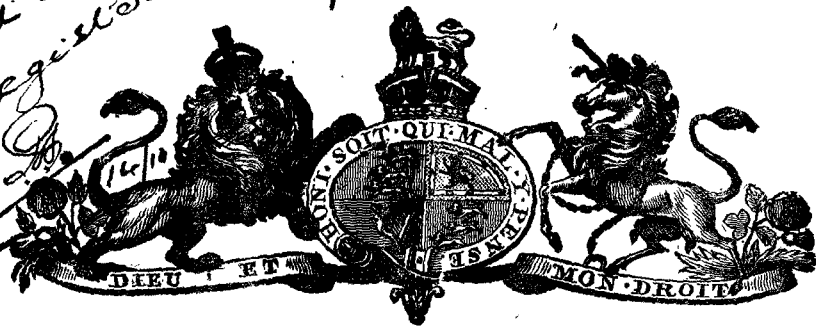

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM HENRY MANNING, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS in pursuance of "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, 1914," by Our Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of August 3, 1917, We did prohibit the exportation from Ceylon of the articles to the extent therein specified :

And whereas by Our subsequent Proclamations similarly from time to time published We did amend the schedule to the aforesaid Proclamation :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in pursuance of the Ordinance aforesaid, do hereby further amend the schedule aforesaid in the manner set forth in the schedule to this Proclamation.

Given at Anuradhapura, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eighteen.

BY virtue of the powers in that behalf vested in Us under and by virtue of section 44 of "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916," as amended by "The Enemy Firms Liquidation (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 4 of 1917," We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Our Proclamation declare that for the purposes

of the properties particularly described in the schedule hereto the expression "prohibited person" in Chapter VI, of the said Ordinance shall extend to and include—

- (a) Any foreigner; and
(b) Any corporation under foreign control—

for and during a period of ten years commencing from the date of the transfer of the said properties.

SCHEDULE.

Auchry Estate.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. For the purpose of these rules “laundry” means the premises occupied by any person carrying on the trade of washing other people's clothes for hire; and “laundryman” signifies such person or employé or assistant of such person in such work.
2. Every laundry situated within Local Board limits must be registered by the Chairman of the Local Board, each subsequent change of address to be notified to him within one week.
3. Every laundryman shall, when so required by the Chairman, provide a separate room for soiled linen, which must be well ventilated and cleaned at all times and white-washed twice annually.
4. A laundryman shall not store soiled linen in any room used as a living apartment.
5. The Chairman shall, when he considers it necessary in the interests and for the good of the public health, allocate special sites for the washing of clothes; such sites will be indicated by a notice board.
6. When any laundryman or any member of his family or household shall contract any infectious or contagious

disease, he shall within 24 hours report the same to the Chairman of the Local Board, either through the Sanitary Inspector or Police Headman.

7. When any laundryman or any member of his family or household shall contract any infectious or contagious disease, all work in the laundry shall immediately cease, nor shall any clothes be taken into the laundry or sent out of it after the outbreak and during the prevalence of such disease, save by special permission of the Chairman.

8. No laundryman shall, without the permission of the Chairman of the Local Board or the Medical Officer, receive soiled linen from any house in which there is reason to believe that a member thereof is suffering from any infectious disease.

9. Every laundryman shall, when called upon by the Chairman of the Local Board or the Medical Officer or his Assistant, give a list of the persons for whom he washes.

10. Contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be a punishable offence in a court of law.

“THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1877.”

(ii.) No Buddhist prisoner shall be compelled to work on the Buddhist Wesak Day, no Muhammadan prisoner on the Muhammadan Hadji Day, and no Hindu prisoner on the Hindu New Year Day.

By-laws of the Sanitary Board of the Kurunegala District for the Town of Kuliya-pitiya, made under and by virtue of the Provisions of Section 32 (2) of Ordinance No. 18 of 1892.

Rate declared by the Sanitary Board to be payable in Labour or in Money in Commutation thereof for the Maintenance of Roads or other Public Means of Communications within the Limits of the Town of Kuliya-pitiya.

1. *Householder to fill up list.*—Every householder residing within the limits of the town of Kuliya-pitiya shall, whenever required by the officer of the Board thereunto authorized, fill in the officer's list with, or if unable to write inform the officer of, the number of males, together with their names, ages, and occupations, including the householder himself if a male, resident in his house, so far as the same shall be known to him.

2. *Every male to notify whether he elects to pay in money or in labour.*—Every male between the ages of 18 and 55 resident within the Sanitary Board limits of the town of Kuliya-pitiya, except such as are exempted by the 50th section of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, shall before the 15th day of December in every year notify to the Sanitary Board, or its officer authorized to demand and take notice thereof, whether he elects to pay in labour or in money in commutation thereof by such male as aforesaid for the year following; and every such male who does not notify his election to the Sanitary Board or its officer as hereinbefore directed shall, whenever required in the following year, pay the rate in labour so declared to be payable in labour by the Sanitary Board as aforesaid for that particular year.

3. *Time and place of attendance to perform labour.*—Every male liable to pay the rate in labour as aforesaid shall attend for the performance of such labour at the time and places within the town of Kuliya-pitiya, of which he shall have reasonable notice either by publication by beat of tom-tom, or by printed or written notices posted up in conspicuous parts of the town, or by a writing given to him, or by a writing left at his then place of residence in the town, and he shall perform the labour duly required of him by the person appointed by the Sanitary Board to direct and superintend such labour.

4. *Rate payable before the 1st day of April in each year.*—Every male who has notified in terms of the 2nd by-law his election to pay the rate in money in commutation of labour, shall pay the same before the 1st day of April in each year in which it is payable to the division officer or to the person appointed by the Sanitary Board to demand and receive payment thereof.

5. *Rate if unpaid to be a debt due to the Sanitary Board.*—The rate in money by way of commutation for such labour payable in each year on or before the 31st day of the month of March in that year shall, if then unpaid, be from that day a debt due to the Sanitary Board.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 5, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 71 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 38 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 10 Moors, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1918, viz., 276,665) was 13.4, as against 20.4 in the preceding week, 23.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 331 (4 Europeans, 22 Burghers, 166 Sinhalese, 63 Tamils, 57 Moors, 8 Malays, and 11 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 62.4, as against 47.5 in the previous week, 19.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 331 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 48 in the preceding week, 25 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.—One hundred and fifty-nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 70 in Maradana (including 17 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 25 in Kotahena, 14 in New Bazaar, 14 in Wellawatta, 13 in Slave Island, 9 in San Sebastian, 6 in St. Paul's, 4 in Pettah, 2 in Fort, and 2 in Kollupitiya, as against 91 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year. There were also registered 47 deaths from *Influenza* and 4 from *Bronchitis*.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Kotahena, 3 in Kollupitiya, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 12 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average last year.

3. Nine deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Kotahena, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Slave Island, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 8 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. There were 22 deaths from *Infantile Convulsions*, 11 from *Debility*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Worms*, 1 from *Diarrhœa*, 1 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 53 from *Other Causes*,

5. Four cases of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 10 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·3°, against 81·9° in the preceding week and 79·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·908 in., against 29·942 in. in the preceding week and 29·901 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·55 in., against 0·60 in. in the preceding week and 1·15 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

"The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899."

THE following regulations made by the Government Agent, Southern Province, being the "proper

authority" in that behalf, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 18 and 23 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1899, in respect of the general cemetery at Gammaddegoda, in Wellaboda pattu, Galle District, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial of the person for whom the grave is wanted.

2. The keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arrival at the cemetery, and if more than one party come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.

3. Should it be necessary for the purposes of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.

4. The keeper shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his commands in that behalf shall be obeyed.

5. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth, or at less distance than 4 feet from another. No grave shall be reopened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.

6. No dead body shall be buried or cremated without the permission of the cemetery-keeper, and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due have been paid. Ashes and other remains on the scene of a cremation shall be buried by the parties responsible for the cremation within three days after the cremation.

7. Applicants for graves may dig the graves themselves. If this work is done by the keeper, the fee payable to him in advance shall be as follows:—

5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depôt within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid, and will be at the risk of the purchasers until removed.

6. Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid, or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and pay 25 per cent. of his bid when so required, or refuse or fail to pay the full purchase amount or balance thereof, as the case may be, and to remove the timber within the time specified in clause 5 above, the lot will again be put up for auction, and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss to Government owing to a lower price being realized at the re-sale, while if an enhanced price is realized at such re-sale, he shall, however, have no claim to the profit which shall accrue to Government.

"Improvements in lamps for burning oil or other illuminant."

Abstract.—The object of this invention is to provide a lamp for oil or other illuminant which will not allow any of the oil to escape if the lamp is upset. The invention consists (1st) of an alleged air-tight stopper for the oil container of the lamp, the said stopper carrying also a tube through which the wick is threaded; and (2nd) of a separate ventilating tube to admit air to the oil container, the said ventilating tube entering the oil container near the top of the handle of the lamp, dipping in a loop to near the bottom of the inside of the oil container and then rising to near the top of the inside of the oil container and in front of the wick tube. It is said that if the lamp should upset and should roll about on its side no oil will escape from that ventilating tube. The lamp is provided with a broad base and is made of metal or other unbreakable material.

The claims are :—
1. The air-tight stopper entirely enclosing the oil or other illuminant substantially as described and illustrated.
2. The specially constructed air tube which while admitting air to replace the consumption of oil does not allow any leakage of oil or other illuminant when upset or placed in any position of the lamp substantially as described and illustrated.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 17, 1918, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 13, 1918.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. S. C. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; and Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 20, 1918, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1917 to July 31, 1918, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's report for July.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July.

(e) The reservoir readings for July.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during July.

In connection with the report of the Medical Officer of Health, the Chairman said that the Medical Officer of Health had submitted a report in regard to the remarks made by Dr. Attygalle as to the insanitary state of the market at the previous Meeting of Council in moving his resolution for the appointment of a Market Inspector, and called upon the

Secretary to read it in the public interest, as the market appears to be far from being in the insanitary condition it was stated to be in by Dr. Attygalle. The report was accordingly read, and it was agreed to circulate it and bring it up for consideration at the next Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets.

4. Petition of August 8, 1918, from M. H. Salgado, praying that a sum of Rs. 50 be accepted in lieu of arrears of excess water charges amounting to Rs. 192.26 in respect of premises 45, Colombo street, and that the water service which has been cut off be restored. It was agreed that petitioner be asked to pay the full amount in four equal monthly instalments, and that the service be restored on payment of the first instalment.

5. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 92 of July 25, 1918, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, re amendments of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, regarding the transfer of properties vested in the Council for the information of the Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 14 of July 25, 1918, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Government is unable to agree to the proposal that the small portions of waste land lying to the east and west of the Military Hospital buildings at Kandy be handed over to the Municipal Council, Kandy, for the purpose of converting them into recreation grounds.—Resolved that it be pointed out that the Council only applied for the temporary possession of the land, and is willing to give up the land whenever required.

(3) Letter No. 15 of July 30, 1918, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary sanctioning the proposed expenditure of a sum of Rs. 200 towards the cost of an illuminated address of welcome to His Excellency Sir William Manning on the occasion of his official visit to Kandy.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 9,225 of July 24, 1918, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, intimating that a Police Constable is being regularly sent now to the public market as desired.—Read.

(5) Letter No. 101 of August 5, 1918, from the Hon. the Treasurer stating that the loan of Rs. 34,821 to the Kandy Municipal Council, under the Riot Damages Ordinance, has been fully paid up and settled.

The Chairman moved :—“ That the scheme framed by the Municipal Council of Kandy, under Ordinance No. 23 of 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,792 of May 5, 1916, be amended, subject to the approval of the Governor in Executive Council, by the substitution of the following section for section 2 :—2. A rate of 1 per cent. on the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the aforesaid Municipality of Kandy shall be made and assessed for the year 1916, with effect from July 1, 1916, the year 1917, and the first quarter of the year 1918, which said rate shall be collected and enforced in conformity with the provisions of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and of any by-laws made thereunder relating to the collection and enforcement of rates.

(6) Letter No. 155 of August 3, 1918, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, asking the Council to nominate an Unofficial Member as a representative in the Excise Advisory Committee for the Kandy Municipal Area. The names of two members, Messrs. Wijegoonewardene and LaBrooy, being proposed, a ballot was taken and Mr. Wijegoonewardene was nominated by a majority of 3.

(7) Letter of August 2, 1918, from the Honorary Secretary, Public Welfare Exhibition, thanking the Council for the generous contribution of Rs. 100 towards the expenses of the exhibition.—Read.

(8) Letter of July 30, from the Superintendent of Works inquiring whether Mr. Buttery may be employed in laying out and tracing roads to localities where there are no proper roads.—Resolved that Mr. Buttery be employed on the investigation survey for road to serve Asgiriya and neighbouring villages.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Beven asked—“ What is the stage of the proceedings under ‘ The Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance ’ in reference to the alleys.”

The Chairman replied as follows :—Six alleys were reported by the Medical Officer of Health to be unfit for human habitation. The alleys were inspected by Chairman and Members on May 4, after inspection it was decided to take proceedings under the Ordinance in respect of the alley No. 49A-49D in Trincomalee street to begin with. Applications in respect of this alley was made by me to the Police Magistrate, under section 74 of the Housing Ordinance, on June 4.

The Magistrate issued notice on June 6, on M. T. M. Sinna Sadakan to appear before him on June 12, and show cause why a closing order in respect of the premises should not be made. This notice was not served on the respondent, and the case was postponed for June 19. On that date, respondent appeared in court and stated that he had cause to show. The case was postponed for June 29. On that date respondent appearing in court stated that he was not the owner of the premises, and gave the address of the owner who is away in India. The Police Magistrate ordered that notice be issued on the owner through the Sub-Magistrate at Tinnevelly, and fixed the inquiry for July 13 last. On this date the Superintendent of Sanitation was informed that the notice had not been issued, and as there was unnecessary delay over the matter, he applied to the Police Magistrate to have the notice reissued on M. T. M. Sinna Sadakan, and the inquiry was fixed for August 10 last. On this date the respondent was present, and his Counsel asked for a postponement, and the inquiry has now been fixed for the 17th instant.

7. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle asked—(1) With reference to letter No. 1,910, whether the Chairman authorized the Secretary to refuse no information which would enable me to investigate the work of the overseers; (2) If so, whether such refusal is not directly contrary to the interests of the rate-payers and subversive of the rights and privileges of the Members of the Council to inquire into the working of its executive officers; (3) Whether the Chairman authorized the Secretary to inquire for what purpose I required the information, and if so whether such inquiry is not *ultra vires*, entirely outside the scope of the Chairman's business, and calculated to throw obstacles in the way of an elected Member fulfilling his obligations to the rate-payers.

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) The reply of the Secretary was in accordance with my instructions; (2) The answer is in the negative; (3) The reply to the first part of the question is in the affirmative, the reply to the second part is in the negative.

8. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle moved—“ That the information asked for in my letter No. 60/A of July 26, 1918, be furnished forthwith, viz. :—A copy of the programme of work allotted to the overseers for the month of August, stating locality, nature of work, and name of overseers.” The motion fell through for want of a seconder.

9. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle moved—“ That all vacancies for appointments above the rank of peons be advertised for.” Mr. LaBrooy seconded.

The Chairman suggested the following amendment which was agreed to by the mover and carried :—That notices calling for applications for appointments to the permanent pensionable establishment of the Council above the rank of peon and to the office of collector, excluding daily-paid employés, be published in the local papers.

10. Papers re discs or badges to be issued to coolies to be worn during working hours. Mr. Beven moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.

Mr. Tomalin moved as an amendment that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adhered to. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried by 5 to 4.

Ayes.—Mr. Tomalin; Mr. Pieris; Mr. Wijegoonewardene; Dr. de Saram; Mr. Ratwatte. Noes.—Mr. Beven; Mr. LaBrooy; Dr. Attygalle; and the Chairman.

11. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law Committee.

(1) That the amendments proposed to sections 132, 144, 150, 157, 157A of the by-laws relating to the Municipal water service be passed.

Finance Committee.

(2) That an Assistant Tamil Teacher for the Municipal School be appointed on Rs. 15 a month.

Works Committee.

(3) That the proposal to erect a public latrine near the 70½ milestone on the Peradeniya road be abandoned.

(4) That the estimate of Rs. 1,255 for repairing padda boat for Halloluwa ferry be sanctioned.

(5) That the following applications for house-service pipes be allowed on usual terms :—(i.) No. 85A, Castle Hill street, F. VanRooyan ; (ii.) No. 5, Trincomalee street, M. K. Meera Lebbe ; (iii.) Nos. 36 and 92, Castle Hill street, M. M. Salgado ; (iv.) No. A, Mosque road, A. Chunchie.

(6) Vote of Rs. 200 for survey of Asgiriya road.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.
