SCHEDULE.

Regulations framed under Sections 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1898 regarding Registration of Cattle.

1. The Arachchi shall make a complete list of cattle in his wasama on form G.A. 4 in triplicate, and shall forward one copy to the Registrar, one to the Chairman, Village Committee, and the other shall be kept by him. In cases where such cattle are kept partly in the division in which such owner resides and partly in another division, the owner shall give the list to the Arachchi of the wasama in which he resides.

2. The Arachchi shall revise the list of cattle on or before January 15 every year by striking off the dead and sold and entering those that were born.

3. Every owner of cattle shall inform the Arachchi the birth, death, and sale of cattle in his possession before the expiry of ten days from the date of death, sale, and birth.

4. The Korals shall be Registrars of Cattle within their respective divisions, provided that the Government Agent may remove them from office or may limit their jurisdictions and appoint special Registrars for the whole or any part of such divisions.

5. The Registrar shall register the lists in the order in which they are received by him, entering the particulars in a register as near as is material in the form A in the schedule hereto.

6. It shall be the duty of the Registrar to compare the list tendered for registration with the corresponding list of the previous year, and otherwise satisfy himself that the number and description of the animals given therein are correct.

7. The Registrar shall, on the application of the owner of cattle, and on payment of the fee prescribed in rule 12, issue in all cases of transfer a certificate of the registration of such cattle as near as is material in the form B in the schedule hereto.

8. No voucher for the transfer of cattle shall be executed by any headman or other officer, except on production of the said certificate of registration from the Registrar, or of the voucher on which such cattle were transferred.

9. The headman or other officer who executes the transfer voucher shall annex the certificate of registration to the counterfoil of the voucher, which is returned to the Kacheheri, and insert the number and date of the certificate and the name of the Registrar issuing the same against item 5 of the transfer voucher form G.A.—K 1.

10. Vouchers for the transfer of cattle belonging to temples, mosques, and pansalas, or to recently deceased persons, or to minors, or to persons of unsound mind, shall be attested by the President, by the Chairman of the Village Committees, or the Chief Headman of the division. In case of a lunatic or minor it shall be the duty of the officer executing such vouchers to satisfy himself that the grantor is the legal or natural guardian of the lunatic or minor, and that the transaction is in the interest of such lunatic or minor, and in no such case shall cattle of the value of Rs. 50 and upwards be transferred, except by a curator duly appointed by the District Court.

11. The Registrar shall keep a register of certificates of registration issued by him as near as is material in the form C in the schedule hereto, and send a copy of it quarterly

to the President of Village Tribunals having jurisdiction over his division.

14. The approximate number of sleepers to be supplied will be about 1,000.

Schedule.

1. Sleepers are to be converted from the ends and tops of trees felled by various contractors in the forests mentioned in paragraph 1, and from such trees as are marked for the purpose by the Forest Department.

2. The trees are to be felled 6 inches from the ground by saw or axe and saw combined.

2. To log the trees, bark, trim, transport, and deliver (a) at Okkanda Bay a distance of 8 to 16 miles; (b) at Kuchchaveli, a distance of about 8 miles; and (c) at Muthur, a distance of about 15 miles, or to deliver all the timber at Kankasanturai.

All suitable dead and hollow trees and branchwood within the forest such as are marked by the Forest Officer, though below 4 ft. 6 in. in girth, should, in addition to all matured sound trees marked by him, be utilized for conversion into sleepers and scantlings or scantlings alone as may be directed. Contractors should understand that only such portions of trees as cannot be converted into sleepers may be sawn into scantlings.

4. Part of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts of logs are not to be sawn into sleepers or scantlings. The sleepers and scantlings should be sawn from sound matured wood, free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

6. Sleepers and scantlings should be rectangular in form, and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs, sleepers, or scantlings with an adze or axe be allowed.

7. Sleepers and scantlings should be covered with sawdust or immersed in water and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn until they can be transported to delivery depôts, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger.

8. Rejected sleepers or scantlings will not be paid for, and they will lapse to Government, as well as all refuse wood in the sleeper operations. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 16, 1918.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 64 (2 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 40 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 6 Moors, and 2 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1918, viz., 276,665) was 12.1, as against 19.4 in the preceding week, 21.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 177 (3 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 73 Sinhalese, 40 Tamils, 35 Moors, 11 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.4, as against 35.8 in the previous week, 23.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 177 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 28 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—Forty-three deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Kotahena, 8 in Maradana, (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 6 in Slave Island, 5 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta, 4 in Kollupitiya, 3 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Fort and Pettah, as against 44, 44, 80, 112, 130, 159, 91, and 54, respectively, for the eight preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 13. There were registered 24 deaths from *Influenza*, 6 in Kotahena, 5 in St. Paul's, 4 in San Sebastian, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Wellawatta, and 1 each in Pettah and Slave Island, as against 51, 66, 74, 68, 107, 47, and 23, respectively, for the seven preceding weeks. Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week.

2. Twenty-one deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 11 in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 11 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered (in San Sebastian), as against 6 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. There were 16 deaths from *Debility*, 10 each from *Enteritis* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 from *Dysentery*, and 45 from *Other Causes*.

5. Four cases of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 2 in the previous week. A case of *Plague* was also reported.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·2°, against 80·6° in the preceding week and 81·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·891 in., against 29·885 in. in the preceding week and 29·889 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·55 in., against 0·83 in. in the preceding week and 0·24 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
