NOW Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us by section 2 of "The Customs Amendment (War Powers) Ordinance, No. 30 of 1916," do hereby prohibit the import into Ceylon of timber, except under ligense from the Principal Collector of Customs.

A PROCLAMATION for Prohibiting the Importation of Cocaine and Opium into the United Kingdom. MATION IS LIST IN GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by second of the Ciscom Combonic ion Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpower, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of cocaine or of opium should

be prohibited except as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proceim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

As from and after this date, subject as hereinafter provided, all cocaine and all opium shall be prohibited to be imported into the United Kingdom:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that nothing in this Proclamation shall apply to cocaine or opium imported under the license of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State and in accordance with the provisions of such license.

The word "cocaine" includes ecgonine, and any substance, whether preparation, admixture, extract, or otherwise, containing 0.1 per cent. (one part in a thousand) or more of cocaine or ecgonine, or of any salt or derivative thereof.

The word "opium" means raw opium powdered or glanulated opium, or opium prepared for smoking, and includes any solid or semi-solid mixture containing opium.

The Cocaine and Opium (Prohibition of Import) No. 2 Proclamation, 1916, is hereby revoked.

This Proclamation may be cited as The Cocaine and Opium (Prohibition of Import) No. 3 Proclamation, 1918.

A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Atticles into the United Kingdom. GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of

certain goods has been prohibited accordingly: And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be

prohibited: Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited, viz. :-

Canes of all descriptions, unmanufactured or manufactured, not otherwise plohibited.

Crabs, prawns, shrimps, and oysters, canned.

Red prussiate of potash.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 26) Proclamation, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 89 (3 Europeans. 12 Burghers, 41 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 12 Moors, 5 Malays, and I Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1918, viz., 276,665) was 16.8, as against 23.2 in the preceding week, 17.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 196 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 102 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 35 Moors, 7 Malays, and 10 Others). The death rate are 1,000 per annum was 26.10 as a grainst 20.4 in the previous week 19.7 in

7 Malays, and 10 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.9, as against 20.4 in the previous week, 12.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 196 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 18 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

Principal Causes of Death.—Fifty-four deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 19 in Maradana (including 12 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 15 in Kotahena, 4 in Pettah, 4 in St. Paul's, 4 in New Bazaar, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in Wellawatta, and 1 in Fort, as against 22 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. Nine deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 10, 1918.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 5, 1918.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena; Mr. H. Makan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subesinghe; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; and Mr. A. E. Mayes.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on July 13, 1918, a copy thereof having been sent to each Councillor, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardena asked-

(1) Is it a fact that the Chairman has received an offer of a donation of Rs. 15,000 towards the building of a Town Hall in Galle? The Chairman replied that no definite offer has been made to him.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardena did not put the questions numbered (2), (3), (4), and (5) on the agenda.

(6) Has the Special Committee appointed in this connection sent in their report? The Chairman replied in the negative. No member attended the last meeting that was called.

(7) If not, when may it be expected? The Chairman replied that he regretted he could not fix a date.

- 3. The questions of which Mr. J. E. Perera had given notice were, in his absence, with the leave of Council, put by Mr. G. E. Abeywardena:—
 - (1) What is the number of assessment taxpayers in the Galle Municipality? The Chairman replied-9,752.
- (2) How many of such taxpayers have paid their taxes to the end of (1) 1916, (2) 1917? The Chairman replied—(1) 9,459, (2) 7,548.
- (3) How many sales of immovable property were carried out in (1) 1917, (2) 1918 for non-payment of such taxes? The Chairman replied—(1) 65, (2) 85.
 - (4) How many sales of movable property was effected in (1) 1917, (2) 1918? The Chairman replied—(1) 3, (2) none.
 - 4. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. W. Subesinghe moved-
- (1) That the Chairman be pleased to recall the notices served on the owners of houses in the Galle Bazaar, calling upon them to cut off the eaves of their houses. Mr. H. M. Makan Markar seconded.

The motion, on being put to the meeting, was declared lost; three voting for, and five against it.

(2) That warrants be not issued for the recovery of rates and taxes due for a given quarter before the expiration of that quarter.

Mr. Subasinghe, with the leave of the Council, withdrew the motion upon the Chairman's assurance that warrants were never issued before the expiration of the quarter for which rates were due, but that they were usually issued three or four months after the expiration of the quarter.

- 5. Nomination of an unofficial member of the Council to serve on the Excise Advisory Committee for the Galle Municipal area, as from October 1, 1918.
- Mr. D. G. Goonewardena proposed that Mr. D. W. Subasinghe be nominated to serve on the Excise Advisory Committee for the Galle Municipal area, as from October 1, 1918. Dr. C. B. Lourensz seconded.—Carried.

6. Application for a site for a tennis court on the Ramparts, for the use of the members of the Y. M. C. A.

The Council resolved that the site (recommended by the Superintendent of Works) behind the residence of Mr. A. C. Hayley be offered on lease for five years, on payment of Rs. 5 per annum; the lease to terminate at one month's notice without compensation.

7. The Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1917.

- Mr. D. G. Goonewardena moved that the report be adopted. Dr. C. B. Lourensz seconded.—Carried unanimously. 8-10. Extracts from the Minutes of the Proceedings of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, Finance and Assessment, and Markets and Sanitation.
