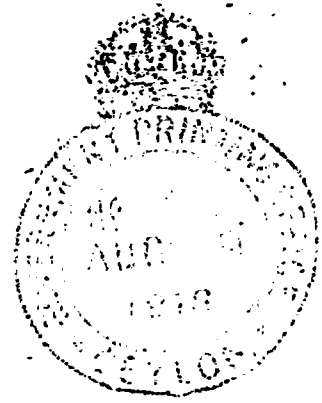

WHEREAS in pursuance of "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, 1914," by Our Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of August 3, 1917, We did prohibit the exportation from Ceylon of the articles to the extent therein specified:

And whereas by Our subsequent Proclamations similarly from time to time published We did amend the schedule to the aforesaid Proclamation:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in pursuance of the Ordinance aforesaid, do hereby further amend the schedule aforesaid in the manner set forth in the schedule to this Proclamation.

KNOW Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 22 of "The Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916," do hereby vary, by making the additions and amendments set forth in the schedule hereto, the special by-laws for regulating and controlling the use of mechanically propelled vehicles, and for protecting persons and property from danger or damage from the use of such vehicles, and generally for carrying out the purposes and objects of the said Ordinance, made and published by Proclamation dated December 14, 1916, as amended by Proclamation dated July 13, 1917, and November 16, 1917.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

By-law 9.—Amend to read as follows:—

"Change in description of car or postal address of owner to be reported.—If any circumstances other than a change of ownership dealt with in the preceding by-law occur in relation to any motor car or the postal address of the usual residence of the owner which affect the accuracy of any particulars entered as respects that motor car or the postal address of the owner in the register of motor cars, the owner of the motor car shall forthwith inform the Registrar, and on receipt of such information the Registrar shall forthwith cause the entries respecting that motor car or the postal address of the owner in the register of motor cars to be amended accordingly, and shall furnish the owner with a copy of the entries as so amended. No stamp duty shall be charged by the Registrar in respect of any amendment of entries or transmission of a copy of such entries under this by-law."

By-law 18.—Add the following clause:—

"(13) *Driver's seat in motor bus.*—In every motor car used as a motor omnibus for carrying passengers the driver's seat shall be divided off from that of a person sitting beside the driver by an arm or division."

Schedule I.—Amend columns (11) and (12) to read (12) and (13), and include as (11) "The car is ordinarily used or to be used in the (Province, District, or Town*) of ———."

* Strike out whatever is not applicable.

Schedule II.—Amend item (3) to read "The vehicle is ordinarily used or to be used in the (Province, District, or Town*) of ———."

Delete the words "or the Railway Department" in line 5 of the remarks at foot of the schedule relating to weight of motor cars.

Schedule VI., Form B.—Add the following "Note":—"The original license issued must be sent with this application for renewal."

A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom.
GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited :

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited, viz. :—

Cheese.

Fuses, fuse components and parts.

Motor spirit (including aviation spirit), kerosene (including white spirit), gas oil, fuel oil, and distillates from which any of the preceding can be produced.

Sugar cane.

Treadle lathes of 3-in. centres and over.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 25) Proclamation, 1918.

WHEREAS the District School Committee of Puttalam, in exercise of the powers vested in them by sections 19 and 20 of the Rural Schools Ordinance, No. 8 of 1907, made certain by-laws, which on being confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sub-section (2) of section 20 of the said Ordinance, were published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 6,323 of August 13, 1909, by Proclamation dated August 5, 1909 :

And whereas the said District School Committee has amended by-law No. 2 of the said by-laws in terms of section 20 (1) (b), as amended by Ordinance No. 34 of 1917, and also added a by-law to the said by-laws to be numbered 7 in terms of section 20 (1) (a), as amended by the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 20 (2) of the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby confirm the amendment of the said by-law No. 2 and the addition of a by-law to be numbered 7 as set forth in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

1. In line 1 of the by-law No. 2 for the word "twelve" there shall be substituted the word "fourteen."
2. The following proviso shall be added to by-law No. 2:—
"Provided that the Chairman shall be empowered to grant temporary exemption from attendance either during the cultivation season or for any other reasonable cause to boys over twelve years of age."
3. That the following clause be added after the words "Schedule B or C" in line 4 and 5 of by-law No. 2, viz.,
"or any school in another district, provided that the said school is less than three miles from the residence of the child."
4. That the following by-law be added and numbered 7:—
7. Any person who desires to open a school or give instruction in English or in any other language in any

schoolroom or in any building not previously used by him for the purpose to any class or classes attended by children of school-going age must report to the nearest Education Inspector or Sub-Inspector at least one month before commencing such school work or instruction, and thereafter to supply such information as may be required by the Director of Education with regard to his class or classes and the course of instruction he proposes to give therein.

The above amendments and additions were made by the Puttalam District School Committee at a meeting held on January 31, 1918.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 8, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 89 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 40 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 17 Moors, 8 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1918, viz., 276,665) was 16.8, as against 16.0 in the preceding week, 16.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 132 (10 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 23 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.9, as against 24.3 in the previous week, 19.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 132 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-two deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 6 in Kotahena, 4 in Wellawatta, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiya, being the same number as in the previous week, as against 13 the weekly average for last year. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

2. Eighteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 3 in St. Paul's, 3 in Kollupitiya, 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 9 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Kotahena, and 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered during the past four weeks. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered during the week. One death was registered in the previous week.

5. Nineteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 6 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 42 from *Other Causes*.

6. Four cases of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 7 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.5°, against 82.2° in the preceding week and 81.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.905 in., against 29.871 in. in the preceding week and 29.857 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.18 in., against 1.24 in. in the preceding week and 0.21 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

"Improvements in apparatus for measuring liquid."

Abstract :—According to this invention, liquid is delivered to a vessel having a number of parallel slots arranged at the same level ; the liquid from one of the slots is separated from that flowing through the rest of the slots and is diverted into a pivoted funnel which delivers it into one or other of two measuring tanks, each of which is provided with a float which turns the funnel on its pivot when a predetermined amount of liquid has been delivered to the tank. One or both of the floats actuates a counter.

Preferably each measuring tank has in it a vessel into which the funnel delivers. When the vessel is full the liquid overflows into the measuring tank, the float in which rises, and having reached a predetermined height opens a valve in the vessel, allowing the liquid in the vessel to run into the measuring tank and causing the float to rise further and to turn the funnel upon its pivot and deliver the liquid into the other measuring tank. The discharge of liquid from the vessel causes a siphon to discharge the liquid from the measuring tank.

In such an apparatus, assuming that there are twenty slots, the volume of liquid flowing through the slots will be twenty times the volume registered by the counter.

The claims are :—

1. Apparatus for measuring liquid, comprising a tank having a number of parallel slots arranged at the same level through which liquid flows, the liquid flowing from one of the slots being diverted into a pivoted funnel which delivers it into one or other of two measuring tanks, each of which is provided with a float which turns the funnel on its pivot, substantially as described.

2. In apparatus for measuring liquid as claimed in claim 1, providing each of the measuring tanks with a vessel having a valve actuated by the floats in the measuring tanks.

3. In apparatus for measuring liquid as claimed in claim 1, providing one of the measuring tanks with a float actuating a counter.

4. In apparatus for measuring liquid as claimed in claim 1, turning the funnel by a double bell crank lever, one of whose arms engages with a cam for locking the funnel in position.

5. Apparatus for measuring liquid, substantially as described and illustrated in the accompanying drawings.

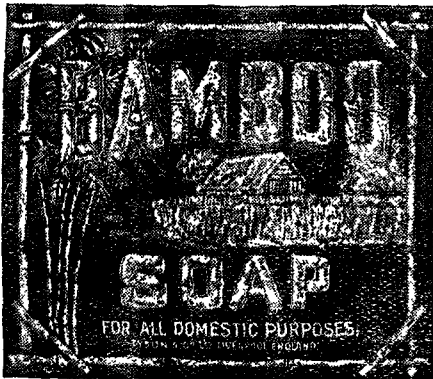

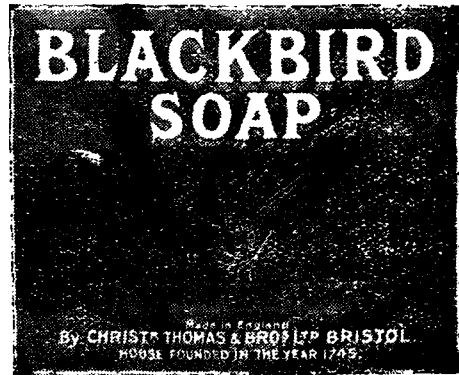

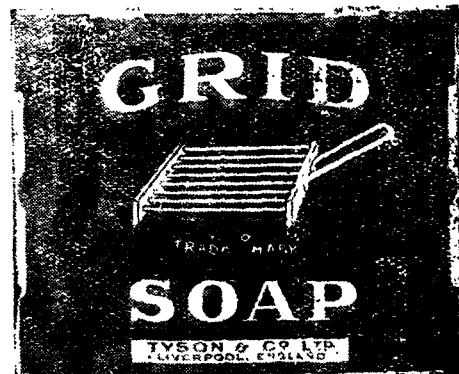

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, July 5, 1918.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 28, 1918.

Present :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Major A. W. de Wilton ; Mr. L. B. Fernando ; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. Arthur Alvis ; Mr. H. L. de Mel ; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene ; Dr. E. V. Ratnam ; Mr. T. L. Villiers ; Mr. F. R. Senanayake ; Major P. W. Mathew, R.A.M.C. ; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford ; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles ; Mr. M. Cassim Ismail ; Mr. W. Sutherland Ross ; and Mr. W. Philips.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 14, 1918, having been previously printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 14, 1918, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following :—(a) Since the last meeting five further cases of human plague and six cases of rat plague have been recorded up to date. This brings the total for the year up to 64 human and 48 rat cases, as against 176 human and 49 rat cases during the year 1917, while in the preceding year there were 115 human and 21 rat cases for the corresponding period. Of the 5 human cases, 4 were septicæmic and 1 bubonic in type. All proved fatal. These cases occurred in the areas of Sea street, Mutwal, 1st Division, Maradana, and Fort.

(b) The smallpox outbreak appears to be well in hand. There have only been a few sporadic cases of late. The total number of cases is 33, the chief centre being St. Joseph's street. There have been a number of concealed cases. In two of these convictions have already been obtained. The outbreak in St. Joseph's street was due to the concealment of the boy Mohamdu Ovis while suffering from the disease. From the history of this case and the history of the case of the carter W. Singho Fernando, it would appear that there was a prior concealment of a case in Galkapanawatta, which resulted in death. The cases have generally been of a modified type. Vaccination has been carried out in the infected areas. The last case discovered was a concealed case at Maligakanda lane. It is anticipated, provided, of course, there are no more undetected concealed cases, that the epidemic is practically over.

3. With the permission of the Council, Dr. E. V. Ratnam presented a petition from the traders of St. John's road, praying for permission to occupy a small space in the verandah in front of their boutiques on some recognizance, and moved that it be referred to the Markets and Sanitation and Finance Committees for consideration.—Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.

The Chairman stated that the question of these verandahs had formed the subject of litigation for many years, and it had been held both in the District Court and in the Supreme Court that these verandahs form part of the public street. Further, as a matter of law, the Council had no power to let a portion of a public street to a private individual. The Chairman suggested the inclusion of the Law Committee among the Committees to which the petition was to be referred for consideration.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam and Mr. E. G. Jayewardene having agreed to the suggestion, the Chairman put the motion to the meeting, and it was declared carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 4 to 9 (inclusive) on the Agenda. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

4-9. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing and the Special Committees, named, were then laid before the Council in Committee :—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of June 24, 1918.

(5) To consider an application from J. D. Lewis for the grant to him of the use of two vegetable stalls which are unoccupied in the Bambalapitiya market, one for beef offal and the other for mutton offal.—Recommended that two stalls in the Bambalapitiya market marked A and B in the sketch attached to the Financial Assistant's memorandum dated June 14, 1918, be let at Rs. 5 each per mensem, one as a beef offal stall, the other as a mutton offal stall.

(6) To approve of the site selected for the erection of a public latrine on the old toll bar site in Galle road, Wellawatta, as per plan No. 291, which accompanied the Acting City Sanitation Engineer's memorandum No. 120 of June 21, 1918, and to recommend an estimate of Rs. 4,741 for its construction.—Recommended.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(3) To consider the proceedings of the Court of Requests cases Nos. 62,578 and 62,579 re Mr. A. A. Sourjah, Prosecuting Inspector, Works Department, and his explanation.—The Committee is of opinion that he should be called upon to resign.

(4) To approve of the site selected for the erection of a public latrine on the old toll bar site in Galle road, Wellawatta, as per plan No. 291, which accompanied the Acting City Sanitation Engineer's memorandum No. 120 of June 21, 1918, and to recommend an estimate of Rs. 4,741 for its construction.—Site and estimate approved.

Resolutions.

With regard to the item No. 3 (corresponding to item No. 16 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 28, 1918), Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred and the papers be circulated, and that a return be called for of similar cases during the last five years in which a similar plea had been raised by the employés of the Council. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item be adopted.

(3) To consider the proposed amendment to by-laws Nos. 24 and 25 of Chapter VIII, of the by-laws re the collection of charges for the services of day or special coolies.—It is recommended that the by-law be altered as follows :—

(1) After the word " month " in the 5th and 7th lines on page 15, add the words " payment being made in advance, as provided below."

(2) In place of the paragraph " All sums payable . . . as hereinafter provided " (14th to 18th line on page 15) the following paragraphs should be inserted :—

(6) All sums payable under this by-law for a day cooly shall be paid in advance for a period of six months within twenty days from the day of commencement of such cooly's services or within twenty days from the last day of the period for which payment was previously made in advance, and if any person shall fail so to pay, the Chairman may proceed to recover the amount due by the process laid down in the succeeding by-law, and may also in his discretion stop the services of such cooly at twenty-four hours' notice.

- (7) All sums similarly payable for a special cooly shall be paid for every three months in advance within twenty days from the day of commencement of such cooly's services or within twenty days from the last day of the period for which payment was previously made in advance, and if any person shall fail so to pay, the Chairman may act as laid down in the paragraph immediately preceding in this by-law.

And that the paragraphs of by-law 24 be numbered as follows:—

- (1) "On the application of any person . . . will be given."
- (2) "The service of the day cooly . . . or compartments."
- (3) "The services of a special cooly . . . on such premises."
- (4) "The rates of payment . . . as follows:—
 - (a) "For a day cooly . . . a month, payment being made in advance.
 - (b) "For a special cooly . . . a month, payment being made in advance."
- (5) "All such payments . . . to be discontinued."
- (6) and (7). The above amended by-laws.

Also recommended that the rate of payment under 4 (b) be Rs. 17·50 per month in place of Rs. 15.

(4) To consider the draft agreement to be entered into between the Council on one part and Cassim Lebbe Marikar Abdul Majeed of Hulftsdorp, the proprietor, and Sana Sangaralingam Pillai, tenant, of premises Nos. 24/26, 2nd Division, Maradana, on the other part *re* demolition of alterations effected to these premises without the permission of the Chairman.—Recommended, with the omission of the words "within the next thirty years" on page 3, line 2, of the draft agreement.

Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 4 (corresponding to item No. 17 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 28, 1918), it was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance be adopted. Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item be adopted.

Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 7, 1918.

(18) To consider a petition from Mr. L. B. Perera, Municipal Contractor, praying that the increased rate of Rs. 2 per cart load of coir, granted to him by Council on December 7, 1917, for the first three months of 1918, as against the contract rate of Re. 1·58 per cart load, be continued from April 1, 1918, until conditions improve.—Recommended that the rate be raised to Rs. 2 per cart load till the end of the year.

Resolution of Council of June 14, 1918.

With regard to item No. 18, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred, and that the papers be circulated. The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

Resolution.

With regard to the above item, the Chairman read the petition from Mr. L. B. Perera and detailed the history of the contract, and stated that the point to be decided was whether the contract rate should be increased to Rs. 2 per cart load or whether the contract be cancelled and fresh tenders called for.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.

Mr. F. R. Senanayake opposed the motion.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred back to the Standing Committee on Finance for re-consideration in view of the alleged more favourable position at present of the fibre manufacturing trade.

Mr. C. P. Dias, with the permission of the Council, withdrew his motion and seconded the Chairman's amendment, which was declared carried.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 28, 1918.

(7) To recommend the re-transfer of premises No. 98, Fourth Cross street, Pettah, vested in the Council, to the trustees of the Dawoodi Borah Trust of Colombo, on payment of all taxes and costs which would have been due up to date of re-conveyance had the property not been vested in the Council. (A sum of Rs. 536·33 has been already paid on account of taxes and costs up to and including the fourth quarter of 1917.)—Recommended on payment in full of all dues up to date of transfer.

(2) In place of the paragraph "All sums payable . . . as hereinafter provided" (14th to 18th line on page 15) the following paragraphs should be inserted:—

- (3) "The services of a special cooly . . . on such premises."
- (4) "The rates of payment . . . as follows:—

 - (b) "For a special cooly . . . a month, payment being made in advance."
- (5) "All such payments . . . to be discontinued."

6 and 7. The above amended by-laws.

Also recommended that the rate of payment under 4 (b) be Rs. 17·50 per month in place of Rs. 15.

(10) To recommend the sanction of Council for the purchase of 250 gallons of boiled oil at Rs. 6 per gallon from Messrs. W. Pedris & Co., Pettah, Colombo.—Recommended.

(11) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 25·50 under vote F 3. Uniforms (Municipal Court), as the vote has been exceeded owing to the unexpected increase in price of uniform coats.—Recommended.

(12) To recommend the sanction of Council for the purchase of 4 tons of sulphur at Rs. 390 per ton from Mr. B. M. Marcelline of Pettah, Colombo.—Recommended.

(13) To recommend the purchase through Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., Ltd., Colombo, of 20,000 gallons Tarco for the Works Department.—Recommended.

(14) To recommend the sanction of Council for the purchase for the refuse destructor of 5,000 fire bricks 9 in. by 4½ in. by 3 in. and 12 fire bricks 34 in. by 15 in. by 4 in. from Messrs. Burn & Co., Ltd., Bombay.—Recommended.

(15) To recommend, under section 21 of the Municipal Pension Minute, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 390 to Jewath Hamy, blacksmith, Works Department.—Recommended.

(16) To consider the proceedings of Court of Requests cases Nos. 62,578 and 62,579 *re* Mr. A. A. Sourjah, Prosecuting Inspector, Works Department, and his explanation.—Recommended that Mr. A. A. Sourjah should be relieved of his duties as Prosecuting Inspector and as Surveyor under the Council.

(17) To consider the draft agreement to be entered into between the Council on the one part and Cassim Lebbe Marikar Abdul Majeed of Hulftsdorp, the proprietor, and Sana Sangaralingam Pillai, tenant of premises Nos. 24/26, 2nd Division, Maradana, on the other part *re* demolition of alterations effected to these premises without the permission of the Chairman.—Recommended, provided that the Council's costs are reimbursed, and that the words "within the next thirty years" omitted in page 3, line 2, of the draft agreement.

(18) To consider the ruling of the Hon. the Treasurer that Mr. F. Ginger should not be paid any climatic bonus by the Council under section 2 of the Municipal Pension Minute, and to recommend to Council that Mr. Ginger be given a pension of Rs. 791 66 per annum as calculated by the Hon. the Treasurer.—Recommended.

(19) To recommend the sanction of Council for the purchase, for the Works Department, of 50 galvanized iron sheets 6 ft. by 3 ft. by ½ in. at Rs. 75 per cwt. from Messrs. Turner Hoare & Co., Bombay, at an estimated cost of about Rs. 2,300.—Recommended.

With regard to item No. 16 (corresponding to item No. 3 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of June 28, 1918), it was resolved that the consideration of the matter be deferred and the papers be circulated, and that a return be called for of similar cases during the last five years in which a similar plea had been raised by the employés of the Council.

Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee *re* Establishment of June 27, 1918.

(3) To consider the comments and observations of the Colonial Auditor regarding the detailed statement of the Municipal staff, their salaries, increments, and allowances.

In order to definitely fix the date of the coming in of the scheme and to lay down a general rule for its application, the Committee, on the motion of the Chairman, passed the following resolution :—

(a) That the scheme shall be deemed to have come into effect as from January 1, 1918, and that the pay of each officer be raised to the initial salary of the class in which he is placed or to the incremental step immediately above that of the salary which he was drawing on December 31, 1917, and that he start drawing an increment on January 1, 1918.

(b) That in future all increments shall be granted on January 1 of each year.

(c) That any officer newly appointed during the first six months of the year shall commence to draw an increment on January 1 of the year next after the year in which he was appointed.

(d) That any officer newly appointed during the last six months of a year shall not draw an increment until January 1 of the year following the year next after the year in which he was appointed.

(e) That any officer promoted shall receive the salary of the step in the incremental scale which is on the same level or immediately above the salary of the post occupied by him prior to his promotion and shall on January 1 next, after his promotion, receive an increment in the class or grade to which he has been promoted.

Resolution.

The Chairman moved that the recommendation be adopted, as a general working rule, subject to any particular recommendation by the Special Committee with regard to any individual cases. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

Report of the Special Committee *re* Feeding of Poor School Children.

(9) To consider the report of the Special Committee *re* Feeding of Poor School Children.

The report having been previously printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, was laid before the Council in Committee, the papers having been previously circulated in compliance with the resolution of Council of June 14, 1918.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the report be adopted.

Mr. F. R. Senanayake seconded, and later spoke at length in support of the motion.

Mr. C. P. Dias opposed the motion and moved as an amendment :—(1) That the sum of Rs. 10,000 already voted by the Council be distributed among the managers of the schools for poor children for the purpose of feeding them ; (2) that provision be made in the next Supplementary Budget for the feeding of the children in the three schools to be established by Government when they are in working order ; (3) that the details of the distribution in the case of the existing schools be left in the hands of the same Committee. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

Mr. T. L. Villiers spoke in favour of the motion.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene spoke against the motion and in support of the amendment.

The Chairman, in explanation of the recommendation of the Special Committee, pointed out that the Government vernacular schools had been selected not owing to the fact that they were Government schools, but because these schools had the requisite machinery for the initiation of the scheme.

Mr. C. P. Dias, with the permission of Council and consent of the seconder, withdrew the amendment.

Mr. T. L. Villiers moved, as an amendment, that, as a preliminary step, the scheme should be confined to one of the vernacular schools erected by the Government on the site provided by the Council, the selection of the school to be left to the Special Committee. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Mr. Arthur Alvis accepted the amendment, which was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume, and that the resolutions of the Council in Committee, as amended, be adopted. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved, in Council, that the resolutions of Council in Committee, as amended, be adopted.

Mr. O. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

The capital of the Company is One million five hundred thousand Rupees (Rs. 1,500,000), divided into 15,000 shares of Rs. 100 each, such shares being numbered 1 to 15,000, with power to divide the shares in the capital for the time being (whether original, increased, or reduced) into several classes, and to attach thereto respectively any preferential, deferred, qualified, or special rights, privileges, or conditions. The Company may also increase its capital and may issue any shares in the new capital with or subject to any special rights, preferences, conditions, and qualifications as regards dividend, capital, voting, or otherwise over or as compared with any other shares of whatsoever description, and whether issued or not, and may vary the regulations of the Company so far as may be necessary to give effect to any such special rights, preferences, conditions, or qualifications, and on the subdivision of any share the right to participate in any profits or capital may be apportioned in any manner resulting from such subdivision.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF DELMEGE, FORSYTH AND COMPANY, LIMITED.

It is agreed as follows:—

PRELIMINARY.

1. The regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, but the following shall be the regulations of the Company.

2. In the construction of these Articles the following words shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, unless there be something in the context inconsistent therewith:—

The word "Company" means Delmege, Forsyth and Company, Limited, incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The word "Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinances, 1861 to 1909," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

"An extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by a majority of not less than three-fourths of such members entitled to vote as are present in person or by proxy (where proxies are allowed) at a General Meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as an extraordinary resolution has been duly given.

"Special resolution" has the meaning attached thereto by the Ordinance.

"The Board" or "The Directors" means the Directors of the Company for the time being.

"The Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

With regard to a Shareholder "presence or present" at a meeting includes presence or present personally or by proxy (where proxies are allowed) or by attorney duly authorized.

"The Register" means any register of members to be kept pursuant to the Ordinance.

"Dividend" includes bonus.

"Month" means calendar month.

"In writing" means written or printed or partly written or partly printed.

Words denoting the singular number only shall include the plural number also and *vice versa*.

Words denoting the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender also.

Words denoting persons only shall include corporations.

3. The Company may by special resolution alter and make provisions instead of or in addition to any of the regulations of the Company whether contained or comprised in these Articles or not.

4. The business of the Company may subject to the provisions of the Ordinance be commenced as soon as the Board thinks fit. Subject as aforesaid any branch or kind of business which by the Memorandum of Association of the Company or by these presents is either expressly or by implication authorized to be undertaken by the Company may be undertaken by the Board at such time or times as the Board shall think fit or suffered by the Board to be in abeyance whether such branch or kind of business shall have been actually commenced or not so long as the Board may deem it expedient not to commence or proceed with such branch or kind of business.

5. The shares in the Capital of the Company shall be under the control of the Board, who may allot or dispose of the same to such persons, on such terms and conditions and at such times as the Board shall think fit.

6. If several persons are registered as joint holders of any share their liability in respect thereof shall be several as well as joint.

7. The executors or administrators of a deceased member not being a joint holder, and in the case of the death of a joint holder the survivor or survivors shall alone be recognized by the Company as having any title to the shares registered in the name of the deceased member; but nothing herein contained shall be taken to release the estate of a deceased joint holder from any liability on shares held by him jointly with any other person.

8. The Company shall not be bound by or be compelled in any way to recognize even when having notice thereof any other right in respect of a share than an absolute right thereto in the registered holder thereof for the time being or such other rights in case of transmission thereof as are hereinafter mentioned.

9. The funds of the Company shall not be expended in the purchase of or lent upon the security of its own shares.

CERTIFICATES OF SHARES.

10. Every member shall be entitled without payment to one certificate under the common seal of the Company specifying the shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon.

11. The certificate of shares registered in the names of joint holders shall be delivered to the holder whose name stands first on the register of members.

12. If a certificate be worn out, destroyed, or lost, it may be renewed upon payment of One Rupee (or such less sum as the Board may from time to time prescribe) upon the production of such evidence of its having been worn out, destroyed, or lost as the Board may consider satisfactory, and upon such indemnity with or without security as the Board may require.

CALLS ON SHARES.

13. The Board may from time to time (subject to any terms upon which any shares may have been issued) make such calls as they think fit upon the members in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares. Each member shall pay the calls so made and any money payable on any share under the terms of allotment thereof to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Board.

14. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Board authorizing such call was made.

15. If any call payable in respect of any share or any money payable on any share under the terms of allotment thereof be not paid on or before the day appointed for payment, the holder or allottee of such share shall be liable to pay interest upon such call or money from such day until it is actually paid at any rate fixed by the Board not exceeding 10 per cent. per annum.

16. The Board may if they think fit receive from any member willing to advance the same all or any part of the moneys unpaid upon any of the shares held by him beyond the sums actually called for, either as a loan repayable or as a payment in advance of calls, but such advance whether repayable or not shall until actually repaid extinguish so far as it shall extend the liability existing upon the shares in respect of which it is received. Upon the money so received, or upon so much thereof as from time to time exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon the shares in respect of which such advance has been made, the Company shall pay interest at such rate as the member advancing the same and the Board agree upon.

TRANSFER AND TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

17. Except with the previous consent of the Board no share shall be transferred by any member to any person not already a member so long as any person selected by the Board as a desirable transferee of the share (whether already a member or not) is willing to purchase the same at a fair value.

18. In order to ascertain whether any person selected as aforesaid is willing to purchase the share the proposing transferor shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called the "Transfer Notice") to the Company that he desires to transfer the same. Such transfer notice shall specify the sum he fixes as the fair value and shall constitute an offer by the proposing transferor to sell the share to any person selected as aforesaid (hereinafter called "the Purchaser") at the price so fixed or at the option of the purchaser at the fair value to be fixed by arbitration as provided by Article 20. The transfer notice may include several shares, and in such case shall operate as if it were a separate transfer notice in respect of each share. A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the consent of the Board.

19. If the Board shall within 60 days after the Company shall have been served with such transfer notice find a person selected as aforesaid willing to purchase the share, the Board shall give notice thereof to the proposing transferor, and in the event of such notice being given the proposing transferor shall be bound upon the payment of the fair value to transfer the share to the purchaser.

20. If any difference arises between the proposing transferor and the purchaser as to the fair value of a share the same shall be referred to the arbitration of a sole arbitrator to be mutually agreed upon by the parties in difference or failing such agreement by two arbitrators one to be appointed by each party with power for such arbitrators to appoint an umpire to decide the matter in dispute in case of a difference between the said arbitrators. And the provisions of the Ceylon Ordinances or other statutory provisions for the time being in force in Ceylon relating to arbitration shall apply to such arbitration, and the decision of such arbitrator, arbitrators, or umpire, as the case may be, shall be absolutely final.

21. In case the proposing transferor after having become bound as aforesaid makes default in transferring the share, the Company may receive the purchase money, and the Board shall thereupon nominate some person to execute any necessary transfer, and on the execution of any such transfer the Board shall cause the name of the purchaser to be entered on the register as the holder of the share, and the Company shall hold the purchase money on trust for the proposing transferor. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchaser, and after the name of the purchaser has been entered on the register in purported exercise of the said power the validity of the proceedings shall not be questioned by any person.

22. In case the Board shall not within 60 days after the Company shall have been served with the transfer notice find a person willing to purchase the share or shares and the Board give notice thereof as aforesaid, the proposing transferor shall at any time within 3 months from the expiry of the said 60 days be at liberty, subject to Articles 23 and 25 hereof to transfer the share or shares or any share not placed to any person and at any price.

23. The Board without assigning any reason therefor may refuse to register any transfer of a share.

24. Subject to these articles any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of any member upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this article, or of his title, as the Board thinks sufficient, may with the consent of the Board (which consent the Board shall be under no obligation to give) be registered as a member in respect of such shares, or may subject to the regulations as to transfer herein contained transfer such shares.

25. The transfer of any share in the Company shall be in writing in the usual common form, and (except where the Board has power under these articles to dispense with the signature of the transferor or transferee or either of them) shall be signed by the transferor and transferee. There shall be paid to the Company in respect of the registration of any transfer such fee not exceeding One Rupee as the Board deem fit.

26. The instrument of transfer shall be lodged with the Company accompanied by the certificate of the share or shares comprised therein and such evidence as the Board may require to prove the title of the transferor, and thereupon and upon payment of the proper fee the transferee shall (subject to the Board's right to decline to register hereinbefore mentioned) be registered as a member in respect of such share, and the instrument of transfer shall be retained by the Company. The Board may waive the production of any certificate upon evidence satisfactory to them of its loss or destruction or in any case in which under the power herein contained they may have power to transfer a share themselves after the holder thereof has failed to transfer when called upon to do so pursuant to these articles.

LIEN ON SHARES.

27. The Company shall have a first and paramount lien on all shares and on the interest and dividends declared payable in respect thereof for all moneys due to (including calls made even though the time appointed for their payment may not have arrived) and liabilities subsisting with the Company from or on the part of the registered holder or any of the registered holders thereof either alone or jointly with any other person and may enforce such lien by sale of all or any of the shares on which the same may attach. Provided that such sale shall not be made except in the case of a debt or liability, the time for the payment, fulfilment, or discharge of which shall have actually arrived, and until notice in writing of the intention to sell shall have been served on the holder or holders of such shares and default shall have been made by him or them in the payment, fulfilment, or discharge of such debt or liability for seven days after such notice.

FORFEITURE AND SURRENDER OF SHARES.

28. If any member fail to pay any call or money payable under the terms of allotment of a share on the day appointed for payment thereof, the Board may at any time while the same remains unpaid, serve a notice on him requiring him to pay the same together with any interest that may have accrued thereon, and any expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

29. The notice shall name a further day not being less than seven days from the service of the notice on or before which such call or other money and all interest and expenses that have accrued by reason of such non-payment are to be paid and the place where payment is to be made (the place so named being either the registered office of the Company or some other place at which calls of the Company are usually made payable) and shall state that in the event of non-payment on or before the day and at the place appointed the share in respect of which such payment is due will be liable to be forfeited.

30. If the requisitions of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, the share in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter before payment of all money due thereon with interest and expenses shall have been made be forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

31. Any share forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company and may be held, re-allotted, sold, or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Board think fit, and in case of re-allotment with or without any money paid thereon by the former holder being credited as paid up, but the Board may at any time before any share so forfeited shall have been re-allotted, sold, or otherwise disposed of, annul the forfeiture thereof upon such conditions as they may think fit.

32. Any member whose shares have been forfeited shall notwithstanding such forfeiture be liable to pay to the Company all calls or other money, interest, and expenses owing in respect of such shares at the time of forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment, at such rate not exceeding 10 per cent. per annum as the Board shall determine.

33. The Board may accept the surrender of any share by way of compromise of any question as to the holder being properly registered in respect thereof. Any share so surrendered may be disposed of in the same manner as a forfeited share.

34. In the event of the re-allotment or sale of a forfeited or surrendered share to enforce a lien of the Company, a certificate in writing under the common seal of the Company that the share has been duly forfeited, surrendered, or sold in accordance with the regulations of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming the share. A certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to the purchaser or allottee, and he shall be registered in respect thereof, and thereupon he shall be deemed the holder of the share discharged from all calls or other money, interest, and expenses due prior to such purchase or allotment, and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money or consideration, nor shall his title to the share be affected by any irregularity in the forfeiture, surrender, or sale.

ALTERATION OF CAPITAL.

35. The Company may in General Meeting from time to time increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares.

36. Such new shares shall be of such amount and shall be issued for such consideration on such terms and conditions and with such preference or priority as regards dividends or in the distribution of assets or as to voting or otherwise over other shares of any class, whether then already issued or not, or as shares to be deferred to any other shares with regard to dividends or in the distribution of assets as the Company in General Meeting may direct, and subject to or in default of any such direction the provisions of these articles shall apply to the new capital in the same manner in all respects as to the original capital of the Company.

37. The Company may by special resolution reduce its capital by paying off capital, cancelling capital which has been lost or is unrepresented by available assets, reducing the liability on the shares, cancelling shares not taken or agreed to be taken by any person or otherwise as may seem expedient, and capital may be paid off upon the footing that it may be called up again or otherwise.

38. The Company may in General Meeting by special resolution subdivide or by ordinary resolution ~~consolidate~~ its shares or any of them.

CONVENING OF GENERAL MEETINGS.

39. The first General Meeting shall be held at such time (not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company) and at such place as the Board may determine.

40. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Board. A General Meeting shall be held once in every year after the year in which the Company is incorporated on such day and at such place as may be determined upon by the Board.

41. The above-mentioned General Meetings shall be called "Ordinary General Meetings"; all others shall be called "Extraordinary General Meetings."

42. The Board may whenever they think fit and they shall on the requisition of the holders of not less than one-tenth of the issued capital of the Company upon which all calls and other sums then due have been paid forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company.

43. Not less than twenty-eight days' notice of any General Meeting (exclusive both of the day on which the notice is served or deemed to be served and of the day of the meeting) specifying the day, hour, and place of the meeting shall be given to the members in manner hereinafter mentioned or in such other manner as may from time to time be prescribed by the Board, but the non-receipt of such notice by any member shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting. With the consent in writing of all the members a General Meeting may be convened by a shorter notice and in any manner they think fit.

44. The notice convening an Ordinary General Meeting shall state the general nature of any business intended to be transacted thereat, other than declaring dividends, electing Directors and Auditors and voting their remuneration, and considering the accounts presented by the Board, the reports of the Board and the Auditors. The notice convening an Extraordinary General Meeting shall state the general nature of the business intended to be transacted thereat.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS.

45. Two members present personally, or by attorney, or by proxy shall be a quorum at a General Meeting. In addition to any power of appointing a proxy or proxies which is conferred by these presents any member shall be entitled to be present and vote at and take part in meetings of the Company by an attorney duly authorized by him in that behalf, provided that notice of the appointment of such attorney shall have been given to the Company or the Company shall otherwise have notice of such appointment.

46. If within half-an-hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum be not present, the meeting if convened upon the requisition of members, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to such day in the next week and to such place as may be appointed by the Chairman.

47. At any such adjourned meeting the members present and entitled to vote, whatever the number or the amount of shares held by them, shall have power to decide upon all matters which could properly have been disposed of at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

48. The members present at any General Meeting shall choose one of their number to act as Chairman of such meeting.

49. The Chairman may with the consent of the meeting adjourn any General Meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

50. Every question submitted to a General Meeting shall be decided in the first instance by a show of hands. In case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to the vote or votes to which he may be entitled as a member either on a show of hands or at a poll.

51. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is demanded, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been passed or lost, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be conclusive evidence of the fact, and in the case of a resolution requiring any particular majority that it was passed by the majority required or was not passed by that majority without the proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

52. A poll may be demanded in writing upon any question (other than the election of a Chairman of a meeting) by any two members present personally or by attorney or by proxy, or by any member or members present personally or by attorney or by proxy holding or representing by proxy or entitled to vote in respect of not less than one-tenth of the capital represented at the meeting.

53. If a poll is demanded on a question of adjourning the meeting it shall be taken forthwith. In any other case if a poll is demanded it shall be taken in such manner and at such place and either immediately or at such other time within 14 days thereafter as the Chairman shall before the conclusion of the meeting direct, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in General Meeting as at the date of taking the poll.

54. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

VOTES AT GENERAL MEETINGS.

55. Subject to any special terms as to voting upon which new capital may be issued, every member shall have one vote in respect of each share held by him.

56. Votes may be given either personally or by attorney or by proxy, both on a show of hands or on a poll.

57. If any member be of unsound mind he may vote by his committee *curator bonis* or other legal curator.

58. If two or more persons be jointly entitled to a share or if any share shall be registered in the name of a firm, any one of such persons or any partner in such firm, as the case may be, may vote at any meeting either personally or by attorney or by proxy in respect thereof, as if he were solely entitled thereto, and if more than one of such joint holders or partners be present at any meeting either personally or by attorney or by proxy, that one of such persons so present whose name stands first in the register of members in respect of such share or such one of the partners as shall have been appointed in writing by a majority of the partners to represent such firm at such meeting, as the case may be, shall alone be entitled to vote as aforesaid in respect thereof.

59. No member shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by attorney or by proxy at any General Meeting or upon any poll or to exercise any privilege as a member unless all calls or other money due and payable in respect of any share of which he is the holder have been paid.

60. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or his attorney, or if such appointor be a corporation under their common seal in such form as the Board may from time to time approve.

61. Any person may be appointed a proxy whether or not he is a member of the Company.

62. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than two clear days before the day for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

63. Where a member appoints an attorney who is authorized to be present or attend or vote at or take part in meetings on his behalf, the Board may if they so think fit require evidence of such appointment to be furnished, and any attorney so appointed shall be deemed to be authorized to act on behalf of the member so appointing him unless and until the Company has received express notice that the authority of such attorney has been withdrawn or has otherwise ceased.

64. Any resolution signed by all the members for the time being of the Company or their attorneys shall be as valid and effectual as a resolution at a General Meeting; but this article shall not apply to a resolution for winding-up the Company or to a resolution passed in respect of any matter which by the Ordinances of Ceylon or any other statutory provisions or by these presents ought to be dealt with by special or extraordinary resolution.

NUMBER AND APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS.

65. The first Directors shall be Algernon Shairp, Edward Henry Vidal, Robert Spencer Philpott, and Territt Hugh Tatham. Subject as aforesaid Directors shall be appointed by the Company in General Meeting.

66. The number of Directors shall not be less than two nor more than seven. The continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their body, provided their number is not reduced below two.

67. The Company in General Meeting may at any time by ordinary resolution remove any Director from office, and may also at any time by the like resolution appoint any person to be a Director.

QUALIFICATION AND REMUNERATION OF DIRECTORS.

68. It shall not be necessary for a Director to hold any share qualification.

69. The remuneration of a Director shall be such (if any) as the Company may in General Meeting from time to time vote.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

70. Subject to the provisions of these articles the business of the Company shall be managed by the Board who in addition to all powers and authorities by these presents expressly conferred on them may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Company, and are not hereby or by Ordinance expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, but subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Companies Acts and of these presents and to any regulations from time to time made by the Company in General Meeting, but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulations had not been made.

71. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing powers or any other powers conferred by these presents the Board may do the following things:—

- (a) Pay the costs, charges, and expenses preliminary and incidental to the formation, establishment, and registration of the Company.
- (b) Establish local boards, local managing committees, or local agencies in the United Kingdom or elsewhere, and appoint any persons to be members thereof with such powers and authorities, under such regulations for such period and at such remuneration as they may think fit, and may from time to time revoke any such appointment.
- (c) Appoint from time to time any one or more of their number to be manager or managers on such terms as to remuneration, and with such powers and authorities and for such period as they may think fit, and from time to time revoke any such appointment.
- (d) Appoint and at their discretion remove or suspend such managers, managing agents, secretaries, officers, clerks, agents, and servants for permanent, temporary, or special services as they may from time to time think fit, and determine their duties and fix their salaries and emoluments and require security in such instances and to such amount as they may think fit.
- (e) Purchase or otherwise acquire for the Company any property, rights, or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire, at such price and generally on such terms and conditions as they may think fit.
- (f) Appoint any person or persons, whether Directors or not, to hold in trust for the Company any property belonging to the Company or in which it is interested or for any other purpose, and to execute and do all such deeds and things as may be requisite in relation to any such trust.
- (g) Appoint for any purpose in connection with the Company's business any person or persons to be the attorney or attorneys of the Company or of the Board either in the Island of Ceylon or elsewhere with all such powers as they may think fit, including power to appear before all or any tribunals or authorities and to make all necessary declarations so as to enable the Company's operations to be validly carried on abroad and (if thought fit) power to sub-delegate.
- (h) Borrow or raise any sum or sums of money by the sale or negotiation of bills of exchange or promissory notes and obtain advances from bankers, brokers, or others for the temporary purposes of the Company by way of overdraft or by way of mortgage or hypothecation of any stocks, goods, or merchandise, or against warrants, bills of lading, or other documents of title to goods, or by any other usual means of obtaining trading accommodation, and also borrow or raise sums not exceeding £15,000 or Rupees 225,000 in all from any person or persons who may from time to time be appointed Manager or Managers, Managing Director or Managing Directors of the Company on such terms as the Board may think fit, but save as aforesaid shall not, without the sanction of the Company in General Meeting exercise any of the borrowing powers authorized by the memorandum of Association.
- (i) Make, draw, accept, endorse, and negotiate respectively promissory notes, bills, cheques, or other negotiable instruments, provided that every promissory note, bill, cheque, or other negotiable instrument drawn, made, or accepted, shall be signed by such person or persons as the Board may appoint for the purpose.
- (j) Invest or lend any funds of the Company in or upon such securities as they may think fit (other than shares of the Company) and from time to time vary any investment.
- (k) Give credit to and deal upon credit with any person with whom the Company may have business.
- (l) Grant to any Director required to go abroad or render any other extraordinary service, such special remuneration for the services rendered as they think proper.
- (m) Pay to any Director his travelling expenses of attending and returning from Board Meetings.
- (n) Execute in favour of any Director or other person who may incur or be about to incur any personal liability on behalf or for the benefit of the Company, such mortgages or charges on the undertaking, or on the whole or any part of the property present or future, or on the uncalled capital of the Company, as they may think fit, and any such mortgage or charge may contain a power of sale, and such other powers, covenants, and provisions as shall be agreed on.
- (o) Sell, let, exchange or otherwise dispose of, absolutely or conditionally, all or any part of the property, privileges, and undertaking of the Company upon such terms and conditions, and for such consideration as they may think fit.
- (p) Cause the common seal to be affixed to any documents, provided that such documents be also signed by at least two Directors or by one Director and the Secretary or other officer appointed for that purpose by the Board. It shall not, however, be necessary to hold any meeting of the Board for the purpose of affixing such seal.

72. Any Director who is, or who anticipates that he will be unable for any reason to attend the meetings of the Board, may appoint any person as a substitute to act in his place during such absence or inability as aforesaid, and such appointment shall have effect and such appointee shall, while he holds office as an alternate Director, be entitled to

of Meetings of the Directors and to attend or vote thereat accordingly, but his powers are to cease if and when the appointor becomes able to resume attendance or ceases to be a Director or removes the appointee from office, and any appointment and removal under this clause shall be effected by notice in writing given to the Secretary of the Company under the hand of the Director making the same. The same person may act as substitute for more than one Director, and shall have a vote in respect of each Director whom he represents, in addition to any vote he may possess in his own right.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

73. The Board may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit, and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise fixed two Directors shall form a quorum.

74. Any Director may at any time summon a Meeting of the Board. Subject to the provisions of Article 72 it shall not be necessary to give notice of any meeting of the Board to a Director who is out of the Island of Ceylon.

75. On every question arising at any Meeting of the Board each Director shall have one vote. The Chairman of such meeting shall not have a casting vote.

76. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In the event of the votes of the Directors on any question being equal the question on which such equality of votes arises shall be forthwith submitted to a General Meeting of the Company, and any decision on such question that may be come to by the Company in General Meeting shall be carried into effect and acted upon, and in the meantime until the question has been so submitted to a General Meeting of the Company the Board shall not take any steps in relation to such question unless at a subsequent Meeting of the Board a resolution to take such steps has been passed by the votes of a majority of the Directors for the time being.

77. The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, but if no such Chairman be elected or if at any Meeting the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the Directors present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

78. The Board may delegate any of their powers other than the power to borrow and make calls to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as they may think fit. Any committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegated conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed on it by the Board.

79. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee consisting of two or more members shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of the Board, so far as the same are applicable thereto and are not superseded by any regulations made by the Board under the last preceding article.

80. All acts done by any Meeting of the Board or of a Committee of the Board or by any person acting as Director shall be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed, and was qualified to be a Director or Substitute Director, notwithstanding that it be afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any such Director or Substitute Director or persons acting as aforesaid or that they or any of them were disqualified.

81. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a Meeting of the Board duly called and constituted.

82. The Board shall cause minutes to be made in books provided for the purpose of all resolutions and proceedings of General Meetings and of Meetings of the Board or Committees of the Board, and any such minutes, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of the Meeting to which they relate or at which they are read, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS.

83. The office of Director shall be vacated—

- (a) If he become of unsound mind, bankrupt, or compound with his creditors.
- (b) If (in any case where qualification is required) he cease to hold the due qualification.
- (c) If he send in a written resignation to the Board.
- (d) If pursuant to clause 67 of these articles a resolution be passed by the Company in General Meeting removing him from office.

84. No Director shall be disqualified by his office from contracting with the Company nor shall any such contract nor any contract or arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company in which any Director shall be in any way interested be avoided, nor shall any Director so contracting or being so interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by such contract or arrangement by reason only of such Director holding that office or of the fiduciary relation thereby established.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

85. At the Ordinary General Meeting to be held in the year 1920 and at every subsequent Ordinary General Meeting one-third of the Directors or if their number is not a multiple of three then the number nearest to one-third shall retire from office. The one-third or other nearest number to retire at the ordinary meeting to be held in the year 1920 shall unless the Directors agree amongst themselves be determined by lot. In every subsequent year the one-third or other nearest number who have been longest in office shall retire. As between two or more who have been in office an equal length of time the Director to retire shall in default of agreement between them be determined by lot. The length of time a Director has been in office shall be computed from his last election or appointment. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-appointment.

86. If at any General Meeting at which an election of Directors ought to take place the places of the retiring Directors are not filled up the retiring Directors or such of them as have not had their places filled up shall if willing continue in office until the Ordinary General Meeting in the next year and so on from year to year until their places are filled up unless it shall be determined at such meeting on due notice to reduce the number of Directors.

87. Any casual vacancy occurring among the Directors may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

MANAGING DIRECTOR.

88. The Board may from time to time appoint one or more of their body to be Managing Director or Managing Directors of the Company either for a fixed term or without any limitation as to the period for which he or they is or are to hold such office, and may from time to time remove or dismiss him or them from office and appoint another or others in his or their place or places.

89. A Managing Director shall not while he continues to hold that office be subject to retirement by rotation, and he shall not be taken into account in determining the rotation or retirement of Directors, but he shall be subject to the provisions of any contract between him and the Company be subject to the same provisions as to resignation and removal as the other Directors, and if he cease to hold the office of Director from any cause he shall *ipso facto* and immediately cease to be a Managing Director.

90. The remuneration of a Managing Director shall from time to time be fixed by the Board, and may be by way of salary or commission or participation in profits or by all or any of those modes.

91. The Board may from time to time entrust to and confer upon a Managing Director for the time being such of the powers exercisable under these presents by the Board as they may think fit, and may confer any such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as

may be thought expedient, and they may confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of and in substitution for all or any of the powers of the Board in that behalf and may from time to time revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers.

INDEMNITY OF DIRECTORS, &C.

92. Every Director, officer, or servant of the Company shall be indemnified out of its funds against all costs, charges, expenses, losses, and liabilities incurred by him in the conduct of the Company's business, or by reason of the use of his name for any purpose thereof, or in the discharge of his duties; and no Director or officer of the Company shall be liable for the acts or omissions of any other Director or officer, or by reason of his having joined in any receipt for money not received by him personally, or for any loss on account of defect of title to any property acquired by the Company, or on account of the insufficiency of any security in or upon which any moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss incurred through any banker, broker, or other agent, or upon any ground whatever other than his own wilful acts or defaults.

ACCOUNTS.

93. The Board shall cause accounts to be kept of the assets and liabilities, receipts and expenditure of the Company.

94. The books of account shall be kept at the registered office of the Company or at such other place or places as the Board think fit. Except as provided by the Ordinance or other statutory provisions or by the authority of the Board, no member shall be entitled as such to inspect any books or papers of the Company.

95. At the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in every year (after the First Ordinary General Meeting) the Board shall submit to the members a balance sheet and profit and loss account made up to a date not more than six months before the day of the meeting, and audited as hereinafter provided, accompanied by a report from the Board on the transaction of the Company during the period covered by such accounts.

AUDIT.

96. The accounts of the Company shall be audited as prescribed by law.

RESERVE FUND.

97. The Board may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies or for equalizing dividends or for repairing or maintaining any property of the Company or for any other purposes of the Company, and the same may be applied accordingly from time to time in such manner as the Board shall determine; and the Board may without placing the same to reserve, carry over any profits which they think it not prudent to divide.

DIVIDENDS.

98. Subject to the provisions of the last preceding article and to the rights of Members (if any) entitled to shares with special rights as to dividends, the profits of the Company available for distribution shall be distributable among the Members in accordance with the amounts paid up or credited as paid up on the shares of the Company held by them respectively. No amount paid on a share in advance of calls shall, while carrying interest, be treated for the purposes of this article as paid up on the share.

99. The Company in General Meeting may declare a dividend to be paid to the Members according to their rights and interests in the profits, but no larger dividend shall be declared than is recommended by the Board.

100. When in the opinion of the Board, the position of the Company permits, interim dividends may be paid to the Members on account of the dividend for the then current year.

101. Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend declared at such meeting, or of any interim dividends which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company or of any other company, or in any other form of specie, or in one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction; and when any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution, they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholders upon the footing of the value so fixed, in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend as may seem expedient to the Directors.

102. The Board may deduct from the dividends or interest payable to any Member all such sums of money as may be due from him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.

103. All dividends and interest shall belong and be paid (subject to the Company's lien) to those Members who shall be on the register at the date at which such dividend shall be declared or at the date on which such interest shall be payable respectively, notwithstanding any subsequent transfer or transmission of shares.

104. If several persons are registered as joint-holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual receipts for all dividends and interest payable in respect thereof.

105. No dividend shall bear interest as against the Company.

NOTICES.

106. A notice may be served by the Company upon any Member either personally or by posting it in a prepaid letter addressed to such Member at his registered address. Where a Member has given to the Company notice that he has authorized an attorney or attorneys to attend and vote at Meetings of the Company on his behalf and shall have given to the Company an address or addresses at which such attorney or attorneys may be served with notices, then notices shall also be given to such attorney or attorneys either personally or by posting it in a prepaid letter to such attorney or attorneys at his or their address or addresses aforesaid, in addition to the notice to be given as aforesaid to the Member himself.

107. Any notice, if served by post, shall be deemed to have been served on the day after the day on which it was posted; and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the notice was properly addressed and posted.

108. All notices directed to be given to the Members or their respective attorneys shall, with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled be given to whichever of such persons is named first in the Register of Members, and a notice so given shall be a sufficient notice to all the holders of such share.

109. Every executor, administrator, committee, or trustee in bankruptcy or liquidation shall be absolutely bound by every notice so given as aforesaid, if sent to the last registered address of such Member, notwithstanding that the Company may have notice of the death, lunacy, bankruptcy, or disability of such Member.

WINDING UP.

110. The Liquidator on any winding up (whether voluntary under supervision or compulsory) may, with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company and may with the like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the Liquidator with the like sanction shall think fit.

111. The dissolution of the Company may be determined on by the Company for any purpose whatever, and whether the object be the absolute and final extinguishment of the Company, or the re-construction or modification of the Company, or the amalgamation of the Company with any other company, or any other object.

112. If upon the winding up of the Company the surplus assets shall be more than sufficient to repay the whole of the paid up capital, the excess shall be distributed among the Members in proportion to the capital paid or which ought to have been paid on the shares held by them respectively at the commencement of the winding up other than amounts paid in advance of calls. If the surplus assets shall be insufficient to repay the whole of the paid up capital, such surplus assets shall be distributed so that as nearly as may be the losses shall be borne by the Members in proportion to the capital paid or which ought to have been paid on the shares held by them respectively at the commencement of the winding up other than amounts paid in advance of calls. But this article is to be without prejudice to the rights of the holders of any shares issued upon special terms and conditions.
