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VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE SECOND QUARTER OF 1903.

I.—Population.

THE estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,729,129, an increase of 26,325 on the previous quarter, due to an excess of 13,183 births over deaths, and a further excess of 13,142 arrivals over departures of Indian coolies. Table I. in the Appendix gives the area of each Province and district of the Island with its estimated population on the first day of the quarter, and the number of marriages, births, and deaths registered in the quarter.

2. *Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.*—The number of Indian coolies who arrived in the Island during the quarter was 28,875, and formed 66 per cent. of the average for the corresponding quarter of the last five years (44,894). The departures numbered 15,733, and were 60 per cent. of the average (27,096).

II.—Marriages.

3. *Marriages.*—The number of general marriages (*i.e.*, marriages other than Kandyan or Mohammedan) registered during the quarter was 3,448 and of Kandyan marriages 2,263.

4. Table VI. in the Appendix shows the marriages solemnized in the general community in each Province and district in the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnization, the number of bridegrooms and brides who signed the register with marks, &c.

5. Table VII. in the Appendix gives similar information in respect of the Kandyans.

6. *First Marriages; Re-marriages.*—Of the 3,448 general marriages, 3,031 (equal to 88 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 265 between widowers and spinsters, 92 between bachelors and widows, 48 between widowers and widows, 6 between bachelors and divorced women, 5 between divorced men and spinsters, and 1 between a divorced woman and a widower. Of the 2,263 Kandyan marriages, 1,693 (equal to 75 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 244 between widowers and spinsters, 123 between bachelors and widows, 93 between widowers and widows, 42 between divorced women and bachelors, 35 between divorced men and spinsters, 14 between divorced women and widowers, 13 between divorced men and divorced women, and 6 between divorced men and widows.

7. *Age at Marriage.*—The mean age at marriage among the general community for males was 27·3 and for females 20·7, and among the Kandyans 25·1 for males and 19·7 for females.

8. *Minors.*—In the general community 5 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 51 per cent. of the brides, and among Kandyans 13 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 68 per cent. of the brides, were under 21 years of age.

9. *Mixed Marriages.*—There were 27 mixed marriages in the quarter: 15 between Sinhalese and Tamils, 8 between Burghers and Sinhalese, 2 between Europeans and Burghers, 1 between a Burgher and a Tamil, and 1 other mixed marriage.

10. *Signatures in Marriage Register.*—Of the 6,896 persons married in the general community during the quarter, 827 men and 2,454 women signed the register with marks; that is to say, 76 per cent. of the men and 29 per cent. of the women were able to write their names. Of the 4,526 Kandyans married, 808 men and 2,182 women signed the register with marks; in other words, only 64 per cent. of the men and not even 4 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

III.—Births and Deaths.

11. *Births.*—The births registered during the quarter numbered 36,459 (52 Europeans, 172 Burghers, 25,978 Sinhalese, 7,853 Tamils, 2,259 Moors, 91 Malays, and 54 Others), and were in the proportion of 39·5 to 1,000 persons living per annum, as against 37·5, the average for the corresponding quarter of the period 1898–1902.

12. *Deaths.*—The deaths registered in the quarter numbered 23,276 (34 Europeans, 157 Burghers, 13,981 Sinhalese, 7,146 Tamils, 1,787 Moors, 89 Malays, and 82 Others), and corresponded to an annual rate of 25·2 per 1,000, as against 26·8, the average for the five second quarters of the period 1898–1902.

13. The births and deaths in this quarter are compared in the following Table A with the figures for the previous quarter, the second quarter of the previous year, and the average for the second quarters in 1898–1902, from which it will be seen that the birth-rate shows an improvement on the average of 2 per 1,000 and the death-rate a decline of 1·6 per 1,000:—

14. *Sex.*—Of the total number of births (36,459), 18,642 were of males and 17,817 were of females, i.e., 1,046 males to 1,000 females. Of the total number of deaths (23,276), 11,974 were of males and 11,302 were of females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex, there died 933 males to 1,000 females.

15. *Infant Mortality.*—The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 5,484, and were in the proportion of 150 to 1,000 registered births. The rate of infant mortality varied in different districts from 426 (for Tamils) in Mannar District, 295 (for Tamils) in Trincomalee District, 279 (for Sinhalese) in Anuradhapura District, 263 (for Tamils) in Mullaittivu District, 260 (for Sinhalese), 242 for Tamils, and 241 for Moors in Puttalam District to 116 (for Sinhalese) in Colombo District, 103 (for Sinhalese) in Kalutara District, 101 (for Sinhalese) in Matara District, 84 (for Sinhalese) in Chilaw District, and 81 (for Sinhalese) in Negombo District.

16. Forty-four deaths (21 males and 23 females) were reported to be of centenarians.

IV.—State of Public Health.

17. The general health of the population during the quarter was satisfactory, the birth-rate showing an increase of 2 per 1,000 and the death-rate a decline of 1·6 per 1,000 on the average of the second quarters of the period 1898–1902. Five of the nine Provinces showed diminished death-rates, while all the Provinces, with the exception of the North-Central Province, showed enhanced birth-rates.

18. Tables III., IV., and V. in the Appendix show the births and deaths, the birth-rates and death-rates for all ages in the several Provinces and districts of the Island and in the revenue subdivisions of those districts for the quarter under review, for the preceding quarter, and for the corresponding quarter of the previous year, and the average rates for the corresponding quarter in the period 1898–1902. The rates shown are for the Sinhalese only in the districts which are mainly inhabited by the Sinhalese, and for the Tamils only where the Tamils form the bulk of the population. In the Puttalam District, where the Sinhalese and Mohammedans are found in equal numbers, and in the Batticaloa District, which is inhabited in almost equal numbers by Tamils and Moors, the rates are given for the different sections of the population.

19. The healthiest Province was, as usual, the Western, the death-rate being 20·4. The healthiest district was Chilaw (14·2), and the healthiest division was the Nuwara Eliya Local Board (10·0), followed by the Pitigal korale south (10·8).

20. *Western Province.*—The Western Province showed an improvement in health during the quarter, its death-rate falling to 18·3 from an average of 19·2 and its birth-rate rising to 36·9 from an average of 35·7. Of its three districts, Negombo and Kalutara shared in the improvement, and the Colombo District maintained normal health.

21. In the Colombo District the death-rate for the quarter (19·1) was the same as the average, and the birth-rate (34·9) was an improvement on the average by 1·2 per 1,000. Three of its subdivisions showed higher death-rates than the average and the other three lower. Siyane korale east showed the lowest death-rate in the Province (13·2), followed by Siyane korale west (13·7), an improvement on their respective averages 16·0 and 14·5. The Colombo Municipality showed a death-rate of 35·1, as against an average of 32·1. The other two divisions which fared worse than the average were the Salpiti korale (18·6) and Alutkuru korale south (18·1). The division of Colombo Municipality is dealt with at greater length in chapter VII.

22. The Negombo District showed a death-rate of 14·7, more than 4 per 1,000 less than the average, while the birth-rate showed a rise of 3 per 1,000 on the average 38·1. Each of its three subdivisions showed lower death-rates than the average, notably the Negombo Local Board, 18·0, as against 29·9. Alutkuru korale north and Hapitgam korale both showed the same death-rate, 14·3.

23. The death-rate in the Kalutara District was in the proportion of 18·8 per 1,000 persons living, against an average of 19·7. All its subdivisions, except Rayigam korale, showed improved death-rates during the quarter. The rate of mortality in Rayigam korale was 3·5 per 1,000 in excess of the average, 15·1. The healthiest division in the district was Pasdun korale east, 15·7. Kalutara Local Board showed the highest death-rate, 22·4, but this division can hardly be considered the unhealthiest in the district, as the hospital and jail deaths add to its normal mortality. As appears from Table G, the death-rate, exclusive of hospital and jail deaths, for the quarter is 19·6, a rate lower than in the Kalutara totamune division (19·9). The highest birth-rate in the district was in Pasdun korale west (42·2), and the lowest in the Kalutara Local Board (28·7).

24. *Central Province.*—The Central Province, with a Sinhalese population of nearly 298,000, showed a Sinhalese death-rate of 26·0 during the quarter. The rate was an improvement on the average (27·7) as well as the rates for the previous quarter (29·3) and the corresponding quarter of 1902 (26·9). Each of its three districts shared in the improvement. The births registered in the Province were equal to a rate of 50·4 per mille per annum, a rise of nearly 2 per 1,000 on the average.

25. The inhabitants of the Kandy District enjoyed better health than usual, their death-rate (25·3) being 2 per 1,000 less than the average for the period 1898–1902. The birth-rate (51·7) was also an improvement on the average (49·2). Seven of its ten subdivisions showed better death-rates than the average, the exceptions being Harispattu (29·5), Uda Dumbara (27·1), and Uda Bulatgama (24·1). The healthiest division in the District was Pata Dumbara (20·3), and the greatest improvement during the quarter was in Yatinuwara, where the death-rate declined to 21·3 from its average, 30·0. The birth-rates in the subdivisions ranged between 60·0 in Harispattu and 36·4 in Uda Bulatgama.

26. The Matale District recorded a mortality rate of 30·8 during the quarter and fared slightly better than the average (31·0), the rate in the previous quarter (34·4) and the rate for the corresponding quarter of the previous year (32·8). The Matale Local Board, with the smallest population in the district (2,009), showed the lowest death-rate (22·0) and Matale south (population 26,137 Sinhalese) the highest (33·1).

27. In the Nuwara Eliya District the death-rate in the quarter (22·8) showed an improvement on the average (24·0) and the birth-rate an increase of 1·1 per 1,000 on the average (40·7). Of its subdivisions, the healthiest was Nuwara Eliya Local Board (10·0) and the unhealthiest Kotmale (29·0). The decline in the death-rate of the Nuwara Eliya Local Board division from an average of 29·9 to 10·0 in the quarter, while the birth-rate rose to 32·0 from an average of 26·0 is particularly noticeable. In the Kotmale division both the birth-rate and the death-rate showed an increase on the average, the former by 7·2 and the latter by 4·1 per 1,000. In Walapane division the birth- and death-rates diminished from the average by 1·9 and 3·4 respectively. In Uda Hewaheta the birth-rate was lower than the average by 2·8 and the death-rate by 2·1.

28. *Northern Province.*—The Tamil inhabitants of the Northern Province, who at the beginning of the quarter were estimated to be 334,213, showed a death-rate of 32·0 during the quarter and fared considerably worse than usual, their average death-rate being 27·6. The Mannar District, where the death-rate rose about 60 per cent., is chiefly responsible for this deterioration in health.

29. The Jaffna District, which contains more than 91 per cent. of the Tamils in the Province, showed a death-rate of 29·2 for the quarter, a rise of 3 per 1,000 on the average. All the subdivisions, except Vadamaradchi west, showed higher death-rates than usual. In Vadamaradchi west the death-rate 23·0 was 4·4 per 1,000 less than the average. The healthiest division in the district was Valikamam north (21·5), and the unhealthiest Vadamaradchi east (70·3).

30. The Mannar District shows a considerable deterioration in health in the quarter, its death-rate (70·6) being 26·3 above the average. All its subdivisions fared worse than usual, notably the Nanaddan division, where the death-rate rose to 109·2 from an average of 43·4. The abnormal death-rate in this division appears to be due to the prevalence of fever and dysentery at Marichchikaddi, especially among the temporary residents attracted thither by the pearl fishery held in this quarter.

31. The health of the inhabitants in the Mullaittivu District showed an improvement in the quarter, their death-rate falling to 48·6 from an average of 51·2, and their birth-rate rising to 48·3 from an average of 46·4. The healthiest division in the district was Maritime pattu (42·6), and the unhealthiest Vavuniya south (59·3).

32. *Southern Province.*—The Sinhalese of the Southern Province, who number considerably over half a million, showed a death-rate (21·4) slightly higher than the average (20·8), but lower than the rates for the preceding quarter (24·9) and for the second quarter of last year (23·6). A similar change in the rates is noticeable in each of the districts composing the Province, of which the Matara District was the healthiest. The birth-rate of the Province (42·6) was almost double the death-rate.

33. The Galle District, containing nearly a quarter of a million Sinhalese, showed a Sinhalese death-rate of 22·3, as against the average of 22·1. The unhealthiest division was Hinidum pattu with a death-rate of 28·5, followed by the Galle Municipality with 27·9 and Walallawiti korale with 25·6. The last-mentioned division used to be the unhealthiest in the district, as may be seen from the average death-rate. The healthiest division in the district (as well as in the Province) was the Four Gravets of Galle (beyond Municipal limits) and Akimirana with a death-rate of 16·0.

34. The death-rate of the Matara District showed a slight rise of .6 per 1,000 from its average, 19·0. Except the Local Board, whose rate (17·6) showed a large reduction from the average 28·1, and Kandaboda pattu, where the reduction is slight (22·2 against the average 22·7), the other subdivisions show increased rates as compared with the average. The highest rate was in Morawak korale 25·6, and the lowest in the three divisions: Four Gravets beyond Local Board limits, Wellaboda pattu, and the Local Board which show the same rate 17·6.

35. The death-rate of Hambantota District rose from an average of 21·1 to 22·5. The unhealthiest division was as usual Magam pattu with a death-rate of 43·8, and the healthiest Giruwa pattu west with a death-rate of 20·2. This division contains more than four-fifths of the population of the district.

36. *Eastern Province.*—The Eastern Province, with a Tamil population of over 99,000, showed a death-rate of 31·2 for the Tamils, revealing an improvement as compared with the average (35·5), but a slight deterioration when compared with the previous quarter (30·4) and the corresponding quarter of last year (30·8). The birth-rate in the Province was 47·1, nearly the same as the average, 47·6. The improvement in the death-rate in the Province was due to the Batticaloa District, the Trincomalee District having showed enhanced rates.

37. In the Batticaloa District the death-rate declined to 28·5 from the average 33·8. Each of its subdivisions showed diminished death-rates during the quarter. The healthiest division in the district was Akkarai pattu 21·1 (average 33·9), and the unhealthiest Koralaikorale 41·3 (average 47·2). The highest birth-rate among the subdivisions was in Koralaikorale (70·7) and the lowest in Karaivaku, 34·6. The Sinhalese in the district showed a death-rate of 55·3 and a birth-rate of 39·5, as against the respective averages 34·0 and 41·7, and the Moors showed a death-rate of 27·5, an improvement on the average 32·0. The healthiest division for the Sinhalese was Akkarai pattu (20·6) and for the Moors Panawa pattu (13·3).

38. In the Trincomalee District the Tamils showed a death-rate of 43·9 per mille per annum, an increase of 8 per mille on the average 35·9. All the subdivisions, except Kadukkulam pattu, contributed to the increase. Among the subdivisions the highest death-rate was in Trincomalee town (48·2). This division also showed a high infant mortality rate of 374 per 1,000 births registered. The healthiest division in the district was Tampalakamam, 34·6 (average 28·3). The birth-rate in the district (48·3) showed a rise of 12·7 on the average. The highest birth-rate was in Koddiyan pattu (76·8 average 45·9).

39. *North-Western Province.*—The North-Western Province showed considerably improved health, its death-rate having fallen to 24·1 from an average of 31·0. The improvement was shared by the Kurunegala and Chilaw Districts, but in the Puttalam District the death-rate was slightly higher than the average.

40. In the District of Kurunegala the death-rate fell 8 per 1,000 (from an average of 34·4 to 26·4) during the quarter. Every one of the seven divisions of the district contributed to the decrease in the death-rate. As usual the healthiest division was Katugampola hatpattu (death-rate 18·9), and next to the small division of the town which usually shows an abnormally high death-rate, the unhealthiest was Wanni hatpattu (37·2).

41. The increase in the Sinhalese death-rate of Puttalam District from an average of 33·3 to 33·9 was due to the increased mortality in Demala hatpattu, which claims more than half of the Sinhalese population of the district. Here the death-rate rose to 46·0 from an average of 40·1. The other two divisions of Kalpitiya and Puttalam showed low death-rates 14·1 and 16·6 respectively for Sinhalese, but high death-rates for Tamils and Moors, viz., 43·1 and 30·2 respectively for Tamils, and 41·8 and 51·3 respectively for Moors.

42. The Chilaw District was the healthiest district in the Island during the quarter with as low a death-rate as 13·8 (average 18·4). Two of its divisions, Pitigal korale south and Pitigal korale central, showed, next to the Nuwara Eliya town, which had a population of only about 2,000 Sinhalese, the lowest death-rate (10·8 and 12·9) respectively of all the divisions in the Island.

43. *North-Central Province.*—The health of the Anuradhapura District constituting the North-Central Province deteriorated much, the death-rate having risen to 48·8 from an average of 35·3. The highest death-rate next to that of the town was in Hurulupalata (52·5) and the lowest in Kalagampala (40·5), closely followed by Tamankaduwa (40·6). All the divisions show higher death-rates as compared with the average, except Tamankaduwa, whose average rate was 9 per 1,000 higher.

44. *Province of Uva.*—The death-rate of Badulla District constituting the Province of Uva (35·4) was nearly the same as the average (35·3). Four out of the eight divisions of the district showed lower rates as compared with the average and the other four higher rates. The healthiest division was Wiyaluwa (death-rate 25·4) followed by Yatikinda (26·2), and the unhealthiest Bintenna (46·0) followed by Wellassa (45·9).

45. *Province of Sabaragamuwa.*—The Province of Sabaragamuwa showed improved health, its death-rate having fallen to 24·9 from an average of 29·3, a result shared by both the Districts Ratnapura and Kegalla. The reduction in the death-rate in the former district is about 1 per 1,000 and in the latter 7 per 1,000.

46. The improvement in health in the Ratnapura District was shared by all except three of its divisions. The exceptions are Kadawat korale (death-rate 41·5 average 32·0), the unhealthiest division in the district and in the Province; Kukulu korale (30·5); and Atakalan korale (29·1). The healthiest division in the district was as usual Kuruwiti korale (26·8).

47. In Kegalla District the decline in the death-rate (from an average of 30·2 to 23·2) was shared by all its divisions, except the Local Board and Paranakuru korale. The healthiest division in the district and in the Province was Atulugam korale (death-rate 15·4), and next to the Kegalla town the unhealthiest in the district Galboda korale (26·7). In the remaining divisions the death-rates ranged between 22·4 in Dehigampal korale and 24·0 in Paranakuru korale.

V.—Causes of Deaths.

48. The causes of deaths registered in the Island during the quarter are given in Table X., and are summarized below:—

49. *Fever and Diarrhoeal Diseases.*—Of the 23,276 deaths registered in the Island, 4,527 were reported as due to various forms of fever and 4,943 to diarrhoeal diseases, i.e., fever and diarrhoeal diseases contributed 40 per cent. of the total number of deaths.

50. *Cholera.*—There were no deaths from cholera during the quarter.

51. There were only 3 cases of smallpox this quarter (2 in Kandy and 1 in Colombo); 40 deaths were due to measles (28 in Jaffna, 4 in Kalutara, 3 in Anuradhapura, 2 in Ratnapura, and 1 each in Matara, Chilaw, and Colombo). Twenty-two deaths resulted from whooping cough (7 each in Colombo and Kalutara, 5 in Galle, and 1 each in Negombo, Chilaw, and Badulla). Mumps and diphtheria were responsible for 1 death each. Influenza caused 7 deaths, of which 3 occurred in Nuwara Eliya, 2 in Kandy, and 1 each in Matale and Matara.

52. The other chief causes of deaths were infantile convulsions 2,269, debility (mostly of infants from inability to suck) 1,117, pneumonia 867, phthisis 794, worms 770, general dropsy 666, anaemia 625, old age 489, puerperal convulsions 244, thrush 230, malarial cachexia 202, premature birth 167, bronchitis 157, tetanus 140, rheumatism 131, puerperal fever 130, parapalse 95, dochmias duodenalis 70, and cancer 53.

53. *Deaths by Violence.*—Of the 405 deaths attributed to accidents, 102 were due to falls from trees, 93 to drowning, 58 to snake bite, 27 to burns or scalds, 18 to falls of heavy substances, 15 to injuries at birth, 12 to gunshot wounds, 8 to lightning, 6 to suffocation, 6 to falls, 4 to falls from heights other than trees, 3 to injuries caused by bulls, 3 to injuries caused by elephants, 3 to injuries caused by crocodiles, 3 to being run over by cart, 3 to explosions of gunpowder, 2 to being run over by train, 2 to falls into pits, 2 to cutting, 2 to poison, 1 to injuries caused by a buffalo, 1 to explosion of firearms, 1 to injuries caused by wasp, 1 to a railway accident, 1 to injuries caused by a fish, 1 death was caused by the bite of a Brabmin lizard.

54. *Suicide.*—Forty-five deaths were attributed to suicide, of which 25 were by hanging, 8 by drowning, 6 by poison, 2 by gunshot wounds, and 4 otherwise.

55. *Homicide.*—Thirty-four deaths were attributed to homicide (7 in Colombo, 4 each in Kurunegala and Puttalam, 3 each in Negombo, Batticaloa, and Badulla, 2 each in Galle and Kegalla, and 1 each in Jaffna, Matara, Hambantota, Chilaw, Anuradhapura, and Ratnapura).

56. *Executions.*—Deaths from judicial executions registered during the quarter numbered 9 (3 each in Kandy and Chilaw, 2 in Colombo, and 1 in Trincomalee).

VI.—Health of the Estate Population.

57. The total number of births reported for registration from the estates of the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province was 2,730 (6 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 2,618 Tamils, 29 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others) and the total number of deaths was 2,493 (1 European, 2 Burghers, 47 Sinhalese, 2,420 Tamils, 17 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others), corresponding to an annual birth-rate of 26·1 and a death-rate of 23·8 per mille, as against the respective averages of 20·5 and 28·8 for 1898-1902. The causes of death are given in Table XI., and are summarized as follows:—

59. *Kandy District.*—The total number of deaths reported for registration from the estates in the Kandy District was 1,063 (4 Europeans, 1 Burgher, 24 Sinhalese, 1,013 Tamils, 20 Moors, and 1 Other), and the deaths numbered 901 (1 Burgher, 20 Sinhalese, 871 Tamils, 7 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The birth-rate during the quarter was 27·4, as against 20·3, the mean rate for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902; and the death-rate was 23·3, as against 30·9, the average for the corresponding period of 1898 to 1902. The most fatal causes of death were, as usual, diarrhoeal diseases 303 (154 dysentery and 149 diarrhoea), forming 33 per cent. of the total number of deaths (901). The other chief causes of deaths were debility 202 (mostly of infants from inability to suck), pneumonia 57, infantile convulsions 51, general dropsy 47, fevers 37, old age 28, malarial cachexia 22, dochmias duodenalis 20, brouchitis 11, and premature birth 11.

60. *Matale District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Matale District was 145 (1 Burgher, 2 Sinhalese, 141 Tamils, and 1 Malay), and the deaths numbered 173 (4 Sinhalese, 164 Tamils, 3 Moors, and 2 Malays). The birth-rate recorded for the quarter (22·2) was in excess of the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902 (21·3), and the death-rate was 26·6, as against the mean rate 32·0 for the second quarters of 1898-1902. Dysentery and diarrhoea were responsible for 49 deaths. The other chief causes of death were debility 23 (mostly of infants from inability to suck), malarial cachexia 20, pneumonia 17, general dropsy 13, infantile convulsions 9, and old age 4.

61. *Nuwara Eliya District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Nuwara Eliya District was 606 (2 Europeans, 1 Burgher, 8 Sinhalese, 591 Tamils, 3 Moors, and 1 Malay), and the deaths numbered 464 (1 European, 1 Burgher, 7 Sinhalese, 453 Tamils, and 2 Moors). The birth-rate during the quarter was 23·5, as against the average 18·6 for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902; and the death-rate was 18·0, as against the average (18·3) for the period 1898-1902. The chief causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases 199 (105 dysentery and 94 diarrhoea), which caused nearly 43 per cent. of the total number of deaths (464). Debility caused 84 deaths (mostly of infants from inability to suck), pneumonia 36, infantile convulsions 27, general dropsy 24, fevers 12, and bronchitis 7.

62. *Badulla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Badulla District was 379 (5 Sinhalese, 373 Tamils, and 1 Moor), and the deaths numbered 334 (2 Sinhalese, 329 Tamils 2 Moors, and 1 Malay). The birth-rate for the quarter was 29·4, as against the average for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902, 22·6; and the death-rate was 25·9, as against the average 23·9. The chief causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 122 deaths (75 dysentery and 47 diarrhoea), or nearly 37 per cent. of the total number of deaths (334). Debility caused 75 deaths (mostly of infants from inability to suck), pneumonia 23, fevers 23, infantile convulsions 17, general dropsy 12, malarial cachexia 10.

63. *Ratnapura District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Ratnapura District was 104 (4 Sinhalese, 99 Tamils, and 1 Moor), and the deaths numbered 136 (1 Sinhalese and 135 Tamils). The birth-rate for the quarter was 25·1, as against the average for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902, 22·5; and the death-rate was 32·8, as against the average 38·2. The chief causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 63 deaths (52 dysentery and 11 diarrhoea), or 46 per cent. of the total number of deaths (136). Debility caused 26 deaths (mostly of infants from inability to suck), dochmias duodenalis 7, pneumonia 6, phthisis 5, old age 5, and infantile convulsions 5.

64. *Kegalla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kegalla District was 294 (17 Sinhalese, 271 Tamils, 4 Moors, and 2 Malays), and the deaths numbered 302 (7 Sinhalese, 294 Tamils, and 1 Moor). The birth-rate for the quarter was 28·4, as against the average for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902 (24·8); and the death-rate was 29·2, as against the average 41·4. Here, too, as elsewhere, the chief causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 129 deaths, or nearly 43 per cent. of the total number of deaths (302). The other chief causes were debility 35 (mostly of infants from inability to suck), malarial cachexia 27, fevers 18, infantile convulsions 11, general dropsy 11, pneumonia 10, phthisis 7, and old age 7.

65. *Colombo District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Colombo District was 35 (3 Sinhalese 31 Tamils, and 1 Other), and the deaths numbered 61 (2 Sinhalese, 58 Tamils, and 1 Moor). The birth-rate during the quarter was 16·9, as against the average for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902, 19·5; and the death-rate was 29·5, as against the average 52·4. Here, too, as elsewhere, diarrhoeal diseases caused the largest number of deaths, i.e., 23 or nearly 38 per cent. of the total number of deaths (61). The other chief natural causes of death were fevers 16, ascites 6, phthisis 3, and old age 2.

66. *Kalutara District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kalutara District was 104 (5 Sinhalese and 99 Tamils), and the deaths numbered 122 (4 Sinhalese and 116 Tamils, 1 Moor, and 1 Other). The birth-rate recorded for the quarter was 24·6, as against the average for the corresponding quarters of 1898-1902, 15·3; and the death-rate was 28·8, as against the average 37·4. As usual, the most fatal causes of death were diarrhoeal diseases 55 (45 diarrhoea and 10 dysentery), debility 26, fevers 5, pneumonia 5, infantile convulsions 4, and malarial cachexia 4.

VII.—Health of the Town of Colombo.

67. The births registered in the town of Colombo numbered 880 and corresponded to an annual rate of 21·7 per mille, an increase of 9 per mille on the average (20·8).

68. The deaths registered numbered 1,364 and corresponded to a rate of 33.7 per mille per annum, 2.7 per mille higher than the average 31.0.

69. As usual in the town the death-rate exceeded the birth-rate, due mainly to the preponderance of males over females (chiefly among Europeans, Indian Tamils, and Moors), to the presence of hospitals, which add to the normal mortality of the town, and to the registration of births being still defective.

70. The subjoined Table E gives the births and deaths and their rates for each race in the second quarters of 1903 and 1902, and the average for the second quarters in 1898-1902:—

71. Too much reliance should not be placed on the birth- and death-rates given in the above table for Europeans, Malays, and the races classed together as "Others," as their population is too small for purposes of rate calculation.

72. Excluding the rates for these sections, the lowest death-rate was among the Burghers (30·8, an increase of 4·3 on their average), followed by the Moors (32·2, against an average of 29·1 in 1898-1902), and the highest death-rate was among the Sinhalese (35·1, against an average of 32·1), followed by the Tamils, who also show a high rate (33·6, against an average of 32·4).

73. The highest birth-rate (32·0) was among the Europeans, followed closely by the Sinhalese (29·4) and Burghers (28·5). The lowest birth-rate was among the Tamils (9·8). The low birth-rate and the high death-rate of this community are due to their including a male adult floating population and a large number of poor and destitute immigrant coolies.

74. The number of births and deaths of the different wards in the town, their rates per mille per annum, the principal zymotic causes of death, &c., during the quarter are shown in the following table F:—

75. The low birth- and death-rates of the Fort and Galle Face and the Pettah Wards are due to their population being chiefly a floating male adult one. Excluding these two divisions, the healthiest division in the town was, as usual, the Kollupitiya Ward, with a death-rate of 20·0 per 1,000 per annum, and the unhealthiest the New Bazaar Ward, where the death-rate was 32·0. The highest birth-rate was in the New Bazaar Ward (21·9), and the next highest in Slave Island (21·5), followed by Maradana (20·3).

76. There were no deaths from cholera, smallpox, or measles. Phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia were fatal in 304 cases (against an average of 258 in the corresponding period of the last five years), diarrhoea and dysentery in 283 (average 194), fever in 142, including 24 of enteric fever (average 26), and 67 of remittent fever (average 41), infantile convulsions in 110 (average 108), old age in 60 (average 52), tetanus in 49 (average 30), premature birth in 13 (average 17), diseases of the circulatory system in 20 (average 22), worms in 11 (average 29), dochmias duodenalis in 10 (average 13), malarial cachexia in 4 (average 19), parturition in 10 (average 16).

77. Thirteen deaths were attributed to accidents, of which 4 were due to being run over by carts, 3 to drowning, 3 to the fall of heavy substances, 1 to burn, and 1 to explosion.

78. Five deaths were attributed to homicide and three to suicide.

VIII.—Health of other Towns.

79. The following Table G shows the birth- and death-rates in each of the principal towns of the Island for the second quarters of 1903 and 1902, and the average rates for the second quarters in 1898–1902:—

80. The death-rates are given inclusive of hospital and jail deaths as well as exclusive. In some of the towns which attract large numbers of estate coolies and destitute poor to the hospitals the difference between the two rates is striking, e.g., Gampola 84·0 and 42·0, Nawalapitiya 71·9 and 27·2, Matale 62·6 and 22·7, Anuradhapura 58·5 and 25·2, Badulla 51·0 and 24·2, Ratnapura 42·9 and 16·2, and Kegalla 47·0 and 13·0. Exclusive of deaths in hospitals and jails, the lowest death-rate was in Tangalla 6·2, followed by Kegalla 13·0, Matara 15·4, Ratnapura 16·2, and Mannar 18·3.
