which corresponds to the larger amplitude is smaller than the portion corresponding to the smaller amplitude, the ratio of the one portion to the other being a function of the ampere turns of the two windings

Each p hase of a supply of n phases is therefore treated in this way, so arranging the ampere turns of the windings that the said ratio shall be equal to 1/n, and the n currents are combined, thus obtaining a current of a frequency n times that of the fundamental.

When n is large, in order to avoid the use of a multiphase generator of the ordinary type which might be inconvenient, a phase transformer may be used consisting of an iron core, in which a rotating field is created, and round which coils are spaced in such a way as to get the necessary phase difference, as described in Specification No. 1,524 dated December 12 1916, by the same patentees.

The claim is :

Changing the frequency of an alternating current by introducing into each phase of a multiphase source a coil wound on a closed (or nearly closed) iron core, which is saturated by means of a winding connected to a source of direct current, the number of phases and coils as well as the ratio of the direct current and alternating current ampere turns being so arranged as to enable the phases to be directly added and to give the desired multiple of the fundamental frequency, substantially as described.
