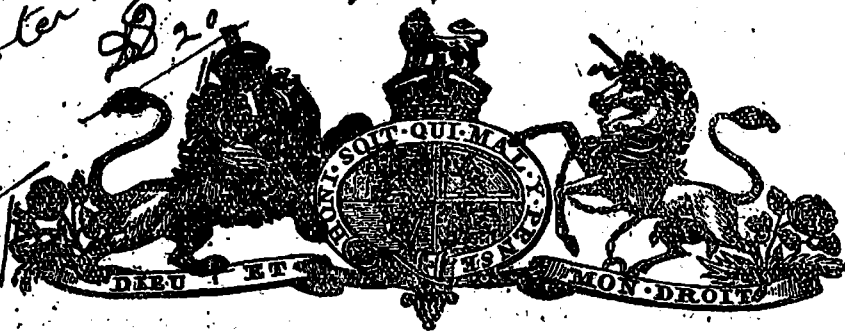

“THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

REGULATIONS made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under section 4 of the said Ordinance:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The definition of the term “disease” in regulation No. 1 of the regulations made under the said Ordinance, and published in the *Government Gazette* of July 31, 1914, is hereby revoked, and the following definition is substituted for the same:—

“The term ‘disease’ means any disease of a contagious, infectious, or epidemic nature.”

2. The definition of the term “infected port” in regulation No. 1 of the said regulations is hereby revoked and the following definition is substituted for the same:—

“The term ‘infected port’ includes a port where disease exists and a place in an area declared by notification in the *Government Gazette* to be infected with disease.”

3. The heading of Part II. of the said regulations is hereby revoked, and the following heading is substituted for the same:—

“Regulations with regard to vessels arriving from infected ports.”

(b) Rule 48 thereof is amended by substituting the figure "3" for "2" therein.

(c) Rule 49 (7) is amended by striking out the figure "2" in the item "2-cent packet" and substituting therefor the figure "3."

1. *Postage.*—The rates of postage on letters to India shall be as follows :—

"The postage on letters for (a) the United Kingdom and British Possessions generally, and (b) Egypt, including the Sudan, is 9 cents for each ounce or part of that weight."

3. *Private Cards.*—The postage on private post cards to India shall be 4 cents on each card.

4. The postage to India on each registered newspaper posted separately shall be 3 cents without limit of weight. A packet of two or more newspapers shall in no case be chargeable with a higher rate of postage than that chargeable on an ordinary inland packet of the same weight.

5. Rule 38 of the rules made under section 12 (3) of the said Ordinance, and published in the *Government Gazette* of August 20, 1909, is amended by striking out the figures "10" and substituting therefor the figures "15."

6. These rules shall come into operation on November 18, 1918.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 9, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 103 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 14 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1918, viz., 276,665) was 19·4, as against 25·3 in the preceding week, 18·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 190 (4 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 34 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 35·8, as against 38·8 in the previous week, 20·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 190 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 52 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Fifty-one deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 10 in Maradana, 8 each in Kotahena and Wellawatta, 6 in St. Paul's, 5 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, 3 in Pettah, and 2 each in Fort, San Sebastian, and Kollupitiya, as against 66, 74, 68, 107, 47, and 23, respectively, for the six preceding weeks. There were registered 44 deaths from *Pneumonia*, 16 in Maradana (including 6 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 5 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, and New Bazaar, 3 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island, 2 each in Fort, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, and 1 in Pettah, as against 44, 80, 112, 130, 159, 91, and 54, respectively, for the seven preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 13. Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Kotahena, 2 each in Maradana, and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 14 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. There were 7 deaths from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 each from *Enteritis* and *Debility*, 5 from *Worms*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Diarrhœa*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 40 from *Other Causes*.

5. Two cases of *Chickenspox* were reported during the week, as against 5 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·6°, against 80·5° in the preceding week and 78·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·885 in., against 29·889 in. in the preceding week and 29·889 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·83 in., against 2·41 in. in the preceding week and 3·38 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Should the person decline or fail to enter into an agreement within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Kurunegala Division, to the effect that his bid has been accepted by the Conservator of Forests or to pay the balance of the purchase amount when due, the deposits already made on account of the purchase and the security shall be forfeited, and the right to collect the produce in question re-sold at the risk of the original purchaser, who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such re-sale, but on the other hand he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by any re-sale.

7. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, re-sold, or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.

8. Should the purchaser or his employes cause any damage to trees in the forests or commit any forest offence, the purchaser shall be held liable to pay compensation for all such damage or loss, and on failure to pay he shall be liable to prosecution.

9. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting the purchaser's employes, and of rescinding the agreement if the above conditions are not adhered to.

10. For any further information, and for inspection of the draft agreement, application should be made at the Office of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Kurunegala Division, in which the forests are situated.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, October 4, 1918.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 27, 1918.

Present :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; Major P. W. Mathew, R.A.M.C.; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. Harold Creasy; Mr. J. K. Hormusjee; and Mr. W. Philips.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 6, 1918, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.—Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of September 6, 1918, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following :—(a) It gives me great pleasure to announce to the Council that since our last meeting no case of plague has been recorded; (b) the City has been suffering from an outbreak of influenza which has been making its way round the world. From Europe, where it has been prevalent in France, Spain, England, and other countries it spread to India. The large towns of India, such as Bombay, Madras, and Rangoon, have all been suffering. The disease is so universal that it is best described as being pandemic. It first appeared in Colombo towards the latter part of June. It was then mild in type and was not attended by any serious consequences, the death-rate not being affected to any appreciable extent. Towards the end of August it died down, the weekly death-rate for the week ending August 31 standing at the remarkably low figure of 17·9. In the latter half of September there was, however, a recrudescence of the outbreak, and owing to the changed climatic conditions, the cases began to develop pulmonary diseases. In many cases pneumonia and bronchitis supervened, and the death-rate went up to 33·6 and 49·6 in the last two weeks of September.

I am pleased to say that at present there is every indication of the disease abating. I may mention that the disease is not a notifiable one. As soon as it was realized that it was assuming a menacing aspect, the public were advised through the medium of the press of the steps which should be taken. Separate instructions were sent to the Headmasters of all schools in Colombo, and also to the Managers of the Banks, the General Manager of the Railway, the Manager of the Tramway Company, the Proper Authorities in charge of the Post Offices, Police Stations, and Public Offices, and also to the Managers of the Cinemas with regard to the disinfection of the buildings in their charge. The requests made met with a ready response on all sides, and, at the request of the Chief Justice, the Law Courts at Hulftsdorp were disinfected by the staff of the Public Health Department.

The universal prevalence of the epidemic in its new form brought about a large amount of distress among the poor, especially in cases where the wage-earner was affected. The Friend-in-Need Society, to which this Council gives an annual grant of Rs. 4,000, found itself in need of funds, and its President, Mr. E. B. Denham, made an eloquent appeal to the public to which, I am glad to say, there was a generous response. As the Friend-in-Need Society has an admirable framework for the relief of the poor throughout the City, I arranged that there should be a co-operation between its officers and the Municipality, as I considered that such co-operation would achieve the best results.

The Chairman, I may mention, has no funds at his disposal for meeting such a case, so I called a meeting of the Finance Committee. After consultation, it was arranged that I should advance such sums as might be necessary for carrying out a relief scheme in anticipation of a vote from the Council. A special recommendation from the Finance Committee on this point is on the agenda.

In addition to securing the co-operation of the Friend-in-Need Society, I invited other charitable organizations to assist. My object in doing so was to co-ordinate the work of all such organisations and make it one, working for the relief of distress in all parts of the City, and so that there might be no overlapping. I have had a ready response. The Rev. C. M. Ricketts undertook to take over the whole of the Polwatta area, and look after it with the assistance of his Guild. Mr. James Peiris assured me of the help and co-operation of the members of the Social Service League, which is starting additional depôts at Grandpass and Dean's road.

In another case help has been given by the presentation of a travelling soup-kitchen, so that soup may be served hot at the house where the patient is.

Many workers have come forward and are rendering valuable assistance.

At an informal meeting which I convened of the elected Councillors to consider what steps should be taken, the Principal Civil Medical Officer, the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, came to our assistance and placed two Medical Officers and six qualified medical students at my disposal.

Medical centres have been created in different parts of the City, and house-to-house visitation has been arranged. The organization is now full and complete, and is fully set out in the statement which is before you. The Health Officers and District Visitors hold house-to-house inspections to discover cases of distress which require relief. If food is required information is given to the local Secretary. If medicine or medical attendance is required the matter is reported to the Medical Officer of the centre.

I also submit a map and an index showing the various centres. It will be seen that five medical centres have been established.

The Medical Visitor begins work at his centre at 7 A.M. and receives applications. After that he starts his itinerary till 11 A.M. He resumes his work at 2 P.M. at his centre and receives applications. He goes out again on his rounds of visit.

The central depôt for the supply of provisions (for example, rice, milk, coriander, &c.) to the respective local depôts is at the Harward Settlement in Dam street, which is in charge of the Rev. H. Haigh, the Honorary Secretary of the Friend-in-Need Society. He sends out what is required to the local depôts, from which provisions are distributed by the local Secretaries by means of visitors and helpers to those families which have been reported to him as deserving of help, where he is satisfied that they require relief. The general principle which has been adopted is to give relief in those cases specially where the wage-earner of the family has been incapacitated and the family has no other means of livelihood.

The scheme is now in full working order, and I am satisfied that relief is being given generally throughout the City, and I hope that in a short space of time the epidemic will be over.

In the absence of Mr. C. P. Dias, who gave notice of the following questions, the Chairman read them out and replied to them.

3. Q.—Whether the Municipal midwives pay visits to the mothers after their confinement? A.—Yes, for a period of ten days after confinement.

Q.—Whether the midwives give them instructions as to the feeding of infants? A.—Yes, the midwives have been provided with printed instructions with regard to the feeding of infants.

4. To move for a return of cases attended to by the midwives in the different Wards during the present year.

The following statement showing the number of confinements conducted by the Municipal midwives from January 1 to August 31, 1918, was laid on the table, after having been read out by the Chairman :—

Slave Island Ward, 99; New Bazaar Ward, 44; San Sebastian Ward, 33; Kotahena Ward, 201; St. Paul's Ward, 51; total number of confinements 428. The first three Wards has each one midwife, and the two latter have two each.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam stated that in view of the statement submitted by the Chairman regarding the epidemic of influenza, he would, with the permission of Council, withdraw the question and motion standing in his name (Nos. 5 and 6 on the agenda).

The permission of the Council having been granted the items Nos. 5 and 6 on the agenda were withdrawn, namely :—

5. What action he (the Chairman) has so far taken to ascertain the extent of the distress caused to the poor of the City by the present epidemic of influenza, and what he has done to relieve such distress; and

6. To move that the Council do appoint a small committee to go into the question, and take such steps immediately as to it may seem proper to render help in all deserving cases and report to this Council.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene stated that he would also, with the permission of Council, withdraw the motion standing in his name, but that he would take the opportunity of thanking the Chairman for the promptitude with which he had taken action, and for the practical action taken to combat the disease.

The permission of Council having been granted, the item No. 7 on the agenda was withdrawn, namely :—

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene to move that—

7. With reference to the appeal made by Mr. E. B. Denham, Chairman of the Friend-in-Need Society, the Council do vote a sum of Rs. 2,500 towards the funds of the Friend-in-Need Society for relief of those suffering from distress by the prevailing fever epidemic in this City, and that the sanction of His Excellency the Governor be obtained for this purpose.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 8 to 12 (inclusive) on the agenda. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

8-12. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special and Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee :—

Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage Works of September 17, 1918.

(6) To consider letter No. 100 of August 15, 1918, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* the expiration of the agreement of Mr. M. R. Atkins, Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works.—It is considered that the agreement with Mr. M. R. Atkins, Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, should be extended till the completion of the programme which is at present in hand.

Resolution.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 28, 1918.

(4) To consider the proposed new regulations *re* electric headlights.—Recommended that the following regulations be approved by the Council :—Regulations framed under the provisions of "The Motor Car Ordinance, No. 25 of 1908." No headlight shall be used within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo, except on the following conditions :—

- (1) In the case of an electric headlight, the whole of the lower half of the reflector shall be completely cut off by the interposition between the light and the reflector of a shield or some other device or contrivance with a dead black surface and the whole of the upper half of the glass of the headlight shall be covered by means of a shield or some other device or contrivance of such a nature as to prevent the rays of light from passing through it.
- (2) In the case of an electric side light, the reflector shall be removed or else shall be completely covered with a non-reflecting substance.
- (3) In the case of gas headlights, the whole of the lower half of the reflector at the back of the light shall be completely cut off by the interposition between the light and the reflector of a shield or some other device or contrivance with a blackened surface.

Resolution of Council of September 6, 1918.

With regard to above item No. 4 (corresponding to item No. 8 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 30, 1918), the Chairman explained the object of the regulations, and a headlight supplied with the proposed black surface was exhibited.

A discussion ensued in which the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, Mr. W. Philips, Mr. T. L. Villiers, Major A. W. de Wilton, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, Mr. W. Sutherland Ross, and Major P. W. Mathew took part.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the consideration of the matter be postponed till the next meeting. Major P. W. Mathew seconded.—Carried.

Resolution.

The Chairman stated that since the last meeting of Council two test demonstrations had been held of the devices to screen the lights, and to the second demonstration the Members of Council had been invited, some of whom had been present. He said he would be glad to hear the views of the Members on the tests made.

The Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, Mr. T. L. Villiers, and Mr. W. Philips expressed their opinions on the relative devices.

The Chairman moved that the regulations be adopted, with the addition to regulation No. 1 of the following, or else the glass of the headlight shall be covered with an opaque substance so as to leave only a central circular aperture of a diameter not exceeding four inches. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 30, 1918.

(8) To consider the proposed new regulations *re* electric headlights.—Recommended that the Council do agree to the adoption of the following regulations :—Regulations framed under the provisions of "The Motor Car Ordinance, No. 25 of 1908." Yoosoof, are not all prepared to take over the blocks lying between their blocks and the road.—Recommended that Mr. P. C. M. Yoosoof be given block T at a price of Rs. 3,500, and that the other blocks be put up for public auction at the following upset prices stated against each block:—Block R, Rs. 1,500; block S, Rs. 10,000; block U, Rs. 700; block V, Rs. 5,500; block W, Rs. 10,000.

With regard to item No. 26, the Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted, and that the Works Engineer be permitted to engage a temporary substitute to be classed in Division II. of the Clerical Service on an initial salary of Rs. 300 per annum to perform the duties. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of September 30, 1918.

A Special Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance was held this day at 2.45 P.M., when the steps to be taken to relieve the distress caused by the influenzal pandemic were considered. The Chairman explained the existing position and the need of relief being afforded to the poor. He informed the Committee that he had seen the President of the Friend-in-Need Society, and recommended that the Municipality should co-operate with the Friend-in-Need Society in relieving the distress. The Committee authorized the Chairman to advance funds not exceeding Rs. 1,500 for the purpose of relieving the present distress, in co-operation with the Friend-in-Need Society, and recommended that the Council do pass a vote covering the expenditure and providing such further sums as may be deemed necessary.

Resolution.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that a sum of Rs. 3,000 be voted to meet the expenditure to relieve the distress, and that the Chairman be authorized to engage two medical officers on a pay of Rs. 6 per diem each and six qualified medical students on a pay of Rs. 4 per diem each, and that they all be paid such allowances for travelling as the Chairman may deem necessary in the circumstances. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

Major P. W. Mathew raised the question of the price of disinfectants sold at the Municipal Stores, and it was agreed that the Chairman should see if the disinfectants can be sold cheaper, and that it should be left to the discretion of the Chairman to issue disinfectants free where he considers it desirable.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the Council do resume, and that the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted as amended. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
